## TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

### SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date earlier than the 2nd December, 1898, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the General Electoral Rolls, which will be made up for the Legislative Assembly on the 1st November and for the Legislative Council on the 1st December next.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in April, 1900.

Intending applicants are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law, as a penalty is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

No person whose name is already on the roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization before doing so.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post-offices, and Police Stations.

## SUPPLEMENTARY ELECTORAL LISTS, 1899.—ISSUE OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that Supplementary Lists of Non-paying Electors for the Legislative Assembly will be made up forthwith after the 1st day of May next, and for the Legislative Council forthwith after the 1st day of June next.

## Marriage Act 1853.

NOTICE TO CLERGYMEN AND ALL PERSONS HAVING IN THEIR POSSESSION OR CONTROL ANY REGISTERS OF BAPTISMS, MARRIAGES, OR BURIALS SOLEMNIZED IN THE DISTRICT OF PORT PHILIP OR THE COLONY OF VICTORIA, BEFORE THE 18TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1853.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Marriage Act 1853*, the following section of that Act is published, and the attention of all persons mentioned in the section is directed to the obligation imposed on them by the provisions therein contained.

## Marriage Act 1853.—No. 1582.

## Section 31—

(1) In order that a permanent record may be kept of all public and private baptisms, marriages, and burials solemnized before the 18th day of January, 1853, it is hereby enacted that all persons having in their possession or control any registers or books of entries or register-books of baptisms, marriages, or burials solemnized in the district of Port Phillip or the colony of Victoria before the said date, shall before the expiration of six months after the commencement of this Act forward such registers or books of entries or register-books to the Government Statist, to be kept and retained in the office of the Government Statist. Provided however that any person having in his possession or control any such registers or books of entries or register-books may, instead of so forwarding the same, forward to the Government Statist a copy thereof, verified by the statutory declaration of such person as being a true and correct copy thereof, and such copy shall be deemed and taken to be *prima facie* evidence of all entries contained in any such registers or books of entries or register-books. (On payment of a fee of Five shillings the person having possession of any such registers or books of entries or register-books shall at all reasonable times permit any other person to inspect any entry therein, and shall, if so requested, supply such other person with a certified copy of such entry.)

(2) Every person who is guilty of a contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and, on conviction thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each baptism, marriage, or burial, the register or book of entry or register-book of which, or a copy thereof verified as aforesaid, is not forwarded to the Government Statist pursuant to this section, and also to a further penalty of One pound for each and every month during which the provisions of this section are not complied with as to any such register or book of entry or register-book.

(3) A copy of this section shall be published in the *Government Gazette* at least once a month during the six months immediately following the commencement of this Act.

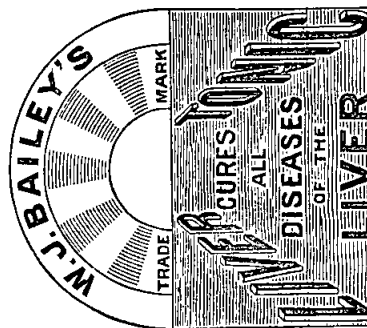

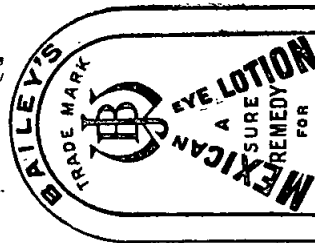

3. The supplies on delivery will be surveyed by a board appointed by the Government for that purpose, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. Payment will be made on the board's certificate that the goods are of contract quality and in good order and condition.

4. If the board of survey shall decide that the goods are not of contract quality, the contractor must in that case remove the goods objected to and supply others in their stead, failing which the supplies may be purchased as in condition 2.

5. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

6. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, as the Treasury may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 2, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security.

7. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

8. In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will be absolutely forfeited, and the contractor disqualified from tendering for a period of twelve months.

9. The packages, case, &c., will become the property of the Government without extra charge.

10. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, provided that the duty on such item has actually been paid.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. ..." indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Parcels up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

A "trip" to mean a journey from the Post Office to the Railway Station and from the Railway Station to the Post Office, carrying mails each way.

The carriage of mails one way, viz., either from a Post Office to a Railway Station or from a Railway Station to a Post Office, shall be regarded as half a trip, and payment made accordingly. Where tenders are invited for a service to and from a Post Office and Railway Station "as often as required," tenderers are required to name a lump sum per annum for the work, and such sum shall not be liable to alteration either through increase or diminution in the number of trips.

13. A separate *bonâ fide* tender must be sent in for each service.

14. The attention of tenderers is drawn to the condition which requires that in cases where vehicles are used, Members of Parliament shall be conveyed free of charge between the districts they represent and the districts in which they reside and Melbourne.

15.
