FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Tuesday, the 1st day of March, 1898, and it is expedient to further prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament from Tuesday, the 1st day of March, 1898, until Tuesday, the 3rd day of May, 1898.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and in the sixty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Visd roce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

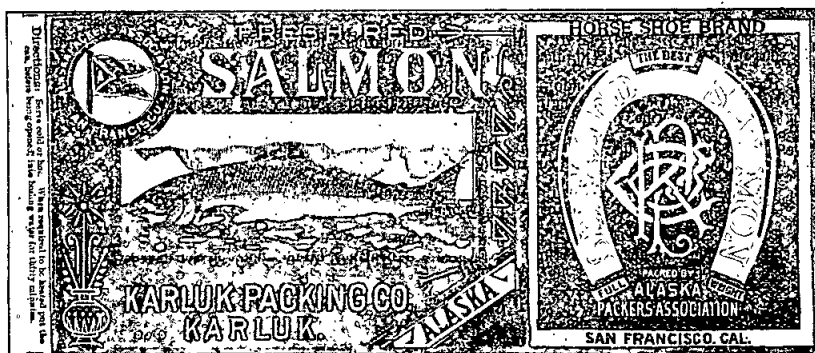

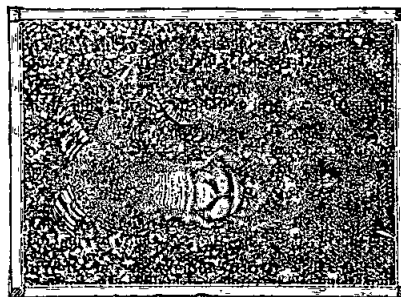

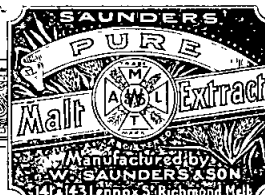

Health Act 1890.

THE SHIRE OF CHARLTON.

BY-LAW No. 1.

(By-law under *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 1.)

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Charlton, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

“*House*” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

“*Cesspool*” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

“*Street*” shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage (whether a thoroughfare or not.)

2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Charlton.

3. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier of a house or any person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

4. *Removal of refuse from houses or premises.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove or cause to be removed therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon at least once every

week, and in case of the default of such occupier the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of the occupier.

5. *Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.*—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated therein as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards or once at least every week; and in case of the default of such occupier the council may remove the same at the expense of the occupier.

6. *Power to use refuse as manure.*—Nothing contained in the foregoing section shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used, as to contravene any by-law of the council, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. *Construction of privies.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof do not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall inclination towards the floor or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

8. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all the night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or receptacle.

9. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier and every owner having the management or control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

10. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night soil, or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

11. *Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land (whether by way of manure or otherwise) any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six (6) inches in thickness.

12. *Earth-closets not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way, or be likely to find their way, into any drain or sewer.

13. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

14. *Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or to be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within 24 hours of notice given by the council or one of its officers.*

15. *Animals not to be kept as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

16. *Registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person who is the occupier or owner of any dairy farm or milk store situated within the Shire of Charlton shall on

or before the 1st day of July in each and every year register himself by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in the form prescribed by the regulations approved by the Governor in Council, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee registration of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

17. *Draining of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such buildings; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired, shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

18. *Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.*—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood, manure, garbage, filth, and other refuse products from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a receptacle constructed of iron or some non-absorbent material to be provided for that purpose, and if allowed to remain therein for twelve hours to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of zinc, in the proportion of 1 lb. to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer, and to be removed within 48 hours after such blood is shed.

19. *Milk stores and shops to be kept clean.*—Every person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

20. *Dairymen, &c., to report disease to the Health Officer.*—Every person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the Health Officer, the recurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

21. *Keeping swine at slaughter-houses.*—An occupier of a slaughter-house shall not at any time keep any swine, unless intended for immediate slaughter, or any dog, or cause or suffer any swine (unless as aforesaid), or any dog to be kept in or about such slaughter-house, nor shall he at any time keep or cause or suffer to be kept in or near such slaughter-house any animal of which the flesh may be used for the food of man, unless such animal be so kept in preparation for the slaughtering thereof upon the premises, and any swine intended for slaughter shall not be so kept in or about such slaughter-house for more than twenty-four (24) hours.

