MARY RIVER.—ADDITIONAL LIGHTS AND LEADING BEACONS.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after 18th November, 1899, the following new pair of leading lights and triangular beacons will be exhibited in the Mary River, viz.:

Two white triangular beacons with a black vertical stripe in centre carrying lights at night situated on the right bank of the Mary River, about 8½ cables above the Leslie Rock, which in line bear about S. 29° E. and lead up the Dundathu Reach, intersecting the Dundathu Cutting lead.

Directions.—After passing through No. 2 or Leslie Rock Cutting, with the leading lights and beacons astern in line, continue keeping clear to the south or right bank until the leading beacons named above come in line astern, when continue with them in that position until the leading beacons for Dundathu Cutting come in line astern (or the leading lights in line ahead), when continue as before.

The new front light will be red. The least depth on this line at low-water springs is 10 feet.

GENERAL NOTICE.

The births of 1,027 children, viz., 525 boys and 502 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of October. This is the first time since 1895 that the number for October exceeded 1,000; which may be taken as a fair indication that the unprecedented decline in the birth rate, which had gone on uninterruptedly ever since 1891, has at last ceased, and will be followed by a marked improvement in the immediate future.

The deaths recorded in October numbered 645, viz., 352 of males and 293 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 382, or by 59 per cent., as against 56 per cent. in October, 1893, and 102 per cent. according to the average. The number exceeded, it will be noticed, that in October, 1893, by 71, and was far larger than that recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years, except 1889—when the number was equal—and 1891; and was 55 above the average of October during the last ten years, or 43 above it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.73 and of deaths registered to 16.16 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1898 of 23.00 and 14.74 respectively, and during the last ten years of 30.83 and 15.24 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 32.45 and 17.33. The birth rate for the month under notice was thus 5 per 1,000 below, but the death rate was nearly 1 per 1,000 above the average.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 81.0° on the 31st, and the lowest was 36.1° on the 1st. The mean temperature of the month (53.5°) was 4 degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35.6°) took place on the 31st, and the least range (4.6°) on the 14th. The mean daily range was 17.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.489 inches on the 28th, and the lowest was 29.332 inches on the 10th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.953 inches) was one-tenth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on thirteen days, the amount being 3.28 inches, which was higher than that recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years, except 1892, 1893, and 1894, and also an inch more than the average during that period.

The mean humidity of the month was 72. Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed only 19 per cent. to that mortality, as against 30 per cent. in October, 1898; 19 per cent. in October, 1897; 21 per cent. in October, 1896; 21 per cent. in October, 1895; 24 per cent. in October, 1894; and 28 per cent. in October, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 91, as compared with 119 in October, 1898. The rate of infantile mortality was 89 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 133 in October, 1898; 64 in October, 1897; 65 in October, 1896; 79 in October, 1895; 64 in October, 1894; 72 in October, 1893; 77 in October, 1892; 136 in October, 1891; 88 in October, 1890; and 134 per 1,000 in October, 1889.

