TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date earlier than the 2nd December, 1898, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up for the Legislative Assembly on the 1st November and for the Legislative Council on the 1st December next.

Notwithstanding that Assembly rights bear on their faces a notice that they hold good until the 1st December, 1899, they must, under a recent alteration in the law, be renewed before or on the 1st November.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in April, 1900.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. If application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue rights to all applicants, and those to whom rights are not issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

No person whose name is already on the roll of ratepaying electors for any division of an electoral district may obtain an elector's right for such district.

Foreigners who desire to obtain electors' rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Electors' rights for the Legislative Assembly can now be obtained free of charge, and "residential" rights for the Assembly may be applied for either in person or in writing through the post. Forms necessary for applications through the post are obtainable at the offices of the Registrars and Deputies, and at all Courts of Petty Sessions, Post offices, and Police Stations.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the right.

NOTICE OF INTENTION REGARDING FISHING IN THE BARWON RIVER.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended at the expiration of one month from the date of this notice to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make and publish in the *Government Gazette* a proclamation under the *Fisheries Act 1890* revoking the proclamation made on the 24th day of December, 1895, relating to netting in the Barwon River, and in lieu thereof to make and publish in the *Government Gazette* a proclamation under the *Fisheries Act 1890* defining the mouth of the Barwon River to be a line commencing at the extreme seaward point of Barwon Head, thence extending north 16° east, approximately, to a post on the foreshore in line with the tower of the Ocean Grove Coffee Palace.

SMALL-POX ON BOARD THE STEAM-SHIP "AFRIC."

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship *Afric* has arrived in Victorian waters, and had on board during the voyage a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the Colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and do further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

MIDDLE CHANNEL INTO BROADMOUNT HARBOR,
FITZROY RIVER.

NOTICE is hereby given that, on and after the 25th October next, the Middle Channel into Broadmount Harbor, Fitzroy River, will be available for navigation.

The entrance is marked by an Occulting Gas Buoy, painted black, and moored in 21 feet at low water, with Sea Hill Light-house bearing E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., distance 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

Between the Gas Buoy and Broadmount there are seven leads, marked as follows:—

No. 1 Lead—By two Dolphin Structures, surmounted by lantern houses painted white, used as Beacons by day, and from which two white lights are shown at night.

No. 2 Lead—By two Dolphin Structures, surmounted by lantern houses painted white, used as Beacons by day, and from which two lights, red and white, are shown at night.

No. 3 Lead—By two Dolphin Structures, surmounted by lantern houses painted white, used as Beacons by day, and from which two lights, red and white, are shown at night.

No. 4 Lead—By two Dolphin Structures, surmounted by lantern houses painted white, and also two Triangular Beacons. Two white lights are shown from the lantern houses at night.

No. 5 Lead—By four Triangular Beacons, two at each end, the Shore Beacons carrying red and white lights at night.

No. 6 Lead—By two Triangular Beacons, carrying green lights at night.

No. 7 Lead—By two Triangular Beacons, carrying red and white lights at night.

In the Bi-coloured Leads, the red is the front light in each case.

DIRECTIONS.

By Day.—After passing the Timandra Gas Buoy, steer S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. $\frac{1}{2}$ miles for the Middle Channel Gas Buoy, and pass it at a cable's distance on the port hand, bringing the first pair of Dolphins, bearing S. 25° W., into line.

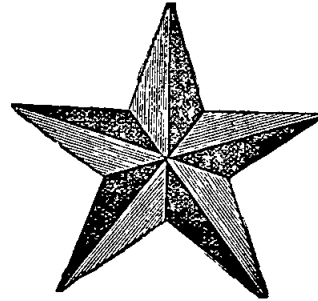

The births of 1,164 children, viz., 593 boys and 571 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. The number was, it will be observed, 121 more than in September, 1893, also exceeded that recorded for the month in all the previous years since 1893, except 1896 and 1894—in the latter of which it was the same as in the month under review. The number was, however, 136 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 162 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in September numbered 530, viz., 304 of males and 226 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 634, or by 120 per cent., as against only 91 per cent. in September, 1893, and 117 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 18 smaller than in September, 1898 or 1897, and the lowest recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years, except 1892 and 1896; it was also 70 below the average of September during the last ten years, or 82 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 30.14 and of deaths registered to 13.72 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1898 of 27.72 and 14.54 respectively, and during the last ten years of 34.32 and 15.84 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 32.45 and 17.58.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 77.5° on the 3rd, and the lowest was 35.0° on the 25th. The mean temperature of the month (53.3°) was half a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (29.6°) took place on the 3rd, and the least range (0.8°) on the 9th. The mean daily range was 16.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.400 inches on the 19th, and the lowest was 29.505 inches on the 22nd. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.026 inches) was nearly one-eighth of an inch above the average, and but little below the maximum recorded for this month in the last eleven years.

Rain fell on eleven days, the amount being 1.11 inches, which was lower than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years, and 1.13 inches below the average during that period. The mean humidity of the month was .72.

Males contributed 57 per cent. and females 43 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 18 per cent. to that mortality, as against 25 per cent. in September, 1898; 21 per cent. in September, 1897; 20 per cent. in September, 1896; 22 per cent. in September, 1895; 30 per cent. in September, 1894; and 29 per cent. in September, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 71, as compared with 85 in September, 1898. The rate of infant mortality was only 61 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 81 in September, 1898; 75 in September, 1897; 59 in September, 1896; 88 in September, 1895; 89 in September, 1894; 91 in September, 1893; 72 in September, 1892; 123 in September, 1891; 89 in September, 1890; and 98 per 1,000 in September, 1889.

