Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MRS. E. D. HARVEY, MANUFACTURER OF CONFECTIONERY, 412 LONSDALE-STREET, MELBOURNE, for a period of one week from the 15th inst., upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than seven females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said seven females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.

- That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
 5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

ASSISTANT MEDICAL INSPECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

A PPLICATIONS will be received by the Public Service Board up to Saturday, the 5th January proximo, from persons who are qualified and are desirous of applying for appointment to the position of Assistant Medical Inspector, Department of Public Health.

Salary—£450 a year.

The officer appointed will be required to give his whole time to assisting the Medical Inspector in the following matters and such others as the Board of Public Health or the Minister of Health may from time to time direct:—

- (1) Advising the Board on the medical aspects of all sanitary matters which come before it.
- (2) Preparing regulations, circulars, and memoranda for publication on all sanitary and medical subjects connected with the health of the community.
- (3) Perusing, minting, and advising on the reports of local officers of health and inspectors, and on the reports of the Board's sanitary inspectors.
- (4) Watching the returns and notifications of infectious diseases, and advising when special inquiries are needed or when special action by the Board is required.
- (5) Investigating the causes of and conditions attending outbreaks of infectious or contagious diseases in particular localities, making recommendations for the prevention of the spread and for the abatement of such outbreaks, and guarding against their recurrence.
- (6) Making periodical inspections of and reporting on the sanitary condition and sanitary administration of the various municipal districts of the colony.
- (7) Advising the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them.
- (8) Inspecting, reporting on, and directing the work of public vaccination throughout the colony.
- (9) Advising the Board in regard to matters relating to quarantine.
- (10) Taking immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any disease introduced into Victoria.
- (11) Making original investigations into prevalence of diseases in man, and the relations of the same to disease in animals.
- (12) Advising the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water, and of the various kinds of foods on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of any Act relating thereto and administered by the Board.
- (13) Advising the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for the granting or cancelling of licences for noxious trade establishments.

The person appointed must be prepared at any moment to clear incoming and outgoing vessels; to take the duties of Medical Superintendent of the Quarantine Station, or to take the general medical management of any isolation hospital under the control of the Board.

Applicants should be between the ages of 25 and 40 years, and must be in vigorous and sound health, have all the necessary qualifications for registration as a medical practitioner of Victoria, and engage to become at once, on appointment, registered as such, and show that he has general experience in the treatment of communicable disease.

CITY OF HAWTHORN.

BY-LAW No. 48.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under the *Health Act 1890*, for the purpose of amending By-law numbered 36 made by the Council of the City of Hawthorn for determining the manner of registering, and the registration fee to be paid by cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk within the City of Hawthorn.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn, order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. That the clause of the schedule to By-law No. 36 which relates to "a full description of the paddocks, grass lands, &c., intended to be used for trade purposes" by the person applying for registration as a dairyman, cowkeeper, or purveyor of milk, be and the same is hereby repealed.
2. That in place of the clause repealed by the preceding section, the following clause shall be substituted, viz.:—

"Every place (if any) within the city at which such trade or any part of it is to be carried on, including a full description of all paddocks, grass lands, grounds, and enclosures occupied or used, or intended to be used by the applicant."

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1900.

THE births of 61 boys and 50 girls, or in all of 111 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of November. Of these 46 occurred in Ballarat East, 54 in Ballarat West, 10 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 7 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 136, viz., 67 of boys and 69 of girls.

The deaths registered in November numbered 72, viz., 48 of males and 24 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 39. In October the recorded deaths numbered 60; in November, 1899, they numbered 98; in November, 1898, they numbered 86; in November, 1897, they numbered 50; in November, 1896, they numbered 60; in November, 1895, they numbered 64; in November, 1894, they numbered 74; in November, 1893, they numbered 67; in November, 1892, they numbered 49; in November, 1891, they numbered 77; and in November, 1890, they numbered 55.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 67 per cent.; females, 33 per cent.; under five years, 14 per cent.; over five years, 86 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 65 and 35 per cent.; under and over five years, 25 and 75 per cent. respectively.

