PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act for the Incorporation of the Mechanics' Institute at Geelong and for other purposes."

"An Act to amend the *Vermia Destruction Act 1890*."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and in the sixty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

NOTICE OF PROCLAMATIONS UNDER THE FISHERIES ACTS TO BE REVOKED, AND PROCLAMATIONS TO BE MADE UNDER THE FISHERIES ACT 1890, RELATING TO THE MERRI RIVER, LADY BAY, AND HOPKINS RIVER, NEAR WARRNAMBOOL.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from the date of this notice, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make, and publish in the *Government Gazette*, a proclamation under the *Fisheries Act 1890* revoking all previous proclamations made under the Fisheries Acts specifically relating to the Merri River, Lady Bay, and the Hopkins River, and in lieu thereof to make, and publish in the *Government Gazette*, proclamations under the *Fisheries Act 1890* defining what shall be deemed the mouths of the Merri and Hopkins Rivers, fixing the distance from such defined mouths of the Merri and Hopkins Rivers within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used, fixing the times and places at and in which trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing shall be used in Lady Bay, determining the times and seasons at which the taking of all fish in the Merri River shall commence and cease, and determining the times and seasons at which the taking of certain species of fish shall commence and cease in the Hopkins River, and in a radius of one quarter of a mile from the mouth thereof, as indicated hereunder:—

MERRI RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Merri River to be a line commencing at a post situated on Pickering Point, thence extending north 72° 30' east to a post on the railway viaduct leading to the Warrnambool breakwater pier.

HOPKINS RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Hopkins River to be a line commencing at a post on the extreme seaward or outward point of the western bank of the Hopkins River, thence extending south 71° east to a post on the sandspit on the eastern bank of such river.

MERRI RIVER.

Fixing the distance from the mouth of the Merri River within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used to be a distance of one thousand and eighty (1,080) feet from the post on Pickering Point defining the mouth of the Merri River, and bearing south 22° east to a post situated at the mouth of the large cove on the eastern side of Middle Island; thence by a distance of one thousand three hundred (1,300) feet bearing north 81° 30' east to the south-east corner of the life-boat shed situated on the Warrnambool breakwater; thence by a distance of one thousand five hundred and seventy (1,570) feet bearing north 34° 23' west to a post on the foreshore between Thornton's jetty and the Tramway jetty; thence by a distance of nine hundred and twenty-five (925) feet along the foreshore in a westerly direction to the post on the railway viaduct leading to the Warrnambool breakwater pier defining the mouth of the Merri River.

HOPKINS RIVER.

Fixing the distance from the mouth of the Hopkins River within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used to be a radius of one quarter of a mile from any portion or point of the line defining the mouth of the said river.

LADY BAY.

Fixing the times and places at and in which trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing shall be used in Lady Bay to be from the 16th October in every year to the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive, within an area bounded on the east by a line commencing at the north-east corner of the seaward end of the Warrnambool breakwater pier, and extending north 10° east to a post on the foreshore in proximity to the bathing boxes; thence on the north by the foreshore in a westerly direction to the post on the foreshore between the Tramway jetty and Thornton's jetty; thence on the west by a line bearing south 34° 23' east to the south-east corner of the life-boat shed on the Warrnambool breakwater pier; thence on the south along such pier easterly to the starting point.

MERRI RIVER.

Determining that the times and seasons for the taking of all fish in the Merri River shall commence on the 1st November in every year and cease on the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive.

HOPKINS RIVER.

Determining that the times and seasons for the taking of all fish in the Hopkins River, eastward of a line marked by a post on each bank of such river about one mile and a half from the mouth of the said river, shall commence on the 1st November in every year, and cease on the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive.

Determining that the times and seasons for the taking of bream and perch in the Hopkins River, westward of the aforesaid line marked by two posts about one mile and a half from the mouth of the said river, to a radius of one quarter of a mile seaward from the mouth of such river, shall commence on the 1st November in every year and cease on the 30th June in every year, both dates inclusive.

All the above bearings are magnetic.

