FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Tuesday, the 3rd day of May, 1898, and it is expedient to further prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday, the 3rd day of May, 1898, until Tuesday, the 31st day of May, 1898.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and in the sixty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

SMALL-POX ON BOARD THE STEAM-SHIP "ORIZABA."

WHEREAS by the Health Act 1890 it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steamship *Orizaba* has arrived in Victorian waters, and has on board a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the Colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steamship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and do further direct that no person whatever, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, except the passengers for Victoria, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steamship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steamship, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steamship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steamship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steamship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

A By-law to prevent the discharge of offensive matter into the Saltwater River (54 Vict. No. 1098, Sec. 244).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

No person shall discharge, or cause or allow to be discharged, any offensive matter into the Saltwater River within the limits of the said city.

Every person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and not less than Five shillings.

This by-law was made and passed by the Council of the City of Melbourne at the meeting of the said council held on the 29th day of November, 1897.

The births of 1,148 children, viz., 605 boys and 543 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of March. The number was, it will be observed, about 40 lower than in March, 1897 or 1895, when they were about equal; and much lower than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 199 below the average of the previous ten years, or 266 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 879, viz., 475 of males and 404 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 269, or by only 31 per cent., as against 112 per cent. in 1897 and 81 per cent. according to the average. The deaths were, it will be noticed, 318 in excess of those in the corresponding month of the preceding year, and were more numerous than in the month of March for any of the previous ten years except 1889 and 1890; they were also 136 above the average of March during the same period, or 132 above it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 29.47 and of deaths registered 22.57 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1897 of 31.06 and 14.62 respectively, and during the last ten years of 35.20 and 19.46 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 33.56 and 17.77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 96.0° on the 8th, and the lowest was 41.2° on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (65.1°) was 1° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (40.9°) took place on the 26th, and the least range (4.7°) on the 30th. The mean daily range was 25.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.185 inches on the 25th, and the lowest was 29.457 inches on the 1st. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.940 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on four days, the amount being .37 of an inch, which was 1.12 inches lower than in March, 1897, and 1.07 inches below the average of the previous ten years. It was also lower than in any of the corresponding months of the previous ten years, except 1889.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 43 per cent. to that mortality, as against 33 per cent. in March, 1897; 38 per cent. in March, 1896; 37 per cent. in March, 1895; 42 per cent. in March, 1894; 48 per cent. in March, 1893; and 47 per cent. in March, 1892.

Seventy-two persons whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years, as compared with only 41 in March, 1897. Of the former, a female, aged 75, died of erysipelas; a gentleman, a pensioner, a licensed victualler, a farmer, and a butcher, each aged 75, of heart disease; a master mariner, aged 75, of asthma; a female, aged 75, of pneumonia; a phthisis; a gentleman, aged 76, of pneumonia; an ex-pilot, aged 75, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 75, of dropsy; a carpenter, aged 76, of phthisis; a gentleman, aged 77, of heart disease; a civil servant, aged 76, of uræmia; a labourer, aged 77, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 77, of syncope; a cook, aged 77, of heart disease; a surveyor, aged 77, of cystitis; a civil engineer, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 78, of dysentery; a clerk and a female, each aged 78, of phthisis; a gentleman, aged 78, of syncope; two females, each aged 78, of heart disease; a dealer, aged 78, of congestion of the lungs; an ironmoulder, aged 78, of Bright's disease; a gentleman,

