### PROCLAMATION

**W**HEREAS by the *Australasian Federation Enabling Act 1896*, and the *Australasian Federation Enabling Act 1899*, it is among other things enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may make Regulations prescribing the mode of submitting to the electors the acceptance or rejection of the Constitution as proposed to be amended, and generally for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions of the said Acts as relate to Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, pursuant to the powers contained in the said Acts, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations made for the purposes aforesaid, and dated the 7th day of July, 1899, that is to say:—

**REGULATION.**

It shall be lawful for the Returning Officer, before forwarding to the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly as required by clause 26 of the Regulations made on the 7th day of July, 1899, pursuant to the *Australasian Federation Enabling Act 1896* and the *Australasian Federation Enabling Act 1899* the sealed parcels containing the rolls used at the polling, to break the seals of and open such parcels and make a record from the rolls therein contained of the names, numbers on the roll, and addresses of all persons who shall have voted at the polling for the acceptance or rejection of the Constitution.

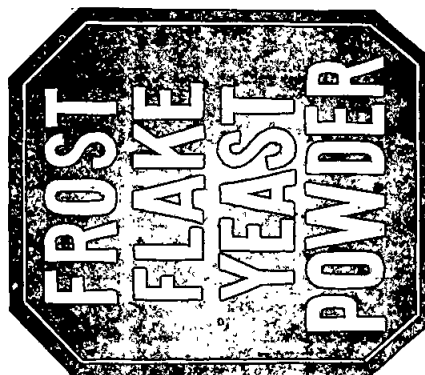

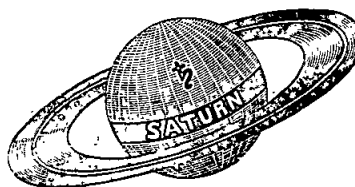

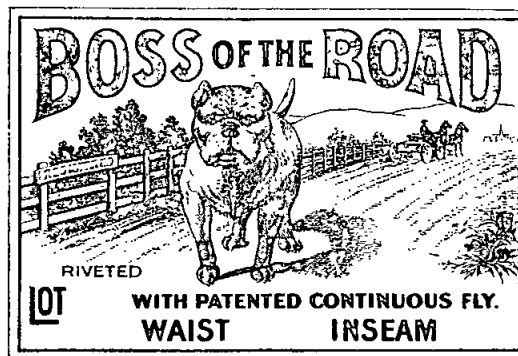

## GIPPSLAND LAKES.—LIGHTS.—ENTRANCE TO LATROBE RIVER.

Referring to Notice to Mariners dated 18th September, 1889, it is hereby notified that on and after 1st September, 1899, the present white and red light will be discontinued, and in lieu thereof two (2) leading lights, consisting of a high and low light, will be exhibited from lamp-posts situated on the northern bank of the Latrobe River, and 668 feet apart. **RULES AND RATES FOR THE HIRING OF THE 50-TON CRANE ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE RIVER YARRA AND THE 15-TON STEAM TRAVELLING CRANE AT THE DOCKYARD, WILLIAMSTOWN.**

THE Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 17th day of July, 1899, rescinded all previously made Rules and Schedules of Rates for the hiring of the 50-ton crane on the south side of the River Yarra, and the 15-ton travelling crane at the dockyard, Williamstown, and in lieu thereof has made the following Rules and Schedules of Rates for the hiring of such cranes, that is to say:—

**RULES FOR THE HIRING OF THE 50-TON CRANE ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE RIVER YARRA, AND THE 15-TON STEAM TRAVELLING CRANE, DOCKYARD, WILLIAMSTOWN.**

1. Any person desirous of hiring either of the cranes must make application to be registered on the form to be obtained from the Officer in Charge of the Ports and Harbors, such application to be lodged between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on week days, and 9 a.m. and noon on Saturdays, which will be duly registered in order of receipt.

2. With application for registration, and before registration is made, a deposit of £2 shall be paid to the Officer in Charge of Ports and Harbors, which sum shall be allowed as part payment of crane rates, provided such rates shall be settled within seven (7) days after delivery of the account for same, otherwise such deposit shall be liable to forfeiture, and the dues to be paid in full.

3. Ships requiring the cranes and for which deposit has been paid shall have prior claim to use of wharf abreast of cranes so long as they are employing the cranes.

