"An Act to authorize the Borough of Flemington and Kensington to construct certain permanent Works and Undertakings in lieu of certain other permanent Works and Undertakings."

"An Act to enable Municipalities to sell Deposit Receipts Stocks and Shares."

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of one million three hundred and six thousand eight hundred and ninety-four pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight and ninety-nine."

Under and by virtue of the provisions of Articles 4 and 6 of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893—

I, the Right Honorable Joseph Chamberlain, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, do hereby direct that jurisdiction under the said Order in Council shall be exercisable in relation to the British Settlement known as Pitcairn Island, situated in the Pacific Ocean, in longitude 130° 6' W., and in latitude 25° 3' S.

## Post Office Acts.

## TRANSMISSION OF TELEGRAMS BY TELEPHONE.

THE Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 7th day of July, 1898, cancelled the Regulations governing the transmission of Telegrams by Telephone, made by Order of the 17th May, 1898, and has made the following Regulations in lieu thereof, viz.:

## REGULATIONS.

1. Subscribers to Telephone Exchanges in Victoria, hereinafter termed "Subscribers," may transmit to any telegraph office which may be connected with any telephone exchange messages intended to be further transmitted from the telegraph office to the respective destinations of such messages as telegrams, provided they pay the usual cost of such telegrams in addition to the rates for transmission through the telephone.

2. Subscribers may also, at their option, have telegrams addressed to them forwarded by telephone from the telegraph office of destination to their telephonic address, provided such telegraph office is connected with a telephone exchange, and copies of such telegrams will, at the same time, be posted for delivery to their address, stamped on the face "Transmitted by telephone."

3. Subscribers may elect to pay either an annual fee of Five guineas (£5 ss.) for the transmission of telegrams by telephone, or they may pay for each individual telegram transmitted.

The charges for transmitting telegrams through the telephone (when the annual fee of Five guineas has not been paid) will be as follow:—

For the first 20 words or under	...	3d.
For each additional 10 words or under	...	1d.

(Address and signature free.)

Where telegrams are required to be transmitted over trunk lines for the use of which special fees are chargeable, these fees must be paid in addition to the above charges or the annual fee.

4. Subscribers may transmit messages through the telephone for delivery within a radius of one mile from the telegraph office connected with the telephone exchange, the fee for these messages, which are known as "telephonograms," being Sixpence for first ten words, and One penny for every additional ten words (address and signature free) in addition to the before-mentioned charges or the annual fee.

Telephonograms will not, however, be transmitted over trunk lines.

5. All fees payable by subscribers for services rendered under these Regulations must be paid by Melbourne and Suburban

subscribers at the General Post Office, and by Country subscribers at the local Exchange, within one month, otherwise the amount due by a subscriber will be debited against his telephone rent, and the term of his rental shall be reduced accordingly.

6. The transcription of telegrams telephoned or telephonograms will, so far as this Department is concerned, become the original telegrams or telephonograms as the case may be, and it must be understood that such transcriptions are not admissible as evidence in Law Courts, and that the Department will not assume, or be subject to, any liability by reason or on account of any failure, delay, or mistake in or about the transcription, transmission, receipt, or delivery of any telegram or telephonogram under this system, from whatever cause the same may arise.

1st. That By-law No. 3, so far as it relates to the amount of registration fee to be paid by purveyors of milk, cow-keepers, and dairymen, is hereby repealed.

2nd. That the annual registration fee shall be—

(a) For each purveyor of milk, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

(b) For each cow-keeper, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

(c) For each dairyman, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

3rd. That such registration shall be made, and fee as above provided shall be paid at the office of the Council to the secretary thereof during the first week in August in each year.

4th. That this by-law shall come into operation after confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication once in the *Government Gazette*.

5th. That this by-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Portland.

## BY-LAW No. 1.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of South Barwon, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 1.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of South Barwon, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, hereby orders and directs:—

1. All former By-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law, shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the council.

3. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the 1st day of March in every year, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the council an application in the form hereunder written; and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence:—

4. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the shire secretary shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

5. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures, in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

6. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean; and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed as may be in any such order so directed.

7. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

8. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous or infectious disease, the occupier of any house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or the officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor if the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

9. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

10. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yard in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

11. In the interpretation of this By-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

12. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law or any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings; or, in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

## TOWN OF GEELONG.

## BY-LAW No. 67.

(Being number 6, made under the provisions of the *Health Acts*.)

A By-law to prescribe the position and manner of construction of privies, earth-closets, and urinals in the Town of Geelong, made by the Council of the Town of Geelong, in pursuance of power given by the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Town of Geelong, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors, and Burgesses thereof, hereby order and enact that from and after the date of this by-law coming into operation—

1. All privies, earth-closets, and urinals in the said town shall be constructed of stone, brick, iron, or wood, and in such manner as may be approved of by the said council.

2. No privy, earth-closet, or urinal to be hereafter constructed shall be placed within 3 feet of any street, lane, or thoroughfare of a greater width than 12 feet, unless the walls thereof be constructed of brickwork of not less than nine (9) inches in thickness.

3. No privy or earth-closet, except such as abut upon a street, lane, or thoroughfare of 12 feet or less in width, shall have a trap-door or opening on the said street, lane, or thoroughfare.

4. Access, for removal of pans or for cleansing by nightmen and others, to all privies, earth-closets, and urinals, which are now or may be constructed upon premises abutting upon any street, lane, or thoroughfare exceeding 12 feet in width, must be obtained from the premises on which such privies, earth-closets, or urinals are placed. Provided, however, that this by-law shall, as to existing privies, earth-closets, and urinals which are in a perfect sanitary condition, apply only where there are any premises abutting upon any such street, lane, or thoroughfare used as dwelling-houses, and access to the front of which dwelling-houses is obtained from such street, lane, or thoroughfare.

5. As to any existing privy, earth-closet, or urinal only such as, in the opinion of the Town Inspector, are in a perfectly sanitary condition shall be allowed to remain for more than three months abutting upon any street, lane, or thoroughfare of more than 12 feet in width.

6. All owners and occupiers of premises are required to see to the performance and observance of the above provisions.

7. This by-law shall not apply to the following area, except as to privies, closets, and urinals to be hereafter constructed and to such as within the said area are, in the opinion of the Town Inspector, in an insanitary condition, that is to say:—

All that portion of the Town of Geelong bounded on the east by the western side of Yarra-street, on the south by the north side of Myers-street, on the west by the east side of Gheringhap-street, and on the north by Corio Bay.

**SHIRE OF GRENVILLE.**  
By-LAW No. 8.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Grenville, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Grenville, do hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in allotments 117, 118, 119, 120, and 122, Parish of Comeraghip, in said shire, known as Pitfield Plains Diggings.
2. Every closet shall be forthwith furnished with a double-pan service.
3. The pans for such service shall be supplied by the council, and every occupier shall permit such pans to be placed in every such closet where directed by the Inspector of Nuisances for the Shire of Grenville.
4. At least once a week, or as much more frequently as the council may direct, the pan in use in every closet shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed in the day-time in a suitable cart, and a pan cleansed by superheated steam, or some equally efficient means approved by the council, left in its place.
5. The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such double-pan service as specified in the by-law, and for pans supplied, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.
6. The occupier of any tenement within allotments 117, 118, 119, 120, and 122, Parish of Comeraghip, Shire of Grenville, shall daily place or cause to be placed in each pan in use at such tenement a quantity of suitable disinfectant and deodorant sufficient to effectually deodorize and disinfect such pan and the contents thereof.
7. No person, unless authorized in writing by the Council of the Shire of Grenville, shall remove any night-soil pan or the contents thereof, and no person shall remove any such pan or the contents thereof except between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of such working day.
8. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this by-law No. 8 shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, and if such breach be a continuing act or default shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part F. of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* (57 Vict. No. 1311) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for the purposes of "village community allotments" any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1890*, and may at any time revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby order as follows, viz.:—

