ADDITION TO GENERAL REGULATIONS  
RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

VIII.—Books.

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.

*Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:*—

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

#### *Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

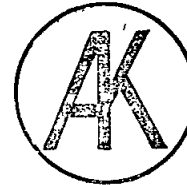

LICENCES TO PERSONS NOT BEING SUBSCRIBERS TO A TELEPHONE EXCHANGE TO USE TELEPHONES OF SUBSCRIBERS.

THE Governor in Council has, by an Order made on the 16th day of August, 1899, made the following Regulations governing the issue of licences to persons not being subscribers to a Telephone Exchange to use the telephone of a subscriber, viz:—

- REGULATIONS.
- (1) Persons not being subscribers to a Telephone Exchange may, with the concurrence of a subscriber, be granted a licence by the Postmaster-General to use such subscriber's telephone.
  - (2) The subscriber whose telephone is used by any such person (hereinafter termed a licensee) shall pay in advance a fee of £2 per annum to the Postmaster-General for every such licence.
  - (3) The licensee's name will appear in the Telephone Directory opposite the number of the subscriber whose telephone he uses.
  - (4) The subscriber and licensee must make their own arrangements as to calling a licensee when wanted, and as to the conditions under which the licensee may enter the subscriber's premises for the purpose of using the telephone.
  - (5) The number of licensees in connexion with any one subscriber's telephone shall be limited to six.
  - (6) The application for a licence must be forwarded to the Postmaster-General by the subscriber whose telephone it is desired to use, and all notices of discontinuance must be forwarded in the same manner.
  - (7) The Postmaster-General shall have absolute power to refuse to grant a licence and to cancel a licence so granted at any time should he so determine.
  - (8) The granting of a licence shall in no way bind the Postmaster-General to guarantee to a licensee the use of the subscriber's telephone referred to in such licence, and no responsibility will be accepted by the Postmaster-General in respect thereto.

## Fisheries Acts.

**NOTICE OF PROCLAMATIONS UNDER THE FISHERIES ACTS TO BE REVOKED, AND PROCLAMATIONS TO BE MADE UNDER THE FISHERIES ACT 1890, RELATING TO THE MERRI RIVER, LADY BAY, AND HOPKINS RIVER, NEAR WARRNAMBOOL.**

It is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from the date of this notice, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make, and publish in the *Government Gazette*, a proclamation under the *Fisheries Act 1890* revoking all previous proclamations made under the Fisheries Acts specifically relating to the Merri River, Lady Bay, and the Hopkins River, and in lieu thereof to make, and publish in the *Government Gazette*, proclamations under the *Fisheries Act 1890* defining what shall be deemed the mouths of the Merri and Hopkins Rivers, fixing the distance from such defined mouths of the Merri and Hopkins Rivers within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used, fixing the times and places at and in which trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing shall be used in Lady Bay, determining the times and seasons at which the taking of all fish in the Merri River shall commence and cease, and determining the times and seasons at which the taking of certain species of fish shall commence and cease in the Hopkins River, and in a radius of one quarter of a mile from the mouth thereof, as indicated hereunder:—

## MERRI RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Merri River to be a line commencing at a post situated on Pickering Point, thence extending north 72° 30' east to a post on the railway viaduct leading to the Warrnambool breakwater pier.

## HOPKINS RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Hopkins River to be a line commencing at a post on the extreme seaward or outward point of the western bank of the Hopkins River, thence extending south 71° east to a post on the sandspit on the eastern bank of such river.

## MERRI RIVER.

Fixing the distance from the mouth of the Merri River within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used to be a distance of one thousand and eighty (1,080) feet from the post on Pickering Point defining the mouth of the Merri River, and bearing south 22° east to a post situated at the mouth of the large cave on the eastern side of Middle Island; thence by a distance of one thousand three hundred (1,300) feet bearing north 64° 30' east to the south-east corner of the life-boat shed situated on the Warrnambool breakwater; thence by a distance of one thousand five hundred and seventy (1,570) feet bearing north 34° 23' west

to a post on the foreshore between Thornton's jetty and the Tramway jetty; thence by a distance of nine hundred and twenty-five (925) feet along the foreshore in a westerly direction to the post on the railway viaduct leading to the Warrnambool breakwater pier defining the mouth of the Merri River.

## HOPKINS RIVER.

Fixing the distance from the mouth of the Hopkins River within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used to be a radius of one quarter of a mile from any portion or point of the line defining the mouth of the said river.

