CONTRACT FROM 1ST AUGUST, 1896, TO 30TH JUNE, 1901.

(All items to Sample.)

Orders will be issued from time to time for such articles as may be required, and contractor will be bound to complete the orders at the rate of not less than 100 garments every week under each of the contracts.

All the clothing must correspond in every particular with the standard patterns as regards shape, make, and workmanship. Machine sewing to be not less than nine or more than eleven stitches to the inch, and fellings to be seven stitches to the inch.

All garments are to be cut full to the sizes, and linings must fit easily. All pipings must show a regular width all round.

All garments for non-commissioned officers and rank and file must be supplied of such sizes as may be demanded on size rolls, and, in the case of tunics, jumpers, and trousers, must conform to the following scales of dimensions.

The Defence Department reserves to itself the right of altering the scales of dimensions from time to time.

All trousers to have the size, number, and the height, waist, and leg measurement of the man prominently marked on a ticket on the outside of the left hip. Stripes of trousers must run regularly down the leg, falling into the hollow of the foot. The cloth for the scarlet stripes must be obtained by the contractor of a quality equal to the stripes in the pattern garment.

All tunics, jumpers, and jackets to have the size, number, the height, breast, and waist measurements of the man prominently marked on a ticket inside.

All caps and other garments not specified above must be made to such dimensions as may be ordered, and have size and number on tickets, which are to be affixed on suitable and prominent places.

Contractor must, if called upon to do so, and without extra charge, measure all warrant officers, also the N.-C. officers and men of the V. E. for their uniforms, but such persons will attend on the contractor for that purpose. All such garments must fit properly.

All articles to sample.

The great-coats and capes are to be made in Victoria, and the contractor must provide everything necessary for the due fulfilment of the contract.

The lengths of the coats from the collar seam downwards, and the sizes of the men round the chest over the tunics for whom they are required, are shown on Schedule I, annexed hereto. Sleeve at wrist to have a full 3-in. turn-up, and the coats must be in trade proportions throughout, and the capes must be made to fit the coats.

RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION No 1.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1896* the Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. Place and time of meeting.—The place of meeting shall be at the office of the Trust, at the Shire Hall, Rushworth, and meetings shall be held on the first Monday in each month at the hour of Eight p.m. The Trust may hold special meetings, and the chairman of the Trust or any two or more commissioners may call a special meeting, but no such meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice in writing thereof at least be given to each commissioner.

2. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

3. Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to the accuracy of such minutes as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the

chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting if required by any commissioner present at such meeting.

4. Order of business at meetings.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof the order of business may be altered by a resolution to that effect:—

- I. Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
- II. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- III. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- IV. Presentation of reports of committees.
- V. Payments.
- VI. Ordinary business.
- VII. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- VIII. Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- IX. Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- X. Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

5. **Motions.**—All notices of motion shall be in writing, dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of any meeting of the Trust; or, if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then four clear days prior to the next meeting of the Trust; and the secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they shall be received.

6. **Notice of motion to be given.**—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion unless notice thereof shall have been given as prescribed by the last preceding clause.

7. **Resolution, how altered or revoked.**—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice, in writing, of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority, consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

8. **Petitions.**—No motion (except that for receiving the same) shall, unless under the most urgent circumstances be made on any petition or memorial or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

9. **Motions to be moved in order in motion book.**—Except by leave of the Trust motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. **Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.**—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of commissioner who gave notice of same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. **Mover of motion to be member of committee.**—The mover of any motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

12. **Order, &c., of debate.**—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in a discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. **Nature of motion to be stated.**—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

14. **Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.**—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

15. **Motion to be seconded.**—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. **Mover of motion.**—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. **Designation of commissioners.**—The commissioners in meeting of the Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

18. **Priority of commissioners.**—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. **Commissioners to rise in addressing Trust.**—Every commissioner, including the chairman, shall stand up whilst addressing the Trust.

20. **Commissioners not to speak a second time on same subject.**—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. **Points of order.**—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. **Commissioners not to digress, &c.**—No Commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. **Commissioners to apologize for disorderly, &c., expressions.**—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression, disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

24. **Commissioner called to order to sit down.**—A commissioner called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. **Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.**—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this regulation.

26. **Commissioner may demand documents.**—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

27. **Voting.**—The Trust shall vote by a show of hands, and the chairman shall, in taking the sense of the meeting, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the result thereof declared by him shall be entered in the minutes by the secretary.

28. **Divisions.**—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result thereof shall be declared by the chairman; and when such division takes place, the names of the commissioners voting in the division shall be recorded in the minutes of the said meeting, and any commissioner present not voting, not being disabled by law, shall be guilty of an offence.

29. **Motions, &c., to be in writing.**—If required by the chairman, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, and signed by the mover and seconder.

30. **Amendments.**—One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but if lost another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any commissioner to move another amendment thereon.