4. Should any vessel not be in a position to use the cranes at such times as may be specified by the Officer in Charge of the Ports and Harbors, the term of such vessel will lapse, and fresh application for registration must be made, the deposit fee being liable to be forfeited, subject to the decision of the Honorable the Commissioner of Trade and Customs; and the applicant will be responsible for any expenses already incurred in getting the cranes ready for work unless the inability to use the cranes shall have occurred through stress of weather or other circumstances which the Officer in Charge of the Ports and Harbors shall determine, when such vessel may retain her position upon the register without forfeiture of the deposit.

5. The working day shall consist of eight (8) hours between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. For every hour earlier or later than the fixed working day Fifteen shillings (15s.) is to be paid in addition to the rates.

6. The Department of Trade and Customs accepts no responsibility in regard to these cranes when in use by the hirer, and the persons using the crane when hired on behalf of the hirer are to be deemed the servants of the latter, and not of the Department.

7. The hirer shall be responsible for, and make good any damage sustained by, the cranes when in use.

### REGULATION OF FANCY GOODS AND TOY SHOPS, CITY OF PRAHRAN, RESCINDED.

It shall be lawful for any fancy goods and toy shop within the municipal district of the City of Hawthorn to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until Ten o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until Eleven o'clock, on obtaining a licence to keep open during such hours from the Chief Inspector of Factories.

All shops in the Township of Tallangatta, and within a radius of one mile of the Post Office, situate in Towong-road, in the said township within the municipal district of the Shire of Towong (other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1890) shall be closed on Saturday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1891 (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the Land Act 1892, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the Government Gazette of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Colac has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate certain roads in the parish of Newlingrook in the said shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the roads defined in the following descriptions to be public highways (that is to say):—

The births of 1,162 children, viz., 585 boys and 577 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. The number was, it will be observed, 113 more than in June, 1898, but slightly exceeded that recorded for the month during the years 1894, 1896, and 1897, although much fewer than in any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 165 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 191 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in June numbered 548, viz., 285 of males and 263 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 614, or by 112 per cent., as against only 60 per cent. in June, 1898, and 114 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 112 fewer than in June, 1896—when the mortality was exceptionally high—and fewer than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years, except 1894; it was also 72 less than the average of June during the last ten years, or 84 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 30.09 and of deaths registered to 14.19 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1898 of 27.80 and 17.43 respectively, and during the last ten years of 35.03 and 16.42 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 32.45 and 17.58.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 63.8° on the 20th, and the lowest was 34.6° on the 18th. The mean temperature of the month (48.5°) was 2.4° below the average, and was the sixth lowest temperature recorded for the month since, 1860—the lowest being 46.5° in June, 1878. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.6°) took place on the 19th, and the least range (2.7°) on the 21st. The mean daily range was 12.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.396 inches on the 16th, and the lowest was 29.520 inches on the 7th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.962 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on fifteen days, the amount being 3.04 inches, which was higher than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years, except 1893, and nearly an inch above the average during that period.

Fog occurred on six days during the month.

The mean humidity of the month was 86.1.

Males contributed 52 per cent. and females 48 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 22 per cent. to that mortality, as against 27 per cent. in June, 1898; 25 per cent. in June, 1897; 25 per cent. in June, 1896; 21 per cent. in June, 1895; 28 per cent. in June, 1894; and 35 per cent. in June, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 87, as compared with 86 in June, 1898. The rate of infantile mortality was exceptionally low, being only 7.5 per 1,000 births, registered in the month under review, as compared with 82 in June, 1898; 93 in June, 1897; 87 in June, 1896; 72 in June, 1895; 85 in June, 1894; 95 in June, 1893; 84 in June, 1892; 91 in June, 1891; 81 in June, 1890; and 119 in June, 1889.

Sixty-three persons—as against 82 in June, 1898—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a farmer, aged 76, died of typhoid fever; two females each aged 76, of valvular disease and thrombosis respectively; a gentleman, aged 76, of heart disease; two females, each aged 76, of pneumonia and calculus respectively; a miller, aged 76, of cystitis; a gentleman, aged 77, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a gardener, aged 77, of pneumonia; a miner, aged 78, of rheumatism; a tailor, aged 78, of cancer; a housekeeper, aged 78, of apoplexy; a boardinghouse-keeper and a nurse, each aged 78, of pneumonia; a carpenter, aged 78, of nephritis; a gentleman, aged 79, of diarrhoea; a labourer, aged 79, of cancer; a gentleman and a female, each aged 79, of heart disease; a cabinetmaker, aged 79, of bronchitis; two females, each aged 79, of pneumonia and nephritis respectively; a female, aged 80, of cancer, a law clerk, aged 80, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 80, of heart disease; a female, aged 80, of inflammation of the lungs; a medical practitioner and a female, each aged 81, of heart disease; a female, aged 81, and a labourer, aged 82, of bronchitis; a female, aged 82, of biliary colic; a park ranger, aged 82, of dropsy; two females, each aged 83, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 83, of bronchitis; a pensioner, aged 83, a farmer and a butcher, each aged 84, of cerebral hæmorrhage and heart disease respectively; a farmer and a brickmaker, each aged 87, of syncope; two females, each aged 88, and a carpenter, aged 89, of heart disease; a builder, aged 91, of bronchitis; three females, aged 76, 76, and 78, respectively, a labourer, aged 79, a farmer and a labourer, each aged 80, a gentleman, aged 81, a farmer, aged 85, a barrister, aged 87, and five females, aged 88, 88, 89, 89, and 92 respectively, of old age.