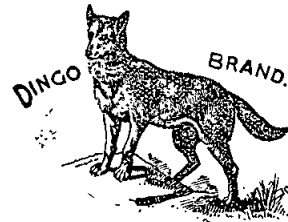

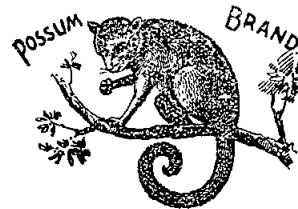

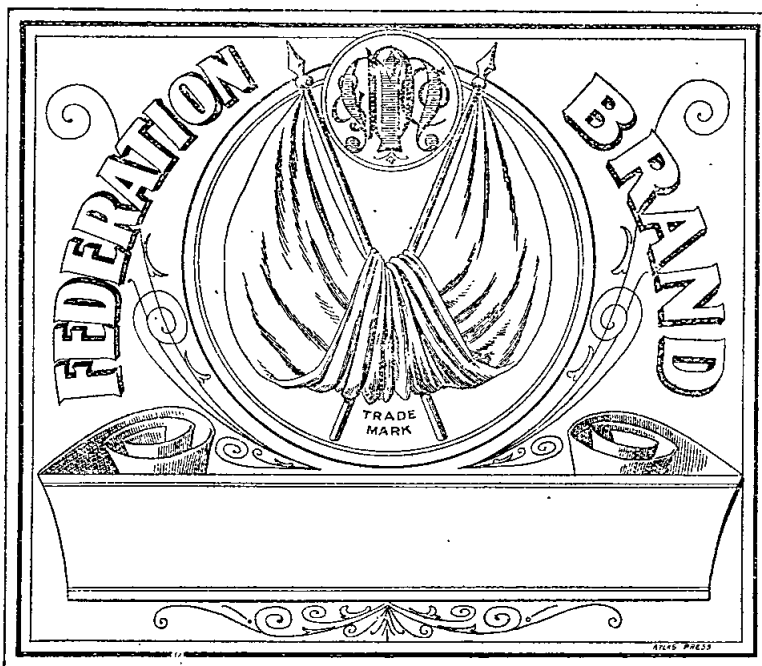

The penalty for such offence shall be any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

This by-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

4. Clause 9 of By-law No. 11, made by the Council of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong, on 14th August, 1897, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and the next clause hereunder substituted.
5. All cess-pans shall be removed in a cart or other conveyance having springs, and so constructed that the pans shall be properly covered in from observation, and so as to prevent the escape therefrom of any noxious or offensive effluvia.
6. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

RATING REGULATION FOR 1899.

REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1899 in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. The rates and charges specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes.
2. On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation.
3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds, and not exceeding Twenty pounds, the sum of Twenty shillings.
4. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, the sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation.
5. The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable on the first day of August, 1899.
6. In the construction of this regulation, the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.
7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATION No. 2.

Water Supplied by the Trust by Measure.

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which shall be paid for water supplied by this Trust by measure for other than domestic purposes within the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. The charges for water supplied by measure for all purposes, except market gardens and cases of special agreement with the

commissioners, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per thousand gallons. For market gardens, except in special cases to be determined by the commissioners, the charge shall be at the rate of Six shillings per thousand gallons.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the commissioners for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

- (a) One-eighth of an acre and less, per annum, 5,000 gallons.
- (b) Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 7,500 gallons.
- (c) Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding one-half of an acre, per annum, 12,500 gallons.
- (d) For every additional half-acre, per annum, 12,500 gallons, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every additional fractional part of an acre.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to owners or occupiers of market gardens shall be as follows:—

- (a) One-eighth of an acre and less, per annum, 10,000 gallons.
- (b) Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 15,000 gallons.
- (c) Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding one-half an acre, per annum, 25,000 gallons.
- (d) For every additional half-acre, per annum, 25,000 gallons, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every additional fractional part of an acre.

4. Market gardens shall mean a garden used for the growth of fruit and vegetables for sale.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to owners or occupiers of livery, bait, coaching, carriers', and carters' stables shall be as follows:—

- (a) For each stall exceeding four, but not exceeding ten, 1,250 gallons per annum.
- (b) For each stall above the first ten, but not exceeding twenty, per annum, 750 gallons.

6. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

7. For each private trough, the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum.

8. Water for steam boilers shall be charged on a sliding scale, with a minimum of Seven shillings and sixpence per inch of the diameter of the cylinder, and a maximum of Fifteen shillings; the charge to be determined in each case by the time during which the boiler is in use.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of buildings, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be one thousand gallons for every thousand bricks or fractional part thereof, and five hundred gallons for every cubic yard of concrete or fractional part thereof used in the construction of the building or of the appurtenances thereto, payment to be made in advance.

10. For manufacturing purposes the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is so supplied by measure shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of Fourpence in the pound of valuation for the lands and tenements used for such manufacturing purposes.

And the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the said borough in which such lands or tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purposes of this section of this regulation.

11. The rates and charges for water supplied by measure, as herein provided, shall be payable quarterly, on the thirty-first day of March, the thirtieth day of June, the thirtieth day of September, and the thirty-first day of December, or whenever demanded by any person or persons appointed by the Commissioners of the Trust for the purpose of receiving, collecting, and recovering such rates and charges.

12. The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable in advance as from the first day of January, 1899.

13. For the construction of this regulation the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, it is provided that any Municipal Council, or Waterworks Trust, or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or the majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of the owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land of the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and to create a Trust therein.

And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that, before any District or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act, upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of any such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from a majority in number of the owners of land within any proposed district, a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition, as set forth in the declaration of the Minister, published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or in whole.

And whereas it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations, or additions, or restrictions, as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same, and, if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of certain lands, situate in the parish of Kerang, in the county of Gunbower, in the colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of the proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition), being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district (as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition) an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration, in writing, of the Minister of Water Supply upon the said petition having been complied with, the said Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of November, 1898, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas, after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition, on this 18th day of September, 1899, a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of the land in the district so proposed to be constituted, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition, as set out in the said declaration, in writing, of the Minister might be adopted.

And whereas the Governor in Council having taken all the circumstances into consideration, and having ascertained and being satisfied that there has been a compliance with all the provisions of the said Act necessary to be observed before the approval of the scheme of the petition for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, has determined to approve of the scheme proposed by such petition.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid, doth hereby approve the scheme of the said recited petition for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, as such scheme is set out in the schedule hereto, in which also are set out the boundaries and area of the proposed district.

SCHEDULE.

Scheme and plan of proposed works as approved by this Order.

The scheme or plan of the proposed works shall be the Kow Swamp and Macorna Channel National Works as now existing; the construction of a supply channel from an offtake on the Macorna National Channel, in the parish of Tragowel; and channels for the conveyance and distribution of water in the Trust District.

The Kow Swamp Storage, the Macorna Channel, and collateral works shall be National works. The Trust's supply channel shall be a joint work with the Macorna North and Dry Lake Irrigation and Water Supply Trusts; all other works shall be Trust works.

Boundaries of the Irrigation and Water Supply District constituted by this Order.

Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 5, section III., in the parish of Kerang, county of Gunbower; thence westerly by the south boundary of allotment 5, section III., across a one-chain road, and by the south boundary of allotment 4, section III., to the right bank of the River Loddon;

thence northerly by the said bank of the said river to the north-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence easterly by the north boundary of aforesaid allotment 4, section III., and across a one-chain road to the north-west angle of allotment 5, section III.; thence north-westerly across a one-chain road and by the west boundary of allotment 6, section III., to the north-west angle thereof; thence westerly across a one-chain road and by the south boundary of allotment 2, section III., to the right bank of the River Loddon; thence northerly by the said bank of the said river to the north-west angle of allotment 4, section I.; thence easterly by the north boundary of last-named allotment and across a three-chain road to the north-west angle of allotment 5, section I.; thence north-westerly by the west boundaries of allotments 6 and 7, section I., to the north-west angle of the latter; thence easterly by the north boundary of allotment 7, section I., and across a one-chain road to a point on the west boundary of allotment 7A, section I., one thousand links from its north-west angle; thence northerly by the west boundary of the last-named allotment to its north-west angle; thence easterly by the north boundaries of allotments 7A and 7B, section I., and south-easterly by the north-east boundaries of allotments 7B and 7C, section I., to the south-east angle of the latter; thence westerly by the south boundaries of allotments 7C, 7B, 7A, section I., and across a one-chain and a three-chain road to the south-east angle of allotment 2, section II.; thence south-easterly by the west boundary of said three-chain road forming the east boundaries of allotments 3, 8, and 7, section II., and 8, 7, 6, and 5, section III., to the south-east angle of latter, the point of commencement.