Thirty-five of the deaths recorded during the month were from external causes, of which 29 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A labourer, aged 25, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a kick from a horse; a driver, aged 21, of injuries, through being crushed by his cart, which had capsized; a clerk, aged 26, of fracture of the spine, and a nightman, aged 37, of fracture of the skull, consequent on falls from carts; a driver, aged 55, of injury to the spine, the result of a fall from a lorry; a girl, aged 10, of rupture of the kidney, caused by a fall down steps; a housekeeper, aged 74, of fracture of the hip, also the result of a fall; a miner, aged 33, of injuries, consequent on an explosion in a mine; a boy, aged 6, of injuries to the ribs and lungs, how caused, not known; a male of no occupation, aged 19, of a gunshot wound; a male child, aged 1 year, of scalds; two male children, each aged 3, two females, aged 6 and 8 respectively, a tailor, aged 25, and a labourer, aged 70, of burns; a male child, aged 2, was accidentally poisoned by acetic acid given by his sister; a female, aged 23, by phosphorus; a boy, aged 11, and a female, aged 41, were drowned whilst bathing, the former in a clay-hole at Brunswick, and the latter in Hobson's Bay; a carrier, aged 36, a carpenter, aged 58, and a male of occupation unknown, aged 65, were "found drowned"; a male and a female infant, each aged 1 month, were overlain; a butcher, aged 82, was suffocated by food; a newborn female infant, at birth; whilst a newborn female infant died of injuries at birth. The homicidal death was that of a physician, aged 32, who died from the effects of an injection of atropine, sold by a chemist in mistake for morphia, a verdict of manslaughter being returned against the chemist. The suicidal deaths were those of a miner, aged 36, who shot himself; a cook, aged 68, who cut his throat; a bookkeeper, aged 59, who poisoned himself; and a labourer, aged 36, and a hawker, aged 48, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and seventy-seven deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 76 in the Melbourne, 15 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 6 in the Women's, 16 in the Children's, 8 in the Homeopathic, and 12 in the Austin Hospitals; 15 in the Metropolitan and 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 4 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 376, of which 204, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 172, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 200 were under one year of age, 113 were between one and two, 36 were between two and three, 14 were between three and four, and 13 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 503. Of these, 271, or 54 per cent., were males, and 232, or 46 per cent., were females; 38 were between five and ten, 14 were between ten and fifteen, 24 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 25 were between twenty-five and thirty, 34 were between thirty and thirty-five, 42 were between thirty-five and forty, 31 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 32 were between fifty-five and sixty, 37 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 36 were between seventy and seventy-five, 43 were between seventy-five and eighty, 16 were between eighty and eighty-five, 9 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 4 were between ninety and ninety-five.

As regards causes of death, the chief feature was the continued prevalence of the measles epidemic, which resulted fatally in 62 cases in the month under notice, making a total number of 121 deaths since its first outbreak in December last. In addition to measles, typhoid fever, diphtheria, diarrhoea, and venereal diseases also caused a high mortality, and also helped to swell the mortality from zymotic diseases to 119 more than in the corresponding month of 1897. Moreover, in the local class, an increase of 135 took place—19 being under diseases of the nervous, 14 under those of the circulatory, 20 under those of the respiratory, and 73 under those of the digestive system—chiefly enteritis; also an increase of 29 in the constitutional class—14 being due to phthisis and 11 to cancer; of 12 in the developmental class—due chiefly to the greater mortality of old people; and of 12 each under violence and ill-defined causes. The fatality of most causes was probably intensified in consequence of the enervating effect on invalids of the recent exceptionally hot summer.

Epidemics of measles recur at intervals of usually four or five years, and the disease is apparently not confined to any particular season of the year. The following are particulars of the leading outbreaks during the last 25 years:—

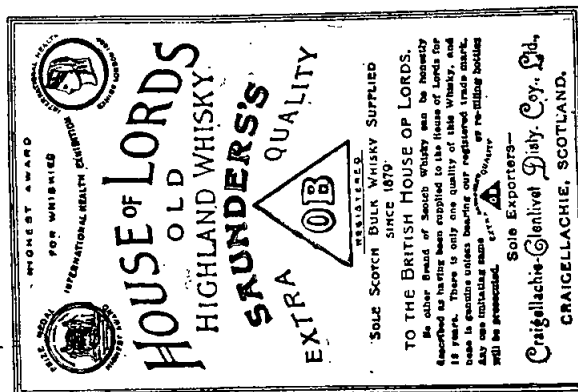

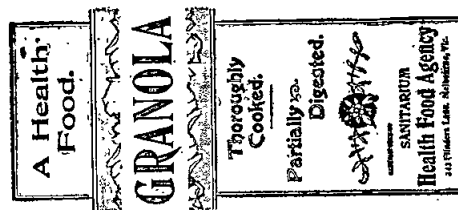

PART OF THE SHIRE OF PHILLIP ISLAND AND WOOLAMAI SEVERED THEREFROM AND ANNEXED TO THE SHIRE OF POOWONG AND JEETHO.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day of April, 1898.

