CONVENTION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND URUGUAY RENEWING THE TREATY OF
COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION OF 13TH NOVEMBER, 1885.

THE following Despatch received by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

SIR,

With reference to my Circular despatch of the 27th September, 1899, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Convention between the United Kingdom and Uruguay renewing the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation of 13th November, 1885, which Convention was signed at Monte Video on the 15th July, 1899, and the ratifications of which were exchanged at Monte Video on the 9th June, 1900.

CONVENTION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND URUGUAY RENEWING THE TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND
NAVIGATION OF 13TH NOVEMBER, 1885.

Signed at Monte Video, 15th July, 1899.

[Ratifications exchanged at Monte Video, 9th June, 1900.]

THEIR Excellencies Mr. Walter Baring, Her Britannic Majesty's Minister Resident, and Dr. Manuel Herrero y Espinosa, Minister for Foreign Affairs, having met together at the Ministry for Foreign Affairs of the Oriental Republic of Uruguay, have declared that, whereas it has not been as yet possible for reasons foreign to the wishes of both Governments to conclude a Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between their respective countries to take the place of the one that has lapsed, and recognising the fact that it is necessary that the commercial interests of the two nations should continue to be regulated by an international compact securing to them the treatment and advantages of the most favoured nation, and being duly authorized to that effect, now agree that the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation concluded on the 13th of November, 1885, and the ratifications of which were exchanged on the 22nd of May, 1886, shall be renewed.

They also declared that British Colonies and possessions may adhere to the present Convention within six months counting from the exchange of ratifications, and may withdraw from the same, at any time, by giving six months' notice of their intention.

In either case the notice will be given by the Representative of Her Britannic Majesty at Montevideo to the Ministry for Foreign Affairs of Uruguay.

It was also agreed that the stipulations contained in the Treaty which is to be renewed do not include cases in which the Government of the Oriental Republic of Uruguay may accord special favours, exemptions, and privileges to the citizens or products of the United States of Brazil, of the Argentine Republic, or of Paraguay in matters of commerce.

Such favours cannot be claimed on behalf of Great Britain on the ground of most-favoured-nation rights, as long as they are not conceded to other States.

It is, nevertheless, understood that the said special favours, exemptions, and privileges shall not be capable of application to products similar to those of Great Britain, nor be extended to navigation.

REUNIDOS en el Ministerio de Relaciones Exteriores de la República Oriental del Uruguay, SS. EE. el Señor Walter Baring, Ministro Residente de Su Magestad Británica, y el Señor Doctor Manuel Herrero y Espinosa, Ministro del Ramo, manifestaron que no habiendo sido posible hasta ahora, por razones ajenas á la voluntad de ambos Gobiernos, celebrar el Tratado de Comercio y Navegación entre los respectivos países, en sustitución del que ha caducado, y reconociendo la necesidad de que los intereses comerciales de las dos naciones continúen regidos por un Pacto internacional que les asegure el tratamiento y las ventajas de la más favorecida, venían en declarar debidamente autorizados al efecto, que quedaba nuevamente en vigencia el Tratado de Amistad, Comercio, y Navegación celebrado en 13 de Noviembre de 1885, y cangeadas sus ratificaciones en 22 de Mayo de 1886.

Manifestaron igualmente que las Colonias y posesiones Británicas podrían adherirse á este Convenio dentro del plazo de seis meses á contar del cange de las ratificaciones, y retirarse en cualquier momento, dando aviso tambien con seis meses de anticipación.

En ambos casos el aviso será dado por el Representante Diplomático de Su Magestad Británica en Montevideo al Ministerio de Relaciones Exteriores del Uruguay.

Quedó igualmente convenido que las estipulaciones consignadas en el Tratado que vá á ponerse nuevamente en vigencia no comprenden los casos en que el Gobierno de la República Oriental del Uruguay acordase favores especiales, exenciones, y privilegios á los ciudadanos ó productos de los Estados Unidos del Brasil, de la República Argentina, y del Paraguay en asuntos de comercio.

Esos favores no pueden ser reclamados por parte de la Gran Bretaña con motivo del derecho de la nación más favorecida, mientras no sean extendidos á otros terceros Estados.

Queda no obstante entendido que dichos favores especiales, exenciones, y privilegios no podrán aplicarse á los productos que sean similares á los productos Ingleses, ni extenderse á la navegación.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications exchanged at Montevideo as soon as possible.

It shall come into force from the day on which the ratifications are exchanged, and shall continue in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which one of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to the other of its intention of terminating it.

The undersigned Plenipotentiaries trust that in the time during which the Present Convention remains in force the necessary negotiations may be carried on for the conclusion of a new Treaty more in keeping with the reciprocal interests of the two States.

