ARREST OF SEAMEN DESERTERS IN THE CASE OF JAPAN.

The Merchant Shipping Act 1894, Section 238.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, and its Enclosure, are published for general information.

I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the O. in C., Colony under your Government, copies of an Order of the Queen in Council applying section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, respecting the arrest of Seamen deserters in the case of Japan.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, it is provided that, where it appears to Her Majesty that due facilities are, or will be, given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending

seamen who desert from British merchant ships in that country, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that section shall apply in the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions, and qualifications contained in the Order:

And whereas it appears to Her Majesty that due facilities are given by the Government of Japan for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in that country:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the hereinbefore recited sub-section (1) of section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that the said section 238 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1894* shall apply in the case of Japan.

And whereas the immediate operation of this Order is urgent; this Order shall come into operation forthwith, and shall be a *Provisional Order* within the meaning of *The Rules Publication Act 1893*.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATION TO FURTHER AMEND "THE SOLOMONS (REVENUE) REGULATION, No. 3 OF 1897."

THE following Regulation, made by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, is published for general information.

QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

To further amend "*The Solomons (Revenue) Regulation, No. 3 of 1897.*"

[L.S.] G. T. M. O'BRIEN.

1. Section 4 of "*The Solomons (Revenue) Regulation 1897*" is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor:—

Ship Licences.—For every ship or vessel trading within or to the Protectorate and not recruiting or returning labour there, there shall be obtained an annual licence at the rate of Ten shillings for every ton of tonnage measurement, provided that the amount payable in respect of any one such ship or vessel shall not exceed the sum of One hundred pounds:

For each punt or boat trading within the Protectorate an annual licence shall be obtained at the rate of Ten shillings for every ton of carrying capacity, such capacity to be estimated by the Resident Commissioner or some person duly authorized by him.

Labour Ship Licences.—For every ship or vessel recruiting labour in or returning labour to the Protectorate there shall be obtained an annual or half-yearly licence, for which the following fees shall be paid :—

For an annual licence, for every ton of tonnage measurement the sum of One pound, provided that the amount payable in respect of any one ship or vessel shall not exceed the sum of One hundred pounds;

For a half-yearly licence, for every ton of tonnage measurement the sum of Twelve shillings, provided that the amount payable in respect of any one ship or vessel shall not exceed the sum of Sixty pounds.

2. Section 10 of the said Regulation shall be read and construed as if the words "or for purposes of recruiting or returning labour" were inserted after the word "trade" in the third line thereof, and formed part of the section.

This Regulation may be cited as "The Solomons (Revenue) Regulation 1898."

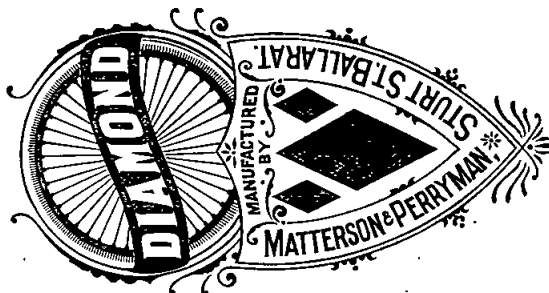

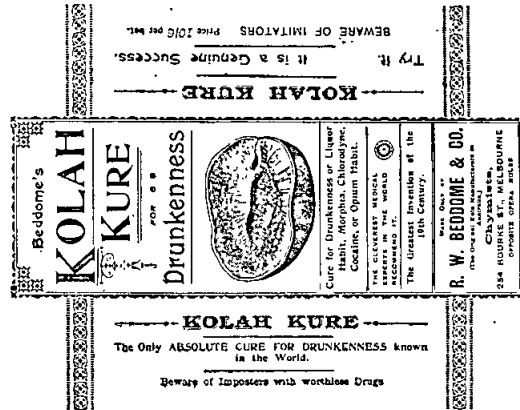

SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust do hereby make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

Regulation for the management and conduct of business at the meetings of the Commissioners of the Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust.

1. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman of the meeting at which such minutes shall be confirmed, and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. Order of business at meetings.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (a) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
- (b) Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon.
- (c) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (d) Presentation of report of committees.
- (e) Payments.
- (f) Ordinary business.
- (g) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (h) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (i) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (j) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Divisions.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner, the Commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the Trust secretary or clerk at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or if not then given, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of the Trust, and such secretary or clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

6. Notice of motion to be given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

7. Petitions.—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

8. Motions to be moved in order in motion book.—Except by leave of the Trust motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Trust secretary or clerk in the notice of motion book, and, if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

9. Motion to be proceeded with by Commissioner giving same except with consent.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

10. Order, &c., of debate.—Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

11. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

12. Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

13. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

14. Mover of motion.—A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

15. Designation of Commissioners.—The Commissioners in meeting of the Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or Commissioner, as the case may require.

16. Priority of Commissioners.—If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

17. Chairman to rise in addressing Trust.—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

18. Commissioner not to speak second time on same question.—No Commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

19. Points of order.—The chairman shall decide upon points of order or practice, and his decision shall be final.

20. Commissioner not to digress, &c.—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion or comment upon the words used by any other Commissioner in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

21. Commissioners to apologize for disorderly, &c., expression.—Whenever any Commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other Commissioner, the Commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

22. Commissioner called to order to sit down.—Any Commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

23. Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.—Any Commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of a breach of this Regulation.

24. Strangers.—Any person not being a Commissioner who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this Regulation.

25. Commissioner not attending order for call.—Any Commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of a breach of this Regulation.

26. Commissioner may demand documents.—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

27. Voting.—The Trust shall vote by show of hands, and any Commissioner present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of a breach of this Regulation.

28. Question how declared.—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

29. Motions, &c., to be in writing.—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

30. No second amendment until previous one disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

31. Effect of rejection of words in original motion.—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

32. If amendment be negatived a second one may be moved.—If an amendment be negatived then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

33. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

34. Resolutions, how revoked.—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority, if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

35. Motion for adjournment.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

36. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

37. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day, on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

38. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committees' minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust, and the Trust secretary or clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

39. Meetings of the committee.—The Trust secretary or clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter, by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

40. Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

41. Accounts when dealt with.—No accounts shall be dealt with at any meeting of the Trust unless received at the office of the Trust two clear days preceding the date of meeting.

42. Common seal.—The corporate seal of the Trust shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the Trust and one other member of the Trust, or, in the absence of such chairman, unless two Commissioners be present.

43. Suspension of rules.—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Trust.

44. Penalty.—If any person shall be guilty of any breach of this Regulation, or of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this Regulation, such person shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

In the construction of this Regulation the word "Trust" shall mean the Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust.

BOROUGH OF PORT FAIRY.

By-LAW No. 1 OF 1897.

Made in pursuance of the *Health Act 1890*.

A By-law of the Borough of Port Fairy, made under and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered One, of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, for providing that the ordinary system of pans for night service be enforced, and to provide for the removal, cleansing, and management thereof, and for the disposal of night-soil at a depot, and for the supervision to be exercised by the Council over such depot, and to provide that individual householders shall not contract for the removal of night-soil except in accordance with the By-laws and Regulations of the said Council of the said Borough.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Port Fairy make order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into force and take effect on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately on its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. All former by-laws on this matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

3. This By-law shall apply to that portion of the said Borough of Port Fairy extending from College-street on the west to the River Moyno on the east, Regent-street on the north, and Campbell-street on the south.

4. The occupier of every house, building, tenement, or premises within the defined limit of the said Borough shall cause every privy or closet in or upon or belonging to such premises to be furnished with a pan of such size and description as the Council shall direct.

5. Every such occupier will be supplied by the Council with the necessary pans, and a sufficient service, for an annual charge to be made by the Council as provided in the *Health Act*.

6. No such occupier shall contract for the removal of night-soil except in accordance with the Regulations and By-laws of the Council.

7. The removal and disposal of night-soil from any premises shall be done by contractors or servants of the Council, or persons employed by such contractors or servants, and not by any other person or persons.

8. The Council shall cause to be removed by their contractors or employes the contents of the said pans from such houses or premises in the said Borough as above defined once in each week, and between such hours as shall be directed by the Council.