Sixty persons—as against 57 in September, 1898—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of influenza; a miner, aged 75, of phthisis; a gentleman and a dairyman, both aged 75, of apoplexy; three females, each aged 75, of heart disease, asthma, and pneumonia respectively; a labourer, aged 76, of paralysis; a sailor, aged 76, was found drowned in the River Yarra; a gentleman, aged 77, died of cancer; a blacksmith, aged 77, of syncope; four females, each aged 77, of heart disease, pneumonia, obstruction of the intestines, and cirrhosis of the liver respectively; a female, aged 78, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a labourer, aged 78, of syncope; a baker, aged 78, of heart disease; a cook, aged 79, of diarrhœa; a female, aged 79, of bronchitis; a cook (male), aged 80, of gout; an ex-civil servant and a gentleman, both aged 80, of cancer; two gentlemen, both aged 80, of apoplexy; a female, aged 80, of insanity; a shoemaker, aged 80, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 81, of influenza; a female, aged 81, of disease of the spine; a grazier, aged 81, of dilatation of the heart; a female, aged 81, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 82, of heart disease; a grocer, aged 83, of apoplexy; a labourer, aged 83, of heart disease; a Presbyterian minister, aged 83, of disease of the prostate; a land-owner, aged 83, of a carbuncle; a farmer, aged 84, of rheumatism; a gentleman, aged 84, of inflammation of the bowels; a male, of no occupation, aged 85, of gout; a sailor, aged 85, of insanity; a dressmaker, aged 87, of syncope; a tinsmith, aged 90, of aneurism; two gentlemen, both aged 90, of pneumonia and cystitis respectively; a female, aged 91, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, a plasterer, a tailor, and a female, each aged 77, a baker and a female, both aged 78, two females, aged 79 and 82 respectively, a labourer, aged 84, three females, aged 85, 85, and 88 respectively, a gardener and a female, both aged 90, and a female, aged 98, of old age.

Twenty-four of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 25 in September, 1898—were from external causes, of which 21 were set down to accident and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—Two cab-drivers, both aged 66 died of fracture of the spine, the result of being thrown from cabs; a presser, aged 42, of injuries caused by a fall from his bicycle through skidding; a female, aged 46, of fracture of the skull, and a female, aged 55, of fracture of the spine, consequent, in both cases, on falls downstairs; a fireman, aged 33, of hæmorrhage from the sloughing of the blood vessels of the neck, the result of injuries caused by a fall whilst drunk; a groom, aged 45, of injuries to the head, caused by a fall whilst in a fit; a slater, aged 60, and a plasterer, aged 67, of injuries, both consequent on falls; an engine-driver, aged 68, of injuries caused by a stone falling on him; a female, aged 44, of traumatic tetanus; a male child, aged 2, of scalds; a boy, aged 11, was drowned by falling into the Merri Creek; an accountant, aged 46, a farmer, aged 69, a sailor, aged 76, and two females, aged 18 and 40 respectively, were "found drowned" in the River Yarra; two male infants, aged 13 days and 4 months respectively, were overland; a seaman, aged 40, died of suffocation, there being not sufficient evidence to show how caused. The suicidal deaths were those of a commercial traveller, aged 42, who shot himself; a dealer, aged 67, who cut his throat; and a labourer, aged 35, who hanged himself.

One hundred and thirty-six deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—51 in the Melbourne, 23 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 5 in the Women's, 5 in the Children's, 3 in the Homœopathic, and 11 in the Austin Hospitals; 8 in the Metropolitan and 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 3 in the Immigrants' Home; 12 in the Benevolent and 1 in the Infant Asylums; and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 94, of which 53, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 41, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 71 were under one year of age, 14 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 1 was between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 436. Of these 251, or 58 per cent., were males, and 185, or 42 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 21 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 35 were between thirty-five and forty, 36 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 19 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 41 were between sixty and sixty-five, 49 were between sixty-five and seventy, 46 were between seventy and seventy-five, 27 were between seventy-five and eighty, 20 were between eighty and eighty-five, 6 were between eighty-five and ninety, 6 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-eight years.

The total mortality of the month was slightly lower than in the corresponding month of 1898; but, as regards the different classes of disease, there was an increase of 12 in the deaths from developmental diseases, and of 1 in those from local diseases; but a decrease of 16 in those from constitutional diseases, 7 in those from zymotic diseases, 5 in those from ill-defined diseases, and by only 1 each in the cases of parasitic diseases, dietic diseases, and violence. There were, however, greater variations in regard to individual causes. In the zymotic class, deaths from measles fell from 15 to *nil*, and those from diphtheria from 7 to 2; but those from influenza rose from 5 to 10, and whooping-cough from 2 to 8. In the constitutional class there was a decrease from 69 to 48 under phthisis, and from 10 to 6 under tubercular meningitis; but an increase under cancer from 30 to 40. In the developmental class, deaths from old age rose from 18 to 23, and those from premature birth from 10 to 14. Under local diseases the only noticeable falling off was under diseases of the respiratory system, the deaths from which fell from 118 to 70, which was more than counterbalanced by increases of 36 and 19 under diseases of the nervous and digestive systems respectively.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1898, and the first nine months of 1899, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from diphtheria during the last nine months, and from typhoid fever in the last five months, was below the average.