All of which boundaries are as shown on an Order in Council plan deposited in the Office of the Minister of Mines and Water Supply, Melbourne.

And the Honorable Henry Foster, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines and Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SOUTH KERANG IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—CONSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of September, 1899.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, it is enacted that any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or a majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein.

And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that before any District or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of any such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from the majority of the owners of land within any proposed district, that a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition, as set out in the declaration of the Minister published under the Act, may be adopted in part or in whole.

And whereas it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations or additions or restrictions as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same, and if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly.

And whereas it is further enacted that, if the Governor in Council approve of such proposed scheme, with or without any alterations, or additions, or restrictions, he may by Order in Council constitute the proposed district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and appoint and create an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust to construct, maintain, and continue the works described in the Order.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of certain land situate within the parish of Kerang, in the county of Gunbower, in the colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of a proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition) being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district (as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition) an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration, in writing, of the Minister of Water Supply upon the said petition having been complied with, the Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of November, 1898, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition on this 18th day of September, 1899, a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of land in the district proposed to be constituted, such majority

being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition, as set out in the said declaration, in writing, of the Minister might be adopted.

And whereas after compliance with all the provisions under the said Act necessary to be observed before approval of the scheme proposed, the Governor in Council has, by an Order in Council dated this 18th day of September, 1899, approved of the said proposed scheme.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1899* aforesaid, doth declare, order, and direct:—

1. That the said proposed district shall be and the same is hereby constituted, as from the date of this Order, an Irrigation and Water Supply District under the said *Water Act 1899*, and an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is hereby appointed and created to construct, maintain, and continue the works in this Order described in accordance with the provisions of this Order and of the said Act.
2. That the limits and boundaries of the district within which such Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall have authority, and which district shall henceforth be an Irrigation and Water Supply District, shall be those contained within the limits and boundaries of the area of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District hereby constituted, as such limits and boundaries are set out and described in the First Schedule hereto.
3. That the name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be the "South Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply District," and the corporate name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the "South Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."
4. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall be the Kow Swamp and Macorna Channel National Works, as now existing; the construction of a supply channel from an offtake on the Macorna National Channel, in the parish of Tragowel, and channels for the conveyance and distribution of water in the Trust district. The Kow Swamp Storage, the Macorna Channel, and collateral works shall be national works. The Trust's supply channel shall be a joint work with the Macorna North and Dry Lake Irrigation and Water Supply Trusts. All other works shall be Trust works.
5. That the source from which the said South Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is to obtain its supply of water is the Kow Swamp Storage Basin.
6. That the total amount of money proposed to be expended by the said South Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be £520, viz.:—£60 for estimated share of liabilities on works constructed by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust; and £460, the share of joint work with the Macorna North and Dry Lake Irrigation and Water Supply Trusts.
7. That the amount of money proposed to be advanced by the Board of Land and Works to the said South Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply Trust by way of loan is Five hundred and twenty pounds sterling (£520); that the rate of interest to be paid upon such loan is Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, being one-half per cent. higher than the rate paid by the Government upon the public loan out of which such moneys are to be advanced; the rate of such interest to be subject to reduction in accordance with section three hundred and six of the said Act, in event of the interest paid by the Government upon such public loan being reduced.
8. The rate at which the Trust shall pay for water supplied from the National Works shall be Thirteen shillings (13s.) per cubic foot per minute during the winter, and Twenty shillings (20s.) per cubic foot per minute during the summer irrigating periods.
The quantity of water which the Trust shall be entitled and required to take from the National Works shall be ninety-three (93) cubic feet per minute in the winter season, and fifty-six (56) cubic feet per minute in the summer season.
The proportion of water that each Trust shall be entitled and required to take from the joint channel shall be as follows:—

South Kerang Trust	15.8 per cent.
Dry Lake Trust	18.7 "
Macorna North Trust	42.1 "
Proportion reserved for the supply of further areas from the joint channel	23.4 "
Total	100.0 "

9. That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed by the said South Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not at any time, together with any balance due from the Trust to the Board of Land and Works, or upon any Trust loan, exceed the sum of Five hundred and twenty pounds sterling (£520). And no rate made by the said South Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall exceed the sum of Five shillings in the pound (£1) upon the annual value of the property rated within the Trust District.
10. That the number of persons to be elected as commissioners of the said South Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be three, and the period for which they shall hold office shall be that provided in such regulations as may hereafter be made by the Governor in Council for the election of commissioners for the Trust.