**YARRAGON AND WARRAGUL.**—The Proclamation bearing date the 11th December, 1894, by which certain lands situate in the township of Yarragon and parish of Warragul, and comprising an area of five hundred and eighty-five acres, more or less, were, amongst others, set apart and appropriated for the purposes of village community allotments, is hereby revoked so far only as it relates to the portion of the said lands hereinafter described, viz.:—Nine acres two rods ten perches, county of Buln Buln, township of Yarragon, being allotment 8 of section 15A.—(98.V.10932.)

No. 1106, Part I.) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes specified in Part I. of the said Act, and generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Part: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say):—

**REGULATIONS UNDER PART I. OF THE LAND ACT 1890.**

REGULATIONS DATED 3RD JULY, 1893.

*Chapter V.—Method of making Application for Leases and Licences under Sections 32, 42, 65, 67, 97, and 99, Land Acts 1890-91, and Section 22, Land Act 1891.*

Regulation 5 is hereby rescinded.

Regulation 4 is hereby rescinded, and the following Regulation is made in lieu thereof:—

The applicant shall, before lodging his application, pay to the nearest Receiver and Paymaster the sum of One pound (£1) for a certificate of registration, which must accompany the application. Should the granting of such application not be recommended by a Local Land Board, the unsuccessful applicant shall be entitled to a refund of Seventeen shillings and sixpence (17s. 6d.) out of the fee paid. But an applicant for a licence under section 42, out of a grazing area leasehold, or under sections 67 and 99, or for a lease under section 97, shall not be required to lodge a certificate of registration with such application.

*Chapter IX.—Of Sales by Auction and Crown Grants.*

The fee for a certificate giving the date of sale of any Crown lands shall be Ten shillings and sixpence (10s. 6d.)

*Schedule 70.*

The fee for a licence for a slaughter-yard site may be fixed by the Minister at an amount not less than Five pounds (£5) per annum, nor more than Ten pounds (£10) per annum, payable quarterly in advance.

And the Honorable Robert Wallace Best, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The Regulation made on the 27th July, 1896, prescribing the fee to be paid for the registration of an application for a mallee block, a mallee allotment, or an agricultural allotment, and permitting an unsuccessful applicant to lodge within twelve months from the date of the application further applications, at a reduced fee of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for each application, is hereby rescinded, and the following Regulation is made in lieu thereof:—

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with an approved surety for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at ...", as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large forest timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet.

3. The orders for wood will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor for wood will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in cutting or supplying the firewood tendered for in this schedule are not to exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 6s. a day; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

##### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The contractor to perform the work in a clean and workmanlike manner, and during the proper hours allowable for such work by the lawful authorities and by the Department within whose premises the work is to be carried on; and, in the case of Queenscliff, in accordance with special specifications.

2. The contractor to thoroughly clean out the earth-closets, cesspits, and dust-bins, and to remove the soil and dust from the premises. All such soil and dust to be the property of the contractor.

3. The contractor to leave the seats, floors, yards, &c., perfectly clean at the completion of the work, and to throw a sufficient quantity of chloride of lime or other approved deodorizer into the various pans and cesspits every time they are cleaned out, for deodorizing the same.

4. The contractor shall perform the work with the least possible delay. Should any of the premises be damaged by the contractor or his workmen, the same must be made good at the expense of the contractor.

5. In the event of the contractor neglecting to perform the service when required, the Department concerned may, on giving the contractor 24 hours' notice in writing, proceed to have the service performed, and the extra expense, if any, will be deducted from any moneys due to the contractor.

6. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

7. Accounts to be rendered to the Department concerned immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.

8. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, but should the Local Municipality during the period for which the contract is made decide to perform such sanitary work, the Tender Board may determine such contract by giving one month's notice in writing to the contractor.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the work tendered for in this schedule are not to exceed forty-eight per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 6s. per day; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. #### SHIRE OF CASTLE DONNINGTON.

##### By-Law No. 8.

A By-law of the Shire of Castle Donnington, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 8, for regulating the proceedings of the council at their meetings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President and Councillors of the Shire of Castle Donnington order as follows:—

That By-law No. 2 be repealed, and that

1. The meetings of the council shall be held at the office of the council in McCullum-street, Swan Hill, at Ten a.m., on the third Wednesday in every month.

2. The secretary shall attend at the office of the council every Monday between the hours of Ten a.m. and Four p.m., except on general holidays or when he is engaged on the business of the council, or when he has obtained leave of absence from the president or chairman.

3. At every ordinary meeting of the council proceedings shall commence (in the absence of the president) by electing a chairman, and on the chair being taken, the minutes of the preceding meeting and any subsequent entries in the minute-book shall be read and put for confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted on the minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. After the confirmation of the minutes the order of business shall be as follows:—

i. Considering how far the orders and instructions given to the secretary and officers at the last meeting have been carried out, and reading copies of the letters issued in relation thereto if demanded by a majority of the councillors present.

ii. Reading correspondence and considering and ordering thereon.

iii. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.

iv. Receiving and reading petitions and memorials and ordering thereon.

v. Orders of the day.

vi. Motions of which previous notice has been duly given.

vii. Examination and passing of accounts for payment.

viii. Notices of motion for consideration at future meetings.

5. Whenever a division is demanded by any councillor the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result shall be declared by the president or chairman, and be recorded in the minutes.

6. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the president and the secretary of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

7. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council must be in writing and presented by a councillor, and on its presentation no debate shall take place thereon except as to its being received, but it shall be taken into consideration at such time as the council may direct.

8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president or chairman may think fit to bring under consideration.

9. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council.

10. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the president's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

11. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

12. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

13. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but upon any amendment being carried the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall take the place of the original motion.

14. Every councillor present shall vote unless he be disabled by law from so doing, and no councillor, after he shall have entered an appearance at any meeting, shall quit the council chamber without leave of the president or chairman for the time being until the adjournment or termination of the meeting.

15. Every councillor upon proposing a motion or amendment or discussing any matter must rise and address the president or chairman, and he shall not be interrupted unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down until the question shall have been decided. The subject may then be resumed or other business entered upon.

16. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the president or chairman shall decide which of them is entitled to pre-audience.

17. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the last proposed amendment, and the president or chairman shall without waiting for the interposition of the council call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment. After the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

18. Any councillor moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

19. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute improper motives, and all personal reflections shall be considered disorderly, and any councillor making use of any expression to any other councillor shall, if required by the president or chairman, withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the council.

20. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a councillor immediately on the same being used.

21. The councillors shall at meetings of the council designate each other by their official titles, viz., president, chairman, or councillor.

22. The president or chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

23. The president or chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

24. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order by the president or chairman, or to withdraw any offensive expression when required so to do, shall for each such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding £5.

25. Any person not being a councillor who, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, is guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who does not leave when lawfully requested by the president or chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

26. Any councillor not attending in compliance with a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor may at right require the production of any documents of the council relating to the question or matter in discussion.

28. The mover of any original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

29. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

30. Any councillor may enter his protest against any resolution of the council, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the council. Notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest signed by the councillor or councillors protesting, and specifying the reason for protesting must, before the next meeting of the council, be entered by the protesting councillor in such part of the minute-book as is set apart for that purpose, and such entry shall be duly referred to in the minutes of the council and shall be considered as part of such minutes.

31. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted at the next ordinary meeting of the council.

32. No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the municipality, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

33. If any person be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this by-law he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £5.

34. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this by-law may be suspended for a special purpose by a unanimous vote of the council.

35. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

# By-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the Shire of Castle Donnington, made under section 15 of the *Butchers and Abattoirs Act 1890*, and numbered 9, for determining the sum to be paid for Slaughtering Licences.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Butchers and Abattoirs Act 1890*, the President and Councillors of the Shire of Castle Donnington order as follows:—

A By-law of the Shire of Castle Donnington, made under section 190 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 10, for extending the provisions of the First Part of the *Police Offences Act 1890* to the shire.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the section 190 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President and Councillors of the Shire of Castle Donnington order as follows:—

That By-law No. 3 be repealed, and that the provisions of the First Part of the *Police Offences Act 1890* be extended to the Shire of Castle Donnington.

# By-LAW No. 11.

A By-law of the Shire of Castle Donnington, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 11, for regulating the porticoes and projections, drains from houses, and crossings over footways and channels in the township of Swan Hill, in the shire of Castle Donnington.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President and Councillors of the Shire of Castle Donnington order as follows:—

That By-law No. 4 be repealed, and that  
PORTICOES, PROJECTIONS, ETC.

1. The word "portico" shall mean and include every awning, portico, porch, verandah, shed, shade, or covering on or across any public footway for the purpose of shade or shelter, together with the supports, other than the building against which it shall be, of such portico.

2. Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, it shall be lawful for the owner of any house or building abutting upon any public footway to erect or place against or in the front of such building, and upon or across such footway, such portico as such owner shall see fit.

3. Every such portico shall be supported by upright pillars or supports fixed on the outer line or kerb of the footway, and shall be in every part thereof of such height from the ground not less than 7 feet, and with the pillars or supports thereof shall be of such shape, figure, dimensions, and materials respectively as shall have been appointed as herein provided.

4. It shall be lawful for the council, from time to time, to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For regulating the height from the ground of such porticoes as aforesaid.

For appointing the shape, figure, dimensions, and materials of such porticoes.

And there shall be deposited at the office of the council a plan and specification of such portico as shall be appointed in any such regulation, and such plan and specification shall be referred to in such regulation, and shall be open for inspection by any ratepayer or person interested at all reasonable times without fee or reward.

5. If before the coming into operation of this subdivision any portico shall have been erected or placed against or in front of any building, and upon or across any public footway, contrary to some by-law lawfully in force in that behalf, or if after such coming into operation any portico shall have been erected or placed against or in front of any building and upon and across any public footway otherwise than as shall have been appointed by some regulation to be made hereunder, or if any projecting window, balcony, step, cellar, cellar-door, or window, or steps leading into any cellar or otherwise, lamp, lamp-post, lamp-iron, sign, sign-post, sign-iron, show-board, window-shutter, wall, gate, fence, or opening, or any other projection or obstruction placed or made against or in front of any building after the coming into operation of this subdivision therein, shall be an annoyance in consequence of the same projecting into or being made in or upon or endangering or rendering less commodious the passage along any footway or street, it shall be lawful for the council to give notice to the owner or occupier of such building to remove or to alter so as to conform to such regulation such portico, or to remove or in such manner as the council shall by such notice require to alter such projection or obstruction, and such owner or occupier shall, within fourteen days after the

service of such notice upon him, remove or in manner aforesaid respectively alter such portico or such projection or obstruction as aforesaid respectively; and if the owner or occupier of any such building neglect or refuse for fourteen days after such notice so served to remove such portico or such projection or obstruction, or to alter the same in manner aforesaid respectively, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which such projection or obstruction continues after the expiration of fourteen days from the time when he may be convicted of any such offence contrary to the provisions of this section.