22. *Disposal of dead or diseased animals.*—No person being the owner of any dead animal shall allow such animal to remain in any place for a longer period than twelve hours, so as to become a nuisance and injurious to health, in default the Council will cause such animal to be removed and destroyed at the expense of such owner.

23. *Repeal of existing by-laws.*—All by-laws under the *Health Act 1890*, or any other Act passed for the preservation of health by the Shire of Korong, the Shire of St. Arnaud, and the Shire of Gordon, and which until the passing of this by-law were in existence, or were or which now might by law be applied to the several territories severed from the said shires by the order of the Governor in Council which constitute the Shire of Charlton, are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into existence.

24. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of the foregoing by-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; and such penalties, together with all expenses incurred by the council under this by-law, may be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace, provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

TOWN OF PORT MELBOURNE.

By-Law No. 69.

REGULATING THE REGISTRATION OF DAIRYMEN, COWKEEPERS, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

THE Council of the Town of Port Melbourne, in the Colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said town, by virtue of the powers contained in section 35 of the *Health Act 1890* and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said council, doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 69 of the council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for made by the council are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in every part of Port Melbourne.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the 1st day of March, 1898, and in subsequent years on or before the 1st day of January, register himself with the council in the manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Town Clerk an application in the form hereunder set out, and with such application pay a fee of Ten shillings.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the Town Clerk shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. Every person guilty of a breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, at the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) nor less than Five shillings (5s.), or, in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) nor less than Five shillings (5s.) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing by-law was duly adopted by the Council of the Town of Port Melbourne this 8th day of December, 1897, and such adoption confirmed by the said council on the 11th day of January, 1898.

By-Law No. 5.

Under the Health Act 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and the Ratepayers of the Shire of Tambo, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following by-law, that is to say:—

Pans and Cess-pits.

1. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be abolished.

Double Pan Service.

2. In lieu of such system of pans every closet shall be furnished with a double pan service.

Removal of Night-soil.

3. No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or person for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the Council of the said Shire, and such pan or pans shall be emptied and removed alternately as the said council shall direct.

Use of Disinfectants.

4. Every householder shall use or cause to be placed for use in and in connexion with every closet a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

Charge for Removal.

5. For the removal of such night-soil every householder or occupier as aforesaid shall pay to the said council for such double pan service such sum per annum, payable quarterly in advance, as such council shall deem fit.

Extent of Application of By-law.

6. This by-law, numbered 5, shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the Township of Bruthen.

Penalties.

7. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall for every breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than Five shillings for each day such offence is continued after any conviction.

The foregoing by-law was passed by the Council of the Shire of Tambo at their ordinary meeting, held on the 6th day of October, 1897, and confirmed on the 8th day of December, 1897.

NOTE.—During the year 1897 the registered births numbered 31,302, or 876 less, and the registered deaths 15,128, or 586 less than in the previous year. The excess of births over deaths was thus 16,174, as shown in the table, as compared with 16,464 in 1896, and 18,070 in 1895.

The recorded arrivals by sea having numbered 90,847, and the recorded departures 97,301, there was thus an apparent net loss by emigration of 6,454, consisting of 1,583 males and 4,871 females. Owing to the defective character of the records, however, it is the custom—based on past experience—to add 10 per cent. to the recorded departures of males, and 6 per cent. to those of females, to allow for unrecorded departures. With this allowance the actual net loss by emigration during the year is estimated to have been 14,880—viz., 8,053 males and 6,827 females—which was lower than in 1896 by 8,391, or than in 1895 by 542, but higher than in 1894 by 1,149, 1893 by 1,469, or 1892 by 2,595; the total loss in the six years being estimated at 93,000. In one respect, a marked change has taken place in the character of the net emigration for, whereas in 1896 2 females emigrated to every 5 males, in 1897 there were nearly 6 females to every 7 males.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) to the end of 1897, the allowance made for unrecorded departures has been 49,019, viz., 38,179 for males and 10,840 for females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of 1897 would have been 1,225,257, viz., 633,581 males and 591,676 females. In the absence of any reliable information as to overland emigration, it is assumed that the immigration and emigration across the border balance each other.

