PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

WEDNESDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Echuca and St. Arnaud, the Shires of Bellarine and Corio; as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Geelong and Rochester;

THURSDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Bannockburn;

IMPORTATION OF DOGS INTO GREAT BRITAIN.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 17th May, 1897, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your government, copies of a memorandum issued by the Board of Agriculture, containing information as to the conditions prescribed by the Board in connexion with the importation of dogs into Great Britain with a view to the prevention of the re-introduction of rabies into this country.

BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.—IMPORTATION OF DOGS INTO GREAT BRITAIN.

Memorandum as to the conditions which have been prescribed in order to prevent the introduction of rabies.

1. The disease of rabies in dogs and of hydrophobia in man, which remains prevalent in almost all other parts of the world, has become practically extinct in this country, but as it may remain latent in a dog for a very long period, it has become necessary, in the interests of owners of dogs in this country, to adopt precautions against the re-introduction of the disease by means of dogs which may, unknown to their owners, have become infected whilst in a foreign country.

2. The Importation of Dogs Orders, therefore, prohibit the introduction of dogs into Great Britain from any foreign country or British Possession, other than the Channel Islands, without the sanction of the Board of Agriculture; and the landing of a dog from abroad (whether originally exported from Great Britain or not) will, unless a licence has previously been obtained, render the owner liable to a penalty of £20 and the possible seizure of the dog.

3. Every person wishing to introduce a dog into Great Britain must, before the dog is embarked, obtain a licence permitting the landing of the dog on arrival; and the attention of owners, charterers, and masters of vessels carrying dogs is drawn to the fact that, by permitting the landing of such dogs from their vessels without the requisite licences, they render themselves liable to legal proceedings.

4. Every application for a licence for landing a dog should be made in writing, on a form which will be supplied to *bona fide* applicants. It must be signed by the owner of the dog, or by his agent, specially authorized in writing for the purpose, and should be sent to *The Secretary, Board of Agriculture, 4 Whitehall-place, London, S.W.*, in sufficient time to enable the Board to make full inquiries into the circumstances of the application, and the suitability of the proposed premises for the isolation of the dog, and to communicate to the owner their decision before the embarkation of the dog is to take place.

5. In order that the Board may have it on record that the conditions on which alone a licence can be issued are fully known by the owner of the dog (or the person, if other than the owner, in whose charge it is to be detained), the signature of the owner or of the proposed custodian of the dog is to be subscribed to the undertaking printed on the back of the form of application. The signature of an agent cannot, in any case, be accepted as sufficient, unless he is prepared personally to undertake the charge of the dog during the whole period of detention.

6. In very exceptional cases, the Board are prepared to entertain applications made by telegram, on the following conditions:—

(a) The telegram must set forth the description of the dog, stating as far as possible, for purposes of identification, the particulars of its breed, sex, age, and colour, and the place where it is proposed that the animal should be detained.

(b) The place of detention must be the residence of a householder, or other responsible resident of long standing, in Great Britain, who is prepared to detain the dog on the premises for not less than 30 days in accordance with the conditions of the licence; and the full name and address of the person must be given so as to enable the Board, before the licence is issued, to place themselves in communication with him to ascertain whether he is in a position to fulfil the requisite conditions.

(c) An address must also be named in the telegram to which the Board can send the licence if issued, or otherwise communicate their decision to the applicant. This should be some place in the country of embarkation, as ship-owners cannot properly permit the embarkation of any dog on board their vessels for importation into this country unless the dog is accompanied by the requisite licence.

(d) The telegram should contain the undertaking of the owner to carry out the conditions imposed.

7. The conditions imposed in the licence require the detention of the dog for a period of six months on some suitable private premises to be specified by the owner, and approved by the

Board, where the dog will be under the supervision of the officers of the Board and of the local authority, for whose inspection it should be produced, if required. But if the general conditions imposed are properly carried out, the Board are prepared, on the production of a certificate of a duly qualified veterinary surgeon that the dog is not affected with, or suspected of, rabies, to consider applications for the release of the dog after a period of detention of 90 days. Dogs which have been recently purchased from foreign dealers or of which the antecedents are unknown, will be subjected to special restrictions and a longer period of detention.

8. The owner's private place of residence is regarded in most instances as a suitable place of detention.

9. Hotels, barracks, or other similar premises where the dog cannot be conveniently isolated, are not regarded by the Board as suitable places of detention.

10. On arrival at a port in Great Britain and before the dog can be landed, the holder of the licence is required to produce it for the inspection of the officer of Her Majesty's Customs, who is empowered and directed to mark it with the name of the port, the date of landing, and his initials, as a verification of the legality of the landing.

11. The dog must be taken as soon as it is landed, by the nearest available route, and without unnecessary delay, to the premises specified in the licence.

12. In the case, however, of dogs landed late in the day, and where the place of detention is several hours' journey from the port, the Board do not object to the journey of the dog from one place to the other being broken by its detention at some suitable place for one night only, provided that it is kept absolutely apart from all other dogs, and that the journey is resumed the next day and completed with all reasonable despatch.