In witness whereof they have signed the present Convention in duplicate at Montevideo, the fifteenth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

Los Plenipotenciarios que suscriben esperan que durante el plazo que se estipula en este Convenio podrán realizarse las negociaciones necesarias para la celebración de un nuevo Tratado, sobre bases que mejor consulten las reciprocas conveniencias de ambos Estados.

En fé de lo cual firman y sellan el presente por duplicado, en Montevideo, á los 15 días del mes de Julio del año mil ochocientos noventa y nueve.

THE BUBONIC PLAGUE.—REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTION OR MITIGATION.

THE provisions contained in section 122 of the *Health Act 1890*, having been directed by the Governor in Council to be put in force in Victoria, the Board of Public Health, by virtue of the powers conferred by the said section, and of every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, doth make the following Regulations for preventing or mitigating the epidemic, infectious or contagious disease, known as the bubonic plague, that is to say:—(a) The Regulations made by the Board of Public Health on the 16th May, 1900, are hereby revoked; (b) the owner, agent, master, or person in charge of any vessel in waters within the jurisdiction of the Melbourne Harbor Trust, and the owner, agent, master, or person in charge of any vessel arriving from any place proclaimed as plague-infected in any waters of Victoria shall observe, do, or carry out, or cause to be observed, done, or carried out, all the matters and things following, namely:—

1. He shall keep the vessel off from the wharf or pier by a distance of at least 4 feet by means of fenders substantially constructed (preferably of wood), to prevent listing towards the wharf or pier, and shall place all fenders directly opposite mooring posts or piles.

2. He shall apply and keep applied to each end of every hawser and rope connecting the vessel with the wharf or pier—(a) tar kept constantly in a sticky condition by repeated applications, and—(b) either a thick brush of metal bristles, or a funnel, or

a stout metal disc at least 12 inches in diameter, and so constructed and so placed (one at each end) as to prevent transit of rats, the application of tar being made just beyond the side of the vessel and just above the end attached to the wharf or pier, the tar being applied over a length of at least 1 foot at each end of each hawser and rope, and the application of the brush, funnel, or disc being made at each of the two tarred portions of the hawser or rope. The tar may be applied on bagging fixed round the hawser or rope.

3. He shall tar the fender and the fender-slings on such parts as to prevent migration of rats, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

4. He shall not use any net between the ship and the wharf or pier, whether in connexion with the gangway or the hatches, unless the centre of the same for a width of at least 18 inches be thoroughly tarred and the tar be kept in a sticky condition by repeated applications, and shall remove any such net, though tarred, between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m., except only in case cargo is being discharged or delivered during that time.

5. He shall draw up and keep drawn up all gangways when not required for the discharging or the receiving of cargo from 7 p.m. until 6 a.m., and shall apply tar to each gangway while down over a length of at least 1 foot at each end, just beyond the side of the vessel and just above the end resting on the wharf or pier, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

6. He shall suspend over the side along the wharf or pier four sets (or more if required) of electric or other lights, distributed so as to afford thorough illumination fore and aft along the whole length of the side of the vessel.

7. He shall supply one watchman by night; shall furnish the same with a stick, and see that he constantly parades on the wharf or pier alongside the vessel from stem to stern, and that he takes all practicable measures to prevent the passage of rats between the ship and the wharf or pier. He shall supply the watchmen with a pot of tar and a brush, and direct him to renew the tarring of gangways, nets, hawsers, and ropes, so as to keep the tar in a sticky condition.

8. He shall completely obstruct all pipes, ports, cabin scuttles, and other holes in the side of the vessel next to the wharf or pier, and shall keep the same obstructed while the vessel is alongside, in order to prevent both ingress and egress of rats.

9. He shall prevent any refuse matter from being discharged into the river.

10. He shall not allow any vessel or any lighter alongside unless precisely the same conditions are observed on the lighting side as set out above on the wharf or pier side of the vessel.

11. He shall not allow the landing of any rags, or of any old cordage or second-hand clothing or bedding, or of any used or returned produce-bags whatever.

12. He shall tar the wharf the whole of the length of the moorings to a width from the edge of 1 foot, and shall keep the tar in a sticky condition by repeated applications.

