LICENCES TO PERSONS NOT BEING SUBSCRIBERS TO A TELEPHONE EXCHANGE TO USE TELE-PHONES OF SUBSCRIBERS.

THE Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 16th day of August, 1899, made the following Regulations governing the issue of licences to persons not being subscribers to a Telephone Exchange to use the telephone of a subscriber, viz.—

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

(1) Persons not being subscribers to a Telephone Exchange may, with the concurrence of a subscriber, be granted a licence by the Postmaster-General to use such subscriber's telephone.

(2) The subscriber whose telephone is used by any such person (hereimafter termed a licensee) shall pay in advance a fee of £2 per annum to the Postmaster General for every such licence.

(3) The licensee's name will appear in the Telephone Directory opposite the number of the subscriber whose telephone he uses.

(4) The subscriber and licensee must make their own arrangements as to calling a licensee when wanted, and as to the conditions under which the licensee may enter the subscriber's premises for the purpose of using the telephone.

(5) The number of licensees in connexion with any one subscriber's telephone shall be limited to six.

(6) The application for a licence must be forwarded to the Postmaster-General by the subscriber whose telephone it is desired to use, and all notices of discontinuance must be forwarded in the same manner.

(7) The Postmaster-General shall have absolute power to refuse to grant a licence and to cancel a licence so granted at any time should he so determine.

(8) The granting of a licence shall in no way bind the Postmaster-General to guarantee to a licensee the use of the subscriber's telephone referred to in such licence, and no responsibility will be accepted by the Postmaster-General in respect thereto.

Commencing at a point at the intersection of Bull-street and Pall Mall in the said city; thence along Pall Mall to McCrac-street; thence along McGrae-street to the White Hills-road; thence along that road to Napier-street, White Hills, in the said city, to its intersection with Napoleon-crescent, near the Botanical Gardens.

Commencing at a point opposite the Town Hall in the Borough of Eaglehawk, at the junction of the Mount Korong-road and the Sailor's Gully-road; thence along the Sailor's Gully-road to the terminus at Darling-street in the said borough.

Tranway where crosses Railway to be under control of Commissioners of Railway.

That the transway to be constructed upon so much of the said route as crosses the Victorian Railway line in McCrae-street shall be under the absolute control of and be subject to all such regulations and orders as may from time to time be made by the Commissioners of Railways, who shall not, however, be in any way liable in respect of any damage or injurious consequences which may in any manner occur to any person or to any property in consequence of the said route crossing the railway line.

Gauge.

That the gauge of such tramway shall be 4ft. Siin., and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 15 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are endorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plains and specifications or deposited as the plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

Motive Power.

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be overhead electric traction, steam, and horses.

Maximum Speed.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be 15 miles in the hour.

Time of Completion.

That the trainway shall be completed and open for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of two years and six months from the date of this Order.

That such tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers, luggage, light goods, and parcels only.

Necessary Precautions for Safety of Passengers and Public to be observed.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said councils of the said municipalities.

Stoppages for Taking Up and Setting Down Passengers.

That, for the convenience of the public, the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of all streets, and at such other points upon the several routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

Tolls und Charges.

That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be, but shall not exceed, the following, that is to say, for each passenger—

From Pall Mall to Golden Square (Maple-street), or any lesser distance between, 3d.

From Charing Cross to Bendigo Cemetery, or any lesser distance between, 3d.

From Charing Cross to Quarry Hill (Peel-street), or any lesser distance between, 3d.

From Charing Cross to Lake Weeroona, or any lesser distance between, 3d.

From Lake Weeroona to White Hills, or any lesser distance between, 3d.

And vice versa on each route.

Luggage, Light Goods, and Parcels.

(a) Where no passenger, but sent in charge of conductor, the like fares as for passenger for each article or package so sent.
(b) If in charge of passenger, where the weight exceeds 28 lbs. or size exceeds 18 inches square, the like fares as for one

passenger for each article or package or luggage taken on the car.

Governor in Council to be Sole Judge of Breach of Order.

That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of, any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 26 of the Regulations contained in the second schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council as provided in the Regulations in the said schedule. the said schedule.

If upon the report of the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said clause 26 of the Regulations in the second schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication; state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall deter-

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the councils of the said municipalities of the city of Bendigo and the borough of Eaglehawk shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is la'd out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order. otherwise order.

No. 1090) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations and rescind the same providing for the storage of Explosives, and, notwithstanding anything in the said Part of the said Act, may from time to time by Order prohibit, either absolutely or subject to conditions or estrictions, the manufacture, keeping, importation from any place out of Victoria, conveyance and sale, or any of them, of any explosive when in the judgment of the Governor in Council it is expedient for the public safety to make such Order: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Exceutive Council thereof, doth by this Order rescind clause I of Part II. (Importation) of the Regulations intituled "Prohibiting the Importation, Keeping, Conveyance, and Sale of Explosives, except under certain Conditions or Restrictions," made by Order in Council No. 6, dated the Lith day of December, 1897, and doth substitute the following clauses in lieu thereof, viz.:—

PART II.

Importation.

1. No explosives except Safety Cartridges, Safety Fuse for Blasting, Railway Fog Signals, and Percussion Caps belonging to Division 1 of Class 6 (Armunition) shall be brought into any ports in Victoria except in virtue of an importation licence granted under the Explosives Act, and the unloading and delivery or the transhipping of any explosive constitutes importation for the purpose of this provision.

Provided that if the explosive brought into Victoria is forthwith transhipped to places outside Victoria the fee paid for the importation licence in respect of such explosive may be refunded.

And the Honorable Robert Wallace Best, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Trade and Customs for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NOTE.—During the quarter of 1899, the births (7,776) were more numerous by 118, but the deaths fewer by 964, than in the

corresponding quarter of the previous year, in which, however, the mortality was exceptionally high. The natural increase (3,959) was thus larger than in the second quarter of 1898 by 1,082, but smaller than in that of 1897 by 318.

According to the records of the Immigration Officer there was a net emigration during the quarter of 364 persons, of whom 52 were males and 312 females. This shows a marked improvement on the corresponding quarters of 1898 and 1897, when the recorded net emigration was 2,239 and 1,806 respectivel). Making the sual correction for unrecorded emigration, however, the total net loss during the quarter under review is increased to 2,139, consisting of 1,361 males and 778 females, as show in the table.

Deducting the estimated net emigration from the natural increase, there results a net increase of population during the quarter of 1,820, viz., 399 males and 1,421 females, as shown in the table, as compared with a decrease of 1,500 in the corresponding quarter of 1898, and an increase of 497 in that of 1897.

The records of migration for the quarter, taking them for what they are worth, show a balance in favour of immigrants of 1,072 from New South Wales, 808 from Tasmania, 208 from New Zealand and South Seas, 17 from South Africa, 103 from other British Dominions, and 64 from Foreign-Ports; but a balance in favour of emigration of 722 to Queensland, 151 to South Australia, 246 to Western Australia, and 1,517 to the United Kingdom. Comparing the results for the second quarter of the last three years, it is found that the net emigration to Western Australia fell off from 2,847 in 1897 to 1,617 in 1898, and to only 246 in 1899; that, although, there was a not emigration to South Africa of 126 in 1899; that the emigration to the United Kingdom rose from 1,221 in 1899; that the emigration to the United Kingdom rose from 1,221 in 1897, but fell from 1,644 in 1898 to 1,517 in 1899.

According to returns received from the other colonies, the population of New South Wales on the 30th June, 1899, was 1,357,050; that of South Australia, 368,960 (approximate); that of Tasmania, 178,792; and that of New Zealand, 747,930 (exclusive of Maoris).
