VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India, to our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Our Colony of Victoria, Greeting.

We do, by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, appoint you, the said Sir John Madden, to be during Our pleasure Our Lieutenant-Governor of Our Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said office belonging or appertaining.

And further, in case of the death, incapacity, or removal of Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Our said Colony, or of his departure from Our said Colony, We do hereby authorize and require you to administer the Government thereof, with all and singular the powers and authorities contained in Our Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the twenty-first day of February, 1879, constituting the office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our said Colony, or in any other Our Letters Patent adding to, amending, or substituted for the same, and according to such Instructions as Our said Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being hath already received from Us, and to such further Orders and Instructions as he or you may hereafter receive from Us or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and according to such Laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in Our said Colony.

Marriage Act 1853.

NOTICE TO CLERGYMEN AND ALL PERSONS HAVING IN THEIR POSSESSION OR CONTROL ANY REGISTERS OF BAPTISMS, MARRIAGES, OR BURIALS SOLEMNIZED IN THE DISTRICT OF PORT PHILLIP OR THE COLONY OF VICTORIA, BEFORE THE 18TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1853.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Marriage Act 1853*, the following section of that Act is published, and the attention of all persons mentioned in the section is directed to the obligation imposed on them by the provisions therein contained.

Marriage Act 1853.—No. 1582.

Section 31—

(1) In order that a permanent record may be kept of all public and private baptisms, marriages, and burials solemnized before the 18th day of January, 1853, it is hereby enacted that all persons having in their possession or control any registers or books of entries or register-books of baptisms, marriages, or burials solemnized in the district of Port Phillip or the colony of Victoria before the said date, shall before the expiration of six months after the commencement of this Act forward such registers or books of entries or register-books to the Government Statist, to be kept and retained in the office of the Government Statist. Provided however that any person having in his possession or control any such registers or books of entries or register-books may, instead of so forwarding the same, forward to the Government Statist a copy thereof, verified by the statutory declaration of such person as being a true and correct copy thereof, and such copy shall be deemed and taken to be *prima facie* evidence of all entries contained in any such registers or books of entries or register-books. On payment of a fee of Five shillings the person having possession of any such registers or books of entries or register-books shall at all reasonable times permit any other person to inspect any entry therein, and shall, if so requested, supply such other person with a certified copy of such entry.

(2) Every person who is guilty of a contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and, on conviction thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds in respect of each baptism, marriage, or burial, the register or book of entry or register-book of which, or a copy thereof verified as aforesaid, is not forwarded to the Government Statist pursuant to this section, and also to a further penalty of One pound for each and every month during which the provisions of this section are not complied with as to any such register or book of entry or register-book.

(3) A copy of this section shall be published in the *Government Gazette* at least once a month during the six months immediately following the commencement of this Act.

Factories and Shops Act.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act*, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Act*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF SANDS AND MCDUGALL LTD., SPENCER-STREET, MELBOURNE (ENVELOPE DEPARTMENT),

for a period of three weeks from the 13th June, 1899, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty-eight females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty-eight females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF MAY, 1899.

THE births of 51 boys and 59 girls, or in all of 110 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of May. Of these, 38 occurred in Ballarat East, 67 in Ballarat West, and 5 in Sebastopol; included were 7 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 120, viz., 57 of boys and 63 of girls.

The deaths registered in May numbered 72, viz., 46 of males and 26 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 38. In April, the recorded deaths numbered 67; in May, 1898, they numbered 85; in May, 1897, they numbered 65; in May, 1896, they numbered 82; in May, 1895, they numbered 86; in May, 1894, they numbered 83; in May, 1893, they numbered 75; in May, 1892, they numbered 60; in May, 1891, they numbered 66; in May, 1890, they numbered 79; and in May, 1889, they numbered 72.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 64 per cent.; females, 36 per cent.; under five years, 11 per cent.; over five years, 89 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 58 and 42 per cent.; under and over five years, 27 and 73 per cent. respectively.