SOUTH KERANG IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of September, 1899.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Sir George Turner

Mr. Foster.

WHEREAS by section 222 of the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust duly appointed and created under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following:—

- (a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any Trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat.
- (c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up, and
- (d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust duly appointed and created under the said Act, and known as the South Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz.:—

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations, "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the South Kerang Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district" shall mean the lands as defined by the Order in Council appointing and creating the said Trust wherein the Trust shall have authority.

2. Period for which commissioners shall hold office.—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners

hereinafter contained for securing the annual retirement of one commissioner, the period during which the commissioners of the said Trust shall hold office shall be three years.

3. Annual retirement of commissioners.—Commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

4. Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.—At the first election of commissioners one of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioner for the term of three years, one other of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining person elected as such commissioner shall hold office for the term of one year, and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following (that is to say):—

(a) How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.

—If the first election is made without a poll, as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall immediately upon such election be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) How term of office ascertained when poll taken.—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the three candidates elected as commissioners the candidate who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioner for the term of three years, and the candidate who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining candidate who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

5. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

6. Date of first election of commissioners; date of ordinary annual election.—The first election of commissioners of the said Trust shall be held on the eighth day of November, 1899, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the eighth day of November in each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any date set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

7. Voters' list to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said Trust a voters' list shall be prepared by the persons upon whose petition the said Trust has been appointed and created, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

8. Form of voters' list. First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, or under the provisions of any Act amending the same, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.

9. Voting in respect of lands jointly owned or leased.—In the case of joint owners of land, or in the case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees, as the case may be, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

10. Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection. Second Schedule. Objections to list to be in writing and forwarded to Minister.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day-time, in some convenient place within or near to the district of the Trust for a period of seven clear days;

and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

11. Grounds of objection to be stated.—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within ten days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

12. Minister to revise and certify lists.—The Minister shall revise the said list and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

13. Certified list to be voters' roll.—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the Trust, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

14. Voters' list to be prepared yearly.—Before the first day of September in each year the officers of the Trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname and address (so far as these may be known) of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the *Water Act 1890* or under the provisions of any Act amending the same, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty the land of each such person, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.

15. Voting in respect of lands jointly owned or leased.—In the case of joint owners of land, or in the case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees, as the case may be, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list or lists shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

16. Copy of list to be available for inspection.—Third Schedule.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day-time, at some convenient place within or near to the district of the Trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

17. Grounds of objections to list to be forwarded in writing to the chairman of Trust.—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

18. Special meeting of Trust to be held to revise list.—List to be certified.—In the month of September in each year a special meeting of the Trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list; and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as by these regulations are required to be made; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

19. Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of Trust commissioners to be held within one year from the eighth day of November then next, the said day inclusive.

20. Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, the chairman of the Trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the Trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the Trust may by resolution appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

21. Notice of election.—Nomination of candidates.—Fourth Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district to be named in such notice, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon, and four o'clock in the afternoon, on

some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper in the form of the Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named, and such candidate or some person on his behalf shall at the time when such nomination paper is delivered to the returning officer pay into the hands of the said returning officer the sum of Ten pounds sterling (£10) to be dealt with as by law provided, and no person who shall not have been so nominated and by whom or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made shall within the subsequent provisions of these regulations be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

22. Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

23. Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.—Fifth Schedule.—Notice of poll.—Hours of polling.—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the district stating the names of the person so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said area as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at four o'clock in the afternoon.

24. Retirement of candidates before polling-day.—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer not later than four clear days before the day of polling a notice in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires, and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the district a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom, and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

25. Polling booth may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

26. Returning officer to preside at polling booth.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.

27. Scrutineers may be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted, at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.

28. Pencils to be provided.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins, and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

29. Mode of voting.—Where voter is illiterate.—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate, and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers, as the case may be, shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time, and no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or

papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-paper, or exercise any further right of voting.

