## EXTRADITION TREATY BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE REPUBLIC OF BOLIVIA.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

#### EXTRADITION TREATY.—REPUBLIC OF BOLIVIA.

Balmoral, 20th October, 1898.

At the Court at Balmoral, the 20th day of October, 1898.

#### PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-second day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, between Her Majesty and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Bolivia, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Bolivia, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within the two countries and their jurisdictions, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes or offences hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up, have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty (that is to say):

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Her Chargé d'Affaires *ad interim* Mr. George Jenner;

And His Excellency the President of the Republic of Bolivia, Señor Don José Manuel Braun, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in Peru;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective Full Powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

#### Article I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article II., committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

JUZGANDO conveniente su Excelencia el Presidente de la Republica de Bolivia, y Su Majestad la Reina del Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, á objeto de una mejor administracion de justicia y de impedir la perpetracion de crímenes dentro de los dos países y sus jurisdicciones, que los individuos acusados ó convictos de los crímenes ó delitos mas adelante enumerados, y que hayan huido de la justicia, sean reciprocamente entregados en ciertas circunstancias, han nombrado sus Plenipotenciarios para concluir un Tratado, á saber:

Su Excelencia el Presidente de la Republica de Bolivia á su Enviado Extraordinario y Ministro Plenipotenciario en el Perú, Señor Don José Manuel Braun;

Y Su Majestad la Reina del Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda á su Encargado de Negocios *ad interim* en la Republica del Perú, Señor Jorge Jenner;

Los cuales, despues de haberse comunicado sus respectivos poderes hallados en buena y debida forma, han convenido y concluido los Artículos siguientes:—

#### Artículo I.

Las Altas Partes Contratantes se comprometen á entregarse reciprocamente, en las circunstancias y condiciones expuestas en el presente Tratado, aquellas personas que, acusadas ó convictas de cualquiera de los crímenes ó delitos enumerados en el Artículo II., cometidos en el territorio de una de las Partes, fueran halladas dentro del territorio de la otra.

*Article II.*

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
4. Rape.
5. Carnal knowledge or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under 16 years of age, if the evidence produced justifies committal for those crimes according to the laws of both the Contracting Parties.
6. Indecent assault.
7. Kidnapping and false imprisonment, child stealing.
8. Abduction.
9. Bigamy.
10. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
11. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
12. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
13. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
14. Arson.
15. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny, or embezzlement.

16. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any Company, punishable with imprisonment for not less than one year by any law for the time being in force.

17. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.

18. (a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.
- (b) Knowingly making, without lawful authority, any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the realm.
- (c) Forgery, or uttering what is forged.

19. Crimes against Bankruptcy Law.

20. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person travelling or being upon a railway.

21. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

22. Piracy and other crimes or offences committed at sea against persons or things which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition offences, and are punishable by more than one year's imprisonment.

23. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

The extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime for which, according to the laws of both the Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

*Article III.*

Either Government reserves the right to refuse or grant the surrender of its own subjects or citizens to the other Government.

*Article IV.*

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of Her Majesty's Government, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of Bolivia, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territory of the Republic of Bolivia or in the United Kingdom respectively for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of Her Majesty's Government, or on the part of the Government of Bolivia, should be under examination for any other crime in the territory of the Republic of Bolivia or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial, and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

*Article V.*

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applying or applied to.

It shall likewise not take place when, according to the laws of either country, the maximum punishment for the offence is imprisonment for less than one year.

*Article VI.*

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

*Article VII.*

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime, or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning, to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

*Artículo II.*

La extradición se concederá recíprocamente por los siguientes crímenes ó delitos:—