Eighty-two persons—as against 64 in October, 1898—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a pensioner, aged 75, died of influenza; a commercial traveller, aged 75, of cancer; a publican, aged 75, of apoplexy; a female, aged 75, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 75, of pericarditis; three females, each aged 75, of heart disease, bronchitis, and pneumonia respectively; a female, aged 76, of cancer; a painter, aged 76, of meningitis; a gentleman, aged 76, of paralysis; two females, each aged 76, of myelitis and heart disease respectively; a flock manufacturer and two females, all aged 77, of influenza; a mariner, aged 77, of diarrhoea; a bricklayer, aged 77, of phthisis; a female, aged 77, of valvular disease of the heart; a greengrocer, aged 77, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 78, of influenza; a teacher, aged 78, of cancer; a clerk, aged 78, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; a male of no occupation, aged 78, of heart disease; two females, both aged 78, of bronchitis; a clergyman, aged 78, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 78, of inflammation of the stomach; two females, both aged 78, of influenza; a female, aged 79, of uremia; a taxidermist, aged 79, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 79, of cystitis; two gentlemen and two females, all aged 80, of influenza; a female, aged 80, of paralysis; a farmer, aged 80, of heart disease; a grocer, aged 80, of bronchitis; a merchant, a cabinetmaker, a labourer, and a female, all aged 81, of influenza; an architect, aged 81, of cancer; a labourer, aged 81, of heart disease; two females, each aged 82, of influenza and valvular disease of the heart respectively; a gentleman, aged 82, of peritonitis; a gentleman and a female, both aged 83, of influenza; a land agent, aged 83, of apoplexy; a wool spinner, aged 83, of bronchitis; a commercial traveller and two females, all aged 84, of influenza; an actuary, aged 84, of heart disease; a female, aged 85, of hemiplegia; two females, aged 86 and 87 respectively, of influenza; a female, aged 87, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 91, of disease of the kidneys; two females, aged 91 and 92 respectively, of influenza; a miner aged 76, a chaff-cutter aged 77, three females—all aged 78, a gentleman and a labourer—both aged 81, a labourer aged 83, two females—both aged 84, two females—both aged 86, a saddler aged 88, and a female aged 92, of old age.

Sixteen of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 24 in October, 1898—were from external causes, of which 14 were set down to accident and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths.—A miner, aged 32, died of laceration of the brain, caused by a fall off a tram-car; a collector, aged 65, of internal injuries, the result of being knocked down by a cab; a labourer, aged 27, and a drover, aged 29, were passed over by a lorry and waggon respectively; a female, aged 9, died of rupture of the liver, consequent on a fall; a boy, aged 3, and a girl, aged 5, of burns; a boy, aged 2, of ptomaine poisoning; five persons were found drowned, viz., a cook, aged 39, and an engineer, aged 46, in the River Yarra, a stonemason, aged 30, in the Saltwater River, a servant (female), aged 34, in the Albert Park Lagoon, and a gardener, aged 62, in Hobson's Bay; a male child, aged 1 month, was overlain. The suicidal deaths were those of a draper, aged 42, and a female, aged 23, who cut their throats.

One hundred and sixty-six deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—62 in the Melbourne, 13 in the Alfred, 5 in St. Vincent's, 6 in the Women's, 6 in the Children's, 9 in the Homeopathic, and 14 in the Austin Hospitals; 13 in the Metropolitan and 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 11 in the Immigrants' Home; 14 in the Benevolent and 1 in the Infant Asylums; 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 125, of which 74, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 51, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 91 were under one year of age, 14 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 1 was between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 520. Of these 278, or 53 per cent., were males, and 242, or 47 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and thirty, 34 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 31 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 56 were between sixty and sixty-five, 61 were between sixty-five and seventy, 64 were between seventy and seventy-five, 42 were between seventy-five and eighty, 29 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, 3 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-nine.

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding month of the previous year, the deaths from zymotic diseases increased by 69, those from local diseases by 12, and those from developmental diseases by 3; whereas those from violence fell off by 8, from constitutional diseases by 4, and from ill-defined causes by 1. The increased mortality from zymotic diseases, as well as that from all causes combined (viz., 71), was solely due to the presence of an unusually fatal epidemic of influenza, which caused 91 deaths as against only 6 in October, 1898. The only other noticeable fluctuations were increases of 27 and 15 under diseases of the nervous and urinary systems respectively; but, as against these, there were decreases in the same class of 18 and 11 under diseases of the digestive and respiratory systems respectively.

