BY-LAW NO. XXI.

For regulating earth-closets and the emptying and cleansing of pans within the township of Trentham and allotments 1 to 11 inclusive of suburban section IX., parish of Trentham.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Health Act 1890, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kyneton hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. XXI. of the said shire, that is to say:—

(1) The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every earth-closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall purchase and place and use such pans as may be required on or in connexion with the said premises, such pans to be supplied and provided by the council and paid for by such occupier or person.

(2) No occupier or person shall deposit in any such closetpan any house or yard rubbish or any material (except for deodorizing) other than night-soil, and shall not place or use any pan which may be damaged or defective. The council or any person duly authorized by them in that behalf may at any time without notice remove from any premises any damaged or defective pan and replace the same by providing a fresh pan, which shall be charged and paid for under clause 5 hereof.

(3) Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall, at least once in every week, allow each pan to be removed by a person or persons duly authorized in that behalf by the council during the day time for cleansing purposes.

(4) No one other than the person or persons duly authorized

purposes.

(4) No one other than the person or persons duly authorized in that behalf by the council shall empty or remove any pan in

(4) No one other than the person or persons duly authorized in that behalf by the council shall empty or remove any pan in or from any house or premises.

(5) Every occupier and every person having the control or management of any premises from which night-soil is removed shall, upon demand, pay to the secretary of the shire, or such other officer as may be appointed, such charge as the council may from time to time make for such service, not exceeding the sum of \$2\$ in each year, and also such charge as the council may from time to time make for supplying and providing the said pans, and, in default of payment, the amount of such charges respectively, or of any expenses connected therewith, may be recovered by the council in any Court of Petty Sessions, in pursuance of the provisions of the Health Act 1890.

(6) This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the limits of the surveyed boundaries of the township of Trentham and allotments I to 11 inclusive of suburban section IX., parish of Trentham, and shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

(7) Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

- (y) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Fitteen pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annual upon the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes a charge of One shilling per One thousand gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the proper named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings. Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework or brickwork and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

12. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

13. For water supplied to market gardens for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling for One thousand gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment to be on the first day of January, 1901, and the second payment on the first day of Juny, 1901.

By-law No. 5 of the Council of the said Shire of Boroondara, made under section 213 of The Local Government Act 1874, is hereby repealed.

(1) All persons standing or loitering upon any of the carriageways, footways, or other public places of the shire, so as in any way to obstruct or impede the traffic thereon or therein, shall discontinue so to do on requirement by any member of the police discontinue so to do on requirement by any member of the police

way to obstruct or impede the traffic thereon or therein, shall discontinue so to do on requirement by any member of the police force.

(2) No procession of persons or vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes, shall parade or pass through any of the streets or roads, unless with the previous consent, in writing, of the President of the shire, or, in his absence, of the Secretary of the shire, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at least twenty-four hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the police in the district.

(3) No person, between the hours of sunset and the following sunrise, shall in or upon, or along any of the roads or streets within the Shire of Boroondara, drive or ride any vehicle, bicycle, or other velocipede without having a good and service-able lamp securely fixed at the off side of the front of such vehicle, bicycle, or velocipede, so placed that it shall show a light in the direction in which such vehicle, bicycle, or velocipede is proceeding, and the same shall be kept lighted.

(4) Any street musician or vocalist shall, when required by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, desist from playing or singing in the neighbourhood of the premises of such householder.

(5) No person shall write, paint, or post bills upon, or otherwise deface any footpath, foetbridge, treeguard, tree or fence, lamp-post, hand-rail, post, wall, or any property under the management and control of the Council of the said shire.

(6) Every person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(7) This By-law shall apply to the whole of the said shire, and shall come into operation on 1st January, 1901.