Twenty-two deaths, or 31 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in Public Institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 11; Benevolent Asylum, 10; and Lunatic Asylum, 1.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of November, separating those under from those over five years of age; also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease:—

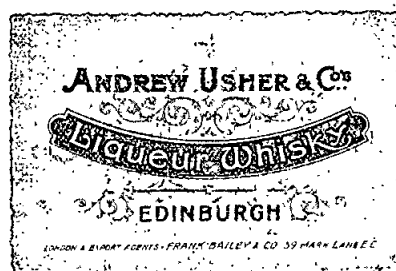

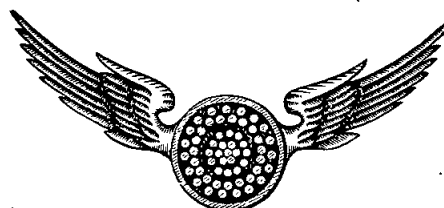

Horses and Vehicles.—From 20th December till 3rd January (both dates inclusive) the Department cannot engage to forward horses or vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From 20th December till 3rd January (both dates inclusive) commercial travellers' samples will only be taken to or from road-side stations by mixed or goods trains. They will not be despatched to or from Spencer-street by passenger or mixed trains, but must be sent by goods trains.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE CENSUS ACT 1901 (64 VICT. NO. 1669).

WHEREAS by the *Census Act 1901* it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for the execution of all matters and things arising under the said Act not therein expressly provided for, and for the more fully carrying out the objects and purposes of the said Act: Now therefore it is recommended that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. *Inclusion of Land and Live Stock in Householders' Schedules.*—In order to facilitate the collection of complete information respecting land and live stock, every occupier of a dwelling shall furnish particulars on the householder's schedule of the total numbers of each kind of live stock and poultry kept; and of the area of land held in connexion with or in the vicinity of such dwelling of one acre in extent or upwards, and of the area of such land in cultivation.

2. *Return of buildings uninhabited or in course of erection.*—The sub-enumerator shall fill up a householder's schedule for every building intended for a dwelling which he shall find uninhabited, or in course of erection on the Census day, with particulars, as required by such Schedule, as to its description and the area of land attached thereto; the area of such land in cultivation; and the number of each description of live stock and poultry thereon (if any).

3. *Cases in which Land and Live Stock Schedules to be left.*—The sub-enumerator shall leave a land and live stock schedule with every occupier of a dwelling in connexion with or in the immediate vicinity of which is land of an area of one acre or upwards, under the control, care, or management of such occupier.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other thing provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

After Part V A. of the regulations the following regulations are added:—

PART V B.—VICTORIAN RAILWAYS VOLUNTEER REGIMENT.

SECTION I.—CONSTITUTION AND REGULATIONS.

1. The Victorian Railways Volunteer Regiment shall consist of such commissioned, warrant, non-commissioned officers, and men as may from time to time be duly appointed and engaged under the provisions of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890*, and amendments of the same.

Engage-
ment.

2. Engagement shall be for a period not exceeding three years, but members may, with the sanction of the Commandant, re-engage during the last year of their service for a further period of one, three, or five years.

Resigna-
tions.

Any person so engaged may (with the approval of the Governor in Council if an officer, or of the Commandant if below the rank of an officer) resign from the regiment by giving fourteen days' notice in writing to the commanding officer.

3. No person shall be engaged unless he is a British subject and is between the ages of 18 and 45, but any person who has previously served in the Imperial Regular or Auxiliary Forces, or in any Colonial Militia or Volunteer Force, may be enrolled if under the age of 50. Persons who have served in a Volunteer Cadet Corps for a period of not less than two years may be engaged between the ages of 17 and 18, if fulfilling all other conditions.

All applicants for engagement shall be subject to a medical examination.

Boys.

4. Boys may be engaged for the purpose of being trained as drummers or buglers. Not more than two boys per company will be allowed. Age, 14 to 18 years.

Recruit
drill.

5. All applicants for engagement in the ranks must attend recruit drill until passed into the ranks. Any recruit who fails to pass into the ranks within three months of the date of his enrolment shall be recommended for discharge, unless in the opinion of his commanding officer there are extenuating circumstances.

Drills to be
attended.

6. After being passed into the ranks members will be required to undergo a minimum of twelve daylight drills and twelve night drills per annum.

Effective-
ness.

7. No member of the regiment shall be classed as effective unless he shall have completed twelve daylight drills and twelve night drills during the twelve months between 1st July and 30th June in each year, and have completed his course of musketry training.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st July and 30th September must attend twelve daylight drills and twelve night drills, and have completed the course of musketry.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st October and 31st December must attend six daylight drills and six night drills, and have completed the half-yearly course of musketry.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st January and 31st March must attend three daylight drills and three night drills, and have completed the quarterly course of musketry.