## LADY BAY.

Fixing the times and places at and in which trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing shall be used in Lady Bay to be from the 16th October in every year to the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive, within an area bounded on the east by a line commencing at the north-east corner of the seaward end of the Warrnambool breakwater pier, and extending north 10° east to a post on the foreshore in proximity to the bathing boxes; thence on the north by the foreshore in a westerly direction to the post on the foreshore between the Tramway jetty and Thornton's jetty; thence on the west by a line bearing south 34° 23' east to the south-east corner of the life-boat shed on the Warrnambool breakwater pier; thence on the south along such pier easterly to the starting point.

## MERRI RIVER.

Determining that the times and seasons for the taking of all fish in the Merri River shall commence on the 1st November in every year and cease on the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive.

## HOPKINS RIVER.

Determining that the times and seasons for the taking of all fish in the Hopkins River, eastward of a line marked by a post on each bank of such river about one mile and a half from the mouth of the said river, shall commence on the 1st November in every year, and cease on the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive.

Determining that the times and seasons for the taking of bream and perch in the Hopkins River, westward of the aforesaid line marked by two posts about one mile and a half from the mouth of the said river, to a radius of one quarter of a mile seaward from the mouth of such river, shall commence on the 1st November in every year and cease on the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive.

All the above bearings are magnetic.

Outer fabric.—The outer fabric must be all wool and must be smooth and unteazled, containing 80 threads per inch in the warp, and 120 threads per inch in the woof, and must weigh not less than 4½ ounces per square yard.

Waterproofing.—The waterproofing must consist of a layer of best quality fully vulcanized para rubber, white or of light colour, containing not more than 10 per cent. of foreign matter and no free sulphur; must be of uniform thickness, free from thin spots, rendering the cloth so watertight that water to the depth of 6 inches standing in it for 24 hours will not percolate through; and must weigh not less than 6 ounces per square yard.

Inner lining.—The inner lining must be all wool, and of the same texture and weight as the outer fabric.

The trade system of measurement will be adopted, viz., 36 inches to the yard, with the thumb measurement given in.

The Chief Commissioner of Police is authorized to inflict a fine of £5 per day if supplies are not delivered within four months of the date of the first order, and within two months for subsequent orders: such fine to be deducted from any money due, or that may be falling due, to the contractor, or from the security money.

No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor: the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in this schedule are not to exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than £2 10s. per week for a man and £1 1s. per week for a woman respectively; and a copy of this labour condition shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

The whole of the articles are to be made in Victoria.

The contractor must supply everything necessary to complete the badges.

All metal, bullion, materials, and workmanship to be equal in every respect to samples, and subject to the approval of the Controller of Naval and Military Stores. The embroidered badges are to be worked on any colour cloth that may be ordered to match the facings of the branch for which the badges are required.

The bullion must be the best silver gilt.

TRAMWAY IN THE CITY OF BENDIGO AND THE BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK.

At Government House, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of August, 1899.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the council of the municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the councils of the municipalities of the City of Bendigo and the Borough of Eaglehawk have made an application under the common seals of the said municipalities, in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal districts of the municipalities of the said City of Bendigo and the Borough of Eaglehawk: And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said councils of the said municipalities, and that notice of the intention of the said councils to make the said application, in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor,

acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say—

That the Councils of the Municipalities of the City of Bendigo and the Borough of Eaglehawk shall be and are hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the Municipal Districts of the City of Bendigo and the Borough of Eaglehawk.

Routes.

That the routes of such tramway shall be as follows:—

- (a) Commencing at a point in the centre of Mitchell-street in the City of Bendigo, opposite Mollison-street; thence along Mitchell-street over the Railway Bridge to Carpenter-street; thence along Carpenter-street to the terminus at the boundary of the said city, near the Bendigo Cemetery.
- (b) Commencing at a point in the centre of Olinda-street in the said city, opposite Mitchell-street; thence along Olinda-street to the terminus at Peel-street in the said city.
- (c) Commencing at a point in the centre of Mollison-street in the said city, opposite Williamson-street; thence along Mollison-street to Mitchell-street aforesaid.
- (d) Commencing at a point at the intersection of Bull-street and Pall Mall in the said city; thence along Pall Mall to McCrae-street; thence along McCrae-street to the White Hills-road; thence along that road to Napier-street, White Hills, in the said city, to its intersection with Napoleon-crescent, near the Botanical Gardens.
- (e) Commencing at a point opposite the Town Hall in the Borough of Eaglehawk, at the junction of the Mount Korong-road and the Sailor's Gully-road; thence along the Sailor's Gully-road to the terminus at Darling-street in the said borough.

Tramway where crosses Railway to be under control of Commissioners of Railway.

