



THE births of 62 boys and 54 girls, or in all of 116 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of November. Of these, 50 occurred in Ballarat East, 55 in Ballarat Wost, 10 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 12 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 124, viz., 59 of boys and 65 of girls.

The deaths registered in November numbered 98, viz., 55 of males and 43 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 18. The mortality of the district continues high, owing to the epidemic of influenza, which caused 40 deaths (24 males and 16 females), as against 37 in the preceding month, and nil in November, 1898. As regards other causes, there was generally a decrease in the month under review, as compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year. ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1900.

THE Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 8.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust for the year 1900:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty-seven pounds municipal value and under, a rate of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-eight pounds and upwards, a rate of Ninepence in the pound sterling.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. A minimum rate of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds (as the Commissioners may determine) to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate upon the annual municipal value.

5. On every horse trough, a charge of One pound per annum.

6. Water supplied to the Government Departments and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.

7. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st of January, 1900, and 1st July, 1900.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said

rate.

THE Commissioners of the Warrackhabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 122 of the Water Act 1890, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

2. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds per annum, the sum of (£7 10s.) Seven pounds ten shillings per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

- 6. No person shall bring into the park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Grown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