Recruits passed into the ranks between 1st April and 30th June must attend two daylight drills and two night drills.

8. Any combatant member of the regiment who fails to carry out the provisions of para. 6 by the 30th June in each year may be struck off the strength, unless such failure was caused by illness, to be certified to by a medical officer of the corps. Absentees to be struck off.

9. Attendance at church parades or funerals shall not be allowed to count towards effectiveness. Church parades and funerals.

10. Any extra number of parades and drills may be called in order to allow members the opportunity of qualifying as effectives. Extra drills.

11. When the Commandant or officer deputed by him inspects the regiment, every officer, warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, or man must be present, unless prevented by sickness or urgent necessity. In the former case, a certificate from a medical officer of the corps to be produced; in the latter, leave may be granted by the commanding officer of the regiment, but only in urgent cases. Annual inspections.

12. Annual musketry training will be carried out in accordance with instructions which will be issued under the authority of the Commandant. Musketry training.

13. Every member of the regiment on enrolment will be supplied, free of charge, with the following articles, which remain the property of the Government, and must be kept in good order, and returned whenever called for:— Free kit.

M.-E. rifle, complete, with bayonet and sling.
Waist belt, pouch, and frog.

14. All appointments of commissioned officers are to be submitted to the Commandant through the commanding officer. Officers, appointment of.

15. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 5 of Section II. Sub-section I. "General Regulations" of Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, the Commandant may recommend any Railway employé for a Commission in the Victorian Railways Volunteer Regiment.

16. Any officer who does not qualify as an effective shall not be allowed to retain his commission, unless it be represented by the Commandant that there are special reasons for a relaxation of this regulation. Officers to be effective.

17. The services of officers on the Reserve are at all times to be at the disposal of the Commandant, but they are not to perform any duty unless he authorizes them to do so, and in carrying out such duty may, on the approval of the Commandant, be classed as effective reserve officers.

18. Non-commissioned officers will be appointed by the commanding officer of the regiment. N.-C. officers, appointment of.

19. Any non-commissioned officer who does not qualify as an effective shall be reduced to the ranks, unless it shall appear to the Commandant that there are special reasons for the relaxation of this regulation. N.-C. officers to be effective.

20. After the regiment or any portion thereof has been called out for actual military service, it shall be released from such service only by order of the Governor in Council; and before the regiment or such portion is released from actual military service it shall be returned to its district. Service in the field, release from.

21. Neither the regiment nor any portion thereof is to quit as a military body, its district, unless the sanction of the Commandant be previously obtained; and no member is to quit the district for a period of more than one month without returning his complete free kit to the commanding officer of the company to which he belongs. Corps not to quit district without authority.

SECTION II.—REGULATIONS.

- Authorized uniform to be worn. 1. Members of the Victorian Railways Volunteer Regiment must appear in authorized uniform or in purely civilian dress, the unsoldier-like appearance of the members of the regiment dressed partly in uniform and partly in civilian dress bringing discredit not only on themselves, but on the force to which they belong.
- Parades. Proper dress to be worn. 2. Members of the regiment must be properly dressed when going to and returning from parade.
- Arrest. 3. Any member of the regiment may, for any offence against good order and discipline, be placed under arrest by his superior officer.
- Definition of arrest. 4. Arrest shall signify suspension from all military duty and participation in rifle shooting; and any member placed under arrest shall deliver up his arms and accoutrements to such person as his commanding officer may direct.
- Disobedience of orders or misconduct. 5. If any member of the regiment, while under arms or on duty with the company to which he belongs, or any portion of the military forces, or while engaged in any military exercise or drill, either in uniform or in plain clothes, or while going to or returning from any place of exercise or assembly, disobeys any lawful order of the officer under whose command he then is, or is guilty of misconduct, any superior officer may order the offender, if an officer, into arrest, and if not an officer, into the custody of any non-commissioned officer or private, but so that the offender be not kept in such custody longer than during the time such portion of the military forces as aforesaid remains under arms or on duty. After which his case will either be disposed of by the commanding officer on the spot, or he will be suspended from duty under para. 3, and reported to higher authority.
- Military duty. 6. Duty with a company, or any portion of the military forces, is held to mean not only presence under arms on parade, but the performance of all administrative duties of a military nature in or out of uniform.
- Mode of punishment for misconduct. 7. Commanding officers shall, immediately after parade, receive the reports of officers as to any members of the regiment who have misconducted themselves, and shall either deal summarily with the case or report it to a higher authority.
- Public or other property, responsibility for. 8. Any member of the regiment who fails to produce for inspection, when required, any arms, accoutrements, or other property intrusted to his care may be proceeded against under the Act, and steps taken for his summary discharge for disobedience of orders. Every member failing to become effective shall, on demand, immediately return to the head-quarters of his company all arms, accoutrements, clothing, stores, &c., which may have been issued to him.
- Public property to be returned. 9. Any member of the regiment whose services are dispensed with shall deliver up in good order, fair wear and tear only excepted, all arms, ammunition, accoutrements, clothing, or appointments, or any public stores or property issued to him, and if he refuse or neglect to comply with this regulation he may be proceeded against under the Act.
- Damage to be made good. 10. Any loss, damage, or destruction of arms, accoutrements, uniform, or stores which may be traced to any member, unless caused by circumstances beyond his control, will be required to be made good by him, or, in default thereof, proceedings against him will be instituted under the Act.
- Reduction or dismissal. 11. The Commandant may summarily reduce in rank any non-commissioned officer, or may dismiss or discharge any warrant officer, non-commissioned officer, or private for misconduct.
- Absent without leave. 12. Any member of the regiment absent without leave for a period of three months shall be discharged, unless, in the opinion of the Commandant, there be extenuating circumstances.
- Division of companies. 13. The commanding officer of a company will keep a muster roll of the whole company, showing the date of enlistment, &c., of each man in it.