30. Ballot-papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

31. Informal ballot-papers.—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

32. What question may be asked.—At any election of commissioners, the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

"Are you the person whose name appears as (A. B.) in the roll now in force for this Trust, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of _____ being (here specify land as described in the roll)?"

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

33. False answer, polling twice, and personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

34. Result of polling, how ascertained.—Returning officer to have casting vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected Commissioners of the Trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officers shall in each case have the casting vote.

35. Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of Commissioners, forthwith after the declaration of the poll indorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of Trust Commissioners shall have been held, forward such sealed packet to the secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, indorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the Commissioners of the Trust.

36. Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question in writing to the Minister, who shall decide the same, and such decision shall be final and binding.

37. Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at any subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, such question shall be determined by the Commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no Commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a Commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner until such question shall have been so determined, and the majority of the Commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

38. Appeal to Minister from determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

39. Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.—If at any election of Commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the Commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

40. Expenses of election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election, shall be defrayed by the Trust.

41. Penalty for breach of regulations.—Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

42. Interpretation.—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby appoint that all assessments of incomes for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1899, which were not made on or before the 12th day of September, 1899, shall be made on or before the 14th day of December, 1899, and that the tax payable on such assessments shall be paid on or before the 29th day of December, 1899.

DEFINITION AND CLASSIFICATION OF
EXPLOSIVES AMENDED.

WHEREAS by the 49th section of the *Explosives Act 1890* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order define for the purposes of the First Part of that Act the composition, quality, and character of any explosive, and may classify explosives: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made in pursuance of the provisions aforesaid and bearing date the 13th day of December, 1897, explosives were classified as detailed in the said Order, and the composition, quality, and character of the explosive known as "Rendite" was amongst others defined: And whereas by a subsequent Order made as aforesaid and bearing date the 19th day of April, 1898, the composition, quality, and character of the said "Rendite" explosive was redefined: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order substitute the following definition of the composition, quality, and character of "Rendite" for that contained in the said last-mentioned Order of the 19th day of April, 1898, that is to say:—

RENDITE.—Consisting of Potassium Nitrate, Sulphur, Picric Acid, Potassium Bicarbonate, and Wood Meal, with or without the addition of Graphite (free from grit) provided that—

1. The amount of Picric Acid or Graphite shall not exceed 2 per cent. of the finished explosive.
2. The amount of Potassium Bicarbonate added shall be sufficient to impart an alkaline reaction to the finished explosive.
3. All the ingredients shall be thoroughly purified.

And the Honorable Robert Wallace Best, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Trade and Customs, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATION.

MANUFACTURE OR KEEPING, ETC., OF FIREWORKS.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Explosives Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1090) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations and rescind the same providing for the storage of Explosives, and, notwithstanding anything in the said Part of the said Act, may from time to time by Order prohibit, either absolutely or subject to conditions or restrictions, the manufacture, keeping, importation from any place out of Victoria, conveyance and sale, or any of them, of any explosive when in the judgment of the Governor in Council it is expedient for the public safety to make such Order: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following Regulation, viz.:—

Manufacture or Keeping, &c., of Fireworks.

No firework as defined by the Order in Council No. 1 made under the provisions of section 49 of the *Explosives Act 1890* and in force for the time being, and which firework consists of sulphur in admixture with Chlorate of Potassium or other Chlorates or which contains any such admixture, shall be manufactured, imported, kept, conveyed, or sold, except with the consent of and subject to conditions approved by a Government-Inspector of Explosives.

Factories and Shops Acts.

HALF-HOLIDAY FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF SHOPS
IN THE TOWNSHIP OF KERANG AND THE
PARISH OF KERANG.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, closing all shops, other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* or all shops of any particular class within such district on one specified day in each week from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council, and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk of such district as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers, other than those mentioned in the said Fourth Schedule, or of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected (as the case may be): And whereas petitions have been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the Township of Kerang and the Parish of Kerang, in the municipal district of the Shire of Kerang, all bakers' shops, all boot shops, all butchers' shops, all drapers' shops, all fancy goods shops, all grocers' shops, and all ironmongers' shops shall be closed on Wednesday in each week from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon: And whereas such petitions have been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as being signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of each particular class to be affected within such district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

All bakers' shops, all boot shops, all butchers' shops, all drapers' shops, all fancy goods shops, all grocers' shops, and all ironmongers' shops within the Township of Kerang and the Parish of Kerang, in the municipal district of the Shire of Kerang, shall be closed on Wednesday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

LILYDALE AND WARBURTON RAILWAY
CONSTRUCTION TRUST.