Any person who fails to comply with any of these Regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section 326 of the *Health Act 1890*, thereby guilty of an offence against that Act, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings, for each day during which such offence is continued, besides any expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

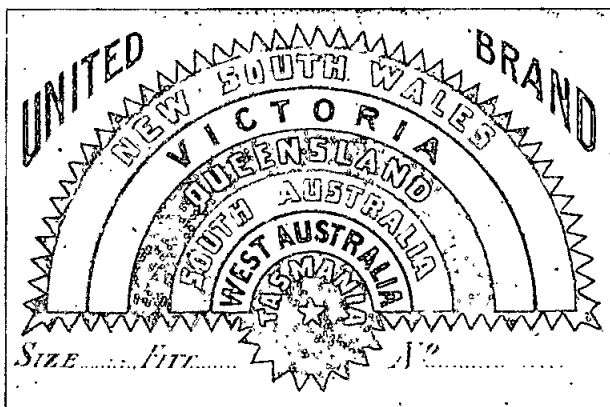

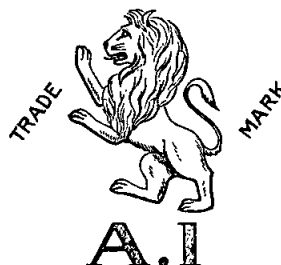

6. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.
7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1901.

4. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water through meters shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons up to their assessments, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for every 1,000 gallons beyond that assessment.
5. Such owners or occupiers of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons.
6. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.
7. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1901, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1901, and shall be payable, the first moiety on the 1st day of January and the second moiety on the 1st day of July of such year.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of all lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, or allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Eleven pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.
2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, or allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of Eleven pounds or more than Eleven pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.
3. For all tenements and allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements and allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements and allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water, except by special agreement, a charge of Twenty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.
5. For water supplied to syphon-pumps, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.
6. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.
7. Water supplied to the Government departments, charitable and other public institutions and religious denominations, shall be by measure or special agreement.
8. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands, where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

- One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
- Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre.

For every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1901, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1901, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1901, and the 1st day of July, 1901.

Where water meters are affixed, payment shall be made on the end of each quarter in each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

1. For every house and tenement of Ten pounds (£10) annual municipal value or under, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.
2. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value and over, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling.
3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid.
4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of

One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other and domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made.

9. For every steam boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings for each stall shall be made.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1901, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust there shall be paid the sum of Five pounds sterling.

6. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, religious denominations, and persons outside the Trust District shall be by measurement or special agreement.

BAIRNSDALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION No. 14.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Regulations for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply by the Trust within the Urban Division and for other purposes during the calendar year 1901:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands, houses, and tenements situate in the Urban Division of the Trust area shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such lands, houses, or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which lands, houses, or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1901, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1901; and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates:—

(a) On every house, tenement, or lands, a rate of Ninepence for every One pound of municipal valuation.

(b) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping, or any other purpose, a maximum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

(c) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (e) of section 1 of this Regulation), One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(d) Water supplied to gardens, nurseries, manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

(e) For water supplied to Government departments, cricket clubs, bowling-greens, boating clubs, show-yards, cattle-yards, and recreation reserves shall be charged by measurement, at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 30,000 gallons per annum.

(f) Private water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.

(g) For water supplied to gardens and for other than domestic purposes will be charged for at the rate of Seven shillings and Sixpence per annum, the quantity of water so used not to exceed 12,000 gallons per annum. A meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer when, in the opinion of the Trust, the same shall be necessary.

(h) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of One pound (£1) per cent on the contract price for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.

2. The rates and charges for water, and all sums due to the Trust under this Regulation, shall be paid by and be recoverable from, the owner of the premises, or the occupier or person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and charges shall be payable in advance by equal instalments on the 1st day of January, 1901, and on the 1st day of July, 1901 (except in the case of water supplied by meter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust from time to time); and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

In the construction of this Regulation the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure other than stand-pipe or hydrant water shall be—

1. If for domestic purposes and other than domestic purposes, a quantity which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied if payable otherwise than by measure.

2. If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges, except for stand-pipes and hydrants water, shall be paid half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1901.

KERANG WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of October, 1900.

WHEREAS by the Water Act 1890 (No. 1156) it is amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust shall have been first advertised in the Government Gazette, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have

been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an order accordingly. And whereas it is further enacted that, if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act. And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, shall—

- State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan to such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan;
- Specify the limits of the lands within which such Waterworks Trust shall have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;
- State what are the principal works to be constructed;
- Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and
- Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the said Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a waterworks district is either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district. Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Councillors for the North-east Riding of the Shire of Kerang, for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust, and for a loan of Four thousand pounds sterling (£4,000), for the purpose of taking over from the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust the waterworks constructed by that body for the supply of the Township of Kerang, and also for the purpose of making additions to such waterworks, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application, deposited in the Department of Mines and Water Supply; and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1) That the Councillors for the North-East Riding of the said Shire of Kerang Municipal District and three other persons shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.

