## ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“ An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One hundred and forty-six thousand nine hundred and three pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven and ninety-eight.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this tenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and in the sixty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

## Factories and Shops Acts.

ELECTION OF A MEMBER (BEING A REPRESENTATIVE OF EMPLOYÉS) OF THE SPECIAL BOARD FOR FIXING THE LOWEST RATES OF PAYMENT FOR MANUFACTURING MEN'S AND BOYS' CLOTHING.

UNDER the Regulations made pursuant to the Factories and Shops Acts, the Under-Secretary is the returning officer at elections of Special Boards; and "every candidate as a representative of employés on any Special Board shall be nominated, in writing, by twenty-five electors; and every nomination shall contain the written consent of the candidate to his nomination, and the particular branch of the trade (if any) such candidate has a special knowledge of, and shall be delivered or posted to the returning officer so as to reach him before Four o'clock on the day of nomination."

In the event of the number of persons nominated as representatives of employés exceeding one (the number to be elected), the day for taking the poll (by voting-papers) will be Wednesday, the 24th day of August instant.

NOMINATION OF CANDIDATE AS A REPRESENTATIVE OF EMPLOYÉS OF THE SPECIAL BOARD FOR MEN'S AND BOYS' CLOTHING.

We, the undersigned electors, being employés, hereby nominate *(insert Christian and Surname in full)* *(insert the particular branch of the trade (if any) the candidate has a special knowledge of, e.g., cutter, machinist, &c.)* as a member of the Special Board for fixing the lowest rates of payment for preparing or manufacturing men's and boy's clothing.

There must be twenty-five signatures of employés who are electors.

3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence ten money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

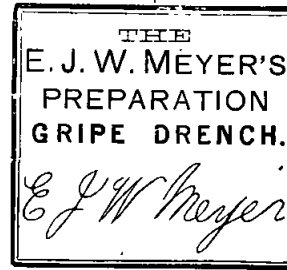

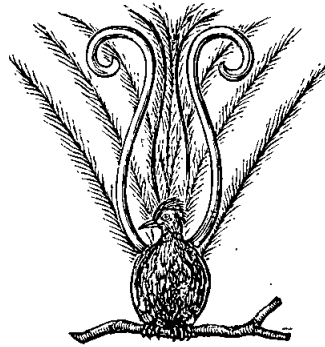

NOTE.—The births registered during the second quarter of 1898 (viz., 7,658) were fewer by 356; but the deaths (viz., 4,781) were more numerous by 1,046, or by more than one-fourth, than the corresponding quarter of the previous year. This exceptionally high mortality, due in a large measure to the prevalence of an epidemic of measles, was exceeded in only one quarter in the last two years, viz., the first quarter of 1898, when 5,390 deaths occurred. Owing to this circumstance, and to the low birth rate, the natural increase (viz., 2,877) was smaller than in the second quarter of 1897 by 1,402, and also much smaller than in any previous quarter for several years, except the first quarter of 1898.

The records of the Immigration Agent indicate a net loss of population by emigration of 2,239 persons, consisting of 953 males and 1,286 females—of whom 1,619, viz., 533 males and 1,086 females, were so-called "adults" (i.e., aged 12 or upwards). This loss was larger than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year by 433. Adding to the recorded loss the usual allowance for unrecorded departures (viz., 2,138), the total net loss by emigration during the quarter is increased to 4,377, consisting of 2,573 males and 1,804 females.

Deducting the natural increase from the estimated net emigration there results a net decrease of population during the quarter of 1,500—viz., 1,331 males and 169 females—as shown in the table, as against an increase of 497 in the corresponding quarter of 1897. An actual decrease of population has occurred in seven previous quarters since the census of 1891; but only once previously did the decrease take place in the second quarter of the year.

The records of migration—taking them for what they are worth—show a balance in favour of immigrants of 227 from New South Wales, 165 from South Australia, 893 from Tasmania, 84 from New Zealand and South Seas, and 311 from Foreign Ports; but a balance in favour of emigrants of 631 to Queensland, 1,617 to Western Australia, 1,644 to the United Kingdom, and 27 to South Africa. As compared with the corresponding quarter of the previous year, the net emigration to Western Australia fell off by 1,230, and that to South Africa by 99; but the emigration to the United Kingdom increased by 423.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with an approved surety for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at \_\_\_\_\_," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood specified under these contracts must be split out of large forest timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. 5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

BY-LAW No. 25.