That the tramway to be constructed upon so much of the said route as crosses the Victorian Railway line in McCrae-street shall be under the absolute control of and be subject to all such regulations and orders as may from time to time be made by the Commissioners of Railways, who shall not, however, be in any way liable in respect of any damage or injurious consequences which may in any manner occur to any person or to any property in consequence of the said route crossing the railway line.

*Gauge.*

That the gauge of such tramway shall be 4ft. 8½in., and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 15 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are endorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plains and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

*Motive Power.*

That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be overhead electric traction, steam, and horses.

*Maximum Speed.*

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be 15 miles in the hour.

*Time of Completion.*

That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of two years and six months from the date of this Order.

*Nature of Traffic.*

That such tramway shall be used for the carriage of passengers, luggage, light goods, and parcels only.

*Necessary Precautions for Safety of Passengers and Public to be observed.*

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said councils of the said municipalities.

*Stoppages for Taking Up and Setting Down Passengers.*

That, for the convenience of the public, the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of all streets, and at such other points upon the several routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

*Tolls and Charges.*

That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be, but shall not exceed, the following, that is to say, for each passenger—

From Pall Mall to Golden Square (Maple-street), or any lesser distance between, 3d.

From Charing Cross to Bendigo Cemetery, or any lesser distance between, 3d.

From Charing Cross to Quarry Hill (Peul-street), or any lesser distance between, 3d.

From Charing Cross to Lake Weeroona, or any lesser distance between, 3d.

From Lake Weeroona to White Hills, or any lesser distance between, 3d.

And *vice versa* on each route.

*Luggage, Light Goods, and Parcels.*

(a) Where no passenger, but sent in charge of conductor, the like fares as for passenger for each article or package so sent.

(b) If in charge of passenger, where the weight exceeds 25 lbs. or size exceeds 18 inches square, the like fares as for one passenger for each article or package or luggage taken on the car.

*Governor in Council to be Sole Judge of Breach of Order.*

That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with, or of the breach of, any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 26 of the Regulations contained in the second schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council as provided in the Regulations in the said schedule.

If upon the report of the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said clause 26 of the Regulations in the second schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or compliance with, or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the councils of the said municipalities of the city of Bendigo and the borough of Eaglehawk shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said routes is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

That in the event of the councils of the said municipalities finding it necessary to provide work of a more substantial or expensive character than the work provided for in this Order, the councils of the said municipalities shall take upon themselves all such additional expenditure, and no claim whatever shall be

NOTE.—During the quarter of 1899, the births (7,776) were more numerous by 118; but the deaths fewer by 964, than in the

corresponding quarter of the previous year, in which, however, the mortality was exceptionally high. The natural increase (3,959) was thus larger than in the second quarter of 1898 by 1,082, but smaller than in that of 1897 by 318.

According to the records of the Immigration Officer there was a net emigration during the quarter of 364 persons, of whom 52 were males and 312 females. This shows a marked improvement on the corresponding quarters of 1898 and 1897, when the recorded net emigration was 2,239 and 1,806 respectively. Making the usual correction for unrecorded emigration, however, the total net loss during the quarter under review is increased to 2,139, consisting of 1,361 males and 778 females, as shown in the table.

Deducting the estimated net emigration from the natural increase, there results a net increase of population during the quarter of 1,820, viz., 399 males and 1,421 females, as shown in the table, as compared with a decrease of 1,500 in the corresponding quarter of 1898, and an increase of 497 in that of 1897.

The records of migration for the quarter, taking them for what they are worth, show a balance in favour of immigrants of 1,072 from New South Wales, 808 from Tasmania, 208 from New Zealand and South Seas, 17 from South Africa, 103 from other British Dominions, and 64 from Foreign Ports; but a balance in favour of emigration of 722 to Queensland, 151 to South Australia, 246 to Western Australia, and 1,517 to the United Kingdom. Comparing the results for the second quarter of the last three years, it is found that the net emigration to Western Australia fell off from 2,847 in 1897 to 1,617 in 1898, and to only 246 in 1899; that, although, there was a net emigration to South Africa of 126 in 1897 and 27 in 1898, there was a net gain therefrom of 17 in 1899; that the emigration to the United Kingdom rose from 1,221 in 1897, but fell from 1,644 in 1898 to 1,517 in 1899.

According to returns received from the other colonies, the population of New South Wales on the 30th June, 1899, was 1,357,050; that of South Australia, 368,960 (approximate); that of Tasmania, 178,732; and that of New Zealand, 747,930 (exclusive of Maoris).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
