ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Five hundred and eighty-four thousand nine hundred and ninety-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine and One thousand nine hundred."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and in the sixty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

AMENDED REGULATIONS FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF THE SUM OF £1,000 GRANTED UNDER ACT 62 VICT. No. 1566, TO ASSIST IN DEVELOPING PIGMENTS.

THE Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 4th day of July, 1899, rescinded the Regulations for the expenditure of the sum of £1,000, granted under the *Railway and Public Works Loan Application Act 1898* (62 Vict. No. 1566), to assist in developing Pigments, made by the Order dated the 7th day of November, 1898, and has made the following Regulations in lieu thereof, viz.:-

REGULATIONS.

- All applications for advances under these Regulations shall be made in writing to the Minister of Mines.
- Such application shall contain the following particulars:-
 - The precise locality of the proposed operations.
 - The nature of the proposed operations, and whether any and if any what machinery is erected or intended to be erected and approximate cost thereof.
 - How the land upon which such proposed operations are to be carried on is held by the applicant or applicants.
 - The names in full of the applicant or applicants.
 - The purpose for which the advance is applied for, and whether for erection of machinery or working the deposit, and any further information which may be required by the Minister.
- Every such application shall be referred by the Minister to the Government Geologist or other professional officer for a report thereon. Such report shall be made after a personal examination of the land on which such applicant or applicants propose to carry on such operations, and shall-
 - Fully describe the character of such land and if the advance be for working the deposit, the formations contained therein.
 - State whether, in the opinion of the Government Geologist or officer making such report, there is a reasonable probability of such operations proving to be of a remunerative character, and shall give reasons and grounds for such opinions.
 - State whether the machinery, working plant, and appliances erected or to be erected are of a character and description properly adapted to the proposed operations; and
 - Give any further or other information which the Minister may require.
- Before any advance be made under these Regulations a first mortgage over the freehold or leasehold land held and a Bill of Sale over the machinery erected thereon shall be given by the applicant or applicants, or if the circumstances of the case will only so permit a Bill of Sale only over the machinery wherever the same may be erected, shall be given by the applicant or applicants with such other security or securities (if any) which the Minister may require, and such advance shall bear interest at the rate of 3½ per centum per annum, payable half-yearly on the 1st of January and the 1st July in each and every year.
- All liabilities in the first instance must be defrayed by the person or persons who have obtained such advance, the Government to refund one-half of the expenditure upon receipt of approved vouchers.
- Monetary assistance granted by the Government shall not exceed one half the amount actually expended by the company or individual receiving such assistance.

LAND EXCEPTED FROM OCCUPATION.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 4th day of July, 1899, rescinded the Order in Council made under the provisions of section 17 of the *Mines Act 1890* on the 31st day of October, 1898, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th November, 1898, excepting from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence or business, under any miner's right or business licence, certain land at Corindhap, and in lieu thereof has, in pursuance of the provisions of section 11 of the *Mines Act 1897*, excepted from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence or business under any miner's right or business licence, the land hereinafter described, viz.:-

CORINDHAP.—All that piece or parcel of land in the colony of Victoria, county of Grenville, parish and township of Corindhap, and containing by admeasurement one acre and four perches, be the same more or less: Commencing at the western angle of the block, and bounded by the southern side of main road from Rokewood to Ballarat; bearing N. 53° 28' E. four chains ninety-two links; and thence by lines bearing S. 26° E. five chains fifteen links; and N. 60° 55' W. four chains fifty-seven links, more or less, to the point of commencement. The block is connected with the north-west angle of allotment 4 of section 1, township of Corindhap, in the following manner, viz.:- Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 4, section 1, township of Corindhap; thence along the southern side of the main road from Rokewood to Ballarat, bearing N. 53° 28' E. fourteen chains eighty five links and a half to the northern angle of the block.

VICTORIAN NAVAL AND MILITARY FORCES.—ALTERATION OF FINANCIAL AND STORE REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of July, 1899.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Financial and Store Regulations for the Victorian Naval and Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART VII.—STORES.

Section III.—Allowance of Ammunition and Stores for Instructional Purposes.

Paragraph 208 is cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—

208. The subjoined table gives the proportion of projectiles and charges for the following guns for military purposes.

The proportion of projectiles herein laid down will be maintained for the total number of guns of each nature in a district, but the number of each description of projectile for individual guns will be decided by the General Officer Commanding according to the relative importance of the position of such gun and the purpose for which its fire would most probably be required in the event of an attack, provided that the total rounds per gun is adhered to.