1. Asesinato (incluso el asesinato con violencia, parricidio, infanticidio, ó envenenamiento), ó la tentativa ó conspiración para asesinar.
2. Homicidio.
3. La administración de drogas ó el empleo de instrumentos con el propósito de procurar el aborto.
4. Estupro.
5. Conocimiento carnal ó las tentativas de tenerlo con una niña menor de diez y seis años, siempre que el testimonio aducido justifique el enjuiciamiento por esos crímenes, según las leyes de las dos Altas Partes Contratantes.
6. Atentado contra el pudor.
7. Robo y secuestro de un ser humano, sustracción de niño.
8. Rapto.
9. Bigamia.
10. Lesiones ó daño corporal grave hecho intencionalmente.
11. Ataque á las personas del que resulte grave daño corporal.
12. Amenazas, ya sea por medio de cartas ó de otra manera, con la intención de sacar dinero ó otros objetos de valor.
13. Perjurio, ó tentativas de conseguirlo.
14. Incendio voluntario.
15. Robo, ó otros crímenes ó sus tentativas cometidas con fractura, robo con violencia, hurto y malversación de valores públicos ó particulares.
16. Fraude cometido por un depositario, banquero, agente, comisionado, fideicomisario, director, miembro, ó empleado público de cualquiera Compañía, siempre que sea considerado como crimen con pena no menor de un año de prisión por una ley que esté en vigencia.

17. El obtener dinero, garantías de valor, ó mercaderías, con pretextos falsos; recibir dinero, garantías de valor ó otros bienes, sabiendo que han sido robados ó habidos indebidamente.

18. (a) Falsificación ó alteración de moneda, circulación de moneda falsificada ó alterada.

(b) Fabricación á sabiendas y sin autorización legal de cualquier instrumento, herramienta, ó aparato adaptado y destinado á la falsificación de la moneda nacional.

(c) Falsificación ó alteración de firmas ó valores, ó circulación de lo falsificado ó alterado.

19. Crímenes contra las leyes de bancarrota.

20. Cualquier acto hecho con intención criminal y que tenga por objeto poner en peligro la seguridad de una persona que se encuentre viajando en un ferrocarril, ó que se halle en él.

21. Daño á la propiedad hecho con intención criminal, siempre que la ofensa sea procesable.

22. Piratería, y otros crímenes ó delitos cometidos en el mar sobre las personas ó sobre las cosas, y que, según las leyes respectivas de las dos Altas Partes Contratantes, sean delitos de extradición y tengan mas de un año de pena.

23. Trata de esclavos, de manera tal que constituya una ofensa criminal contra las leyes de ambos Estados.

Debe también concederse la extradición por la participación en cualesquiera de los precitados crímenes, siempre que esa participación sea punible por las leyes de ambas Partes Contratantes.

Puede también concederse la extradición según lo juzgue conveniente el Estado al que se hiciere el pedido con motivo de cualquier otro crimen que, según las leyes que estén vigentes á la sazón, dé lugar á ella.

*Artículo III.*

Cada una de las dos Altas Partes Contratantes se reserva el derecho de negar ó conceder la entrega de sus propios súbditos ó ciudadanos.

*Artículo IV.*

La extradición no tendrá lugar si el individuo reclamado por el Gobierno de Su Majestad, ó el individuo reclamado por el Gobierno de Bolivia, ya hubiese sido enjuiciado y puesto en libertad ó castigado, ó continuará procesado en el territorio de la Republica de Bolivia ó en el Reino Unido respectivamente, por el crimen por el que se demande su extradición.

Si el individuo reclamado por el Gobierno de Su Majestad, ó por el Gobierno de Bolivia, estuviera detenido por cualquier otro crimen en el territorio de la Republica de Bolivia, ó en el Reino Unido respectivamente, su extradición será aplazada hasta la terminación del juicio y la completa ejecución del castigo que le fué impuesto.

*Artículo V.*

La extradición no tendrá lugar si, despues de cometido el crimen ó de instituida la acusación criminal ó de condenado el reo, surgiera la prescripción, según las leyes del Estado requerido ó requeriente.

No tendrá igualmente lugar cuando, según las leyes de cada país, la mas alta pena del delito sea menor de un año de prisión.

*Artículo VI.*

Un criminal fugado no será entregado si el delito por el cual se solicita su extradición es de carácter político, ó si dicho criminal probare que el pedido de extradición se ha hecho en realidad con la mira de enjuiciarlo ó castigarlo por un delito de carácter político.

*Artículo VII.*

Un individuo entregado no puede en caso alguno ser detenido ni enjuiciado en el Estado al que se haga la entrega, por otro crimen ó por otros asuntos que no sean aquellos que hayan motivado la extradición, hasta tanto que haya sido devuelto, ó haya tenido una oportunidad de regresar al Estado que lo entregare.