(2) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Four thousand pounds sterling (£4,000) for the purpose of taking over the aforesaid works from the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, and making additions to such works, and also for paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be Four pounds per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, requiring shops within such district of any particular class not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* to close before the hours mentioned in the said Factories and Shops Acts, and on one specified day in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon, provided petitions shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected: And whereas petitions have been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the municipal district of the Borough of Hamilton all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat shall be closed on the evening of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week from the hour of Five o'clock, on the evening of Friday in each week from the hour of Six o'clock, on the evening of Saturday in each week from the hour of Nine o'clock, and on Wednesday in each week from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon: And whereas such petitions have been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers keeping shops of the particular class to be affected within the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat in the municipal district of the Borough of Hamilton shall be closed on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week from the hour of Five o'clock, on the evening of Friday in each week from the hour of Six o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from the hour of Nine o'clock.
2. All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat in the municipal district of the Borough of Hamilton shall be closed on Wednesday in each week from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

And the Honorable Allan McLean, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is among other things provided that in order to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in any process, trade, or business usually or frequently carried on in a factory or work-room the Governor in Council may, if he think fit, from time to time appoint a Special Board consisting of not less than four or more than ten members and a Chairman, provided that, subject to certain exceptions, no such Special Board shall be appointed unless a resolution has been passed by either House of Parliament declaring it is expedient to appoint such Board: And whereas the Legislative Assembly on the 11th day of October, 1900, passed a resolution declaring that it is expedient to appoint a Special Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of manufacturing overmantels and wood mantelpieces, other than wood mantelpieces to be painted, such as are usually made in saw mills, being a process, trade, or business usually or frequently carried on in a factory or work-room; and also on the said 11th day of October, 1900, passed a resolution declaring that it is expedient to appoint a Special Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of manufacturing mattresses or bedding, being a process, trade, or business usually or frequently carried on in a factory or work-room: And whereas, pursuant to the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Governor in Council may, if he think fit, appoint a Special Board consisting of not less than four or more than ten members and a Chairman, to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any particular articles of furniture: And whereas by the *Factories and Shops Act 1900* it is among other things provided that One Special Board may, under the Factories and Shops Acts, be appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons for

wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any particular articles of furniture, and to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the manufacturing processes of a maker of overmantels and of wood mantelpieces, other than wood mantelpieces to be painted, such as are usually made in saw-mills, and to any person or persons or classes of persons engaged in the manufacturing of mattresses or bedding: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby Order that a Special Board be appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any particular articles of furniture of which wood forms a part, and which are usually made by cabinet-makers and chair and couch makers, upholsterers, wood carvers, or turners, and to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the manufacturing processes of a maker of overmantels and of wood mantelpieces, other than wood mantelpieces to be painted, such as are usually made in saw-mills, and to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the manufacturing of mattresses or bedding, such Special Board to consist of ten members and a Chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of the employers and five as representatives of the employes: And His Excellency doth further direct that such Special Board may in any regulation, determination, order or instrument or legal proceedings be described for all purposes as the Furniture Board.

And the Honorable Allan McLean, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Regulation No. 6 (being a Regulation of the Shire of Malvern made under the first section of Part 5, of the 13th Schedule to *The Local Government Act 1890*, in force in the said Shire by virtue of a By-law of the above-named Shire numbered 37.—For regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building. For regulating the height, thickness, construction, and materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys) and the materials for and mode of enclosing same. For prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes hereinafter in this Regulation called in common "chimneys." For regulating the construction, materials, and enclosing by building or otherwise of fireplaces or furnaces to be used in the working of engines by steam, or in any mill, brewery, bakehouse or gaswork, or in any manufactory whatever—although a steam-engine be not used therein respectively. For appointing the fee which may be charged and received on account of the Municipal Fund by the Treasurer or other proper officer of the Council for any inspection, superintendence or other service made or performed by him under this Regulation, and for repealing Regulation No. 5 of the Shire of Malvern) be passed, as a Regulation of the Shire of Malvern.

SHIRE OF MALVERN.

BY-LAW No. 41.