Eighteen deaths, or 25 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz., Ballarat Hospital, 15; Benevolent Asylum, 3.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of May, separating those under from those over five years of age; also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease:—

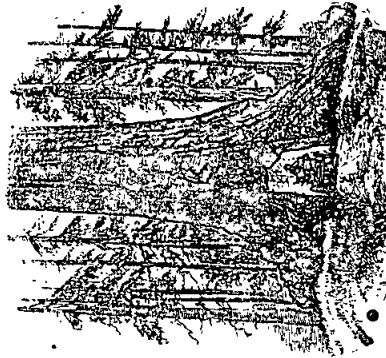

RUTHERGLEN WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION NO. 1.*

THE Commissioners of the Rutherglen Waterworks Trust, acting under the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. The ordinary meetings of the Trust shall be held on the second Tuesday in every month, at half-past Seven p.m., at the Municipal Chambers, Rutherglen. The Chairman may convene special meetings, and shall do so if requested by two commissioners in writing, provided two (2) clear days' notice in writing thereof be given to each Commissioner.

2. The business of the Trust at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors.

3. The first business of the meetings of the Trust shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; after confirmation such minutes shall be signed by the Chairman.

4. At the ordinary meetings of the Trust, after the confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business, viz.:

- (a) Reading and ordering on correspondence.
- (b) Reading and considering petitions.
- (c) Reading and ordering on reports.
- (d) Orders of the day arising out of former minutes, and any business the Chairman may bring before the meeting.
- (e) Motions of which notice shall have been given in writing.
- (f) Examination and passing of accounts.
- (g) General business.
- (h) Notices of motion.

5. No motion shall be proceeded with unless the Commissioner who gave notice thereof, or some other Commissioner duly authorized by him in writing, be present when called upon to proceed with the same. Notices of motion not so proceeded with shall be considered as having lapsed.

6. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall for that occasion be a member of such committee.

7. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but if lost another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any Commissioner to move another amendment thereon.

8. No person not being a Commissioner shall be permitted to address the Trust without the consent of the majority of the Trust then present.

9. Every Commissioner, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

10. The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

11. Any Commissioner may require the Secretary to take down the particular words used by a Commissioner on the same being uttered.

12. No Commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

13. Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in a discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

14. Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

15. No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice in writing of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not

greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

16. It shall be competent for the majority of the Trust to suspend at any meeting one or more of the Regulations for the management and conduct of business, except the purport of such suspension be the rescinding of any motion previously adopted.

17. The Chairman and Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same, and impressions only to be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman and Secretary.

18. No election to any vacant office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given by advertisement in some newspaper or newspapers approved of by the Trust, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

19. Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

20. Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the notice shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting Commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof, but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with the truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

21. The salary or allowance attached to any office or place at the disposal of the Trust shall, unless otherwise ordered by resolution of the Trust, be fixed before the Trust proceeds to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

22. All payments by the Trust shall be made by cheque on the order of the Commissioners, and all such cheques shall be signed by two Commissioners and countersigned by the Secretary.

Interpretation Clause.—The word "Chairman" shall, in all cases, signify the permanent Chairman of the Trust, or, in his absence, any Commissioner appointed to preside at any meeting of the Trust; the term "Trust" shall, in all cases, signify a quorum of the Trust.

PUBLIC HEALTH.

Section 125 of Act 1098.

Health Act 1890.
SHIRE OF MILDURA.
BY-LAW No. 4.

THE President, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Shire of Mildura, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, doth hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 4:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the surface of the ground.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. *Removal of refuse from houses.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in the case of the default of such occupier the Shire Council may remove the same at the expense of said owner and occupier to some place appointed by the Council.

4. *Receptacles for house refuse.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week; and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

5. *Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.*—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon once at least every fourth day; and in the case of the default of such occupier the Shire Council may remove the same at the expense of such occupier.

6. *Power to use refuse as manure.*—Nothing contained in the foregoing section shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on the premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the Shire Council, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. *Removal of refuse from places where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, soil, offal, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture from which offensive effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid the same may be removed by the Shire Council at the expense of the occupier or person above mentioned.

8. *Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.*—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed shall cause all blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in the proportion of one pound to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed.

9. *Construction of privies.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan of approved pattern for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed 3 cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the floor or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

10. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

11. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises, once at least in every week shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

12. *Removal of night-soil to be by properly constructed conveyances.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

13. *Hours within which night-soil may be removed.*—No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Twelve midnight and Five a.m., or such other time appointed by the Council, nor until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

14. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—Individual householders shall not contract for removal of night-soil or other refuse or offensive matter except in accordance with the by-laws and regulations of the Shire Council, and night-soil and other refuse or offensive matter shall only be deposited at the places set apart by the Shire Council for those purposes except by special permission of the said Council, and subject to such conditions as shall be determined on by the said Council when granting permission.