Esta estipulación no es aplicable á crímenes cometidos despues de la extradición.

## Article VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively. The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed *in contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

## Article IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

## Article X.

A fugitive criminal may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any Police Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which the Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority exercises jurisdiction; provided, however, that in the United Kingdom the accused shall, in such case, be sent as speedily as possible before a Police Magistrate in London. He shall, in accordance with this Article, be discharged, as well in the Republic of Bolivia as in the United Kingdom, if within the term of sixty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the Diplomatic Agent of his country in accordance with the stipulations of this Treaty. The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this Treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

## Article XI.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to; and no criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

## Article XII.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or statements of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating, the fact of a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State.
2. Depositions, or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified, under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.
3. A certificate of, or judicial document stating, the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State.
4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of the other State; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the country where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

## Article XIII.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

## Article XIV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper Tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

## Article XV.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery of such articles, be given up when the

## Artículo VIII.

La requisitoria de la extradición se hará por los Agentes Diplomáticos de las Altas Partes Contratantes respectivamente.

La requisitoria para la extradición de un individuo acusado ha de ser acompañada de orden de prisión, dada por autoridad competente del Estado que requiera la extradición, y de aquellas pruebas que, según las leyes del lugar donde sea hallado el acusado, justificarian su prisión si el crimen hubiese sido cometido allí.

Si la requisitoria se relaciona con persona ya condenada, deberá venir acompañada de la sentencia condenatoria dictada contra la persona condenada por el Tribunal competente del Estado que haga la requisitoria para la extradición.

Una sentencia dictada en rebeldía no ha de reputarse condenatoria; pero a una persona así sentenciada puede tratarse como a persona acusada.

## Artículo IX.

Si la requisitoria para la extradición está de acuerdo con las precedentes estipulaciones, las autoridades competentes del Estado requerido procederán a la prisión del fugitivo.

## Artículo X.

Puede prenderse a un criminal fugitivo en virtud de un mandato de prisión, dictado por cualquier Juez de Instrucción ó de Paz, u otra autoridad competente en cualquiera de los dos países, mediante aquellas pruebas, informes ó denuncias, y aquellos procedimientos, que en la opinión de la autoridad que de el mandato justificarian análogo mandato si el crimen se hubiera cometido ó la persona hubiera sido condenada en aquella parte de los dominios de las dos Partes Contratantes donde ejerza jurisdicción el Juez de Instrucción ó de Paz, u otra autoridad competente; bajo la condición, sin embargo, que en el Reino Unido el acusado ha de ser remitido en tal caso, á la mayor brevedad, á Londres, á disposición de algun Juez de Instrucción. De conformidad con este Artículo, el acusado será puesto en libertad tanto en la Republica de Bolivia como en el Reino Unido, si dentro del plazo de sesenta dias no hubiera hecho una requisitoria para la extradición el Agente Diplomático de su país de acuerdo con las estipulaciones de este Tratado. La misma regla se aplicará á los casos de personas acusadas ó condenadas por cualquiera de los crímenes ó delitos especificados en el presente Tratado, y que se hubieran cometido en alta mar abordo de un buque de cualquiera de los dos países que entrase en un puerto del otro.

## Artículo XI.

Solo tendrá lugar la extradición en el caso de hallarse suficiente el testimonio, según las leyes del país requerido, ya sea para justificar el enjuiciamiento en el caso de que se hubiera cometido el crimen en el territorio del mismo Estado, ya sea para comprobar la identidad del preso como la persona condenada por los Tribunales del Estado que hace la requisitoria, y que el crimen por el que se lo haya condenado es de aquellos con motivo de los cuales podria, en la época de dicha condenación, haberse concedido la extradición por el Estado requerido; y ningun criminal será entregado hasta despues de pasados quince dias, contados desde la fecha de su encarcelación á esperar la orden para su entrega.