A By-Law of the Shire of Malvern made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and with the approval of the Governor in Council under section 48 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, and numbered 41, for carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in Part V. of the 13th. Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1890*, and for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings and erections, and for requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings and erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and for selling the materials and applying the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings and erections, and any fees and penalties due by the owner thereof, and appointing fees to be charged and received by the Council of the Shire of Malvern for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such regulation, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council, and for other purposes in connexion with the foregoing purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Malvern order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force and effect throughout the said Shire of Malvern with respect to all buildings which are constructed or erected within 100 feet of the building line of any street or road.
2. For the purposes of this By-law all buildings, of whatever kind, subject to the provisions thereof, are to be deemed to belong to one or other of the classes which are described and defined in a certain regulation of the said Shire Council of Malvern, namely, Regulation No. 6.
3. And the buildings included in the said classes are to be deemed to belong to the rates of those classes which are described and defined in the said Regulation No. 6 according to the conditions of height, area, and number of storeys set forth in the tables set out and described in the said regulation, which conditions are to be determined according to the rules as therein set out, defined, and described.
4. With regard to the roofs of buildings of the second class, as described and defined in the said regulation, in order to prevent the formation of curved roofs to such buildings the plane of the surface of the roof of every such building must not incline from the external or party walls upwards at a greater angle than 40 degrees with the horizon.
5. With regard to buildings of the first or dwelling-house class, and of second or warehouse class, as respectively described and defined in the said Regulation, which shall be insulated, if any such building be hereafter divided into two or more distinct buildings, and the several parts of such buildings so divided be not at least 4 feet from each other, and from other buildings and ground, then such several parts must be separated from each other by such party walls as are prescribed in the said regulation for the rate to which the several parts if adjoining would belong.
6. In any buildings of the first class as described and defined in the said Regulation No. 6 the surface of the earth or of any paving on the outside (except the pavement of any public way) must not at any time be raised to within six inches of the surface of the lowest or first floor of such building. And every cross-wall and every hearth shall have a damp-proof course of slate and cement or of asphalt not less than half-an-inch thick through the whole thickness of the wall at the level of the ground-floor plates.
7. With regard to return walls, which may be cross-walls: such walls must be built across the entire story of either brick or stone, at right angles to the ridge of the roof, and to the full height of such story, and must be properly bonded to the external or party walls, and must not contain openings or recesses exceeding one-half of the superficial area of the wall measured in each story; and provided always that buildings containing not more than ten squares as described and defined in the said Regulation No. 6 shall not require more than one cross-wall. The surveyor may, at his discretion, allow a girder, supported on piers of brick or iron columns, to be substituted for a cross-wall.

DIVISION OF BUILDING.

8. And with regard to walls used to divide single buildings into two or more: If it be intended to divide any building into two or more distinct parts, then every wall for that purpose must be built as a party-wall, in the manner, and of the materials, and of the several heights and thicknesses for party walls of the highest rates of the part of the building to which such party-wall shall belong or adjoin, prescribed with reference to the thickness of party-walls in the said Regulation No. 6.

9. And if any building already built, or which shall be hereafter built, be converted, used, or occupied as two or more separate buildings, each having a separate entrance or staircase, such conversion, use, or occupation not having been made or not having taken place prior to this By-law coming into operation, then every such building shall be deemed to be two or more separate houses; and such separate houses must be divided from each other by a party-wall, or party-arch, or arches built in the manner and of the materials required for party walls or for party arches by the said Regulation No. 6, for the class and rate to which the largest of the buildings so divided shall belong.

EXTERNAL PROJECTIONS.

Projections from the Face-wall, &c.

10. And with regard to buildings hereafter to be built or rebuilt in reference to projections therefrom as to the copings, parapets, cornices to overhanging roofs, blocking courses, piers, columns, pilasters, entablatures, facias, door and window dressings, or other architectural decorations forming part of an external wall:—All such must be built of the same materials as are by the said Regulation No. 6 directed to be used for building external walls to which such projections belong, or of such other proper and sufficient materials as the surveyor may approve or permit; and as to all verandahs, porches, porticoes, shop fronts,

open enclosures of open areas, and steps, and water-pipes, and to all other projections from external walls not forming part thereof, every such projection must be built of brick, tile, stone, artificial stone, slate, cement, metal or other fireproof material; and such projections must be so built as not to overhang the ground belonging to any other owner, nor to obstruct the light or air, or be otherwise injurious to the owner or occupier of the buildings adjoining thereto on any side thereof; nor shall any such projections extend beyond the building line at any height less than 10 feet from the level of the public footway, nor encroach upon the building line of any public footway, except that the base or plinth thereof may project beyond the building line to an extent not exceeding 2 inches.

And no projections, including steps, cellar doors and area enclosures are to encroach upon the building line of any public footway; and no verandah except that built upon the public pathway shall approach nearer to the boundary of the land on which the same stands than 3 feet, unless separated from any adjoining verandah or premises by a brick wall at least 8½ inches in thickness and projecting 3 inches at least beyond the face of the woodwork and spouting. And with regard to the projecting eaves of any building on either side thereof such eaves may project beyond the face of the external wall, provided such eaves be at least 3 feet from the ground not in the same possession. And no cornice must project a greater distance, measured from the finished face of the wall, to the extreme projection of such cornice than 4 inches more than the thickness of the wall of the story surmounted by the same, and every such cornice must have one course of stone flagging, tailed through to the inside face of the said wall, unless the method of construction of such cornice shall have previously been submitted to the surveyor, and shall have been by him approved.