13. In every case the licence should accompany the dog on its journey, and be retained by the person in charge until it is required to be returned to the Board.

14. It should be clearly understood that the dog cannot in any case be moved from the place of detention, either to other premises or to a vessel for exportation out of the United Kingdom, without a further licence from the Board; but should exceptional circumstances arise which render such removal necessary or expedient, the Board are prepared to consider an application for a licence, provided that they are satisfied by the production of a certificate of a duly qualified veterinary surgeon that the dog is not affected with, or suspected of, rabies. When the proposed removal is to some other place in the United Kingdom, a suitable place must be specified where the dog can be kept for the remainder of the period of detention.

15. During the period of detention the dog, when temporarily moved for exercise or other like purpose from the place of detention, must be in charge of a competent person, and be properly muzzled with a wire cage muzzle, and this latter condition is also applicable when the dog is likely at any time to be brought into contact with other dogs.

16. Should the dog die, or be lost, the fact should be at once reported to the Board, together with full information as to the symptoms preceding death, or the circumstances under which the loss took place; and, in the event of the dog sickening with any of the symptoms of rabies, it should be at once isolated, and the advice of a veterinary surgeon obtained.

17. Licences to which special conditions are attached are issued by the Board to land *bona fide* performing dogs, if it can be shown that the dogs have been trained to take part in performances for the entertainment of the public, and that they are to be imported for that purpose only. In such cases satisfactory evidence must be offered that the animals are habitually kept absolutely apart from all other dogs, whether in this country or abroad, and a place must be specified where the dogs can be examined, if thought necessary, after being landed.

18. For the convenience of persons passing through Great Britain, the Board are also prepared, in special cases, to authorize the landing of dogs which are proposed to be exported within a few days. In making an application for such a licence, the ports, the names of the vessels, and the dates of arrival and departure, must be specified, and the address of some suitable place where the dog can be detained during the period that it remains in Great Britain, which must not exceed ten days. The licence in this case should be indorsed by an officer of the vessel of departure, and returned to the Board by the owner, and the dog must not be again landed in Great Britain without a further licence.

Land Surveyors Act 1896.

EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

THE Surveyors Board appointed under the *Land Surveyors Act 1896* hereby gives notice that the next examination will commence on Tuesday, 19th September, 1899.

All applications from intending candidates must be in the hands of the Secretary by the 11th September, 1899.

REGULATIONS.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificate of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

I, A. B., a registered land surveyor of the colony of _____ hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, and that he is fully competent to conduct surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

9. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

Mathematics.

Trigonometry plane and spherical, geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurements of heights, surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

Leveling, &c.

Leveling, measurement of earthwork.

Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

* If the certificate be of professional employment only, the words from "and that" to "surveys" inclusive shall be struck out.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

REGULATIONS.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visà voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from the date of this notice, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make, and publish in the *Government Gazette*, a proclamation under the *Fisheries Act 1890* revoking all previous proclamations made under the Fisheries Acts specifically relating to the Merri River, Lady Bay, and the Hopkins River, and in lieu thereof to make, and publish in the *Government Gazette*, proclamations under the *Fisheries Act 1890* defining what shall be deemed the mouths of the Merri and Hopkins Rivers, fixing the distance from such defined mouths of the Merri and Hopkins Rivers within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used, fixing the times and places at and in which trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing shall be used in Lady Bay, determining the times and seasons at which the taking of all fish in the Merri River shall commence and cease, and determining the times and seasons at which the taking of certain species of fish shall commence and cease in the Hopkins River, and in a radius of one quarter of a mile from the mouth thereof, as indicated hereunder:—

MERRI RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Merri River to be a line commencing at a post situated on Pickering Point, thence extending north 72° 30' east to a post on the railway viaduct leading to the Warrnambool breakwater pier.

HOPKINS RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Hopkins River to be a line commencing at a post on the extreme seaward or outward point of the western bank of the Hopkins River, thence extending south 71° east to a post on the sandspit on the eastern bank of such river.

MERRI RIVER.

Fixing the distance from the mouth of the Merri River within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used to be a distance of one thousand and eighty (1,080) feet from the post on Pickering Point defining the mouth of the Merri River, and bearing south 22° east to a post situated at the mouth of the large cove on the eastern side of Middle Island; thence by a distance of one thousand three hundred (1,300) feet bearing north 64° 30' east to the south-east corner of the life-boat shed situated on the Warrnambool breakwater; thence by a distance of one thousand five hundred and seventy (1,570) feet bearing north 34° 23' west to a post on the foreshore between Thornton's jetty and the Tramway jetty; thence by a distance of nine hundred and twenty-five (925) feet along the foreshore in a westerly direction to the post on the railway viaduct leading to the Warrnambool breakwater pier defining the mouth of the Merri River.

