### PROCLAMATION

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to provide for the Sale of the Show-yards at Kerang.”

“An Act to abolish Plural Voting in the Elections of Members of the Legislative Assembly.”

“An Act to amend the Law of Evidence with regard to the Office of Deputy Registrar-General.”

“An Act to provide for the Resumption by the Crown of certain Land in the Parish of Ararat.”

“An Act to amend the *Moorpanyal Land Act 1897*.”

“An Act relating to the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Ireland at Geelong.”

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One hundred and sixty-seven thousand seven hundred and sixty-six pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight and ninety-nine.”

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million one hundred and seventy-eight thousand five hundred and thirty-one pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine and One thousand nine hundred.”

## RULE OF THE SUPREME COURT.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

8. It is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from the date of this notice, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make, and publish in the *Government Gazette*, a proclamation under the *Fisheries Act 1890* revoking all previous proclamations made under the Fisheries Acts specifically relating to the Merri River, Lady Bay, and the Hopkins River, and in lieu thereof to make, and publish in the *Government Gazette*, proclamations under the *Fisheries Act 1890* defining what shall be deemed the mouths of the Merri and Hopkins Rivers, fixing the distance from such defined mouths of the Merri and Hopkins Rivers within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used; fixing the times and places at and in which trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing shall be used in Lady Bay, determining the times and seasons at which the taking of all fish in the Merri River shall commence and cease, and determining the times and seasons at which the taking of certain species of fish shall commence and cease in the Hopkins River, and in a radius of one quarter of a mile from the mouth thereof, as indicated hereunder:—

## MERRI RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Merri River to be a line commencing at a post situated on Pickering Point, thence extending north 72° 30' east to a post on the railway viaduct leading to the Warrnambool breakwater pier.

## HOPKINS RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Hopkins River to be a line commencing at a post on the extreme seaward or outward point of the western bank of the Hopkins River, thence extending south 71° east to a post on the sandspit on the eastern bank of such river.

## MERRI RIVER.

CONSTRUCTION ACT 1898.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RECREATION RESERVE IN THE TOWN OF NORTHCOTE.**

THE Council of the Town of Northcote, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Recreation Reserve in the Town of Northcote, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890* :—

**REGULATIONS.**

- The reserve shall be parcelled out in the following divisions :—
  - The cricket and football pavilion and enclosure.
  - The tennis-court enclosure, including the asphalt courts and pavilion.
  - The remainder of the reserve.
- All persons shall be admitted to the third division of the reserve free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, athletic, cycling, or other sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the third division of the reserve.
- The Council shall be at liberty from time to time to authorize the issue of tickets of admission to the first and second divisions respectively, and thereupon no person shall enter at any time into either of such divisions except on production of a ticket so issued.
- No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall damage in any way any buildings, fences, asphalt, netting, posts, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- No person shall put in the reserve, except with the consent of the Council, any cattle, goats, or pigs.
- No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the Council first obtained.
- No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the Council first obtained.
- No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

SHIRE OF MORNINGTON.

BY-LAW No. 16.

For the care, protection, and management of the reserves, known as the Mornington and Royal Parks, in the township of Mornington.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by sub-section XIII. of section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington order as follows, viz.:—That

1. The Mornington Park and the Royal Park, hereinafter described as the reserves, shall be open to the public free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserves who may offend against decency, as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, seats, gates, fences, or buildings therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names, letters, or figures on any of the buildings, fences, gates, seats, or trees therein, or throw stones in the reserves, or deposit any glass or rubbish therein, or remove any sand, soil, or loam therefrom.
5. No person shall place in the reserves any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, or light any fires therein without the written consent of the Council.
6. No dogs shall be allowed into the reserves on such days as fees for admission thereto are charged as hereinafter provided.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling, booth, or other structure, or offer for sale in the reserves, any fruit, refreshments, goods, or articles of any description without first obtaining the consent of the Council.
8. No person shall engage in any game or sport, or in dancing in the reserves, or use the bicycle track on Sundays.
9. No person shall carry on the trade, business, calling, or occupation of a bookmaker in the reserves, without first obtaining the consent, in writing, of the Council, and such trade, business, calling, or occupation is absolutely prohibited on any of the buildings therein or on the space between the buildings and the chain fence adjacent thereto.

10. Every person having or erecting any booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or for the purpose of any game or amusement, shall pay such fee as the Council may fix from time to time, and any picnic party requiring the use of the pavilions, cycle track, and other conveniences in the park shall pay such fee as the Council shall fix from time to time.

11. The upper rooms, verandah, and passage leading thereto on the cricket pavilion shall not be hired out to picnic parties with the conveniences referred to in clause 10.

12. No person shall enter the reserves on any day set apart for sports or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Council duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date for which it was issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, or enclosure or cultivated spot within the reserves; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized by the Council to collect the same.

13. Any person being drunk or disorderly or assaulting any other person shall be liable to removal from the reserves notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

14. All net proceeds of sports or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of the public charitable institutions, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserves.

15. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserves on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserves may be set apart for fêtes or sports shall be as follows:—