PROJECTED BUILDINGS BEYOND THE GENERAL LINE OF BUILDINGS, AND OTHER EXTERNAL WALLS.

11. And with regard to buildings already built or hereafter to be built as to how windows or other projections of any kind. Such projections must neither be built with nor added to any buildings on any face of an external wall thereof so as to extend beyond the general line of buildings in any street (which general line shall be determined by the surveyor), except so far as hereinbefore provided with regard to projections from face-wall and shop fronts, nor so as to overhang the ground belonging to any other owner nor so as to obstruct the light and air, or be otherwise injurious to the owners or occupiers of the buildings adjoining thereto, on any side thereof.

WOODEN SHOP FRONTS, SHUTTERS, SIGN AND SHOW BOARDS.

12. And with regard to shop fronts and their entablatures, their shutters, and pilasters, and stall-boards made of wood:—No part of such shop front except the cornice must project from the face of the wall, whether there be an area or not further than the base line, nor must the cornice project therefrom more than 12 inches, and the wood-work of any shop front must not be fixed nearer than 4½ inches to the face of an external, or to the centre-line of a party-wall.

13. And with regard to such wood-work if it be put up at such distance of 4½ inches, then a pier or corbel built of stone, or of brick, or incombustible material, to commence at the level of the underside plinth at bottom of wood pilasters, and to be of the width of 8½ inches at the least, must be fixed in line of the party-wall, so as to be as high as such wood-work, and so as to project 1 inch at the least in front of the face thereof; and no show-board or sign-board shall be affixed to the front of any building so as to extend over any public footway, except by leave of the Council.

SLABS AND HEARTHES.

14. And a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, slate, marble, cement, or other proper and sufficient substance, at the least 9 inches longer than the opening of every chimney when finished, and at the least 18 inches in front of the arch over the same, must be laid before the opening of every chimney; and in every floor except the lowest floor, such slab or slabs must be laid upon stone, iron, or wooden bearers, or upon brick trimmers; but where they are laid other than on brick trimmers the slab must rest at least 2 inches on the chimney breast, and be well bedded upon a proper boxing, provided always that in the case of a chimney being built upon corbels the use of the brick trimmer or stone corbels to support the inner half shall be imperative, but in the lowest floor they may be laid upon a brick fender or bedded on the solid ground. And the inner hearth of every chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick or stone or other incombustible substance, which must be solid for a thickness of 9 inches at the least beneath the surface of any such hearth.

CLOSE FIRES.

15. And as to every oven, furnace, coke, or close fire used for the purpose of trade or manufacture:—It must be 6 inches at least distant from any party wall, and must not be upon or within a distance of 18 inches of any timber or woodwork; and the floor on or above which such oven, furnace, coke, or close fire shall be built or fixed must be formed and paved under and for a distance of 2 feet all round the same with stone, brick, tile, or slate at least 2 inches thick, or other proper incombustible and non-conducting materials.

STEAM BOILERS.

16. And as to any boiler or engine used for the purpose of generating steam:—It must not be set or fixed inside any house of the first or dwelling-house class, nor within a distance of 2½ feet of the external wall of any dwelling-house, nor within 5 feet of any land not in the same occupation, the said 2½ feet being in every case measured from the external face of the setting of the said steam boiler.

RAIN-WATER PIPES AND EAVES GUTTERS.

17. And with regard to the roof, flat, and gutter of any building, and of any projection therefrom, and also balconies, verandahs, and shop fronts:—They must be so arranged and constructed, and so supplied with gutters and pipes as to prevent the water therefrom dropping on to or running over any public way, and all such rain-water pipes and eaves gutters are to be made of metal.

RULES CONCERNING DRAINS TO BUILDINGS.

18. With regard to the drains of buildings of any class, and of every addition thereto:—Before the several walls of any such buildings are built to the height of 10 feet from their foundations the drains thereof must have been properly built and made good, that is to say, to the best outlet that can be obtained, so as to render all such drains available for the drainage of the lowest floor of such building or addition thereto, and also of its areas; and the drains under and from every building for drainage purposes must be constructed with glazed earthenware, pottery-pipes jointed with good cement, and having in transverse section a circular area of not less than 4 inches in diameter. And every such drain must be laid to a sufficient fall or current, so as that the whole of every such drain within the walls of such building shall be wholly covered over under the lowest floor independently thereof, and every such drain within the walls of such building must be built so as to render the drain air-tight, and shall be properly trapped and ventilated. And in no case shall the soil below the floor of any building be left undrained, or so that water may remain stagnant on any portion thereof.

RULES CONCERNING PRIVIES.