SECTION III.—MEDICAL STAFF.

1. The officers of the Medical Staff will wear the uniform of their corps, and will perform duty with their corps only. Uniform.
2. Whenever the regiment is brigaded with other troops the officers of the Medical Staff will be under the general direction of the principal medical officer of the military forces, and will take rank with officers of the Victorian Medical Staff in accordance with the dates of their commissions. Authority of P.M.O.
Relative rank.
3. No emolument is attached to any of the above appointments. No pay given to officers.

SECTION IV.—LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

1. Leave of absence, not exceeding three months, may be granted by the commanding officer to all officers, warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, and men of the regiment under his command (those permanently employed excepted), or he may delegate this power to commanding officers of companies. Beyond this period application must be made to the Commandant through the proper channel. Leave of absence.

SECTION V.—DRESS AND EQUIPMENT.

Uniform will be as authorized by the Dress Regulations.

Explosives Act 1890.

CONDITIONS AS TO SALE OF EXPLOSIVES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of December, 1900.

WHEREAS by the 24th Section of the *Explosives Act 1890*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order prescribe the conditions to be inserted in general licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale, and for the selling of explosives other than nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals, and in special licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale, and for the selling of nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals : Now, therefore, in pursuance of the above-mentioned section of the said Act, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria doth, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, prescribe the conditions to be inserted in general licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale, and for the selling of explosives other than nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals, and in special licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale and for the selling of nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals, that is to say :—

1. Applications for a licence to sell explosives shall be made to a Government Inspector of Explosives.

2. Every application must state the name in full of the applicant, his occupation and full address, the kind of explosives to be sold, the maximum quantity of each kind of explosive to be kept on the premises of the applicant, and the place where explosives are to be kept.

3. The Inspector of Explosives shall submit to the Minister each application, and may recommend the issue or refusal of a licence.

4. Upon the Minister's approval a licence shall be issued upon payment of the licence fee.

5. The following conditions shall be inserted in general licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale and for the selling of explosives other than nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals and such of them as may apply in special licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale, and for selling nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals :—

(a) No explosives shall be hawked, sold, or exposed for sale in or upon any highway, street, road, public thoroughfare, or public place. No explosives other than those defined in Division 1, Class 6 (Ammunition), shall be exhibited or exposed upon any premises. All explosives for sale other than those defined in Division 1, Class 6 (Ammunition), must be kept only in the building or receptacle provided for the storage of the same.

(b) No fireworks shall be sold or delivered to any child under the age of thirteen years, and no other explosive shall be sold or delivered to any one under the age of sixteen years.