6. If before the coming into operation of this subdivision any portico shall have been erected or placed without violation of any by-law for the time being lawfully in force, against or in front of any building, and upon or across any public footway laid out as such hereunder or otherwise, and such portico shall not be in conformity with some regulation for the time being in force hereunder, or if any such projection or obstruction as in the last preceding section mentioned, which has been placed or made against or in front of any building before such coming into operation as aforesaid, shall be an annoyance as in the said section mentioned, it shall be lawful for the council to cause such portico to be removed or altered so as to conform to such regulation, or (as the case may be) such projection or obstruction to be removed or altered as they see fit: Provided that the council shall give notice of every such intended removal or alteration to the owner or occupier against or in front of whose building such portico, projection, or obstruction may be seven days before such removal or alteration shall be commenced, and shall make reasonable compensation, to be ascertained and ordered, if the parties differ, by two justices, to every person who shall incur any loss or damage by such removal or alteration, except in cases where the portico, projection, or obstruction shall have been erected, placed, or made without lawful right, or may be removable under some other Act or law, in which case no compensation shall be made.

7. Every owner or occupier of any building against or in front of which there shall be any portico shall keep the same clean and in good repair; and it shall be lawful for the council to give notice to any such owner or occupier to clean or repair such portico if and as the same shall require; and every owner or occupier who shall neglect or refuse, within seven days after the service of such notice, to effect such cleaning and repair shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which he shall fail to effect the same.

#### DRAINS FROM HOUSES.

8. The owner or occupier of every house or building in, adjoining, or near to any street or road, within seven days next after service of a notice by the council for that purpose, shall construct or lay from the frontage line of the allotment on which such house or building is situated to the water-channel, a gutter, herein called channel, at the outer edge of the footway, and through, under, and transversely to the footway, such covered drain or trunk for carrying such water to such channel as shall be authorized or directed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall thereafter keep in good condition every such drain and trunk, and every such drain or trunk shall be constructed, laid, and repaired subject to the inspection of such officer as the council shall have appointed in that behalf; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid, or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day that he shall so make default.

9. Every owner or occupier of land in, adjoining to, or near any street or road, if such land shall be so situated that surface or storm water from or upon the same overflows or tends naturally, if not otherwise discharged, to overflow any footway of such street or road, shall, within seven days next after the service of notice by the council for that purpose, construct and lay from such point upon such land, being near to the footway, as shall be specified in such notice by plan appended or otherwise, and higher in level than the bottom of the channel at the outer edge of the footway to the said channel, and through, under, and transversely to the footway, and keep in good condition such covered drain or trunk as and subject to the like inspection as in the last preceding section mentioned respectively; and, in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid, or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which he shall make default.

10. It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—For regulating the materials and the size, the level and the fall of any drain or trunk to be laid or constructed under any footway, either absolutely or with relation to the level or fall of the footway or channel or otherwise, in like manner, and so, if they please, that such size be variable within limits prescribed in the regulation, according to the discretion of such officer, as the council shall thereby direct.

#### CROSSINGS OVER FOOTWAYS AND CHANNELS.

11. Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides or drives any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway, or any water channel, or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and by or at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the council such sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

12. If any land shall front to, adjoin, or abut upon the footway of any street or road, and if access with horses and vehicles from such street or road to such land or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto cannot be had without riding, driving, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway or the

channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land shall desire that a crossing for horses and other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel, and shall give a notice in writing of such his desire to the council, and in such notice describe the land in question and the proposed work by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof and with such regulation as may be in force in that behalf, it shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving of such notice, and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction), at his own cost and under the inspection of such officer as the council shall have appointed for the purpose, to make such crossing according to the tenor of such notice and specification and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards in like manner maintain the same.

13. Every such owner who desires as aforesaid that any such crossing shall be made shall, before giving notice to the council as herein provided, deposit with the municipal clerk a specification describing the proposed work with respect to each of the several matters hereby or by any such regulation in force in that behalf required or provided.