The records of migration by sea for the year—taking them for what they are worth—show a balance in favour of immigration from New South Wales of 2,938, Queensland of 81, Tasmania of 1,166, South Australia of 371, United Kingdom of 45, and from Foreign Ports of 2,252; but a balance in favour of emigration to Western Australia of 11,195, New Zealand of 712, South Seas of 654, and South Africa of 746. So long as it is the practice to include persons merely passing through Victorian ports en route both as immigrants and emigrants, no correct indication can be obtained of the migration as between Victoria and other countries individually.

The recorded net emigration to Western Australia—not only from Victoria but practically from the whole of Eastern Australasia—during the last eight years was as follows:—786 in 1890, 1,900 in 1891, 1,714 in 1892, 2,255 in 1893, 10,145 in 1894, 11,127 in 1895, 24,497 in 1896, and 11,195 in 1897; and that to South Africa in the last three years as follows:—1,488 in 1895, 2,881 in 1896, and 746 in 1897. Thus the emigration to Western Australia in 1897, although still high, was less than half, whilst that to South Africa was little more than one-fourth what it was in the preceding year.

The figures of births and deaths, and consequently those of population, may be slightly altered when the returns are finally examined.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1898.

THE births of 50 boys and 51 girls, or in all of 101 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of January. Of these, 46 occurred in Ballarat East, 48 in Ballarat West, 6 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 3 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 111, viz., 63 of boys and 48 of girls.

The deaths registered in January numbered 111, viz., 63 of males and 48 of females. The births were less than the deaths by 10. In December the recorded deaths numbered 73: in January, 1897, they numbered 86; in January, 1896, they numbered 90; in January, 1895, they numbered 107; in January, 1894, they numbered 101; in January, 1893, they numbered 69; in January, 1892, they numbered 69; in January, 1891, they numbered 71; in January, 1890, they numbered 104; in January, 1889, they numbered 104; and in January, 1888, they numbered 84.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The births of 955 children, viz., 489 boys and 466 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of January. The number was, it will be observed, 27 lower than in January, 1897; and still lower than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 262 below the average of the previous ten years, or 263 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 860, viz., 468 of males and 392 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 95, or by only 11 per cent.—the average for January being 50 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, 323, or 60 per cent. in excess of those in the corresponding month of the preceding year, and were more numerous than in the month of January for any of the previous ten years except 1889, 1890, and 1891: they were also 58 above the average of January during the same period, or 56 above it, allowing for the increase of population.

For every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24.93 and of deaths registered 22.45 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1897 of 25.57 and 13.98 respectively, and during the last ten years of 31.69 and 21.01 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 34.55 and 18.37.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 109.2° on the 11th, and the lowest was 48.1° on the 23rd. The former was exceeded on only five previous occasions since 1837, viz.:—111.2° on 14th January, 1862; 111.0° on 22nd January, 1860; 110.7° on 15th December, 1876; 110.5° on 19th January, 1882; 110.4° on 20th January, 1875; and 109.9° on 21st January, 1875. The mean temperature of the month (69.2°) was 2.6° above the average, and was the second highest on record, the maximum being 71.6° in January, 1890. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (49.1°) took place on the 28th, and the least range (6.0°) on the 8th. The mean daily range was 24.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.189 inches on the 5th, and the lowest was 29.444 inches on the 18th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.814 inches) was slightly below the average.

According to the Acting Government Astronomer the present summer is unprecedented during the last 30 years, both as to the number of very hot days recorded, and for the sequence of successive hot days. Thus, the thermometer rose above 100° on 5 days in December last, on 7 days in the month under review, and on 3 days in the first half of the current month, as against an average of 3 days for December, 14 for January, and 1 for February, and the following maxima previously recorded since 1857:—4 days in December, 1871; 5 in January, 1875; and 3 in February, 1866, 1879, 1890, and 1893. Whilst the longest sequences of hot days—on which the thermometer rose above 90° since 1859—were as follow:—January, 1872, 5 days, on 2 of which it rose above 100°; March, 1872, 6 days, all under 100°; February, 1876, 5 days, only 1 above 100°; January, 1887, 5 days, 2 above 100°; February, 1893, 6 days, 1 above 100°; January-February, 1898, 8 days, on 6 of which it rose above 100°.