## Artículo XII.

En los exámenes que deben practicar de conformidad con las precedentes estipulaciones, las autoridades del Estado requerido aceptarán como testimonio valido las deposiciones juramentadas ó las declaraciones de testigos tomadas en el otro Estado, ó copia de ellas, y tambien las ordenes de prisión y sentencias allí dictadas y certificadas del hecho de una condena ó documentos judiciales que lo declaren, con tal que estén autenticados como sigue:—

1. Una orden de prisión debe parecer firmada por algun Juez, Magistrado, ó empleado del otro Estado.
2. Las deposiciones, ó afirmaciones, ó las copias de estas, deben demostrar que certifican, mediante la firma de algun Juez, Magistrado, ó empleado del otro Estado, ser las deposiciones ó afirmaciones originales, ó copias fieles de ellas, según lo requiere el caso.
3. Un certificado del hecho de una condena ó documento judicial que la declare, debe demostrar que esta otorgada por algun Juez, Magistrado, ó empleado del otro Estado.
4. En todos los casos dicha orden, deposición, afirmación, copia, certificado, ó documento judicial debe autenticarse, ya sea mediante juramento de algun testigo, ya sea mediante el sello oficial del Ministro de Justicia, ó de algun otro Ministro del otro Estado; pero cualquiera otra manera de autenticar que esté permitida á la sazón por la ley del país donde se practique el examen, puede sustituirse á las precedentes.

## Artículo XIII.

Si el individuo reclamado por una de las Altas Partes Contratantes conforme al presente Tratado tambien lo fuera por otra ó otras Potencias con motivo de otros crímenes ó delitos cometidos en sus respectivos territorios, se concederá la extradición al Estado cuya requisición fuere de fecha mas antigua.

## Artículo XIV.

Si no se exhibiera testimonio bastante para la extradición dentro de los dos meses despues de la fecha en que se prendió al fugitivo, ó dentro del nuevo plazo que designe el Estado requerido ó el correspondiente Tribunal del mismo, el fugitivo será puesto en libertad.

## Artículo XV.

Todo objeto que esté en posesión del individuo que haya de entregarse y que se lo tome al tiempo de prenderlo, será entregado al efectuarse la extradición si la autoridad competente del Estado requerido para la extradición ha ordenado la entrega de

extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

*Article XVI.*

All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

*Article XVII.*

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such Colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal, who has taken refuge in any of such Colonies or foreign possessions, shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by the chief Consular officer of the Republic of Bolivia in such Colony or possession.

Such requisition may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of Bolivian criminals who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

*Article XVIII.*

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting parties by a notice not exceeding one year, and not less than six months.

The Treaty, after receiving the approval of the Congress of the Republic of Bolivia, shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Lima as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done at Lima, on the twenty-second day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

*Artículo XVI.*

Todos los gastos que ocasione la extradición estarán á cargo del Estado que la requiera.

*Artículo XVII.*

Las estipulaciones del presente Tratado se aplicarán á las Colonias y posesiones exteriores de Su Majestad Británica, en cuanto lo permitan las leyes que estén á la sazón en vigor en dichas Colonias y posesiones exteriores.

La requisitoria para la entrega de un criminal fugitivo, refugiado en alguna de dichas Colonias ó posesiones exteriores, sera hecha al Gobernador ó autoridad principal de dicha Colonia ó posesion por el Agente principal Consular de la Republica de Bolivia en dicha Colonia ó posesion.

Su Majestad Británica tendrá, no obstante, la facultad de hacer arreglos especiales en las Colonias y posesiones exteriores Británicas para la entrega de criminales Bolivianos que se refugien en dichas Colonias y posesiones exteriores, sobre la base, en cuanto lo permita la ley de dicha Colonia ó posesion exterior, de las estipulaciones del presente Tratado.

Las requisitorias para la entrega de un criminal fugitivo que emanen de alguna Colonia ó posesion exterior de Su Majestad Británica serán regidas por las reglas sentadas en los precedentes Artículos del presente Tratado.

*Artículo XVIII.*

El presente Tratado entrará en vigor diez dias despues de publicado, conforme á las formas prescritas por las leyes de las Altas Partes Contratantes. Podrá dárlo por terminado cualquiera de las Altas Partes Contratantes, previo aviso que no pase de un año y no bajo de seis meses.

El Tratado, despues de aprobado por el Congreso de la Republica de Bolivia, será ratificado, y las ratificaciones serán canjeadas en Lima á la brevedad posible.

En fé de lo cual los respectivos Plenipotenciarios lo han firmado, y le han puesto el sello de sus armas.