19. And every privy, whether already built or hereafter to be built, must have a door, and be properly enclosed, screened, and fenced from public view. No privy, earth-closet, or urinal shall be erected or remain in front of any dwelling, or at a less distance than 10 feet from any street or from the door or window of any dwelling, or from any lane or street of a width of 33 feet or upwards, or at a less distance than 2 feet from any partition-fence, unless divided by an 8½-in. brick wall.

RULES CONCERNING VENTILATION BENEATH FLOORS OF BUILDINGS.

20. With regard to the ventilation of the space beneath buildings, of whatever class, and every addition thereto:—The space between the lowermost floor and the ground beneath each room shall be provided with openings on every side, arranged to allow of the free passage of air in any direction, the openings on any side to have an area free from grating bars or other obstruction at the rate of at least 30 square inches to every square in the area of the room. No ventilators to be less than 9 inches by 6 inches.

RULES CONCERNING DWELLING-HOUSES HEREAFTER BUILT OR RE-BUILT WITH REGARD TO BACK YARDS AND EARES, AND ROOMS UNDERGROUND AND IN THE ROOF.

Back Yards.

21. With regard to back yards, or open spaces attached to dwelling-houses:—Every house hereafter built or re-built must have an enclosed back yard or open space of at least four squares, exclusive of any building thereon, unless all the rooms of such house can be lighted and ventilated from the street or way.

Lowermost Rooms.

22. And with regard to the lowermost rooms of houses, being rooms of which the surface of the floor is more than 3 feet below the surface or footway of the nearest street or right-of-way, and to cellars or buildings hereafter to be built or rebuilt:—If any such room or cellar cannot be otherwise lighted, the same may be lighted by means of apertures or areas extending under the footway, provided such apertures or areas be enclosed by solid masonry or brickwork surmounted by a proper stone kerb, and such apertures or areas to be covered with an approved and immovable horizontal iron grating, with bars fitted at an angle of 90 degrees, level with the surface of such footway, and secured to the kerbing by being run thereto with lead or zinc to the satisfaction of the surveyor; provided that no such aperture, area, or grating do extend from the line of building under the footway more than 2 feet, nor be more than 4 feet in length, except with the written permission of the Council.

Attic Rooms.

23. And with regard to rooms in the roof of any building hereafter built or rebuilt, in reference to the number of floors or rooms in the roof, and to the height of such rooms:—There must not be more than one floor of such rooms, and such rooms must not be of a less height than 7 feet 6 inches, except the sloping part (if any) of such roof, which sloping part must not begin at less than 3 feet 6 inches above the floor, nor extend more than 3 feet 6 inches on the ceiling of such room.

Rooms in Other Parts.

24. And with regard to rooms in other parts of the building, in reference to the height thereof, every room in the main building, used or intended to be used as a dwelling, must be of at least the height of 10 feet from the floor to the ceiling, and contain not less than 700 cubic feet of space, but skillion roofs may have a height of not less than 8 feet from the floor to lowest part of roof.

RULES CONCERNING EVERY BUILDING HEREAFTER TO BE BUILT, SO FAR AS RELATES TO THE RAISING THEREOF, AND CONCERNING EXISTING BUILDINGS TO BE REBUILT.

25. Any building may be raised, so that, nevertheless, the party and external walls, and chimneys thereof, when so raised be of the materials, and of the several heights and thicknesses described in the said Regulation No. 6 for party and external walls and chimneys, of the rate which such buildings shall be of when so raised; and with regard to buildings already built, so far as relates to the raising thereof, although the walls of such building be not of the thickness prescribed by the said Regulations, if, in the opinion of the surveyor, such walls be sufficiently secure to allow of the raising thereof, then any such building already built may be raised to an additional height not exceeding 10 feet; and with regard to any building adjoining one which shall be raised, so far as relates to the raising of the chimneys thereof, then if any building be raised it shall be the duty of the owner of such building, and he is hereby required to build up at his own expense, the party wall between his own and any adjoining building, and all flues and chimney stacks belonging thereto respectively.

26. With regard to buildings already built, so far as relates to the rebuilding thereof, in conformity with the said Regulation No. 6 in respect to the required area, or in any other respect

than the required height and thickness of walls:—If a full compliance with the provision of the said Regulation would be attended by great loss and inconvenience, then, subject to the consent of the surveyor, and to such terms as he may impose, it shall be lawful for the parties concerned to rebuild such buildings on the site of the old buildings, as nearly as may be practicable, but so that nevertheless both the party walls and the external walls be of the required height and thickness.

27. Notwithstanding anything in this By-law, or in the said Regulation No. 6 contained, no building or erection, the external walls of which are of other materials than stone or brick, shall be erected or constructed in any of the streets specified in the First Schedule to the said Regulation No. 6, and such other streets as shall from time to time by special order of the Council be added to such list, nor for a distance of 50 feet on either side of such street.