14. Unless within the period of seven days after the receipt of any such notice as aforesaid the council shall give notice to the person giving the same that (if the fact be so) such notice or the specification referred to therein and deposited is not in accordance with the provisions of such regulation as aforesaid, such notice and specification shall thereafter, so far only as affects the liability of such person to any penalty, be deemed to be in accordance therewith.

15. In streets or roads in which, at the site of any such proposed crossing, there is a kerb of stone or wood along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing so far as the footway extends shall have on both sides a kerb not higher in any part than the surface of the footway at that part, and similar in all respects to such first-mentioned kerb, and such kerb shall approach to and join the street kerbing in gentle curves outwards, and such crossings shall be of such width, and the surface thereof so far as the footway extends shall have such inclination outwards, and be depressed so far below the footway as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall with respect to the channel be so laid or constructed as not to raise or obstruct the same or any part thereof.

16. In streets or roads in which at the site of any such proposed crossing there is no such kerbing as in the last preceding section mentioned, the crossing over the channel shall be such suitable bridge as shall leave a free passage for the water under the same, and shall be of such materials, form, length, size, strength, and fall as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and the surface of such crossing so far as the footway extends shall be so made good by paving, macadamising, gravelling, or otherwise that the necessary traffic by animals or vehicles over the same shall not cause any damage thereto, but that such crossing shall be as sound and commodious for the passage of persons using the footway as the other portions of such footway adjoining such crossing.

17. No person making any crossing shall be deemed guilty of an offence by reason only of some departure in making such crossing from the notice or specification relating thereto, unless the officer of the Council appointed as hereinbefore provided to inspect the making of the crossing shall have reported, in writing, such departure to the Council within three days after the same shall have occurred, and unless such person, being served by the Council within three days after such report with a notice so to do, shall for the space of seven clear days after such notice have failed to correct or supply such departure.

18. If any crossing shall have been made in any respect contrary to this by-law or any regulation in force hereunder, it shall be lawful for the Council, if they shall see fit, to cause the same to be altered so as to conform thereto and to such regulation respectively, and to recover in manner in the *Local Government Act 1894* provided the expenses of such alteration from the owner of the land to which such crossing shall lead; but they shall not so recover in those cases of departure from the notice or specification which the Council or their officer might respectively have given notice of or reported, but failed to give notice of or report respectively in manner and within the time provided in the preceding sections hereof.

19. If any private street or road shall meet at an angle the footway of any public street or road, and there shall be no crossing upon and across such footway and the channel adjacent thereto from such private street or road, to such public street or road, it shall be lawful for the Council, if they shall see fit, to make in accordance with any regulation in force in that behalf a crossing upon and over such footway and channel of the description hereinbefore provided with respect to other crossings, and to recover from the owner of each of the tenements abutting on such private street or road such portion of the expenses of such making as shall bear to the whole of such expenses the same proportion as the rateable value of such tenement bears to the whole rateable value of all the tenements so abutting.

20. If any crossing across or over any footway or channel to any land or way appurtenant thereto, or to any private street or road, shall have been made before the coming into operation of this subdivision, but shall in any respect not be in accordance with any regulation made hereunder, the Council may, if they shall see fit, cause the same to be altered so as to conform to such regulation; and if such crossing shall have been made contrary to any by-law in force at the time of making the same, the Council may recover the expenses of such alteration in manner in the last two preceding sections mentioned, according as one or the other may be applicable to the case.

21. If any crossing shall be out of repair, and the person liable hereunder to maintain or repair the same shall, for seven days after notice from the Council to that effect, neglect properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing shall remain so unrepaid a sum

of Forty shillings, and the Council may, if they shall see fit, effect such repair and recover the same from such person before any justice.

22. It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—For regulating the width, depression and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels and the materials for making and constructing the same, the mode of laying and bedding such materials, the length, width, size, strength and fall of bridge crossings, and the said inclination and fall, either absolutely or with relation to the levels, inclination or fall of the footway or channel or otherwise in like manner.

#### BY-LAW NO. 12.