9. No contractor or his employé, nor any servant of the Council, shall remove the contents of any pan from any premises in the said Borough as above defined, except between the hours of Eleven p.m. to Four a.m.

10. No contractor, servant, or employé of the Council shall remove the contents of any pan from any premises as aforesaid unless and until the said contents shall be covered by him with deodorizing powder.

11. The contents of all such pans shall be removed in such a description of vehicle as the Council may direct or provide.

12. Every contractor and his employé, and every servant of the Council, removing the contents of any pans as aforesaid from any premises in the said Borough as above defined shall convey the same to such night-soil depot as shall be directed or provided by the Council.

13. No contractor or his employé, nor any servant of the Council, shall deposit any night-soil at such depot except in trenches from 18 inches to 24 inches wide, dug down to a depth of at least 18 inches from the surface, and except in a layer not exceeding 6 inches thick, and covered immediately with the earth taken out of the trenches, and unless bars 2 feet wide are left across such trenches at intervals of 5 feet.

14. The occupier or person in charge of every premises in the said Borough as above defined shall cause to be kept in every privy or closet on his premises or belonging thereto a supply of lime, powdered earth, caustic sawdust, ashes, charcoal, or other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan to be immediately covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly deodorize the contents thereof.

15. The Council shall have power to make a charge for any pans supplied to any such occupier, the amount thereof in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

16. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings; or, if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall forfeit and pay a penalty for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF MARCH, 1898.

THE births of 78 boys and 53 girls, or in all of 131 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of March. Of these, 61 occurred in Ballarat East, 61 in Ballarat West, 8 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 13 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 103, viz., 46 of boys and 57 of girls.

The deaths registered in March numbered 132, viz., 89 of males and 43 of females. The deaths thus exceeded the births by 1. In February the recorded deaths numbered 96; in March, 1897, they numbered 72; in March, 1896, they numbered 89; in March, 1895, they numbered 75; in March, 1894, they numbered 93; in March, 1893, they numbered 92; in March, 1892, they numbered 80; in March, 1891, they numbered 91; in March, 1890, they numbered 71; in March, 1889, they numbered 78; and in March, 1888, they numbered 53.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Twenty-eight deaths, or 21 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 21; Benevolent Asylum, 7.

The total mortality of the month was nearly twice as great as that in the corresponding month of 1897, and also far greater than that of any other of the previous ten years. In consequence the deaths actually exceed the births, a circumstance which has occurred for the first time since January, 1889.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, deaths from typhoid fever rose from 2 to 8; those from diarrhœal diseases from 2 to 6; those from premature birth from 1 to 5; those from old age from 1 to 6; those from diseases of the nervous and respiratory systems each from 5 to 12; those from diseases of the digestive system from 15 to 34; those from violence from 3 to 6; and those from debility from 2 to 8. On the other hand, deaths from phthisis fell from 9 to 6.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steam-ship or vessel *Orizaba* arrived in Victorian waters on 27th April having on board a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and doth further direct that no person whatever, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the Board of Public Health, except the passengers for Victoria, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel, and all persons and things on board of her, shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

And the Honorable Henry Roberts Williams, Her Majesty's Minister of Health for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

INTRODUCTION OF HIDES INTO VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890* it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such places and for such period as the Governor in Council so appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meats, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of an animal, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever: And it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act: And that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct, and that such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows (that is to say):-

1. *Introduction of unsalted hides forbidden.*—The introduction into Victoria from Western Australia of unsalted hides of cattle is hereby prohibited.

2. *Introduction of salted hides.*—Before any hides are landed at any place within Victoria from any vessel the master of such vessel shall produce to the Chief Inspector of Stock a certificate from an inspector of stock at the port of shipment verifying that such hides have been thoroughly and effectively salted:

3. *Breaches of Order.*—No person shall do or attempt to do, or omit from doing, or cause or omit to be done or attempted to be done, or assist in doing or attempt to do any act directed or forbidden by this Order, or obtain or endeavour to obtain or assist any one in obtaining or endeavouring to obtain by fraud any authority under this Order, or forge any such authority, or make use of any such forged or fraudulently obtained authority, or fraudulently grant or issue any such authority, or obstruct or refuse to carry out the directions of any inspector or any person acting under the authority of this Order.

