



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RECREATION RESERVE IN THE TOWN OF NORTHCOTE.

THE TOWN OF NORTHOOTE.

THE Council of the Town of Northcote, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Recreation Reserve in the Town of Northcote, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the Land Act 1850:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The reserve shall be parcelled out in the following divi-

 - The cricket and football pavilion and enclosure.
 The tennis-court enclosure, including the asphalt courts and pavilion.
 The remainder of the reserve.
- (3) The remainder of the reserve.
 2. All persons shall be admitted to the third division of the reserve free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, athletic, cycling, or other sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the third division of the reserve.
 3. The Council shall be at liberty from time to time to authorize the issue of tickets of admission to the first and second divisions respectively, and thereupon no person shall enter at any time into either of such divisions except on production of a ticket so issued.

- divisions represent the consent of the Council first obtained.

 4. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

 5. No person shall damage in any way any buildings, fences, asphalt, netting, posts, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

 6. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve, except with the consent of the Council, any cattle, goats, or pigs.

 7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the Council first obtained.

 9. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the Council first obtained. 10. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the

reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

11. Any person committing in any part of the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission or have a ticket for admission thereto:—

or have a ticket for admission thereto:—

(1) Assaulting any other person.
(2) Being drunk.
(3) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground or tenniscourt enclosure (as the case may be) during any cricket match, football match, tennis match, cycling race, or sports, or during practice at cricket, football, tennis, or cycling, or when crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground, tennis-court enclosure, or cycling track would be injurious to any of thom as a cricket ground, football ground, tennis court, or cycling track respectively.

ground, football ground, tennis court, or cycling track respectively.

(4) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.

(5) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.

(6) Behaving improperly or riotously.

(7) Improperly interfering with or interrupting any cricket match, football match, tennis match, cycling race, or practice, or any athletic or other sports or holiday amusements.

(8) Obtaining admission to any part of the first record on

amusements.

(8) Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, or third division when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

(9) Offering to the public any wager or bet.

(10) Calling the odds upon any race or event, or any competitors therein.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

For the care, protection, and management of the reserves, known as the Mornington and Royal Parks, in the township of Mornington.

DURSUANT to the powers conferred by sub-section XIII.

of section 191 of the Local Government Act 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington Order as follows, viz.:—That

1. The Mornington Park and the Royal Park, hereinafter described as the reserves, shall be open to the public free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserves who may offend against decency, as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, saick bills thereon, or cut names, letters, or figures on any of the buildings, fences, gates, seats, or trees therein, or throw stones in the reserves, or deposit any glass or rubbish therein, or remove any sand, soil, or loam therefrom.

5. No person shall place in the reserves any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, or light any fires therein without the written consent of the Council.

6. No degs shall be allowed into the reserves on such days as fees for admission thereto are charged as hereinafter provided.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling, booth, or other structure, or offer for sale in the reserves, any fruit, refreshments, goods, or articles of any description without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

8. No person shall engage in any game or sport, or in dancing in the reserves, or use the bicycle track on Sundays.

9. No person shall engage in the reserves, without first obtaining the consent. in writing, of the Council, and such trade, business, calling, or occupation of a bookmaker in the reserves, without first obtaining the consent. in writing, of the Council, and such trade, business, calling, or occupation is absolutely prohibitied on any of the buildings therein or on the space between the buildings and the ch and the chain fence adjacent thereto.

10. Every person having or erecting any booth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or for the purpose of any game or amusement, shall pay such fee as the Council may fix from time to time, and any picnic party requiring the use of the paylions, cycle track, and other conveniences in the park shall pay such fee as the Council shall fix from time to time.

11. The upper rooms, verandal, and passage leading thereto on the cricket paylion shall not be hired out to picnic parties with the conveniences referred to in clause 10.

12. No person shall enter the reserves on any day set apart for sports or feles, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Council duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date for which it was issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, or enclosure or cultivated spot within the reserves; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized by the Council to collect the same.

13. Any person being drunk or disorderly or assaulting any other person shall be liable to removal from the reserves notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

14. All net proceeds of sports or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of the public charitable institutions, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserves.

15. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserves on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserves may be set apart for fêtes or sports shall be as follows:—

Any person or persons offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against this by-law, and who, after he has been warned by any constable or officer of the Council does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such constable or officer of the Council, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
