#### PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath;
Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the Public Service Act 1830 (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of
the Banks and Currency Act 1830 (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1837 (61 Vict. No. 1534),
and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places
respectively specified, viz.:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Rutherglen, the Shires of Kerang and Rutherglen, the Tarnagulla Riding of the Shire of Bet Bet, and the North Riding of the Shire of Tullaroop;

THURSDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Portland, and the Shires of Bright, Dundas, Rutherglen, and Tungamah;

FRIDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Tungamah\*; and as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Borough of Ararat;

TCESDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Devenish and Mokoan Ridings of the Shire of Benalla, and the Central and Southern Ridings of the Shire of Tungamah;

Wednesday, the 27th day of September instant, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Huntly and the Western Riding of the Shire of Waranga; THURSDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Tungamah and the Devenish and Mokoan Ridings of the Shire of Benalla;

FRIDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Karkarooc;

TUESDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Tungamah;

WEDNESDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXY, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Chiltern and Maldon, the North Riding of the Shire of Huntly, and the Western Riding of the Shire of Waranga; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Maldon, Pyramid Hill, and St. Arnaud;

THURSDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXY, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Tungamah, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Tungamah;

FRIDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Dimboola;

Tuesday, the 10th day of October Next, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Dimboola, Shepparton, and Tungamah;

Wednesday, the 11th day of October Next, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Huntly, Marong, and Tullaroop, and the Central and Eastern Ridings of the Shire of Waranga, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the City of Bendigo, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Beaufort;

THURSDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Benalla and Shepparton, and the Central and Southern Ridings of the Shire of Tungamah;

WEDNESDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Bet Bet, Chiltern, North Ovens, and Tullaroop, and the Central and Eastern Ridings of the Shire of Waranga, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Nhill;

THURSDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF COTOBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Clunes, and the Shires of Bet and Tullaroop, and as a Bank Holiday at Clunes;

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF OUTOBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Shepparton and Tungamah, and the Devenish Riding of the Shire of Benalla.