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the fourth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Bolivia, and of the said Treaty with the President of the Republic of Bolivia.

Provided always, that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and entitled "An Act respecting the extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

## RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1898.

THE births of 55 boys and 43 girls, or in all of 98 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of December. Of these, 36 occurred in Ballarat East, 52 in Ballarat West, 9 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 9 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 101, viz., 53 of boys and 48 of girls.

The deaths registered in December numbered 96, viz., 62 of males and 34 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 2. In November, the recorded deaths numbered 86; in December, 1897, they numbered 73; in December, 1896, they numbered 64; in December, 1895, they numbered 76; in December, 1894, they numbered 69; in December, 1893, they numbered 53; in December, 1892, they numbered 53; in December, 1891, they numbered 80; in December, 1890, they numbered 65; in December, 1889, they numbered 72; and in December, 1888, they numbered 57.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 63 per cent.; females, 35 per cent.; under five years, 32 per cent.; over five years, 68 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 64 and 36 per cent.; under and over five years, 36 and 64 per cent. respectively.

Twenty-three deaths, or 24 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz., Ballarat Hospital, 11; Benevolent Asylum, 8; Lunatic Asylum, 4.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of December, separating those under from those over five

years of age; also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease:—

The mortality of the month was much above the average. As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding

year, deaths from phthisis rose from 2 to 8; those from old age from 2 to 7; those from diseases of the circulatory system from 5 to 18; those from diseases of the respiratory system from 6 to 19; and those from diseases of the urinary system from 11 to 5. On the other hand, deaths from influenza fell from 3 to 1; those from diseases of the digestive system from 18 to 6; and those from violence from 5 to 2.

In the year 1898, the births registered in Ballarat and suburbs numbered 1,240, viz., 643 of males and 597 of females, as against 1,336 in 1897. The deaths registered during the same period numbered 1,077, viz., 647 of males and 430 of females, as against 765 in 1897. The apparent gain to the population by excess of births over deaths was thus 163, as compared with 571 in 1897.

A By-law of the Borough of Echuca, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 4, for the purpose of amending By-law No. 11 as to Dairies, Dairy Cattle, and Milk.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Echuca order as follows:—

That clause 4 of By-law No. 11 shall be and is hereby repealed, and the following clause substituted:—

##### Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, before or on the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Council of the Borough aforesaid in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the Town Clerk of the Borough aforesaid an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings.

#### SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1899, No. 9.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates for 1899 which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound sterling shall be paid.
2. For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound seven shillings and sixpence shall be paid.
3. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence shall be paid.
4. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, and not exceeding Thirty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound fifteen shillings shall be paid.
5. For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Thirty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.
6. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotment, shall be One pound per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.
7. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from the stand-pipe, one quarter of the before-mentioned rate.
8. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.
9. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal instalments on the 1st of January and 1st of July, 1899.
10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

# ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day  
of January, 1899.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

- State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out same and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same, and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the public loan out of which such loan may be granted;
- Proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust shall have authority to be called a Waterworks District;
- State what are the principal works to be constructed;
- Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust: and
- Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas it is further enacted, by section 25 of the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid, that whenever a Waterworks District is either wholly or, with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one municipal district, the Governor in Council may appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons, not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Council of the Shire of Alexandra, for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust and for a loan to carry out works for the supply of the township of Alexandra with water, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

- The construction of the said waterworks.
- The Municipal Council of the Shire of Alexandra for the time being and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.
- That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Three thousand five hundred pounds sterling (£3,500), and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.
- That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Portion I.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the township of Alexandra, in the parish of Alexandra; thence westerly, northerly, north-westerly, north-easterly, south-easterly, and southerly by the south, west, north, and east boundaries of said township to the point of commencement.

Portion II.—A strip of land one chain wide, commencing at a point on the township boundary opposite the south-west angle of allotment 26 in the township of Alexandra, and extending south-westerly and westerly along the pipe track through allotments 32a and 31 to the Goulburn River; together with an area of one acre at the site of the service basin, and one acre at the site of the pumping plant, in the parish of Alexandra:

All of which boundaries are as shown on an Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister of Mines and Water Supply, Melbourne.