31. **Mover of motion to have right of reply.**—The mover of every original proposition but not of any amendment shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once upon the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

32. **Motion for adjournment.**—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for the adjournment of the Trust, but if on being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debate on the motion moved and seconded, or any order of the day may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

33. **Protests.**—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the notice shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof, but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with the truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

34. **Lapsed meetings.**—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion on notice.

35. **Lapsed orders of the day may be restored.**—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion on notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

36. **When petitions not to be presented.**—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day, and it shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

37. **Petitions to be in writing.**—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

38. **To be signed by petitioners.**—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

39. **No letters, &c., to be attached.**—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

40. **Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.**—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

41. **Appointments, &c., of officers.**—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the waterworks district inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

42. **Salaries of officers.**—The salary or allowance attached to any office or place at the disposal of the Trust shall, unless otherwise ordered by resolution of the Trust, be fixed before the Trust proceeds to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

43. **Expense of preparing security.**—The cost of preparing the security to be given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract shall in all cases, unless otherwise ordered by a resolution of the Trust, be borne by the person providing the same.

44. **Duties of secretary.**—The secretary shall, under the direction of the chairman or of his substitute, at any meeting of the commissioners, keep and record the minutes of all meetings of the commissioners or of any committee of the commissioners. He shall conduct all correspondence by and in behalf of the Trust, and he shall, under the direction of the commissioners, conduct all the ordinary business of the Trust, and should any urgent business transpire during the interval elapsing between meetings of the commissioners, he shall under the direction of the chairman transact such business.

45. Duties of treasurer.—The treasurer shall receive all moneys on behalf of the Trust, and shall pay all such into the bank appointed by the commissioners within 48 hours after they shall come into his hands.

46. Payments.—All payments by the Trust shall be made by cheques on the order of the commissioners, and all such cheques shall be signed by two commissioners and countersigned by the Secretary.

47. Common seal.—The secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of its common seal, and shall be responsible for the same, and impressions are only to be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the chairman and secretary.

48. Suspension of regulations.—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained herein may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of two-thirds of the commissioners present at any meeting.

49. Penalty.—Any person guilty of an offence or a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

LEAGHUR AND MEERING IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION FOR THE SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER.

THE Commissioners of the Leaghur and Meering Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following regulations:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. The form of measurement shall be determined by the Trust.

2. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for cereals and crops of all kinds, and Four and a half pence (4½d.) per inch per acre for grass land. The minimum quantity of water to be supplied at each watering shall be 3 inches per acre for cereals and crops of all kinds, and 2 inches per acre for grass lands.

3. Payment for water delivered from the works of the Trust must be made in all cases within one month after delivery of such water.

4. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct, and the delivery of water shall be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.

5. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by persons authorized by the Trust, and no person who is not so authorized shall under any circumstances (unless he obtain permission from the chairman of the Trust) open any such outlet or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.

6. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of the Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-holders, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

7. Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding, for any offence, the sum of Ten pounds.

8. That the regulation for the sale and distribution of water made by this Trust on the 17th day of October, 1898, shall be, and the same is, hereby repealed.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of July, 1899.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order repeal Chapter VI. (*Limiting the total Number of Hours in the Week during which certain persons may be employed, and for providing a Weekly half-holiday for all persons in certain Shops and for waitresses*) of the Regulations by Orders dated respectively the 21st day of September, 1896, and the 24th day of December, 1896, and doth make the following Regulation instead thereof (that is to say):—

REGULATION.

CHAPTER VI.—LIMITING THE TOTAL NUMBER OF HOURS IN THE WEEK DURING WHICH CERTAIN PERSONS MAY BE EMPLOYED, AND FOR PROVIDING A WEEKLY HALF-HOLIDAY FOR ALL PERSONS IN CERTAIN SHOPS, AND FOR WAITRESSES.

1. Except as hereinafter provided, no person under the age of sixteen years, and no woman or girl shall be employed in any shop of any of the classes included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, for more than sixty hours, excluding meal times, in any one week, and no waitress in a restaurant, coffee palace, hotel, eating-house, or fish and oyster shop, shall be employed in any such place for more than sixty hours, excluding meal times, in any one week.

2. Any such person under the age of sixteen years or woman or girl or waitress may, with the written consent of the Chief Inspector, be employed in any shop or place mentioned in the next preceding clause, for any time not exceeding seventy hours in any one week, provided that the total number of weeks in any one year in which in any such shop or place, any such person, woman, girl, or waitress is so employed shall not exceed six.

3. Every occupier of a shop of any of the classes included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* shall permit each and every person whomsoever employed for hire or reward in any such shop, or at any work in connexion with such shop, to have and take a half-holiday from the hour of Two o'clock in the afternoon on some Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, or Saturday in each and every week.

4. Every keeper, proprietor, or occupier of a restaurant, coffee palace, hotel, eating-house, or fish and oyster shop shall permit each and every waitress employed on the premises of which he is such keeper, proprietor, or occupier to have and take a half-holiday from the hour of Two o'clock in the afternoon on some Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, or Saturday in each and every week.