Twenty-two of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 21 in June, 1898—were from external causes, of which 20 were set down to accident, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A jockey, aged 32, died of injuries, through being thrown against a post, whilst riding in a race; a labourer, aged 14, of injuries, caused through being struck by a revolving shaft; a boy, aged 15, of meningitis, having been struck by a rifle rod; a labourer, aged 14, of injuries, the result of a fall down a lift well; an artist, aged 60, of concussion of the brain, caused by a fall; a female, aged 27, of hæmorrhage, from a wound in the throat, the result of a fall on a teapot which she was carrying, whilst intoxicated; three male children, aged 11 months, 3 years, and 3 years respectively; and a female, aged 66, of burns; two female children, aged 1 and 2 years respectively, of scalds; a female child, aged 1 year, of phosphorus poisoning; a female child, aged 18 months, was accidentally drowned in a tub of water; three persons were "found drowned," viz.:—a farmer, aged 65, in the River Yarra, and a fireman, aged 29, and a customs officer, aged 39, in Hobson's Bay; a farmer, aged 40, was suffocated by food; and two male infants, aged 5 and 10 weeks respectively were overlied. The suicidal deaths were those of a labourer, aged 67, who cut his throat; and a female, aged 24, who poisoned herself with cyanide of potassium.

One hundred and forty-eight deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—60 in the Melbourne, 15 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 6 in the Women's, 9 in the Children's, 1 in the Homœopathic, and 7 in the Austin Hospitals; 15 in the Metropolitan and 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 10 in the Immigrants' Home; 8 in the Benevolent Asylum; 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 2 in the Protestant Refuge; 1 in the Deaf and Dumb Asylum; and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 123, of which 70, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 53, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 87 were under one year of age, 19 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 425. Of these 215, or 51 per cent., were males, and 210, or 49 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 31 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 19 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 41 were between sixty and sixty-five, 43 were between sixty-five and seventy, 54 were between seventy and seventy-five, 26 were between seventy-five and eighty, 19 were between eighty and eighty-five, 16 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 2 were between ninety and ninety-five.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding month last year, deaths from zymotic diseases diminished by 61, those from constitutional diseases by 39, those from developmental diseases by 9, those from local diseases by 9; whereas those from ill-defined causes alone showed an increase, viz., of 5. In the zymotic class deaths from measles fell from 41 to nil, those from influenza from 14 to 8, from diphtheria from 12 to 6, and from syphilis (chiefly congenital) from 8 to 2; but, on the other hand, deaths from whooping-cough rose from nil to 5. In the constitutional class there was a decrease under cancer from 44 to 29, under phthisis from 65 to 38, and under diabetes from 9 to 4; but an increase under rheumatism from nil to 5, and scrofula, tuberculosis, &c., from 8 to 12. In the developmental class the chief variation was a reduction in the number of deaths from old age from 30 to 20. In the local class, although there was a slight falling-off on the whole, considerable fluctuations occurred in some of the sub-classes; thus, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system rose from 57 to 81, from those of the digestive system from 35 to 46, and from those of the generative system from nil to 7; whereas deaths from diseases of the respiratory system fell from 118 to 83, and from those of parturition from 5 to 1. In the sub-class comprising diseases of the digestive system the most marked increases occurred under enteritis, viz., from 7 to 14, and under obstruction of the intestines from 1 to 7.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899, and the first six months of 1899, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from diphtheria during the last six months, and from typhoid fever in the last month, was below the average.

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE SHIRE OF CASTLE DONNINGTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112, section 388) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Castle Donnington has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making streets within the Township of Lake Boga, in the said Shire, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the Township of Lake Boga, in the Shire of Castle Donnington aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :-

No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the Chinese Act 1890 aforesaid for a period of three years from the date hereof, that is to say:—