28. If any building or erection shall be erected or constructed contrary to the provisions or requirements of any clause of this by-law the owner thereof shall, within fourteen days of the receipt of a notice in writing from the surveyor to pull down or remove the same, pull down or remove, or cause to be pulled down or removed, the said buildings or erection; and if the same be not pulled down or removed to the satisfaction of the surveyor within the said period of fourteen days, then the surveyor may cause the same to be pulled down and removed, and may cause the materials thereof to be sold, and the proceeds shall be applied in reimbursing the Council the expenses of such pulling down and removal, and the surplus (if any) shall be handed over to the said owner.

29. The surveyor or building surveyor referred to in this By-law shall be the surveyor to the Shire Council for the time being.

30. It shall be the duty of the surveyor, and he is hereby authorized and required, to see that all the rules and directions of this By-law and of the said Regulation No. 6 are well and truly observed and carried out in and throughout the Shire of Malvern, or such portion or portions of the said shire as this by-law or the said Regulation No. 6 or any clause thereof applies, and for the purpose to proceed from time to time in due course upon the receipt of any notice; or if, from ignorance or neglect, or from any other circumstance, notice of any work intended to be done has not been given, then, upon such work being observed by, or being made known to him, to inspect the works intended to be done, or which shall have been commenced or executed; and to cause all the rules and directions of this By-law, and of the said Regulation No. 6 in respect thereof, to be strictly observed, and also to attend and perform everything required of him by this By-law and the said Regulation, whether with or without notice, and also to inspect ruinous buildings and projections, and to take all necessary measures thereupon.

POWER OF ENTRY BY SURVEYOR OR OTHER AUTHORIZED PERSON.

31. With regard to buildings and works so far as relates to the entry thereon for the supervision thereof, at all times during the progress thereof, within the meaning of this By-law and the said Regulation No. 6. It shall be lawful for the surveyor or any other person or persons duly authorized by him in that behalf, and they are hereby respectively authorized, to enter upon the premises upon which such operations have been commenced or are in progress.

32. Within four days before the following acts or events, that is to say:—Before any building shall be begun to be built, and also before any addition or alteration, which by this By-law or the said Regulation No. 6 is placed under the supervision of the surveyor shall be made to any building, and also before any party wall, external wall, chimney stack or flues shall be begun to be built, pulled down, rebuilt, cut into or altered, and also before any opening shall be made in any party or external wall, and also before any other matter or thing shall be done which by this By-law or the said Regulation No. 6 is placed under the supervision of the surveyor, it shall be the duty of the builder (by which term is to be understood both in this provision and elsewhere throughout this By-law and the said Regulation No. 6 the master builder or other person employed to execute any work), or if there be no master builder or other person so employed, then the owner of the building or other person for whom or by whose orders such work is to be done, and he is hereby required to give to the surveyor at his office notice in the form (No. 1) contained in the 2nd schedule annexed to the said regulation, or to the like effect, and at the time of giving any such notice as aforesaid to produce to the surveyor plans and specifications of the proposed works, and pay to the treasurer of the shire such fees as are provided, and if for any period exceeding three months any builder having duly begun any building requiring compliance with the provisions of this By-law or the said regulation, suspend the progress of such building and again go on with the same, or if during the progress thereof the builder be changed then two days before such builder shall enter or re-enter upon the performance of the work it shall be the duty of such builder to give notice to the surveyor, and such notices must be in the terms specified in the forms (Nos. 2 and 3) contained in the said 2nd schedule annexed to the said Regulation No. 6 or to the like effect. Provided that the notices specified in this clause of this By-law are in addition to the notices mentioned in clause 11 and in sub-clause 2 of clause 12 of the said Regulation No. 6 which last mentioned notices are hereby authorized and directed to be given. Provided always that if by reason of any emergency, any act, matter, or thing placed under the supervision of the surveyor be required to be done immediately, or before notice can be given to the surveyor, then it shall be lawful for the builder or any person to do such act, matter or thing so requisite, but upon this condition, that within 48 hours after beginning to execute such work notice thereof be given to the surveyor.

33. The following words and expressions wherever used in this By-law are intended to have the same meanings as are respectively assigned to them, or as they bear in the said Regulation

No. 6, that is to say, the words—"square," "floor," "story," "external wall," "party wall," "alteration," "addition," "building," "already built," and "hereafter to be built."

34. The fees payable under this By-law are the same as those set out in the said Regulation No. 6.

35. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10 nor less than 10s.

This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication as provided by the *Local Government Act 1890* in the *Government Gazette*.
