BANK HALF-HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint

FRIDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

a special day to be observed as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Ballarat and Chiltern.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and in the sixty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.