15. *Night-soil and refuse to be deposited so as not to be a nuisance.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

16. *Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere, to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than 6 inches in thickness.

17. *Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way or be likely to find their way into any drain or sewer.

18. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

19. *Cesspools not to be emptied into water used for drinking or domestic purposes.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool, or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way into any such water.

20. *Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of the notice given by the Shire Council, or by one of its officers.*

21. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep pigs or any other animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

22. *Animals not to be kept so as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

23. *Supply of water to slaughter-houses.*—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

24. *Drainage of new buildings.*—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

25. *Drainage of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards are unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

Health Act 1890.
SHIRE OF ALBERTON.
BY-LAW No. 13.

For keeping free from noxious matter yards, stables, places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, and other places of a like nature; for regulating the management of earth-closets and privies; and for regulating the removal and final deposit of night-soil and offensive matter.

THE Council of the Shire of Alberton, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and every other power enabling them in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said council, hereby make the following by-law, being by-law number thirteen of the said council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Port Albert, in the Shire of Alberton, within the boundaries herein described, that is to say:—All that piece or parcel of land in the colony of Victoria, containing, by admeasurement, One hundred and eighty acres, be the same more or less, situate in the parish of Alberton East, county of Buln Buln, being the land purchased by Alexander Davidson as lot one in pursuance of the proclamation of the 24th day of August, 1843, bounded on the west by the township reserve, being a line bearing north 37 chains; on the north by the township of Palmerston, being a line bearing east 52 chains and 50 links; and on the east and south by the harbor of Port Albert.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said township of Port Albert shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, or refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter removed as aforesaid, the said council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said township of Port Albert on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-house, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such soil, dung, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

6. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be properly and sufficiently ventilated, and shall be constructed so as to admit of the pan provided by the said council being placed and fitted beneath the seat in such manner as may effectually prevent the deposit elsewhere than in such pan of any filth which may from time to time fall or be cast through the aperture in such seat; and such privy building shall be constructed and placed so as to afford proper means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and the contents thereof. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

7. No person shall empty any such closet, privy, or place for reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, and approved of by the said council; and when a nightman is appointed by the said council, such nightman only shall be empowered to remove night-soil.

8. All night-soil or other offensive matter shall be removed to and be deposited in such places only as may be appointed by the said council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and be trenched into friable earth in a layer not exceeding 6 inches thick, and be covered over with at least 1 foot of clean earth.

9. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be abolished and, instead thereof, every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, of which the pans shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, with handles and a tight-fitting lid, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet; and there shall be one tight-fitting lid suitable for both pans.

10. The pans for such service shall be provided by the said council, and shall remain the property of the said council; and every occupier shall permit such pans to be placed in every such closet, and to be from time to time removed for emptying and cleansing as herein provided.

11. At least once in every week, or so much more frequently as the said council shall from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid and be removed in a suitable cart, and a thoroughly cleansed pan shall be left in its place.

12. The said council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil by the double-pan service as herein provided, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied; the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

13. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil; and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

14. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause every cesspool belonging thereto already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed, from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of 1 foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Four o'clock in the morning and Eleven o'clock in the morning; and provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient material sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

15. The occupier of any tenement within the said township of Port Albert in which any night-soil pan is in use shall pay to the said council, or to such person or persons as the said council may, by resolution, appoint to receive the same, such sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said council for emptying and removing the contents of each pan; such sum to be paid by quarterly instalments.

16. Stringent supervision will be exercised by the said council over all depôts for the disposal of night-soil.

17. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be permitted or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion to be paid not being less than Five shillings; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the said council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

For keeping free from noxious matter yards, stables, places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, and other places of a like nature; for regulating the management of earth-closets and privies; and for regulating the removal and final deposit of night-soil and offensive matter.

THE Council of the Shire of Alberton, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the

said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said council, hereby make the following by-law, being by-law number 11 of the said council (that is to say) :-

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to, and have operation in, the Township of Alberton, in the Shire of Alberton.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said Township of Alberton shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all filth, rubbish, or refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter removed as aforesaid the said council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

The occupier of any land in the said Township of Alberton on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-house, cow-yard, cattle shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of same so produced or accumulated shall amount to 1 cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such soil, dung, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid the same may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

6. No person shall construct, or cause to be constructed, any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be properly and sufficiently ventilated, and shall be constructed so as to admit of the pan provided by the said council being placed and fitted beneath the seat in such manner as may effectually prevent the deposit elsewhere than in such pan of any filth which may from time to time fall or be cast through the aperture in such seat; and such privy building shall be constructed and placed so as to afford proper means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and the contents thereof. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, of which the pans shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, with handles and a tight-fitting lid, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet, and there shall be one tight-fitting lid suitable for both pans.

Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause every cesspool belonging thereto already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of 1 foot from the top of the side walls or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Four o'clock in the morning and Eleven o'clock in the morning; and provided also that the contents of

any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient material sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

15. The occupier of any tenement within the said Township of Alberton in which any night-soil pan is in use shall pay to the said council, or to such person or persons as the said council may by resolution appoint to receive the same, such sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the said council for emptying and removing the contents of each pan, such sum to be paid by quarterly instalments.

16. Stringent supervision will be exercised by the said council over all depots for the disposal of night-soil.

17. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion to be paid not being less than Five shillings; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the said council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BY-LAW No. 5.

THE Council of the Shire of Wycheproof, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire in the Colony of Victoria, by virtue of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and every other power enabling the said Council in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Council, doth hereby make the following By-law No. 5 of the said Council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

4. All occupiers of houses or premises shall provide boxes or other receptacles for the temporary deposit of all house refuse, and no such refuse shall be swept, deposited, or emptied into any street, drain, or gutter running into any open channel of any street.

5. The occupier of any premises shall within 24 hours from the service of notice by an inspector remove all refuse so temporarily deposited as aforesaid, as also any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, and soil collected placed or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, shed, or place whatsoever to the depôt provided by the said Council for that purpose, and in case of the occupier neglecting to comply with such notice the council may itself carry out such removal at the expense of the occupier.

6. All earth closets, privies, cesspools, and places for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter shall be emptied, cleansed, and disinfected at such times so that the same shall always be clean and in no way a nuisance or injurious to health. Provided that the contents of any cess-pool, closet, privy, or place for the deposit of night soil shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., and provided also that such contents shall not be removed until such have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect same.

7. All buildings or structures or places used for keeping or holding pigs shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any such buildings or structures.

8. All buildings or structures or places used for keeping or holding pigs shall be regularly swept and kept perfectly clean, and shall within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed as may be in any such order so directed.

9. No pigs shall be kept in any sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered by any cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or allowed to wander in any public thoroughfare or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to public health.

10. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed 3 cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of

access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and contents thereof and emptying and cleansing the same. Every such pan shall be of galvanized iron or other approved material properly rivetted and soldered so as to be watertight, and provided with suitable and sufficient handles, and shall always be kept in good repair. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

11. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of such trade shall forthwith report, in writing, to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered or not registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger in the opinion of the council or officer of health no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

13. If any occupier or owner neglect or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this by-law, by neglecting or failing to remove any nuisance as hereinbefore stated, such nuisance may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier or owner.

14. In the interpretation of this by-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word person shall include a corporation.

15. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; and every inspector of the council shall and is hereby empowered to take proceedings against any person offending against any by-law of the council, as provided by section 37 of the *Health Act 1890*.

WHEREAS by section 25 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* (No. 1288) it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations for the purposes in the said section specified: And whereas by the *Acts Interpretation Act 1890* (No. 1058) it is among other things provided that where an Act passed after the commencement of the said *Acts Interpretation Act 1890* confers a power to make rules, regulations, or by-laws, the power shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be construed as including a power to rescind, revoke, amend, or vary the rules, regulations, or by-laws: And whereas by Orders in Council made the 26th day of September and the 2nd October, 1893, certain Regulations were made in connexion with the Natimuk and Goroke Railway Construction Trust for convening meetings of the Trust, and generally for regulating the conduct of the business of the said Trust: And whereas it is advisable to amend certain of the said Regulations so made, and to revoke others, and substitute therefor a new Regulation in place of the Regulations so revoked: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Acts hereinbefore referred to, doth make the Regulation following (that is to say):—

In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the Schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of

replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

14. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

16. It will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving three full calendar months' notice, in writing, to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made, and under no other circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract except in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, when the Government or the contractor, as the case may be, may give two months' notice, in writing, of the termination of the contract to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

17. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture of the clothing tendered for in this Schedule shall not exceed forty-eight per week; and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than £2 5s. per week for a man and £1 per week for a woman respectively; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which articles are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds) as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.