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any direction as to any matters and things that may be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Acts are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the rate-payers of a portion of the Woolamai Riding of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai, with regard to a certain area therein described, notices of such petition having been published in the manner prescribed in the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the Woolamai Riding of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai the portion described in such petition, and doth annex the portion so severed from such shire to the Jumbunna Riding of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho; and with the advice aforesaid, doth re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai and of the several Ridings thereof, including the Woolamai Riding as hereby reduced, and of the said Shire of Poowong and Jeetho, including the Jumbunna Riding thereof as hereby enlarged, in the manner set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

PHILLIP ISLAND AND WOOLAMAI SHIRE (REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED).

any matters and things that may be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Acts are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the ratepayers of portion of the South Riding of the Shire of Donald with regard to a certain area therein described, notices of such petition having been published in the manner prescribed in the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Donald the portion described in such petition, being portion of the South Riding of the said shire, and doth annex the portion so severed from such shire to the South Riding of the Shire of Wycheproof; and with the advice aforesaid doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Donald and of the South Riding thereof as hereby reduced, and of the said Shire of Wycheproof and of the South Riding thereof as hereby enlarged, in the manner set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight, and to determine and alter, within the limits prescribed by the said Acts, the number of councillors assigned to any municipality; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Ferntree Gully has been presented to the Administrator of the Government in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th day of January, 1898, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Shire of Ferntree Gully aforesaid, and, in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth hereby re-subdivide the said shire into four separate ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be those severally hereunder set forth and described, and doth hereby further order that a council consisting of twelve members be elected accordingly.

CENTRE RIDING.

No. 1112), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, for the purpose of adjusting the conterminous boundaries of the Shires of Healesville, Howqua, and Upper Yarra, doth hereby cancel all previously defined boundaries of the said Shires of Healesville, Howqua, and Upper Yarra, and also of the several ridings of the Howqua Shire, and doth re-define the boundaries of the said shires and of the said ridings respectively in the manner following, that is to say:—

HEALESVILLE SHIRE.

EXPLOSIVES AMENDED.

WHEREAS by the 49th section of the *Explosives Act 1890* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order define for the purposes of the First Part of that Act the composition, quality, and character of any explosive, and may classify explosives; And whereas by an Order of the

Governor in Council made in pursuance of the provisions aforesaid and bearing date the 13th day of December, 1897, explosives were classified as detailed in the said Order, and the composition, quality, and character of the explosive known as "Rendite" was amongst others defined: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order substitute the following definition of the composition, quality, and character of "Rendite" for that contained in the said Order of the 13th day of December, 1897, that is to say:—

RENDITE.—Consisting of Potassium Nitrate, Sulphur, Picric Acid, and Wood Meal, with or without the addition of Graphite (free from grit) provided that—

1. The amount of Picric Acid or Graphite shall not exceed 2 per cent. of the finished explosive.
2. All the ingredients shall be thoroughly purified.

And the Honorable Robert Wallace Best, Her Majesty's Minister of Trade and Customs, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Whenever for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order and for such time as by notice in writing under the hand or by direction of the Mayor, or in his absence or the case of sudden emergency under the hand of the Town Clerk or the officer in charge of the local police, any carriage-way, footway, street, or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of vehicles or persons or both, the drivers of vehicles, and all persons contemplated by such notice shall when so required by any member of the police force obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or by withdrawing and removing from where mentioned therein. And the drivers of all vehicles shall when so required by any member of the police force remove their vehicles thence, and if desiring to remain in the vicinity shall proceed to any other carriage-way, street, or public place which may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in manner directed by any member of the police force.