Influenza seems to have first appeared in an endemic form in Melbourne in April, 1890 (when 30 deaths occurred). Prior to that period the average annual number of deaths from the disease was only 7, and the highest ever recorded was 15; but, since 1889, the number was once as high as 406, viz., in 1891, and varied in the eight other years ended with 1898 from a minimum of 34 to a maximum of 134, and averaged 69. The largest number ever recorded in one month was 233, viz., in October, 1891, the next largest being in the month under review, and the next in September and November, 1891—when 90 and 58 deaths respectively occurred. As a rule the principal epidemics appeared in the spring season of the year (September to November). The number of deaths from influenza in each month during the ten years ended with 1899 is shown in the following table:—

Of the deaths from the recent epidemic, 15 occurred in the City of Melbourne (including 8 in Carlton), 11 in Richmond, 10 in Brunswick, 7 each in North Melbourne and Collingwood, 5 each in Hawthorn, the Remainder of District, and Public Institutions (1 occurring in each of the following institutions, viz.:—Immigrants' Home, Benevolent Asylum, Old Colonists' Home, Coburg Female Prison, and Alfred Hospital), and 4 in St. Kilda. On the other hand, no deaths occurred in Kew, Footscray, Oakleigh, or Malvern, and only 1 in Essendon; but 2 or 3 in each of the other Sub-Districts. The epidemic was especially fatal to elderly people, the great majority of those who died being over 60. Only 1 death occurred between the ages of 15 and 30, and 21 between 30 and 60, although the number of persons affected with the disease at those ages must have been very numerous. The ages of the victims are shown by the following figures:—

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1898, and the first ten months of 1899, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from diphtheria during the last ten months, and from typhoid fever in the last six months, was below the average.

BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1900.

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust.

1. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.

3. For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five (5) feet shall be charged for as a stall.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1900.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS UNDER THE LAND ACTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of November, 1899.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Peacock | Mr. McCulloch.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid, that is to say:—

PART IV.—SAW-MILL AND TIMBER LICENCES.

From and after 1st December, 1899, the Timber Regulations contained in Part IV. of the Regulations made on 4th July, 1899, shall not apply to the Wombat State Forest.

Chapter VIII.—Licences for Deadwood.—State Forests.

To the list of exemptions is to be added the following, viz.:—Wombat State Forest.

Chapter XIII.—Wombat State Forest.

The Regulations, together with Schedules 129 and 130, made on 4th July, 1899, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations and Schedules are made in lieu thereof:—

From and after 1st December, 1899, timber of all kinds, other than redgum within the Wombat State Forest shall be sold under special permit and royalty only at the prices hereafter stated, and subject to the conditions in Schedule 129A hereto; but licences current shall remain in force until their expiry by effluxion of time, and written contracts now existing for the supply of timber shall not be affected by this Regulation, provided that such contracts had been entered into prior to the 27th June, 1899, and will expire not later than six months from such date.

Timber not otherwise specified, at rates to be fixed by the Minister.

Burnt young timber may be obtained at half the above rates from such areas in the western part of the forest as may be approved of by the Conservator of Forests.

Saw-millers may obtain the exclusive right to fell timber other than redgum, on royalty, on an area not exceeding 640 acres in connexion with any one saw-mill, should the Minister think fit to grant a licence therefor, at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per month for 100 acres or portion thereof; but no person or firm shall be permitted to hold more than 1,280 acres in one or more areas at any one time. These areas shall be known as "Special Areas," and every holder of such area or areas shall be entitled, within the boundaries of any such area, to a saw-mill site, not exceeding 5 acres in extent, for the purpose of operating on timber obtained under these Regulations. The locality of each site shall be approved by the forest officer, and no fee shall be charged for the site. All timber remaining on a "Special Area," after the expiration of the licence for the same, shall revert to the Crown. The Minister may, however, should the circumstances in his opinion warrant the concession, grant a stated time after the expiration of a "Special Area" licence for the removal of any timber purchased by the licensee under these Regulations.

The licence for a "Special Area" shall be in the form and subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 130A hereto.

