Audit Act 1890.

ALTERATION OF GENERAL REGULATIONS
RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.*

THE Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 of the *Audit Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1064), by an Order made on the 17th day of May, 1898, made the following alterations in the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts, viz.:—

Clause 35(a).—In that portion of clause 35(a), providing for the indorsement of a certificate on an order for payment of a pension to an agent, the words "except in the case of Police Pensions" are repealed.

Clause 55.—To clause 55 the words "except in the case of Police Pensions which shall be prepared upon the Form L7 annexed" are added.

Post Office Acts.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE TRANSMISSION
OF TELEGRAMS BY TELEPHONE.

THE Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order dated the 17th day of May, 1898, made the following Regulations governing the transmission of telegrams by telephone, to have effect from the 1st day of July, 1898, viz.:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Subscribers to Telephone Exchanges in Victoria, herein after termed "Subscribers," may transmit to any Telegraph Office which may be connected with any Telephone Exchange messages intended to be further transmitted from the Telegraph Office to the respective destinations of such messages as telegrams; provided they pay the usual cost of such telegrams in addition to the rates for transmission through the telephone.

2. Subscribers may also, at their option, have telegrams addressed to them forwarded by telephone from the Telegraph Office of destination to their telephonic address; provided such Telegraph Office is connected with a Telephone Exchange; and copies of such telegrams will at the same time be posted for delivery to their address, stamped on the face "Transmitted by Telephone."

3. The charges for transmitting telegrams through the telephone will be as follow:—

For the first Twenty words or under ... 3d.
For each additional Ten words or under (address and signature free) ... 1d.

Where telegrams are required to be transmitted over trunk lines for the use of which special fees are chargeable, these fees must be paid in addition to the above charges.

4. Subscribers may transmit messages through the telephone for delivery within a radius of one mile from the Telegraph Office connected with the Telephone Exchange; the fee for these messages, which are known as telephonograms, being Sixpence for the first ten words, and One penny for every additional ten words (address and signature free).
Telephonograms will not, however, be transmitted over trunk lines.

5. All fees payable by subscribers for services rendered under these Regulations must be paid by Melbourne and Suburban subscribers at the General Post Office, and by country subscribers at the local Exchange within one month, otherwise the amount due by a subscriber will be debited against his telephone rent, and the term of his rental shall be reduced accordingly.

6. Any person not being a subscriber, on payment of the fees herein mentioned in addition to the Bureau fee, may transmit from a Public Telephone Bureau telephonograms or telegrams to be transmitted over any telegraph line.

7. The transcription of telegrams telephoned or telephonograms will, so far as the Post and Telegraph Department is concerned, become the original telegrams or telephonograms (as the case may be), and it must be understood that such transcriptions are not admissible as evidence in law courts, and that the Department will not assume or be subject to any liability by reason or on account of any failure, delay, or mistake in or about the transcription, transmission, receipt, or delivery of any telegram or telephonogram under this system from whatever cause the same may arise.

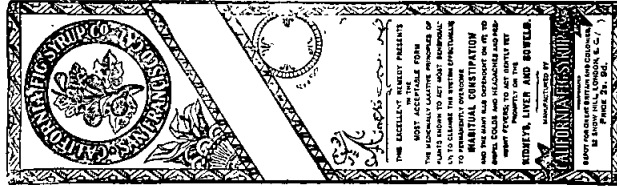

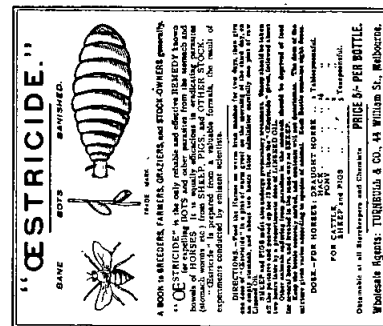

The births of 943 children, viz., 479 boys and 464 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of April. The number was, it will be observed, 37 lower than in April, 1897; and much lower than that recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 320 below the average of the previous ten years, or 326 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 821, viz., 440 of males and 381 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 122, or by only 15 per cent., as against 92 per cent. in 1897 and 87 per cent. according to the average. The deaths were, it will be noticed, 311 in excess of those in the corresponding month of the preceding year, and 294 in excess of the average of the previous four years; they were also 145 above the average of April during the last ten years, or 142 above it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.02 and of deaths registered 21.78 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1897 of 26.43 and 13.75 respectively, and during the last ten years of 33.60 and 17.76 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 33.56 and 17.77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 85.9° on the 1st, and the lowest was 41.2° on the 21st. The mean temperature of the month (58.2°) was 1.5° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (38.4°) took place on the 1st, and the least range (8.0°) on the 15th. The mean daily range was 17.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.412 inches on the 11th, and the lowest was 29.404 inches on the 3rd. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.019 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on twelve days, the amount being 1.68 inches, which was 1.04 inches higher than in April, 1897, but was lower than in any other of the corresponding months in the previous ten years, with two exceptions, and about three-fourths of an inch below the average.

Fog occurred on one day during the month.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 40 per cent. to that mortality, as against 31 per cent. in April, 1897; 32 per cent. in April, 1896; 31 per cent. in April, 1895; 34 per cent. in April, 1894; 41 per cent. in April, 1893; and 38 per cent. in April, 1892. More than half—53 per cent.—of the increase in the total mortality in April, 1898, as compared with April, 1897, was confined to children under five years.

