EXAMINATION FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1900.

IT is hereby notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 1st August, 1900, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 2nd July, 1900, an application on the prescribed form, accompanied by a list of the subjects in which the candidate desires to be examined.

No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.
- (ii.) That he had attained the age of 21, and had not attained the age of 23, on the first day of the year in which the examination is held.

[N.B.—In the case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or, should he reside in a Native State, by the highest political officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]

- (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.
- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.

Medical Act 1890.—Part III.

THE PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.—ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS FOR PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION FOR REGISTRATION OF PHARMACEUTICAL CHEMISTS.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the Medical Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1118) the Pharmacy Board of Victoria is empowered, subject to confirmation by the Governor in Council, to make, alter, or rescind regulations for the purpose of carrying the said Part of the said Act into effect: And whereas on the 3rd day of November, 1890, the Governor in Council confirmed certain regulations for, amongst other things, prescribing subjects for the preliminary examination under the said Part of the said Act for the registration of pharmaceutical chemists: And whereas the Pharmacy Board of Victoria has rescinded Regulation No. 41 of such regulations, and has made the subjoined regulation in lieu thereof: His Excellency the Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 31st day of July, 1899, confirmed such rescission and such substituted regulation, which is set out hereunder, that is to say:—

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION CERTIFICATE.

Every person must, before he enter into articles of agreement to be an apprentice within the meaning of section 8, sub-section (4), of the Medical Act 1890, pass a preliminary examination before the Board or before some person appointed by it in that behalf in the following five subjects:—

Latin.—Grammar and translation, De Bello Gallico, Book I.; translation of simple sentences from English into Latin.

English.—Grammar and composition.

Arithmetic.—First four rules simple and compound vulgar and decimal fractions and simple and compound proportion. Thorough knowledge of the British and metrical system of weights and measures.

Geometry.—The first book of Euclid.

Algebra.—So far as simple equations.

(Quality of handwriting to be taken into account in awarding marks.) And obtain a certificate that he has passed in the same from the Board or from the person examining, as the case may be. The fee to be paid for such examination shall be One guinea. This Regulation shall come into force on and after the 1st March, 1900.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF JOHN CONNELL & CO. PROPRIETARY LTD., BOURKE-STREET, MELBOURNE (TEA PACKING DEPARTMENT),

for a period of four weeks from the 3rd August, 1899, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than ten females or more than one boy under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said ten females and one boy under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings and Twelve shillings respectively per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Six pence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

And whereas application has been made by the minister of a religious denomination styled "The Reformed Presbyterian Church of Ireland" to be registered as a minister entitled to celebrate marriages under the said Act: And whereas it appears after due inquiry to be expedient that such religious denomination should be declared to be a religious denomination for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order declare

THE REFORMED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF IRELAND

to be a religious denomination for the purposes of the *Marriage Act 1898* aforesaid.

No. 1156) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for prescribing rates of charges for the use of the water supplied from any works constructed under the authority of Division 2 of the said Part of the said Act, and the manner and conditions in and upon which such water shall be used, and for determining the limits of the district to be rated for any such works, and for making and levying a water rate upon all or some of the lands and tenements within such district (except hospitals, benevolent institutions, buildings used exclusively for public charitable purposes, churches, chapels, and other buildings used exclusively for public worship, the dwellings of ministers of religious denominations, and buildings used as schools and receiving aid from the Government or otherwise of a public character), and for fixing the amount of such water rate, and the mode and conditions of levying and collecting the same, and generally for any or all of the purposes for which the Board of Land and Works is empowered by Division 1 of the said Part of the said Act to make by-laws relating to water supply: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the valuation of lands and tenements within the Castlemaine and Bendigo (Sandhurst) District (Item 1 of the Seventh Schedule to the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid), for the purpose of making and levying a water rate during the financial year 1899-1900, shall be the valuation of such lands and tenements during the municipal year 1898-9 by the corporation or council of any town, borough, or shire in which such lands or tenements are situated.

**CHURCH OF ENGLAND, WOOD'S POINT.—
 POWER TO DISPOSE OF SITE.**

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England, in the Diocese of Melbourne, in Victoria, under the provisions of the *Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the 31st day of July, 1899, and the following is the form in which such Statement of Trusts has been allowed:—

Description of land.—Firstly: All that piece or parcel of land, containing one rood fifteen perches, situated in the county of Wonnangatta, township of Wood's Point, being allotments four and nine of section fifteen: Commencing at the north angle of allotment four; bounded thence by Bridge-street bearing south fifty-nine degrees fourteen minutes east one chain; thence by allotments five and eight bearing south thirty degrees forty-six minutes west three chains eighty links; thence by McDougal-street bearing north fifty-nine degrees fourteen minutes west one chain; and thence by allotments ten and three bearing north thirty degrees forty-six minutes east three chains eighty links to the point of commencement.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To be paid to the Bishop or administrator aforesaid, to be applied to such purposes of the Church of England, in the Diocese of Melbourne, as may by such Bishop or administrator, acting on the advice of the Council of the Diocese, be from time to time deemed desirable.