REGULATION No. 1.

FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE TRUST, AND GENERALLY FOR
REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE TRUST.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of September, 1899.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Sir George Turner | Mr. Foster.

WHEREAS by section 25 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* (No. 1238) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under Part I. of the said Act for the purposes following:—

- (a) The mode in which meetings of the members of Trusts under the said Part of the said Act are to be convened;
- (b) The form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under the said Act; and
- (c) Generally for regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of such Trusts and the numbers of members to form quorums thereof, and the appointment of the Chairman of each Trust, and for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part of the said Act.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts, and known as the Lilydale and Warburton Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulation following, viz.:—

1. First meeting.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.
2. Time and place of meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.
3. Quorums of meetings.—There shall be present at least two members from each municipal council in such Construction District at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of four members, exclusive of the Chairman.
4. Chairmen.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually by a majority of votes of those present, and he

shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.

5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting. Provided that in the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district and be willing to act.

6. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.

7. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any seven members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless seven clear days' notice thereof at least be given.

8. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

9. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, seven clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.

10. Minutes of meeting to be read at subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any Committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.

11. Order of business of meetings.—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of Committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

12. Addresses to the Governor in Council.—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

13. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.

14. Notice of motion to be given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

15. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

16. Motions to be moved in order.—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

17. Motion to be moved by member giving notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

18. Mover of motion appointing committee to be a member.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

19. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

20. Order, &c., of debate.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the Chair may proceed with his subject.

21. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

22. No motion to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.

23. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

24. Mover of motion.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

25. Motions, &c., how decided.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.

26. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.

27. Priority of members.—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.

28. Members to stand while addressing the Trust.—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

29. Points of order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussion or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

30. Members not to digress.—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

31. Members to apologize for disorderly or offensive expressions.—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

32. Members called to order to sit down.—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.

33. Members twice offending to be liable to a penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

34. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

35. Members may demand documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

36. No second amendment until previous one disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

37. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.

38. No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any other order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

39. Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

40. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

41. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

43. Meetings of Committees.—The Secretary shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the Committee.

44. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

45. No debate shall take place upon petitions.—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial, except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a Committee.

46. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or Committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.

47. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

48. Collector.—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay to the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the Secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.

49. Appointment, &c., of Officers.—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Construction District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.

50. Salaries of Officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

52. Common seal.—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.

53. Suspension of rules.—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended *pro tem.* in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

54. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

And the Honorable Henry Roberts Williams, Her Majesty's Minister of Railways for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TALGARNO PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Talgarno Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on

obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burial shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

EXEMPTIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, from the date hereof, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the said Schedule, that is to say:

SWAMP LANDS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION UNDER CONDITIONAL PURCHASE LEASE OR PERPETUAL LEASE.

MOR SWAMP.

The allotments mentioned in the schedule hereunder will be available for application on or before Wednesday, 27th September, 1899.

Applications, accompanied by the registration fee of £1, must be made on usual form, and lodged at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

All applications so lodged on or before the above-mentioned date will be deemed to have been simultaneously made.

The applications received will be dealt with by a Special Local Land Board; the place and date of sitting of which will be hereafter notified.

Not more than one allotment may be included in any application.

Conditional Purchase Lease.

Every conditional purchase lease will be dated the 1st day of January, 1900, and may be for such a term of years, not exceeding 31½, as may be agreed upon between the lessee and the Board.

The purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments (including deposit), calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

On a conditional purchase lease, application a deposit equal to the two (2) first instalments of purchase money, together with fees (including survey charge), must be paid within fourteen days after an allotment has been recommended.

Perpetual Lease.

On a perpetual lease application the first rent and fees (including survey charge), must be paid within fourteen days after an allotment has been recommended.

Rent.

On payment of deposit or rent, together with fees, a permit to occupy will forthwith issue.