Sixty-five persons whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years, as compared with only 33 in April, 1897. Of the former, a packer, aged 75, died of rheumatism; two females, each aged 75, of cancer; a store-keeper and two females, each aged 75, of apoplexy; a farmer, aged 75, of syncope; a gentleman and a female, each aged 76, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 76, of valvular disease of the heart; a gentleman, aged 76, of heart disease; a clergyman, aged 76, of cystitis; a servant (female), aged 77, of dysentery; two females, each aged 77, of apoplexy; a female, aged 77, of gastro-enteric catarrh; a gentleman, aged 78, of diarrhoea; two females, each aged 78, of rheumatism and apoplexy respectively; two females,

each aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; a housekeeper, aged 78, of syncope; a male, of no occupation, aged 78, of pneumonia; a grocer, aged 78, of liver disease; a female, aged 78, of Bright's disease; an accountant, aged 78, of extravasation of blood on the brain, the result of a fall; a female, aged 79, of paralysis; a gentleman and a female, each aged 79, of valvular disease of the heart; a gentleman, aged 79, of heart disease; a female, aged 79, of disease of the liver; a pensioner, aged 79, of cystitis; a gardener, aged 80, of dysentery; a female, aged 80, of softening of the brain; a clothing manufacturer, aged 80, of spinal disease; three females, each aged 80, of bronchitis, Bright's disease, and uræmia respectively; a male, of no occupation, aged 81, of burns; a clergyman, aged 83, of syncope; two females, each aged 83, of pneumonia and enteritis respectively; a female, aged 84, of Bright's disease; another, aged 87, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 87, of hepatitis; a labourer, aged 88, cut his throat; a soldier, aged 91, died of paralysis; a female, aged 91, of emphysema; another, aged 92, of heart disease; an estate agent, a farrier, and a labourer, each aged 77, two farmers, each aged 78, a labourer, aged 79, a gardener and a female, each aged 80, a gentleman and a dealer, each aged 81, three females, each aged 82, a female, aged 86, a merchant, aged 87, and a female, aged 97, of old age.

Twenty-five of the deaths recorded during the month were from external causes, of which 19 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—An accountant, aged 47, was passed over by a tram-car; a boy, aged 4, by a lorry; a labourer, aged 63, by a cart; a jockey, aged 24, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a horse; a cab proprietor, aged 51, of laceration of the brain, caused by the kick of a horse; a labourer, aged 38, was killed by being struck by a piece of rock in a sewer; a female, aged 49, died of injuries consequent on a fall down stairs; a female, aged 62, of fracture of the thigh; and an accountant, aged 78, of extravasation of blood on the brain, the result of falls; a clerk, aged 17, of gun-hot wounds; a butcher, aged 43, of traumatic tetanus; two females, aged 48 and 54 respectively, a groom, aged 64, and a male, of no occupation, aged 81, of burns; a lighterman, aged 39, and a builder, aged 65, were accidentally drowned through falling into the River Yarra; a driver, aged 35, was "found drowned" in the Merri Creek; and a female infant, aged 3 weeks, was overlain. The homicidal death was that of a new-born female infant, who was strangled, a verdict of wilful murder being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 37, and a labourer, aged 88, who cut their throats; a male, of no occupation, aged 59, who drowned himself; and a cyclist trainer, aged 29, and his wife, aged 28, who suffocated themselves with charcoal fumes.

One hundred and fifty-one deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 64 in the Melbourne, 15 in the Alfred, 2 in St. Vincent's, 7 in the Women's, 11 in the Children's, 1 in the Homœopathic, and 5 in the Austin Hospitals; 12 in the Metropolitan and 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 3 in the Protestant Refuge, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 4 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 324, of which 183, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 141, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 161 were under one year of age, 91 were between one and two, 34 were between two and three, 17 were between three and four, and 18 were between four and five. As compared with the corresponding month of 1897, there was an increase of 165 in the deaths of children under five, 56 in those under one year, 67 in those between one and two, and 42 between two and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 497. Of these, 257, or 52 per cent., were males, and 240, or 48 per cent., were females; 45 were between five and ten, 17 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 28 were between twenty and twenty-five, 30 were between twenty-five and thirty, 38 were between thirty and thirty-five, 35 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 30 were between fifty-five and sixty, 42 were between sixty and sixty-five, 33 were between sixty-five and seventy, 47 were between seventy and seventy-five, 38 were between seventy-five and eighty, 18 were between eighty and eighty-five, 5 were between eighty-five and ninety, 3 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-seven. As compared with the month of April, 1897, the deaths of persons between five and ten increased by 27, those between ten and fifteen by 10, those between fifteen and sixty by 47, and those aged sixty and upwards by 62.

As compared with the corresponding month of 1897, deaths from zymotic diseases increased by 140, from local diseases by 112, from constitutional diseases by 47, from parasitic diseases by 3, from dietetic diseases by 1, from developmental diseases by 9, and from ill-defined causes by 7; but those from violence fell off by 8. The increased mortality under zymotic diseases was caused by measles, the deaths from which rose from nil to 99, diphtheria from 13 to 18, typhoid fever from 15 to 36, diarrhoeal diseases from 12 to 28. Of the increase under local diseases, 36 took place under the head of diseases of the nervous system, 15 under that of the circulatory system, 10 under that of the respiratory system, 52 under that of the digestive system (chiefly enteritis), and 6 under diseases of parturition. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer rose from 22 to 36, and from phthisis from 53 to 76; whilst under the developmental class deaths from premature births rose from 14 to 23. Since its outbreak in December, the measles epidemic has already caused 220 deaths.

Epidemics of measles recur at intervals of usually four or five years, and the disease is apparently not confined to any particular season of the year. The following are particulars of the leading outbreaks during the last 25 years:—
