



## WYCHEPROOF WATERWORKS TRUST,—REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, do make the following Regulations:—

#### No. 1.

Regulation for determining rates to be paid for supply of water for domestic and other use, for preventing waste of water, and for other purposes in connexion with water supply for the Urban District situated within the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust District, and which Urban District was proclaimed and defined on the 29th April, 1898.

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables or troughs, or a supply for steam boilers, or for any manufacturing purpose, or

for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing the house-walls, or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter. Siphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

2. The charges for water supplied by measure for other than domestic use, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

(a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000

(a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000

(a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
(b) Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
(c) Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
(d) Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 23,000 gallons.
(e) Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding an acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.
(f) And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.
(g) In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for above purposes each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case (except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust) where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic use shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure. For all water used in excess of such minimum quantity, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by meter for manufacturing or other purposes otherwise than provided in clauses 2 and 3 hereof, shall be 15,000 gallons per half-year.

5. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, or by meter or measure, shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed

6. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, and who shall not be rated or liable to be rated for water in respect of property situated within the Urban District, who shall take or carry away water from any private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, allow persons not residing within the Urban District to have water from any public service-pipe in the Urban District at the rate of One shilling and sixpence for each tank of 400 gallons or for any less quantity.

9. The Trust may direct that a meter or meters be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary; such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

10. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and no such pipe shall exceed in any case that known as a \( \frac{1}{2}\) in, pipe: and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

11. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

11. The Trust may contract with any service-pipe or branch'servi

16. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

17. Any person whether licensed or not who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust without giving two days notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

18. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main, being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and, if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WINIAM PUBLIC CEMETERY. IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cometeries Act 1850, the Trustees of the Winiam Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. ISM, the Trustees of the Winiam Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. Those Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

3. The name, age, late place of residence, and cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the interment.

5. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to two of the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges, except the cost of digging the grave.

6. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying.

7. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the directions of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

S. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or

cemented, or covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

9. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every monument which shall appear to them inappopriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

10. A plan of the cemetery and registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.

11. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

12. No grave to be of less depth than 6 feet for the body of an adult, 4ft. 6in. for the body of a child under twelve years, and 4 feet for still-born.

13. The charge for digging grave to include filling up.

14. Family vaults to be limited to 10 feet frontage by a depth of 10 feet.

15. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undis-turbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same

grave.

16. No re interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.