4. *Penalties.*—All persons offending against this Order shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50).

This Order shall take effect from on and after the 1st May, 1898.

SHIRE OF HEYTESBURY.—LOAN.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Vermin Destruction Acts it is among other things provided that, on the application of the council of any shire, the Governor in Council, out of any trust funds or moneys under the control of the Treasurer of Victoria, may from time to time grant a loan to any such shire for the purpose of enabling such shire to obtain materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing to be supplied to owners of land in special areas constituted under the said Acts: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Heytesbury has received petitions signed by a majority in number of the owners of land in the special area (the petitioners owning more than one-half of the land in such area) describing the special area for which the petitioners desire a loan to be obtained by the shire, which petitions contain statements of the acreage of the whole of such special area and of the acreage owned by each and every owner of every part thereof, with a short description of the land owned by each petitioner, and of the acreage thereof, and gives an estimate of the probable cost of the whole of the materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing required for the land in such area, and asks that the said shire council will apply to the Governor in Council for a loan an amount sufficient to purchase materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing not exceeding four lineal miles of fencing to every owner, and gives an estimate of the materials required for each petitioner's land, and the probable cost of such material, and an estimate of the extent of fencing to be erected by each owner [and states that in such special area adjoining properties could advantageously be enclosed by one

continuous wire-netting fence, and states in each case the estimated cost of such continuous fence and the proportions thereof to be borne by every owner of property to be enclosed by such fence] and states that each petitioner signing the petitions undertakes to pay to the council in each and every year one-tenth part of his proportion of the value of all materials for wire-netting fencing which the council may obtain by means of the loan proposed to be obtained from the Governor in Council, with interest in the meantime at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum on the amount of the value of such materials or on the value of so much thereof as is unpaid for, and that such undertaking as between each petitioner, or the owner for the time being of the land of such petitioner, or any part thereof, and the said shire council is to be deemed to be and may be enforced as a specialty contract, and states that each petitioner undertakes to erect on his land, with the materials with which he may be furnished, wire-netting fencing to the satisfaction of the said council, or that he will join with other owners in erecting all necessary fencing: And whereas every signature to such petitions is verified by the solemn declaration of a person signing such petitions, which declaration is in the form or to the effect in the Eighth Schedule to the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890*.

And whereas the said shire council has considered the prayer of such petitions and has determined to apply for a loan from the Governor in Council in accordance therewith, and has transmitted to the Minister the said petitions, accompanied by an application, under seal on behalf of the said shire, for a loan of £719 in the terms therein stated, which said application contains an undertaking by the said shire to repay such loan in accordance with the provisions of the said-recited Acts and of any Order in Council granting such loan: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the sum of £719, being the whole of the amount applied for by the said shire council in the application hereinbefore referred to, be granted out of any trust funds or money under the control of the Treasurer of Victoria, available by virtue of the provisions of the *Vermin-proof Fences Advances Act 1890*, as a loan to the said shire of Heytesbury for the purposes of the said *Vermin Destruction Acts*.

That the said sum of £719 be paid to the council in one instalment of £719.

That the said sum of £719 be a loan for the benefit of the whole land described in the petitions.

That the said sum of £719 be a loan for the benefit of the land specified in the Schedule hereunder.

That the proportion of the said sum of £719 to be paid by each and every owner of land within the special area to the said shire council is that set out in the Schedule hereunder.

That the said sum of £719 be repaid by the council of the said shire to the Treasurer of Victoria for the time being within ten years, by annual instalments of not less than £71 18s. each. The first of such payments to be made on or before the 31st day of May, 1898, and a further instalment of not less than £71 18s. on or before the 31st day of May in each and every succeeding year until the whole sum of £719 is repaid.

That in the month of May in each and every year until the whole amount of the loan be repaid the council pay to the Treasurer of Victoria on such loan, or on so much thereof as is unpaid, interest at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum.