(c) All explosives exceeding 1lb. in weight when sold shall be in a substantial case, bag, canister, or other receptacle, made and closed so as to prevent the explosives from escaping, and (except when the same is sold to any person employed by or on the property occupied by the vendor for immediate use in the service of the vendor or on such property) the outermost receptacle containing such explosives shall have affixed in conspicuous characters, by means of a brand or securely attached label or other mark :—

(1) In the case of gunpowder, the word "Gunpowder," and

(2) In the case of explosive other than gunpowder, the name of such explosive, with the addition of the word "Explosive," and if such name is materially false, the person selling or offering for sale such explosive, and also the owner of such explosive, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these conditions.

(d) Every person selling any explosive other than gunpowder or explosives defined in Division 1, Class 6 (Ammunition), or fireworks shall keep a record of the name and address of the person to whom, and the date on which he sells such explosive, together with the description of such explosive, and the quantity thereof sold.

(e) The premises shall be occupied only by the licensee, except as hereinafter directed.

(f) If such licensee dies or becomes insolvent, or applies to take the benefit of any Act in force for the relief of insolvent debtors, or assigns his estate for the benefit of his creditors, or becomes mentally incapable or otherwise disabled, the person carrying on the business of such licensee shall not be liable to any penalty or forfeiture under these conditions for carrying on the business, and acting under the licence during such reasonable time as may be necessary to allow him to apply for a licence to sell, so that he otherwise conform to the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1890* and the *Explosives Act 1896*, and of the Regulations and Orders made thereunder.

(g) The licence shall be valid only for the person to whom the same is issued.

(h) All buildings and places adjoining each other and occupied together shall be deemed to be the same premises, and shall accordingly be included in one licence.

- (i) No explosives except those specified in the licence shall be kept on any premises, and all explosives on the premises, except those defined in Division 1, Class 6 (Ammunition), shall be kept in one or other or all of the following modes, namely :—

Mode 1.—In a substantially constructed building detached from a dwelling house, and at a safe distance from any highway, street, public thoroughfare, or public place. Provided that such building is closed so as to prevent unauthorized persons having access thereto, and to secure it from danger from without, and exclusively appropriated to the keeping of explosives ; or

Mode 2.—In a receptacle exclusively appropriated to the keeping of explosives, and placed inside a dwelling house or inside any building as is not itself qualified for the keeping of explosives in Mode 1 (the receptacle to be made of wood, iron, copper, or other suitable material). The lid or door thereof shall have copper or brass hinges and fastenings and be provided with a lock, and the word "Explosives" shall be painted conspicuously on the receptacle. The receptacle shall be placed in a safe position, away from all goods of an inflammable nature, and shall (except in cases where the amount of explosives authorized to be kept does not exceed 50lbs.) be on wheels so as to be readily removed in the event of a fire taking place ; or

Mode 3.—In a building or receptacle in respect of which a certificate has been obtained from a Government Inspector of Explosives that such building or receptacle has been approved by such inspector. Such certificate may be cancelled and revoked by any Government Inspector of Explosives at any time after it is granted.

- (j) There shall not be on the premises at any one time an amount of any sort of explosive exceeding the amount prescribed by the licence, and the maximum quantities of the various explosives that may be kept on any premises shall be as follows :—

Two hundred pounds of gunpowder, or in lieu thereof, 200 lbs. of fireworks or 100 lbs. of nitro-compounds for blasting, and in addition loaded safety cartridges containing not more than 500 lbs. of explosive, 500 detonators, and percussion caps unlimited.