Licences shall, at the discretion of the Minister, be granted to saw-millers of areas of not more than 5 acres each, as a site for a saw-mill, for the purpose of therein operating upon the timber obtained under these Regulations. The fee for such site shall be Ten shillings (10s.) per month, payable quarterly in advance.

As soon as may be, after examination of the entire area included in the forest by the Conservator of Forests and the Inspector and Assistant Inspector of Forests, the issue of licences to split timber within the forest shall be limited to such number as those officers, having regard to the conservation and protection of the young timber, may determine.

All-priced timber licences issued after 21st October, 1899, shall terminate not later than 30th November, 1899, and the fee payable in respect of each of such licences shall be determined by the proportionate part of the quarter during which they have currency.

Every person employed by a permit-holder must obtain a "free permit," which must be produced when demanded by a forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.

WOMBAT STATE FOREST.

Conditions of Permit for Timber other than Redgum.

1. This permit is available for a period of from
2. Applications shall be made to the officer in charge of the forest, who will arrange for the work to proceed without delay immediately on the issue of the permit by him.
3. The officer in charge will locate the permit-holder in any portion of the forest which, in his opinion, is most suitable, and, when necessary, will mark with the broad arrow (thus †) the trees which may be felled. He will also give the permit-holder instructions generally how to proceed with the work.
4. All forest produce cut under this permit must be branded with the Crown brand by the officer in charge, and paid for before removal from the place where felled, but the forest officer may, in his discretion, arrange for branding at any depot or railway station.
5. Should the officer in charge deem it necessary, he may require that a sum of not less than £2 shall be deposited by permit-holders who obtain props and other timber, as a guarantee of strict compliance with the conditions of this permit.
6. Permit-holders must stack and burn off all debris when directed to do so by the officer in charge, and this must be done to his satisfaction, or that of the supervising officer. In the event of any wilful breach of this condition taking place, the Minister may cancel this permit, forfeit any deposit, and seize all timber already cut.
7. If the permit-holder remove, or allow to be removed, unbranded timber, cut under this permit without special authority in writing, from the officer in charge, legal proceedings will be taken against him under the provisions of the *Land Act 1890* or the *Crimes Act 1890*, and any person having in his possession unbranded timber cut under a permit, and without having written authority from the forest officer for the possession of the same, will also be prosecuted under the provisions of the *Land Act 1890* or the *Crimes Act 1890*.
8. This permit is personal, and must be produced when demanded by a forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.
9. The forest officer may, in writing, summarily suspend any permit pending the decision of the Minister, and during such suspension the permit shall have no force or effect.
10. When felling trees or burning debris the utmost care shall be taken that no young timber is broken down, injured, or burnt by fire. No live tree shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.
11. No tree shall be felled so as to obstruct any path or road used for the transport of timber or stores, or by the public generally.
12. The permit-holder may cut upon the block assigned to him as late in the year as is consistent with safety from bush fires. Upon receiving fourteen days' notice the permit-holder shall at once clear up his block to the satisfaction of the officer in charge, and shall entirely cease work within the period mentioned.
13. Fires shall not be permitted within the forest during the period from 1st December to 28th February, except special precautions be taken in lighting such fires in a bare cleared space of at least 20 feet in diameter, and in a hole dug for the purpose. Small wood only shall be used, and every fire shall be carefully extinguished by being covered with earth, or being put out by water. The burning off of debris during the period above specified is strictly prohibited. The lighting of standing trees, stumps, or fallen logs is strictly prohibited, and will be regarded as a breach of these conditions.
14. Receipt for payment of fees must be produced at any time when demanded by a forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.
15. This permit may be cancelled for any breach of or non-compliance with any of the conditions hereof.

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE FOR A "SPECIAL AREA" WITHIN THE WOMBAT STATE FOREST.