The expenditure for practice is to be regulated so as to bring the quantity on hand into accord with the same.

REGULATION OF FANCY GOODS AND TOY SHOPS IN THE CITY OF PRAHRAN.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district, or any specified part of such district, for, amongst other things, permitting shops of any particular class not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, on obtaining a licence to keep open after the hours mentioned in the said Factories and Shops Acts, and during such hours as shall be specified in such licence, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such

class within such district: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the municipal district of the City of Prahran all fancy goods and toy shops (such shops being shops not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* aforesaid) may be permitted, on obtaining a licence, to keep open until Ten o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week, and until Eleven o'clock on the evening of Saturday in each week: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation (that is to say):—

It shall be lawful for any fancy goods and toy shop within the municipal district of the City of Prahran to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until Ten o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until Eleven o'clock, on obtaining a licence to keep open during such hours from the Chief Inspector of Factories.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1899.

THE births of 55 boys and 51 girls, or in all of 106 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of June. Of these, 43 occurred in Ballarat East, 55 in Ballarat West, 5 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 7 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 110, viz., 51 of boys and 59 of girls.

The deaths registered in June numbered 68, viz., 39 of males and 29 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 38. In May, the recorded deaths numbered 72; in June, 1898, they numbered 73; in June, 1897, they numbered 55; in June, 1896, they numbered 70; in June, 1895, they numbered 73; in June, 1894, they numbered 67; in June, 1893, they numbered 67; in June, 1892, they numbered 72; in June, 1891, they numbered 57; in June, 1890, they numbered 65; and in June, 1889, they numbered 50.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Eighteen deaths, or 26 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 10; Benevolent Asylum, 5; lunatic asylum, 3.

By-Law No. 28.

A By-law to prevent the danger from the Driving of Vehicles at night without Light in the Borough of Geelong West.

WHEREAS by the 191st section of the *Local Government Act 1890*, power is given to any municipality to make by-laws for the suppression of nuisances. And whereas the driving of vehicles at night without light is a nuisance by reason of the danger thereby caused to wayfarers, and it is therefore necessary to prevent and suppress the same. Now therefore we the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

1. Any person who between sunset and the following sunrise shall, in upon or along any of the roads or streets within the Borough of Geelong West, drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of persons, without having a good and serviceable carriage-lamp securely fixed and properly lighted at each side of the front of such vehicle, shall, for every such offence, upon conviction thereof before one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

2. The driver of any waggon, cart, or dray (whether such waggon, cart, or dray be upon springs or otherwise) who shall drive same, whether for hire or otherwise, in upon or along any street, road, or thoroughfare, or place used as such, within the limits of the Borough of Geelong West, between any sunset and before sunrise of the following morning, shall carry a lamp or lantern properly and sufficiently lighted and attached to or suspended from the off side of such waggon, cart, or dray in such manner as to be plainly visible to the driver of any vehicle proceeding along the same street, thoroughfare, or place in a contrary direction to that in which such waggon, cart, or dray shall be proceeding, and any person who shall be driving such waggon, cart, or dray without having such lamp or lantern properly and sufficiently lighted and exhibited as aforesaid shall, for every such offence, upon conviction thereof before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

BOROUGH OF GEELONG WEST.
By-Law No. 29.

A By-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 29, for the regulation and government of drivers of bicycles, tricycles, and other velocipedes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

1. Throughout this by-law the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or velocipede.

2. A person shall not drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers; provided, however, that a machine may be taken across any footway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted, and kept lighted, as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever any such person shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep such machine at a distance not less than six (6) feet on the right or off side of such vehicle or horse or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.

5. In every case where a person driving or riding a machine meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall, on such meeting, become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such horse or other beast of burden, the person driving or riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

6. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine along or across any street or any other public thoroughfare furiously or negligently or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of or injure any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such machine is being driven, ridden, or impelled.

7. No person shall ride, drive, or impel a machine along any street or any other public thoroughfare in such manner in such order that more than three machines shall be travelling side by side in the same direction, except when such machines shall form part of a duly authorized parade or procession.

8. No person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall proceed at a greater speed than ten miles per hour upon or along any street or public place, nor shall proceed at a greater speed than five miles per hour upon, over, or along any crossing.

9. No person whilst riding, driving, or impelling a machine through any street shall ride with his feet off the pedals, or with his hands off the handle-bars, or otherwise ride the machine carelessly or negligently, or adopt the practice generally known as "coasting," but shall so ride, drive, or impel the machine in such a manner that he shall at all times retain full control thereof.

10. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
