## FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Tuesday, the 2nd day of May, 1899, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday, the 2nd day of May, 1899, until Tuesday, the 6th day of June, 1899.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and in the sixty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

**Factories and Shops Acts.**

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. BUSSELL, ROUSON, AND BUSSELL, MILLINERS AND DRESSMAKERS, 216-52 BOURKE-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of four weeks from the 20th April, 1899, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty-five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty-five females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

**SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.**

The births of 1,088 children, viz., 563 boys and 525 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of March. The number was, it will be observed, 59 fewer than in March, 1897, and also much fewer than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 251 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 278 (or one-fifth) below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in March numbered 644, viz., 341 of males and 303 of females; the births having thus exceeded the deaths by 444, or 69 per cent., as against only 31 per cent. in March, 1898, and 77 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 235 fewer than in March, 1898, and much fewer than that recorded for the month during any of the five years 1889 to 1893, but more numerous than in the four years 1894 to 1897; it was also 112 less than the average of March during the last ten years, or 127 (or about a sixth) below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 27.26 and of deaths registered to 16.14 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1898 of 29.47 and 22.37 per annum respectively, and of the last ten years of 34.16 and 19.47 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 32.45 and 17.58.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 98.2° on the 15th, and the lowest was 48.9° on the 20th. The mean temperature of the month (65.5°) was 1.3° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.2°) took place on the 11th, and the least range (11.2°) on the 4th, 18th, and 23rd. The mean daily range was 21.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.232 inches on the 10th, and the lowest was 29.372 inches on the 26th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.900 inches) was about one-thirteenth of an inch below the average, and the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years.

Rain fell on seven days, the amount being 2.93 inches, which was 1.72 inches above the average of the last ten years, and was, with three exceptions—viz., 3.87 inches in March, 1880, 4.15 in March, 1883, and 3.11 in March, 1884—the highest recorded for the month during the last twenty years.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 40 per cent. to that mortality, as against 43 per cent. in March, 1898; and 48 per cent. in March, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 180, as compared with 200 in March, 1898. The rate of infantile mortality (i.e., the proportion of deaths of infants per 1,000 births, registered in the same month) was 165 in the month under review, as compared with 174 in March, 1898, 124 in March, 1897, 143 in March, 1896, 137 in March, 1895, 149 in March, 1894, 186 in March, 1893, 180 in March, 1892, 200 in March, 1891, 184 in March 1890, and 197 in March, 1889.

Thirty-nine persons—as against 72 in March, 1898—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a cab-owner, aged 75, died of cancer; a pensioner, aged 75, of syncope; a labourer, aged 75, of nephritis; an umbrella-maker, aged 76, of leucocythemia; a farmer, aged 76, of cerebral hæmorrhage; two females, each aged 76, of pneumonia and ovarian disease respectively; an orchardist, aged 76, of rupture of an artery, caused by a fall from a cart; a musician, aged 77, of pneumonia; a female, aged 77, of enteritis; a gentleman, aged 77, of disease of the prostate gland; three females, each aged 78, of dysentery, cancer, and cerebral hæmorrhage respectively; a gardener, aged 78, of arthritis; a nurseryman, aged 79, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 79, of heart disease; a blacksmith, aged 79, of bronchitis; a female, aged 81, of dysentery; another, aged 83, of cancer; a male, of no occupation, aged 84, of diarrhœa; a female, aged 84, of cancer; a housekeeper, aged 85, of hemiplegia; two females, each aged 86, of cancer and valvular disease of the heart respectively; a gentleman, aged 76, a male of unstated occupation, aged 77, a stonemason, aged 78, a groom and a labourer, each aged 79, an ex-master stevedore, aged 80, an engine-driver and a female, each aged 81, a gentleman and a female, each aged 83, a bookbinder, aged 85, two females, aged 86 and 87 respectively, and a labourer, aged 88, of "old age."