Rain fell on two days, the amount being .30 of an inch, which was 5.16 inches lower than in January, 1897, and 1.78 inches below the average of the previous ten years. It was also lower than in any of the corresponding months of the previous ten years, except 1893.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 39 per cent. to that mortality, as against 30 per cent. in January, 1897; 43 per cent. in January, 1896; 43 per cent. in January, 1895; 42 per cent. in January, 1894; 50 per cent. in January, 1893; and 53 per cent. in January, 1892.

Eighty-two persons whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years, as compared with only 49 in January, 1897. Of the former, a gentleman, aged 75, died of cancer; a gentleman, aged 76, of diarrhoea; a draper and a female, each aged 76, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 76, of dilatation of the heart; four females, each aged 76, of aneurism, heart disease, bronchitis, and Bright's disease respectively; a gentleman, aged 76, of cystitis; two females, each aged 76, of heat apoplexy; two females, each aged 77, of influenza and insanity respectively; an agent and a decorator, both aged 77, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 77, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 77, of pneumonia; a female, aged 77, of Bright's disease; another, aged 78, of paralysis; a minister, aged 78, of senile gangrene; a female, aged 78, of heart disease; a groom, aged 78, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of enteritis; two females, each aged 79, of dysentery and cancer respectively; an artisan, aged 79, of softening of the brain; a female, aged 79, of valvular heart disease; another, aged 80, of cancer; a ship-joiner, aged 80, of heart disease; a dairyman, aged 80, of bronchitis; a cabinetmaker and a female, each aged 80, of pneumonia; a farmer, aged 80, of heat apoplexy; a farmer, aged 81, of influenza; a female, aged 81, of pneumonia; a shoemaker, aged 81, of hepatitis; a clerk, aged 82, of dysentery; a carrier, aged 82, of cancer; a female, aged 82, of apoplexy; a saddler, aged 82, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 82, of bronchitis; a female, aged 82, of ulceration of the bowels; a miner, aged 83, of influenza; a gentleman and a clerk, each aged 83, of dysentery; a farmer, aged 83, of cancer; a labourer, aged 83, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a bootmaker, aged 84, of softening of the brain; a gentleman, aged 84, of heart disease; a clerk, aged 84, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 84, of obstruction of the bowels; a postmaster, aged 85, of influenza; a labourer, aged 85, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 86, of intestinal obstruction; a female, aged 86, of Bright's disease; a housekeeper, aged 89, of insanity; a gentleman, aged 90, of bronchitis; a gardener, aged 90, of jaundice; a farmer, aged 91, of intestinal obstruction; an architect, a carter, and a female, each aged 75, a labourer and a female, each aged 76, a gentleman, aged 79, four females, each aged 80, a seaman and three females, each aged 84, three females, each aged 85, a teacher (female), aged 86, two gentlemen and a female, each aged 87, and a female, aged 89, of old age.

Forty-seven deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 39 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A jockey, aged 25, died of injuries to the head, the result of a fall whilst riding in a race; a farmer, aged 40, of injuries caused by a fall from a bicycle; a boy, aged 8, and a florist, aged 40, of injuries consequent on being thrown from carts; a farmer, aged 45, of injuries received by falling from a balcony; a labourer, aged 46, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall whilst drunk; a labourer, aged 48, of injuries consequent on a fall through the trap-door of a ballast truck; a watchman, aged 53, of scalds; a butcher, aged 34, a fruiterer, aged 36, a commercial traveller, aged 46, a police constable, aged 63, three labourers, aged 35, 45, and 66 respectively, two farmers, aged 31 and 80 respectively, and seven females, aged 2 months, 4 months, 6 months, 40, 63, 76, and 76 respectively, of heat apoplexy; a taxidermist was accidentally poisoned; a male child, aged 1 year, was drowned in a tub; three boys, aged 8, 9, and 11 respectively, and a messenger, aged 13, were drowned whilst bathing; a seamstress, aged 33, and a labourer, aged 48, were found drowned, the former in the River Yarra, the latter in the receiving reservoir at Kew; a female child, aged 10 weeks, was overlain; a foreman, aged 30, an inspector of works, aged 34, and three labourers, aged 30, 34, and 39 respectively, were suffocated by sewer gas; and a male infant, aged 12 days, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born female infant, who was suffocated, and a labourer, aged 69, who died of rupture of an artery of the brain caused by violence, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the former, and of manslaughter in the latter case. The suicidal deaths were those of an accountant, aged 23, and a slater, aged 46, who shot themselves; a female, aged 54, who poisoned herself; a printer aged 21, and a female, aged 34, who drowned themselves; and a female, aged 34, who hanged herself.