Fixing the times and places at and in which trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing shall be used in Lady Bay to be from the 16th October in every year to the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive, within an area bounded on the east by a line commencing at the north-east corner of the seaward end of the Warrnambool breakwater pier, and extending north 10° east to a post on the foreshore in proximity to the bathing boxes; thence on the north by the foreshore in a westerly direction to the post on the foreshore between the Tramway jetty and Thornton's jetty; thence on the west by a line bearing south 34° 23' east to the south-east corner of the life-boat shed on the Warrnambool breakwater pier; thence on the south along such pier easterly to the starting point.

MERRI RIVER.

Determining that the times and seasons for the taking of all fish in the Merri River shall commence on the 1st November in every year and cease on the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive.

HOPKINS RIVER.

Determining that the times and seasons for the taking of all fish in the Hopkins River, eastward of a line marked by a post on each bank of such river about one mile and a half from the mouth of the said river, shall commence on the 1st November in every year, and cease on the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive.

Determining that the times and seasons for the taking of bream and perch in the Hopkins River, westward of the aforesaid line marked by two posts about one mile and a half from the mouth of the said river, to a radius of one quarter of a mile seaward from the mouth of such river, shall commence on the 1st November in every year and cease on the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the Chinese Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the Chinese Act 1890 aforesaid, from the date hereof, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the said Schedule, that is to say:—

No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by proclamation notify that any place beyond the sea is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels whatever arriving from or having touched at any such place and all vessels and boats receiving any person or thing whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at any such infected place as aforesaid (whether such person or thing shall have come or been brought in such vessel or such person shall have come or have been put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessel at any place in Victoria, and all persons and things whatsoever on board of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act and of any Order made by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of departure of such vessels from such infected place as aforesaid or from the time such persons or things shall have been received on board respectively: And whereas it is enacted that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid and all persons (as well pilots as others), and all things whether coming or brought in such vessels or boats from such infected place as aforesaid or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats in any place in Victoria, and all persons and things as aforesaid on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid shall upon their arrival at any place in Victoria be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be from time to time directed by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas it is further enacted that until such vessels and boats persons and things as aforesaid shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from quarantine no such persons or things shall either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria come or be brought on shore or go or be put on board any other vessel or boat in order to come or be brought on shore in any such place (unless in such manner and in such cases and by such license as shall be directed or permitted by any such Order as aforesaid): Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation notify that

PORTUGAL AND SOUTH AFRICA

are infected with Oriental Plague, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such places to Victoria.

BACCHUS MARSH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF WATER.

THE Commissioners of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Part III. of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulation, providing for the sale of water for irrigation:—

1. That the rates or prices to be charged for water delivered from the works of the Trust, by means of a hose 8 inches in diameter, with a discharge of not more than 250,000 gallons per day, for the purpose of irrigation, shall be as follow:—

Two shillings and sixpence per day from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of August;

Five shillings per day from the 1st day of September to the 30th day of November; and

Seven shillings and sixpence per day from the 1st day of December to the 30th day of April.

2. All water supplied under the foregoing charges shall be paid for in advance.

3. That clause 4 of Regulation No. 1, made by the Trust on the 17th day of December, 1892, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 30th day of December, 1892, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

DANDENONG WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS.

THAT the Commissioners of the Dandenong Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following regulation:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1899, in respect of water supply by the Trust within the Trust area, and such rates shall be payable in one moiety on the 31st July, 1899.

2. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds (£10) and under, the annual minimum sum of Twenty shillings (20s.) per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10), the annual sum of Two shillings in the pound (£1) on the amount of said valuation.

4. Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles or used in retail business, the sum of Two shillings in the pound (£1) on the amount of municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a less rate than One pound sterling be paid.

5. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be levied on all vacant ground fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, shall be equal to the amount which the Commissioners would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to building, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied to charitable institutions for gardens or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries, cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a charge for domestic or other purposes.

13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, and plastering.

MOE SWAMP.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1899.

THE births of 76 boys and 79 girls, or in all of 155 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of August. Of these, 62 occurred in Ballarat East, 82 in Ballarat West, 8 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 16 illegitimate births and 3 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 119, viz., 65 of boys and 54 of girls.

The deaths registered in August numbered 66, viz., 42 of males and 24 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 89. In July, the recorded deaths numbered 69; in August, 1898, they numbered 87; in August, 1897, they numbered 59; in August, 1896, they numbered 71; in August, 1895, they numbered 77; in August, 1894, they numbered 75; in August, 1893, they numbered 88; in August, 1892, they numbered 77; in August, 1891, they numbered 72; in August, 1890, they numbered 62; and in August, 1889, they numbered 63.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 62 and 38 per cent.; under and over five years, 17 and 83 per cent. respectively.

Twenty deaths, or 30 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.—Ballarat Hospital, 11; Benevolent Asylum, 7; Lunatic Asylum, 2.