Provided that—

- (1) A maximum of 2,000 detonators and of 2,400 lbs. of explosive contained in loaded safety cartridges may be kept on the premises if the other explosives (excepting percussion caps) are reduced in the proportion of 10 lbs. of gunpowder or fireworks or of 5 lbs. of nitro-compound for blasting for every additional 100 detonators and 120 lbs. of explosive contained in loaded safety cartridges, but if the premises are licensed for the keeping of loaded safety cartridges only, such loaded safety cartridges may be kept in unlimited quantity.
 - (2) There shall not be kept on the premises in Mode 2 any detonators or more than 100 lbs. of gunpowder, or in lieu thereof 100 lbs. of fireworks or 25 lbs. of nitro-compounds for blasting.
 - (3) The maximum quantities of the various explosives to be kept in Mode 3 shall be those specified in the certificate issued in that behalf.
 - (4) Loaded safety cartridges or percussion caps and detonators shall not be kept together or in the same building or receptacle as the other explosives unless separated by an intervening partition of such substance and character, or by such intervening space as will effectually prevent explosion or fire in the one communicating with the other.
- (k) With respect to every such building or receptacle, the interior thereof, and the shelves and fittings therein, shall be so constructed or so lined or covered as to prevent the exposure of any iron or steel, or the detaching of any grit, iron, steel, or similar substance in such manner as to come into contact with the explosive, and such interior, shelves, and fittings shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be kept free from grit and otherwise clean ; and in case of any explosive being kept which is liable to be dangerously affected by water, due precautions shall be taken to exclude water therefrom ; but this provision, so far as relates to the exposure of iron or steel or similar substance, shall not be obligatory in the case where no explosive other than explosives of the 1st Division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class are kept.
- (l) Every article of a highly inflammable nature, and every article liable to cause fire or explosion, shall be kept at a safe distance from all explosives, and from all buildings and receptacles containing the same.
- (m) All explosive exceeding 5lbs. in amount of the 1st Division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class, or of the 2nd Division of the 7th (Firework) Class and all other explosives exceeding 1lb. in amount shall be kept in a substantial bag, canister, or case made and closed so as to prevent any explosive from escaping.
- (n) If two or more explosives are kept on the premises they must be separated from each other by an intervening partition of such substance and character, or by such intervening space, as will effectually prevent explosion or fire in the one communicating with the other, subject nevertheless to the following qualifications :—
- (1) The various explosives of Class 1, Class 2, Class 3, safety fuse belonging to the 1st Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) and such of the various explosives of the 2nd Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) as do not contain any exposed iron or steel, may be kept with each other without any intervening partition or space.

- (2) The various explosives of the 1st Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) may be kept with each other without any intervening partition or space.
- (3) Such of the various explosives of the 2nd Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) as contain any exposed iron or steel may be kept with each other without any intervening partition or space.
- (4) The various explosives of the 3rd Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) may be kept with each other without any intervening partition or space.
- (5) The various explosives of Class 7 (Firework) may be kept with each other without any intervening partition or space.
- (o) If a room is used in connexion with the premises for the filling of small arm cartridges—
 - (1) There shall not be present in such room more than 5 lbs. of explosive not made into safety cartridges.
 - (2) No work unconnected with the making of the cartridges shall be carried on in the room while such filling is being carried on.
 - (3) There shall not be in the room while such filling is being carried on any fire or any artificial light, except a light of such construction, position, or character as not to cause any danger of fire or explosion.
 - (4) The licensee shall give notice to the Government Inspector that he intends to carry on such filling as is allowed by this clause.
 - (5) The outer clothing of the work-people employed in filling cartridges shall be of woollen or other unflammable material, and made without pockets, and suitable shoes, without iron nails, shall be used by those who enter the room.

Ordinary clothing, if of wool or other unflammable material, with all pockets torn out or sewn up, will be accepted as complying with this clause.

 - (6) Before the filling of cartridges is commenced, the bench or table at which such filling is to be carried on, shall be carefully swept down, and the floor, shelves, and fittings of the room shall be kept clean and free from grit.
 - (7) No exposed iron or steel shall be on the floor of the room near the explosive or on the bench or table at which the filling of cartridges is carried on.
 - (8) No fire or matches or any substance or articles likely to be a source of danger shall be allowed in the room.
 - (9) No finished cartridges, beyond the quantity at hand in the immediate course of preparation, shall be allowed to remain on the bench or table at which they were filled, or in close proximity thereto.
 - (10) No person under the age of sixteen years shall be employed in or allowed to enter a filling room, excepting under the supervision of some grown-up person.
 - (11) Any process involving pressure shall be conducted with great care, and in such manner as to avoid jerking or concussion.
 - (12) Articles of a highly inflammable nature, or which are liable to cause fire or explosion, shall be stored in close proximity to the room used for the filling of small-arm cartridges.
- (p) Every licensee and every person employed in and about the premises shall take all due precaution for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion in the same, and for preventing unauthorized persons having access to the premises or to the explosives therein, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion, and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of the work on such premises.
- (q) Wherever in these conditions an explosive is distinguished as belonging to a particular class or division of a class reference is made to the classification of explosives contained in an Order of the Governor in Council made in pursuance of section 49 of the *Explosives Act 1890*.
- (r) Premises shall mean any house, storeroom, warehouse, shop, cellar, yard, building, or enclosed space occupied by or under the control of the licensee.

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

A tenderer not desiring to accept a contract for part of the requirements of any station should write against such station the words "all or none."

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