Thirty-two of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 35 in March, 1898—were from external causes, of which 26 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A newsboy, aged 14, a railway porter, aged 39, a railway guard, aged 40, and a labourer, aged 62, were passed over by railway trains; a jockey, aged 18, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from a horse; an orchardist, aged 70, of rupture of an artery consequent on a fall from a cart; a law student, aged 30, of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall down a lift; a chief mate, aged 45, and a labourer, aged 67, of fracture of the skull, the result of falls, the latter whilst in a fit; an engine-driver, aged 43, of gunshot wounds; two female children, each aged 3, and a female, aged 53, of burns; a female child, aged 1, and a male child, aged 2, of scalds; a male child, aged 1, of poison by kerosene; a chemist, aged 55, by an overdose of opium; a boy, aged 11, was drowned in a tank of water; a grocer's assistant, aged 16, in the River Yarra; a blacksmith, aged 40, was "found drowned" in Hobson's Bay; and two females, aged 24 and 62 respectively, in the River Yarra; a female, aged 15, was suffocated by food; a male infant, aged 8 days, was overlain; a new-born male infant, and a female infant, aged 3 weeks, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male and two new-born female infants, who were suffocated, a verdict of manslaughter being returned against the mother for neglect in the first, and one of wilful murder in the two last cases. The suicidal deaths were those of a labourer aged 38, who cut his throat; and an ex-railway guard, aged 43, and a female, aged 71, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and sixty-nine deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 76 in the Melbourne, 20 in the Alfred, 5 in St. Vincent's, 10 in the Women's, 6 in the Children's, 12 in the Homeopathic, and 8 in the Austin Hospitals; 3 in the Metropolitan and 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 8 in the Immigrants' Home; 11 in the Benevolent Asylum; 4 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 2 in the Protestant Refuge; and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 259, of which 135, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 124, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 180 were under one year of age, 51 were between one and two, 15 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five. As compared with the corresponding month of 1898, there was a decrease of 117 in the number of deaths, chiefly amongst children aged over twelve months.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 385. Of these, 206, or 54 per cent., were males, and 179, or 46 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 23 were between fifteen and twenty, 23 were between twenty and twenty-five, 24 were between twenty-five and thirty, 14 were between thirty and thirty-five, 30 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 33 were between fifty-five and sixty, 35 were between sixty and sixty-five, 31 were between sixty-five and seventy, 34 were between seventy and seventy-five, 23 were between seventy-five and eighty, 9 were between eighty and eighty-five, and 7 were between eighty-five and ninety. As compared with the corresponding month of 1898, there was a falling-off of 118 in the deaths over five years, of which 27 occurred amongst children between five and ten; 37 amongst persons aged thirty to forty-five; and 33 amongst old people aged seventy-five or upwards.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

Of the falling off of 235 deaths in the month under notice as compared with the corresponding one last year, 64 took place under the zymotic class of diseases, 36 under the constitutional, 109 under the local, and 16 in the ill-defined class. In the zymotic class, deaths from measles fell from 62 in March, 1898, to nil in March, 1899, those from diphtheria from 20 to 7, those from typhoid fever from 41 to 32, those from venereal disease from 7 to 2, and those from influenza from 6 to 2, whereas those from whooping-cough rose from 1 to 21, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 25 to 35. In the constitutional class, the chief variation was in phthisis, from which the deaths fell from 72 to 41. In the developmental class, a decrease of 6 under old age was counterbalanced by an increase of 6 under premature birth. In the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system fell off by 30, from those of the organs of circulation by 17, from those of the respiratory system by 14, from enteritis (digestive system) by 36, and from those of the urinary system by 8.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1898, and the first three months of 1899, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the last three months was below the average.

Between November and April diarrhoeal diseases and enteritis cause great havoc and carry off their most numerous victims, and in this respect the past year has been much more conspicuous than usual, for 964 deaths from those diseases were recorded in 1898 as compared with 840 in 1896, when they were much above the average. It is satisfactory to find, however, that a marked reduction in such deaths took place in the four months ended with March, 1899.\* As four-sevenths of the deaths from diarrhoeal diseases, and eight-ninths of those from enteritis, are of infants under two years, whose staple article of diet—when not breast-fed—is cow's milk, there is every reason to suspect a close connexion between the deterioration of the milk consumed during the summer months, and the great fatality from the causes named. Assuming this to be so, the introduction of some general and effective means of preventing such deterioration would probably result in the saving of nearly 500 or 600 lives annually in Melbourne and suburbs alone. The following are the deaths from those causes in each month from January, 1894, onwards:—

# EAST BOORT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the East Boort Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 3.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of such form and pattern as may be adopted and fixed by the Trust. The registration of the quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust's officers.

2. All irrigation or other outlets required from any of the channels or works of the Trust shall be constructed by the Trust upon the application only of owners of the land to be supplied from such outlet or outlets, or of occupiers of the said land indorsed or approved by such owners.

3. All applications for the construction of irrigation outlets shall be dealt with by the duly appointed committee of the Trust to manage and regulate the distribution of the available water, and known as the water committee, except when otherwise directed by the Trust.

4. Only one outlet shall be allowed to each owner or occupier of land up to 320 acres, and one for every additional 320 acres or fraction thereof, except in such cases where the Trust may order otherwise, or the full cost of construction of the said outlet is paid by the applicant.

5. Outlets may be fixed at any suitable spot most convenient to the applicant, subject to the approval of the engineer to the Trust.

6. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet, shall remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be intertered with, either by such owner or occupier or any other person in any way whatsoever, except with the express sanction of the Trust in writing, and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.

7. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for all lands (including gardens) from the 1st day of April to the 31st day of December in each year, and Ninepence per inch per acre from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of March in each year, except as hereinafter provided; payment in all cases to be made at the same time as the application.

8. In no case shall the charge for supply of water be less than for 3 inches per acre for cultivation land for the first watering, and for 2 inches per acre for subsequent waterings.

9. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the water committee or the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence (excepting in the case of gardens, applications for the supply of water for the irrigation of which may be dealt with by the Trust on their merits, and such agreement made from time to time as may be deemed expedient); and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.

10. The water-bailiff shall receive all applications for water, and shall enter same in an order-book supplied to him for that purpose with the several particulars required therein, and all applicants for water may request, and shall be entitled to, the inspection of such order-book.

11. Each applicant for water will be supplied in the order in which his application appears in the order-book, except in the case of any subsequent applications being received on the channel then working, when all such applications shall be allowed one week on that channel before the water is transferred to another channel, and so on by rotation of channels for which applications for water have been made, and the water will be supplied to the applicant as near as practicable to the time at which such water is required (if available), but the Trust will not be responsible for the non-supply of water applied for under any circumstances. No applicant shall be allowed to irrigate more than 50 acres at any one time.

12. No person shall receive water for the irrigation of land to a greater extent at each turn than is equal to 30 acres for each allotment on the channel then working when there are other applicants awaiting service, unless special instructions are given by the water committee or the Trust to do otherwise. Owners of more than one allotment to be restricted to water to irrigate not more than 30 acres in each 320 acres owned.

13. Any applicant refusing to take water in his turn, when asked to do so by the water-bailiff, shall forfeit to the Trust half of such application money on the date on which the water is refused.

14. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owners, damage to works on adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

15. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlet or junction sluice, or interfere with any stop, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, excepting as hereinbefore provided, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

16. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or do any act which may cause such works to be injured or damaged or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

17. Garden irrigation rights must be paid for at the time the application is made for the said rights.

18. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not

exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the East Boort Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 22nd day of November, 1898.

The Regulation No. 2, made by the Trust on the 10th day of February, 1891, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and the foregoing adopted in lieu thereof.

And whereas the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust has made application for the sanction of the Governor in Council to supply surplus water to the settlers within the Young Brothers Irrigation Colony and the settlers within the Horsham Irrigation Colonizing Colony Limited, both of which irrigation colonies are situated outside the limits of the said Trust District.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, under the powers conferred by the aforesaid section of the *Water Act 1890*, sanction the Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust entering into contracts for the year commencing on the 1st day of July, 1899, and ending on the 30th day of June, 1900, for supplying water within the aforesaid irrigation colonies, at the rate of Two shillings per inch per acre, such rate being not less than double the amount charged for water supplied to persons within the limits of the Trust District, and that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case during the said year shall be equal to the value of Two pounds sterling.

No. 1072) it is amongst other things enacted that no cemetery or burial ground shall be established or opened in Victoria save with the approval of the Governor in Council; and that in case it shall appear to the Governor in Council that burials in any cemetery under any law relating to public cemeteries or in any other burial ground or place of burial whatsoever should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, the Governor in Council may, by an Order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, direct that after a time to be mentioned in such Order, not being less than three months from the date thereof, burials in such cemetery or burial ground or place of burial shall be discontinued wholly or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in the same or in any subsequent Order, and may from time to time postpone the time mentioned in such Order for the discontinuance of burials or otherwise vary any such Order, whether the time appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder or other operation of such Order shall or shall not have arrived: And whereas it appears to the Governor in Council that burials in the St. Kilda Cemetery, situate within the City of St. Kilda, should be discontinued, subject to the exceptions and qualifications herein-after mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that all burials in such cemetery shall be discontinued, except in allotments or land the right of burial in which has already been purchased from the trustees of such cemetery or shall be so purchased before the 31st day of December, 1900.

The Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; Williamstown District will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra, and all Government vessels which may be in Hobson's Bay during the currency of the contract; the Ararat, Beechworth, and Ballarat Districts will include the Lunatic Asylums, Gaols, Police Gaols, and Lock-ups at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of two miles from the Post Office.

The lock-ups at City Watch-House, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, King-street, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, St. Kilda-road, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District.

Samples of the sago, soaps, rice, teas, and sugars required at Yarra Bend, Kew, Sunbury, Ararat, and Ballarat can be seen at the respective lunatic asylums; and samples of the teas, sugars, and soaps required at Geelong, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Maryborough, and Sale can be seen on application to the governors of the respective gaols. Samples of the whole of the above-mentioned articles can also be seen at the offices of the Secretary to the Tender Board.

