PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Constitution Act it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, alled "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Tuesday, the 3rd day of May, 1898, and it is expedient to further prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday, the 3rd day of May, 1898, until Tuesday, the 3rd day of May, 1898 of the Colony, at

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and in the sixty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by the Health Act 1590 it is amongst other things provided that in any energency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagiou until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steamship Oricaba has arrived in Victorian waters, and has on board a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the Colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmasthead; and do further direct that no person whatever, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, except the passengers for Victoria, nor any article, cargo, goods, or elters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer proposed to shore under his directions; and, further, tha

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

No person shall discharge, or cause or allow to be discharged, any offensive matter into the Saltwater River within the limits of the said city.

Every person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and not less than Five shillings.

The births of 1,148 children, viz., 605 boys and 543 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of March. The number was, it will be observed, about 40 lower than in March, 1897 or 1895, when they were about equal; and much lower than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 199 below the average of the perevious ten years, or 206 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 879, viz., 475 of males and 404 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 269, or by only 31 per cent., as against 112 per cent. in 1897 and 81 per cent. according to the average. The deaths were, it will be noticed, 318 in excess of those in the corresponding month of the preceding year, and were more numerous than in the month of March for any of the previous ten years except 1889 and 1890; they were also 186 above the average of March during the same period, or 132 above it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,600 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 29.47 and of deaths or a compared with averages of the same month in 1897 of 31.06 and 14.02 respectively, and during the last ten years of 35.20 and 19.46 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 33.56 and 17.77.

As regards causes of death, the chief feature was the continued prevalence of the measles epidemic, which resulted fatally in 62 cases in the month under notice, making a total number of 121 deaths since its first outbreak in December last. In addition to measles, typhoid fever, diphtheria, diarrhoal, and venereal diseases also caused a high mortality, and also helped to swell the mortality from zymotic diseases to 119 more than in the corresponding month of 1897. Moreover, in the local class, an increase of 135 took place—19 being under diseases of the nervous, 14 under those of the circulatory, 20 under those of the respiratory, and 73 under those of the digestive system—chiefly entertits; also an increase of 29 in the constitutional class—14 being due to phthisis and 11 to cancer; of 12 in the developmental class—due thiefly to the greater mortality of old people; and of 12 cach under violence and ill-defined causes. The fatality of most causes was probably intensified in consequence of the enervating effect on invalids of the recent exceptionally hot summer.

Epidemics of measles recur at intervals of usually four or five years, and the disease is apparently not confined to any particular season of the year. The following are particulars of the leading outbreaks during the last 23 years:—