- That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of a pumping plant, rising main, service basin, 4-in. diameter cast-iron main, and street reticulation.

- That the name of the Trust shall be the "Alexandra Waterworks Trust."

And the Honorable Henry Foster, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines and Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WE, George Fitzgerald, Walter James Thomas Armstrong, Robert Alexander David Hood, and Harry Quiney, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course at Mortlake, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is parcelled out into the following divisions, shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.

(1) The stand enclosure.

(2) The remainder of the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

4. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, gates, seats, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. The scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the first and second divisions of the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for racing shall be as follows:—

For admission of every adult to the first division such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Seven shillings and sixpence.

For admission of every adult to the second division such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

10. No person shall after the 31st day of December, 1898, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on such portion of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

(a) That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the Committee of Management of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Mortlake Racing Club, or by those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, on payment of a fee of Two pounds two shillings.

(b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Mortlake Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
  2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
  3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
  4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
  5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
  6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
  7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
  8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
  9. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission the reserve on such days, not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year, as the reserve may be set apart for racing, sports, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows :—For admission of every adult, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One shilling. For admission of every horse or vehicle, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## FIRST DIVISION.—289 SERVICES.

**TENDERS** are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon on Tuesday, the 17th day of January, 1899, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails, viz., Letters, Packets, Parcels, and Newspapers, as undermentioned, FOR THREE YEARS, from the 1st July, 1899.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. *Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.*

3. *The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.*

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term for which it was accepted.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

##### REGULATION No. 6.

Regulation No. 6 of the Shire of Nunawading, made under the provisions of section 43 of Part I. of the council's By-law No. 10, relating to wandering cattle.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts 1890 and 1891 and of the by-laws made thereunder, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading order as follows:—

That from and after the date of this Regulation coming into operation the provisions of sections forty-one (41) and forty-two (42) of Part I. of the council's By-law No. 10, relating to wandering cattle shall apply to all Government and public roads and streets within the boundaries of the Shire of Nunawading which have been taken over by the council, and to all places within the following boundaries, viz.:—

Commencing at the junction of the Canterbury-road and the Middleboro'-road; thence westerly by the Canterbury-road to the Elgar-road; thence southerly by the Elgar-road to the Riversdale-road; thence westerly by the Riversdale-road to the western boundary of the shire; thence northerly by the western boundary of the shire to the White Horse-road; thence easterly by the White Horse-road to the Elgar-road; thence northerly by the Elgar-road to a point twenty (20) chains north from the railway line; thence easterly by a line parallel to and twenty (20) chains north of the railway to the Middleboro'-road; thence southerly by the Middleboro'-road to the commencing point.

This Regulation shall come into operation on the day after its publication in the *Government Gazette* of the colony of Victoria as a Regulation of the Shire of Nunawading.

From and after the date of this Regulation coming into operation Regulation No. 2, made under the provisions of section 43 of Part I. of the council's By-law No. 10 shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

#### BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

##### BY-LAW No. 25.

A By-law of the Municipality of the Borough of Hamilton, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 1112, for further regulating traffic in, through, and over the streets of the said borough.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Council of the Borough of Hamilton doth hereby order that:—

1. The expression machine wherever used herein shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.

2. Except as hereinafter provided no person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway, pavement, or causeway made or set apart for the use or accommodation of foot passengers. But this section shall not apply to a machine merely impelled or taken across any footway, pavement, or causeway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to such machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted, and kept lighted, as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person when driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall carry a proper bell, which shall be capable at the will of such person of giving audible and sufficient warning to foot passengers and others of the approach of such machine.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine overtaking or passing any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden in charge of any person, or any foot passenger proceeding along or across any street, shall, within a reasonable distance from and before overtaking or passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, horse, or

other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding the bell affixed to such machine, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.

6. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any machine furiously or negligently through or upon any public place or thoroughfare.

7. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way except there be justifiable cause for deviating therefrom.

8. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle, or any horse, or any other beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden, except there be justifiable cause for deviating therefrom.

9. Any person using a machine causing any injury, accident, or collision with any other person, machine, or vehicle, or being concerned therein, who shall proceed on his or her way without stopping a reasonable time to see the extent of any injuries caused and giving on demand his or her name and address to the person injured, or to some one on his or her behalf, or to any member of the police force on demand at any time shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

10. Any person who shall not observe this By-law or any clauses hereof, saving the last preceding clause, shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding £2 for each such offence.

#### BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

##### REGULATION No. 26.

Regulation made by the Council of the Borough of Hamilton, under the provisions of the *Police Offences Act 1890*, for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and foot ways and public places of the Borough of Hamilton, and for preventing any obstruction thereof respectively.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Act of Parliament of Victoria No. 1128, the Mayor and Councillors of the Borough of Hamilton order as follows:—

1. All persons causing any obstruction by standing or loitering upon any of the carriage-ways, footways, or any other public places of the borough shall discontinue to do so immediately on being so required by any member of the police force.

2. All persons walking along the footways shall, in passing each other, keep on their respective right-hand side of the footway.

3. The driver of any vehicle shall give way, if he conveniently can, to any other vehicle during the taking up or setting down of any person into or from such other vehicle.

4. The driver of any hackney carriage or omnibus shall not stop the same for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger at any part of the street except as near as may be to the left or near side thereof.

5. No driver of any omnibus or hackney carriage shall drive the same so as to immediately and closely precede or follow and intentionally conform to the progress of any other omnibus or hackney carriage in competition against or to the annoyance of any other person.

6. The driver of any vehicle, of whatsoever kind it may be, and whether private or public, before stopping the same in any carriage-way for any purpose, shall give notice of his intention so to do, if riding upon such vehicle, by holding up his whip or his hand so that the same may be seen by the driver of any other vehicle in the rear of his, and upon stopping he shall so place his vehicle as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if the stoppage prevent the passing of any other vehicle or interrupt or delay traffic he shall, upon being so required by the driver of such other vehicle, or by any member of the police force, remove his vehicle so as to permit such other vehicle to pass or so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

7. Between the hours of Seven o'clock in the morning and Six o'clock in the evening of any day no person shall cause interruption or annoyance to passengers along the public roadways or footways by raising or discharging dust upon or across any such roadway or footway, whether from buildings in process of construction, demolition, or in any other manner.

8. No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the streets unless with the previous consent, in writing, of the Mayor, or, in his absence, the Town Clerk, of the borough, and only by the route specified by such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at least 24 hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the police in the borough.

#### BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

##### REGULATION No. 27.

REGULATION made by the Council of the Borough of Hamilton, under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 1112, for regulating the erection of tents:—

1. Any person intending to erect, or cause to be erected, any tent shall give to the Town Clerk of the Borough of Hamilton two days' previous notice of such intention, and in such notice shall state precisely the nature of the structure, the purpose for which it is intended to be used, the site on which it is proposed to erect it, and upon giving such notice shall pay to the Town Clerk the fee mentioned in the schedule hereto and applicable to such tent.

2. No tent shall be erected within thirty feet of any building, nor shall any rope or other fastening appertaining to such tent be fastened within ten feet of any building.

3. The erection and construction of all tents intended to be used for public purposes, and the seats and fittings therein, shall be subject to the approval of the Town Clerk of the said borough; and no tent shall be open for the admission of the public until the written consent of the Town Clerk for such purpose shall have been obtained, and the fee or fees mentioned in the said schedule, and applicable to the case, shall have been paid to the Town Clerk.

4. No tent shall remain erected for more than seven days unless with the written consent of the Mayor or Town Clerk of the said borough.

5. This regulation shall apply to tents intended to be used for the purpose of temporarily covering horses, cattle, or other animals, goods, or chattels, or for any other purpose.

6. This regulation shall apply to the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Hamilton.

For regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.

For regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes; and the material for and mode of enclosing the same.

For regulating the construction materials, and enclosing by building or otherwise of fireplaces or furnaces to be used in the working of engines by steam, or in any mill, brewery, bake-house, or gas works, or in any manufactory whatsoever, although steam-engines be not used therein respectively.

For appointing fees to be charged and received on account of the municipal funds by the proper officer of the council for any inspection, superintendence, or other service made or performed by him under any such regulations as hereinbefore provided for. A copy of the above-mentioned Regulation is open for inspection at this office.