The prices must be expressed without alterations or erasures, in words as well as in figures, and the total amount of the tender stated.

Printed forms of tender, showing the estimated monthly consumption, and the conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne; and for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Maryborough, and Sale; and the Medical Superintendent, Lunatic Asylum, Sunbury, by whom also information will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received). Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders enclosed in an envelope, and having the words "Tender for" at (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, they must be prepaid, and addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good-coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Meat.—With the exception of meat for the Victorian Naval Forces at Williamstown, fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than 10 inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef. As regards meat for the Naval Forces at Williamstown, the fresh meat must be supplied in equal quantities from ribs, sirloin, and thick flanks, and, when the quantity admits, hind and fore quarters will be taken alternately; shins and sticking pieces to be removed from fore quarters; kidney suet and surplus bone from hind quarters; mutton to be delivered in sides; all kidney fat to be removed, and meat containing an undue proportion of fat will not be accepted.

7. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

9. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

10. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

11. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if after taking delivery of any stores or material he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons

named by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 11.

14. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 11.

15. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

16. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

17. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

18. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

19. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

20. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 19 of these conditions.

21. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

22. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate improperly with a prisoner.

23. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or Defence Department, or on account of other Governments, or for supplies to the aborigines; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

24. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as the case may be, may give two months' notice of the termination of the contract to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

25. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 23 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

26. Where specially indicated in the schedules no subletting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or

manufacture of the articles tendered for in these schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any other way in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in these schedules, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated in the schedules), and every such person shall be paid at the minimum wage specified in the schedules concerned, and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

A By-law of the Shire of Bellarine made under section 191, subsection (XIX.), of the *Local Government Act 1890* for regulating traffic and generally maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

**IN** pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bellarine order as follows:—

1. Throughout this by-law the word "machine" shall mean any vehicle, other than vehicles known as "perambulators," used for locomotion or carriage, whether driven by manual or pedal power or by any mechanical means; the word "propel" shall mean and include impel, or using or causing any machine to progress with any person thereon; and the word "driver" shall mean and include every person in charge of or propelling or using a machine; and words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular; and clause 2 of this by-law shall only apply within those parts of the said shire contained within the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—1st. All that portion of the said shire commencing at the south-east angle of the township of Portarlington at the junction of Mercer-street and Smythe-street; thence proceeding north along the east boundary line of Mercer-street to Port Phillip Bay; thence proceeding westerly along the shore of Port Phillip Bay to Sproat-street; thence proceeding southerly along the west boundary line of Sproat-street to the intersection of Sproat-street and Smythe-street; and thence proceeding easterly along the south boundary line of Smythe-street to the commencing point. 2ndly. All that other part of the said shire commencing at the north-west angle of the township of Drysdale at the

junction of the township with portion VI., parish of Bellarine; thence proceeding easterly 89° 47' to Wyndham-street; thence further easterly along the north side of Wyndham-street to the junction of Princess-street; thence proceeding southerly along the east side of Princess-street to the south-east angle of the township of Drysdale; thence along the south side of a public road forming the south boundary of the township of Drysdale; thence proceeding northerly along the west side of another public road forming the west boundary of Drysdale to the commencing point. 3rdly. All that other part of the said shire commencing at the intersection of Princess-street and Wyndham-street; thence proceeding northerly along the west side of a public road known as Glenholm-road to the south-west angle of portion XI., parish of Bellarine; thence proceeding along the north side of a public road to a point one chain north of the north-west angle of portion XLVII.; thence proceeding southerly along the east side of a public road to the junction with the Murradoe-road; thence along the south side of the Murradoe-road westerly to the north-east angle of the township of Drysdale.

2. No machine shall be propelled upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers except for the purpose of crossing such footway to enter premises abutting thereon.

3. No machine shall be propelled during the hours between sunset and sunrise unless a lamp shall be attached to the same so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which the machine is being moved, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of indicating the moving and position of such machine.

4. Every driver shall keep his machine upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, except as provided hereunder, and whenever he shall overtake or pass with such machine any vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along or across the carriage-way, he shall, within at least 50 yards distance from and before passing such vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, give audible warning of his coming by sounding a bell or whistle.

5. Every driver who overtakes or passes any other machine, or any vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden proceeding in the same direction as himself, shall keep his machine to the right or off side of the machine, vehicle, or animal being passed.

6. Every driver meeting or overtaking any horse or other beast of burden, whether drawing a vehicle or not, and such animal on such meeting or overtaking becoming restive or alarmed or censing to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall immediately dismount and cease propelling his machine, and shall so continue until such animal shall be removed or quietened.

7. Every driver offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction therefor to a penalty not exceeding £5.