1. No tree of less diameter than 24 inches shall be felled.
 2. All trees felled and not delivered at the mill at the expiry of the licence shall revert to the Crown.
 3. No tree on the block under licence shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.
 4. The licensee shall protect saplings and young seedling indigenous trees, and neither he nor any other person shall depasture goats on the block under licence to h or cultivate any part of such block.
 5. Within the period of one month from the felling of any tree, the portion thereof not required for use shall be so disposed of by the licensee as not to encumber the ground.
 6. The licence-fee, amounting to Ten shillings (10s.) per month per 100 acres, shall be paid in advance on the day of One thousand eight hundred and ninety- to the Receiver and Paymaster at or to any other officer who may be authorized to collect the same.
 7. The licence shall be produced by the holder thereof when asked so to do by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
 8. Non-compliance with or non-performance of any of the foregoing conditions shall render this licence null and void.
 9. This licence shall be in force for one month from the date hereof, and then from month to month at the same rental, until either the licensee shall have given notice in writing of intention to abandon the licence, or until such licence shall be revoked by the Hon. the Minister.
 10. Should a saw-mill be erected within the boundaries of the area, the site thereof must be approved by the inspecting forester.
- And the Honorable Robert Wallace Best, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark, or pieces of wood with bark adhering will be received. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular area concerned.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width specified in the various schedules, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., cross-ways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as

closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. Firewood for the Yarra Bend need not be stacked, but must be weighed on the Asylum weighbridge.

5. The acceptance of the firewood shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named by him. If after the delivery of the firewood has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any firewood, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the wood so rejected or returned.

6. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood as to the quality the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

8. If the board shall decide that the wood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition No. 3.

9. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such wood as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected wood, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

13. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged therein are not to exceed forty-eight per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 6s. per day; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of this condition, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted as in condition 3, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of coal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The coal supplied must have been screened at the pit's mouth, and must be the best of its kind. The house coal must be free from shale, small coal, dust, ashes, or other impurities, and the smiths' coal must be free from dust, ashes, shale, or other impurities. No other coal will be received. 6. If after the delivery of the coal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such coal may be returned to the contractor.

7. The contractor must produce the pit certificate if requested to do so by the officer receiving the coal.

8. The contractor will be bound to weigh the house coal and coke on delivery at such establishments as are provided with weighbridges. In other cases the tickets of the public weighbridges are to be accepted as the weight to be charged for. Coal to be delivered in the places set apart therefor.

TOWN OF BRIGHTON.

A By-law of the Town of Brighton, made under section 48 of the *Local Government Act 1897*, and numbered 49, for the purpose of regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections within the Town of Brighton.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1897*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Brighton order as follows:—

On and after the coming into force of this By-law no person shall erect or construct, or cause or suffer to be erected or constructed, upon any land within the Town of Brighton, any building, dwelling, or other erection without first obtaining a permit or licence from the Council to such building, dwelling, or erection, and, if required by the Council, submitting to the Council a plan and specification, together with an estimate of the cost of the proposed building, dwelling, or other erection, and any person offending against this part of this By-law shall on conviction forfeit a sum of £20.

And if any building, dwelling, or erection be erected or constructed upon any land within the Town of Brighton by any person without having first obtained the permit or licence of the Council as aforesaid, the Council may, by notice in writing signed by the town clerk given to such person, or placed on some conspicuous part of the building, dwelling, or erection, require such building, dwelling, or erection to be forthwith pulled down and removed, and if such person do not begin to pull down and remove such building, dwelling, or erection within seven days after such notice has been given or placed as aforesaid, and complete the pulling down and removal of such building, dwelling, or erection as speedily as the nature of the case will permit, he shall forfeit a sum of £20.

And in case any building, dwelling, or erection be not pulled down and removed within the time aforesaid, the Council may, with all convenient speed, cause such building, dwelling, or erection to be pulled down and removed, and the Council may sell the materials thereof, and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the expenses incurred in the pulling down and removal of such building, dwelling, or erection, and any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof, and the Council shall restore any surplus arising from such sale to the owner on demand.