2. This Regulation shall come into operation on the day after its publication in the *Government Gazette* of the colony of Victoria as a Regulation of the Shire of Nunawading.

3. That from and after the date of this Regulation coming into operation Regulation No. 4, made under the provisions of section 3 of the Council's By-law No. 11, and intitled a Regulation for keeping order upon and preventing obstruction of the carriage-ways and footways of the shire, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

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## THE MELBOURNE DISTRICT NURSING SOCIETY.

## BY-LAWS.

**THE** name of this association shall be the Melbourne District Nursing Society.

2. Objects of the Society.—The objects for which the society is incorporated are—

- (a) To provide nursing for the sick poor in their own homes in and around Melbourne and suburbs and in such other districts as the committee of the society may think fit, and to supply them with medicines and medical comforts and necessary nourishment.
- (b) To provide skilled midwifery nurses for poor women who are unable to attend at any public Maternity Hospital, and to supply them with necessary comforts and nourishment.
- (c) To maintain and support in such place or places as the committee of the society may deem most suitable a home or homes in which the nurses employed by the society shall live during the time they are employed, and to which donations in kind may be sent; and which home or homes may be used for any other purposes the committee may deem expedient.

3. Common Seal.—The common seal of this corporation shall be kept at the office of the society in the custody of the honorary secretary, and shall be affixed only under the order of the committee by and in the presence of one member of the committee and the honorary secretary, who shall sign their names as witnesses.

4. Unsectarian.—The association shall be entirely unsectarian in its character.

5. Subscribers.—Any person subscribing Twenty shillings or upwards per annum to the funds shall be a subscriber within the meaning of these Rules, and entitled to vote at all general meetings according to the following scale:—

Annual subscription of not less than 20s.	1 vote.
Annual subscription of between £2 and £5	2 votes.
Annual subscription upwards of £5	3 votes.

6. Annual Subscriptions.—All subscriptions shall be annual and payable in advance, and the annual period shall date from the first payment.

7. Life Governor.—Any person subscribing £20 or more in one sum to the funds of the society shall be a life governor, and entitled to one vote at each general meeting.

8. Public Bodies.—Any public or corporate body subscribing £5 annually to the society shall be entitled to nominate some person, who shall be entitled to one vote and the other privileges of a subscriber, and if the contribution be £20 such person so nominated shall be entitled to all the privileges of a life governor.

9. Donations from Performances.—Any person or combination of persons contributing £25 or upwards in one sum to the funds of the society as the proceeds or part of the proceeds of collection by means of any entertainment or otherwise may nominate some person, who shall be entitled to all the privileges of a life governor, and if such contribution be £100 or upwards two persons may be so nominated.

10. Donations by Will.—The executors of the will of any deceased person by whose will the sum of £50 or upwards is bequeathed to the society may on payment over of such legacy nominate either one of themselves or some other person, who shall be entitled to all the privileges of a life governor.

11. Absent Subscriber.—Any subscriber or life governor absent from the colony of Victoria may exercise all his privileges through an attorney under power, but the power of attorney must be produced to the secretary for record at least three days before the same can be used in exercise of any such privileges.

12. Subscriptions in Arrears.—No subscriber of less than three days' standing as such shall be entitled to vote, and no person shall be entitled to vote whose subscription is in arrear.

13. Officers.—The officers of the society—who shall retire annually but be eligible for re-election—shall be a president, three vice-presidents, an honorary secretary, and an honorary treasurer.

14. Committee of Management.—The committee of management shall consist of the officers of the society as *ex officio* members and thirty-three members of committee and the mayoress for the time being of the city of Melbourne, who shall be an honorary member.

15. Management.—The committee of management shall direct all business of the society, appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants, and generally have the control and management of the business of the society, and of all matters in connexion therewith.

16. Chairman.—The president, or in his or her absence one of the vice-presidents, shall preside at all meetings, either of the committee of management or of subscribers, and in the absence of all of these the meeting shall elect a chairman. The chairman shall have a deliberative vote and also a casting vote in case of an equality of votes.

17. Voting.—Except where herein required, all questions shall be decided by a majority of the votes of those present.

18. Retirement.—On the last Thursday of the month of July in each year one-third of the elected members of committee, who shall be those longest in office without re-election, shall retire but be eligible for re-election.