A By-law of the Municipality of the Borough of Hamilton, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 112, for further regulating traffic in, through, and over the streets of the said borough.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Council of the Borough of Hamilton doth hereby order that—

1. The expression, "machine" wherever used herein shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.

2. Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway, pavement, or causeway made or set apart for the use and accommodation of foot passengers. But this section shall not apply to a machine merely impelled or taken across any footway, pavement, or causeway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to such machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person when driving, riding, or impelling a machine, shall carry a proper bell which shall be capable, at the will of such person, of giving audible and sufficient warning to foot passengers and others of the approach of such machine.

5. Every person riding, driving, or impelling a machine, overtaking or passing any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse, or other beast of burden in charge of any person, or any foot passenger proceeding along or across any street, shall within a reasonable distance from and before overtaking or passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding the bell affixed to such machine give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.

6. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any machine furiously or negligently through or upon any public place or thoroughfare.

7. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, except there be justifiable cause for deviation therefrom.

8. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle, or any horse, or other beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle, horse, or beast of burden, except there be justifiable cause for deviating therefrom.

9. Any person using a machine causing any injury, accident, or collision with any other person, machine, or vehicle, or being concerned therein who shall proceed on his or her way without stopping a reasonable time to see the extent of any injuries caused, and giving, on demand, his or her name and address to the person injured, or to some one on his or her behalf, or to any member of the police force, on demand, at any time, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

10. Any person who shall not observe this by-law, or any clauses hereof, saving the last preceding clause, shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding £2 for each such offence.

BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

REGULATION No. 26.

Regulation made by the Council of the Borough of Hamilton under the provisions of the *Police Offences Act 1890* for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and public places of the Borough of Hamilton, and for preventing any obstruction thereof respectively.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Act of Parliament of Victoria, No. 1126, the Mayor and Councillors of the Borough of Hamilton order as follows:—

1. All persons causing an obstruction by standing or loitering upon any of the carriage-ways, footways, or other public places of the borough shall discontinue to do so immediately on being so required by any member of the police force.

2. All persons walking along the footways shall, on passing each other, keep on their respective right-hand side of the footway.

3. The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such vehicle.

4. The driver of any hackney carriage or omnibus shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street except as near as may be to the left or near side thereof.

5. No driver of any omnibus or hackney carriage shall drive the same so as to immediately and closely precede or follow and intentionally conform to the progress of any other omnibus or hackney carriage in competition against or to the annoyance of any other person.

6. The driver of any vehicle of whatsoever kind it may be, and whether private or public, before stopping the same in any carriage-way for any purpose, shall give notice of his intention so to do, if riding upon such vehicle, by holding up his whip or his hand, so that the same may be seen by the driver of any other vehicle in the rear of his, and upon stopping he shall so place his vehicle as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if the stoppage prevent the passing of any other vehicle, or interrupt or delay traffic, he shall, upon being so required by the driver of any other vehicle, or by any member of the police force, remove his vehicle so as to permit such other vehicle to pass, or so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

7. Between the hours of Seven o'clock in the morning and Six o'clock in the evening of any day, no person shall cause interruption or annoyance to passengers along the public roadways or

footways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such roadway or footway, whether from buildings in process of construction, demolition, or in any other manner.

8. No procession of persons or of vehicles or both for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the streets unless with the previous consent, in writing, of the mayor or, in his absence, the town clerk of the borough, and only by the route specified by such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at least 24 hours' notice with particulars of such consent and route to the officer in charge of the police in the borough.

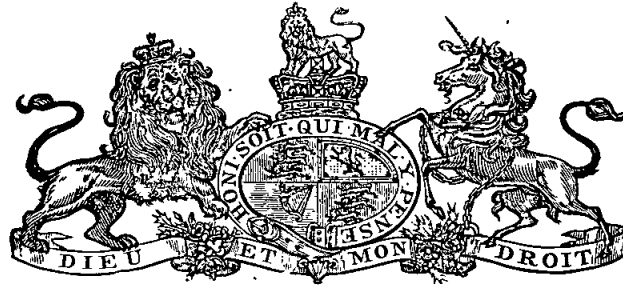