One hundred and ninety-two deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—71 in the Melbourne, 28 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 3 in the Women's, 7 in the Children's, 2 in the Homœopathic, and 7 in the Austin Hospitals; 11 in the Metropolitan and 17 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 17 in the Benevolent and 2 in the Infant Asylums, 11 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 4 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 337, of which 174, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 163, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 237 were under one year of age, 73 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five. The increase as compared with the corresponding month of 1897 was 174—of which 97 appear in the age group under one year, and 60 between one and two years.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 523. Of these, 294, or 56 per cent., were males, and 229, or 44 per cent., were females; 21 were between five and ten, 15 were between ten and fifteen, 23 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 44 were between thirty and thirty-five, 40 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 35 were between fifty-five and sixty, 40 were between sixty and sixty-five, 45 were between sixty-five and seventy, 42 were between seventy and seventy-five, 34 were between seventy-five and eighty, 32 were between eighty and eighty-five, 13 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 3 were between ninety and ninety-five. There was an increase of 149 in the deaths over five years, as compared with January, 1897, which was distributed generally over all the age groups—the only age groups which showed no increase being 25-30 and 50-55.

Of the increase of 323 in the total number of deaths in the month under review as compared with January twelve months previously, 175 went to swell the mortality of diseases embraced in the local class, 66 in the zymotic, 32 in the constitutional, 23 under violence, 16 in the undefined class—chiefly under debility, and 7 each in the dietetic and developmental classes; whilst the only decrease was 3 in the parasitic class. In the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system rose from 47 to 82, of the respiratory system from 40 to 81, of the digestive from 83 to 174—chiefly under enteritis, and of the urinary from 31 to 39. In the zymotic class deaths from measles rose from nil to 22, those from influenza from 2 to 7, from typhoid fever from 25 to 38, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 16 to 42; as against which there was a decrease in the deaths from septic diseases from 5 (including 2 from puerperal fever) to nil. The current epidemic of measles appeared first in December last, when 6 deaths occurred, and is the first outbreak since the year 1893, when 386 deaths from measles took place. In the constitutional class, deaths from cancer rose from 30 to 40, and those from phthisis from 51 to 68. Sunstroke, owing to the excessive heat, caused 8 deaths in December last, and 16 in January. During the last twelve years, the largest number of deaths from sunstroke was 32, viz., in the year 1890—chiefly in January and February, the next largest number prior to the present occasion having been 14 in 1896.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1897, and the first month of 1898, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever in January, 1898, was much above the average.

HOMESTEAD ASSOCIATIONS.—PROCLAMATIONS PARTLY REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1898* (57 Vict. No. 1311), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for occupation by the members of associations or societies under the said Part of the said Act blocks of any land not alienated from the Crown and not being ariferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such blocks of land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1890*; and that except as to so much of any block as may be occupied or leased under the said Part of the said Act, no Proclamation setting apart a block for a society shall remain in force for longer than three years or for an association for longer than six months after in each case the survey and subdivision of such block; and that at the expiration of such three years or six months (as the case may be) all land in any block which is not occupied or leased under Part II. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1898* aforesaid shall be deemed and taken to be unoccupied Crown land; And whereas by certain Proclamations as hereunder set forth, made in pursuance of the provisions of the said Part of the said *Settlement on Lands Act 1898*, certain lands respectively described in such Proclamations were set apart and appropriated for occupation by the members of associations or societies under the said Part of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part each of such Proclamations: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby order as follows, viz.:

SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

By-Law No. 1.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of South Barwon, made under the *Health Act 1892*, and numbered 1.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1892*, the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of South Barwon hereby orders and directs:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health.

3. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the 1st day of March in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

5. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

6. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows, shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean; and shall within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

7. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

8. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever, or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of any house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order, as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board, or the officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows, or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination has ceased.

9. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, venditor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

10. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yard in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

11. In the interpretation of this by-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females; and the singular, the plural; and the plural, the singular; and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

12. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings; or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
