## PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, viz. :—

FRIDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Creswick, Dunolly, and Port Fairy, and the Shires of Alberton and Bot Bot;

WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Melvor;

THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Town of Warrnambool; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Bairnsdale and Warrnambool;

FRIDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1900, as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Buninyong and Sebastopol, and the Shires of Bungaree and Grenville; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Alexandra, Ballarat, and Buninyong;

WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Malmesbury, the United Shire of Newham, the North Riding of the Shire of Huntly, and the Taradale, North, and South Ridings of the United Shire of Metcalfe; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Elmore and Kyneton;

THURSDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Sale; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Colac, Heyfield, and Maffra;

TUESDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Merriang;

WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Creswick, and the Shires of Creswick and Kilmore; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Allendale and Creswick;

THURSDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Winchelsea;

WEDNESDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Yarram Yarram;

THURSDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Minnamite;

THURSDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF JANUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Frankston and Hastings.

##### By-Law No. XXI.

For regulating earth-closets and the emptying and cleansing of pans within the township of Trentham and allotments 1 to 11 inclusive of suburban section IX., parish of Trentham.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kyneton hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. XXI. of the said shire, that is to say:—

(1) The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every earth-closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall purchase and place and use such pans as may be required on or in connexion with the said premises, such pans to be supplied and provided by the council and paid for by such occupier or person.

(2) No occupier or person shall deposit in any such closet-pan any house or yard rubbish or any material (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, and shall not place or use any pan which may be damaged or defective. The council or any person duly authorized by them in that behalf may at any time without notice remove from any premises any damaged or defective pan and replace the same by providing a fresh pan, which shall be charged and paid for under clause 5 hereof.

(3) Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall, at least once in every week, allow each pan to be removed by a person or persons duly authorized in that behalf by the council during the day time for cleansing purposes.

(4) No one other than the person or persons duly authorized in that behalf by the council shall empty or remove any pan in or from any house or premises.

(5) Every occupier and every person having the control or management of any premises from which night-soil is removed shall, upon demand, pay to the secretary of the shire, or such other officer as may be appointed, such charge as the council may from time to time make for such service, not exceeding the sum of £2 in each year, and also such charge as the council may from time to time make for supplying and providing the said pans, and, in default of payment, the amount of such charges respectively, or of any expenses connected therewith, may be recovered by the council in any Court of Petty Sessions, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*.

(6) This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the limits of the surveyed boundaries of the township of Trentham and allotments 1 to 11 inclusive of suburban section IX., parish of Trentham, and shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(7) Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
RATING REGULATION FOR 1901.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds (£13) or under municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of £13 per annum, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings (£7 10s.) per centum per annum shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said district, situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rate; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water through meters shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons up to their assessments, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for every 1,000 gallons beyond that assessment.

5. Such owners or occupiers of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons.

6. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

7. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1901, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1901, and shall be payable, the first moiety on the 1st day of January and the second moiety on the 1st day of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

# BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1901.

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1901, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house, tenement, piece, or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house, tenement, piece, or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding houses.

3. For water supplied by the Trust to livery and carriers' stables, the charge shall be Five shillings for each stall or loose box in open sheds used for stabling, each space of five (5) feet shall be charged for as a stall.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1901.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

1. For lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District the water rate for the year 1901 shall be Two shillings in the One pound on the municipal valuation for the year 1900-1901, with a minimum charge of One pound upon all lands and tenements valued at or under Ten pounds, except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 120 of the Water Act 1892. The minimum charge on vacant lands shall be Five shillings.

2. All rates and charges on lands and tenements not having a water meter affixed shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance, that is to say, on 1st January, 1901, and 1st July, 1901, and all rates and charges on lands and tenements where water meters are affixed payment shall be due and payable at the end of each quarter, that is to say, on 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, 1901. All payments shall be payable at the Trust's offices, Town Hall, Wilson-street, Horsham.

# WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION No. 10.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water district has, for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1901, in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Eighteen pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.

(b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

(c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-thirds rates.

(d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.

(f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

(g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.

(h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings or Five shillings per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided. Payment in either case to be made in advance.

(k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters, the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

(l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

(m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.

(n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely, shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1901.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

#### REGULATION No. 8.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of the lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1901 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.

3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.

7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes a charge of One shilling per One thousand gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measurement.

11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework or brickwork and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

12. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

13. For water supplied to market gardens for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling for One thousand gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment to be on the first day of January, 1901, and the second payment on the first day of July, 1901.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate and charges.

SHIRE OF BOROONDARA.

BY-LAW No. 18.

A By-law of the Shire of Boroondara, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 18, for regulating traffic and processions, and generally maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Boroondara, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire order as follows:—

By-law No. 5 of the Council of the said Shire of Boroondara, made under section 213 of *The Local Government Act 1874*, is hereby repealed.

(1) All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriage-ways, footways, or other public places of the shire, so as in any way to obstruct or impede the traffic thereon or therein, shall discontinue so to do on requirement by any member of the police force.

(2) No procession of persons or vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes, shall parade or pass through any of the streets or roads, unless with the previous consent, in writing, of the President of the shire, or, in his absence, of the Secretary of the shire, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at least twenty-four hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the police in the district.

(3) No person, between the hours of sunset and the following sunrise, shall in or upon, or along any of the roads or streets within the Shire of Boroondara, drive or ride any vehicle, bicycle, or other velocipede without having a good and serviceable lamp securely fixed at the off side of the front of such vehicle, bicycle, or velocipede, so placed that it shall show a light in the direction in which such vehicle, bicycle, or velocipede is proceeding, and the same shall be kept lighted.

(4) Any street musician or vocalist shall, when required by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, desist from playing or singing in the neighbourhood of the premises of such householder.

(5) No person shall write, paint, or post bills upon, or otherwise deface any footpath, footbridge, treeguard, tree or fence, lamp-post, hand-rail, post, wall, or any property under the management and control of the Council of the said shire.

(6) Every person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(7) This By-law shall apply to the whole of the said shire, and shall come into operation on 1st January, 1901.

The foregoing By-law, being By-law No. 18 of the Shire of Boroondara, was made by the Council of the said shire on the 27th day of August, 1900, and confirmed by special order this 22nd day of October, 1900.
