CONVENTION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND GUATEMALA RELATIVE TO TRADE MARKS.

Sir,

I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Convention between the United Kingdom and Guatemala relative to Trade Marks, signed at Guatemala on the 20th of July, 1898, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Guatemala on the 28th July, 1899.

2. I have to call your attention to Article II. of the Convention, from which you will observe that, if it is desired that the stipulations of the Convention should be made applicable to the Colony under your Government, notice to that effect must be given to the Minister of Foreign Relations of the Republic of Guatemala within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications.

3. I have therefore to request that you will be good enough to acquaint me as soon as possible of the wishes of your Government in the matter.

CONVENTION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND GUATEMALA RELATIVE TO TRADE MARKS.

Signed at Guatemala, 20th July, 1898.

[Ratifications exchanged at Guatemala, 28th July, 1899.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., &c., and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Guatemala, being desirous to conclude a Convention for the mutual protection of trade marks and designs, have for that purpose appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, namely:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., George Birt Jenner, Esquire, her Minister Resident in Central America;

And His Excellency the President of Guatemala, Doctor Francisco Anguiano, Secretary of State for the Department of the Interior and Justice, and in charge of that of Foreign Relations;

Who, after having mutually communicated their Full Powers, found in good and due form, have agreed to the following Articles:—

Article I.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall have, in the dominions and possessions of the other, the same rights as are now granted, or may hereafter be granted, to national subjects or citizens in all that relates to trade marks, industrial designs, and patterns.

In order that such rights may be obtained, the formalities required by the laws of the respective countries must be fulfilled.

SU Majestad la Reina del Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, Emperatriz de la India, &c., &c., y su Excelencia el Presidente de la República de Guatemala, en el deseo de celebrar una Convención para la protección recíproca de marcas de fábrica y de comercio, han nombrado al efecto sus Plenipotenciarios, á saber:

Su Majestad la Reina del Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, Emperatriz de la India, &c., al Señor Don Jorge Birt Jenner, su Ministro Residente en Centro América;

Y su Excelencia el Presidente de la República de Guatemala, al Doctor Don Francisco Anguiano, Secretario de Estado y del Despacho de Gobernación y Justicia, y encargado del de Relaciones Exteriores;

Quienes, despues de haberse comunicado sus Plenos Poderes, hallados en buena y debida forma, han convenido en los Artículos siguientes:—

Artículo I.

Los ciudadanos o súbditos de cualquiera de las Partes Contratantes gozarán, en los dominios y posesiones de la otra, de los mismos derechos que en ellos se conceden en la actualidad, ó que mas tarde sean concedidos, á sus nacionales en todo lo que se relacione con marcas de fábrica y comercio, etiquetas industriales, y modelos.

Para obtener el goce de estos derechos debe cumplirse recíprocamente con las formalidades que establezcan las leyes de los respectivos países.

Article II.

The stipulations of the present Convention shall be applicable to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to India, the Dominion of Canada, Newfoundland, the Cape of Good Hope, Natal, New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, Tasmania, South Australia, Western Australia, and New Zealand.

Provided always that the stipulations of the present Convention shall be made applicable to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions, on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative to the Minister of Foreign Relations of the Republic of Guatemala within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of the present Convention.

Article III.

The present Convention shall be ratified as soon as possible, and shall remain in force for five years, which will commence to run one month after the exchange of ratifications, which shall take place in the city of Guatemala. Nevertheless, if one year before the expiration of that term neither of the two Contracting Parties shall have announced to the other, by means of an official declaration, the intention of putting an end to the present Convention, it shall continue binding until the lapse of a year after such declaration shall have been made.

In witness whereof the Undersigned Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention, and affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate in Guatemala, on the twentieth day of July, eighteen hundred and ninety-eight.

Artículo II.

Las estipulaciones de la presente Convención serán extensivas á todas las Colonias y posesiones exteriores de Su Majestad Británica, con excepción de India, Canadá, Terranova, el Cabo de Buena Esperanza, Natal, Nueva Gales del Sur, Victoria, Queensland, Tasmania, Australia del Sur, Australia Occidental, y Nueva Zelandia.

Queda entendido sin embargo que las estipulaciones de la presente Convención se harán aplicables á cualquiera de las Colonias ó posesiones arriba mencionadas, en favor de las cuales el Representante de Su Majestad Británica haya hecho una notificación con el objeto mencionado al Señor Ministro de Relaciones Exteriores de la República de Guatemala, dentro de un año contado desde la fecha del canje de las ratificaciones de la presente Convención.

Artículo III.

La presente Convención será ratificada cuanto antes sea posible, y estará en vigor durante cinco años que comenzarán á correr un mes despues del canje de las ratificaciones, que se efectuará en la ciudad de Guatemala. Sin embargo, si un año antes de expirar este plazo ninguna de las dos Partes Contratantes anunciare á la otra, mediante declaración oficial, su intención de hacer cesar sus efectos, dicha Convención continuará siendo obligatoria durante un año despues de hecha la declaración antes mencionada.

En fe de lo cual los infrascritos Plenipotenciarios han firmado la presente Convención y puesto en ella sus sellos.

INSTRUCTIONS TO SURVEYORS.

Carriage of Liquid Ammonia on Board Ship.

THE Board of Trade are advised that ammoniacal gas compressed into liquid form should be classed with dangerous goods, not only on account of the danger of explosion involved when it is contained in vessels not sufficiently strong to withstand the pressure which may be produced by a rise in temperature, but also on account of the highly dangerous nature of the gas.

The following precautions should be adopted when this liquid is carried as cargo on board ship:—It should only be packed in iron vessels which have been carefully tested up to a pressure of 67½ lbs. per square inch, and should be stored in a part of the ship beyond the influence of any heat from boilers or furnaces, and remote from the living quarters.

The aqueous solution of ammonia of a specific gravity of .880 at 60° F. should be conveyed in drums of about 12 gallons capacity, with an empty space equal to 5.33 per cent. left in each drum. If for carriage on board ship, the drums should be capable of withstanding a pressure of 66 lbs. per square inch, and should be packed in cases with not more than four drums in a case, the interstices being filled with sawdust.

But for short voyages, such as to Ireland or the Continent, the drums need not be packed in cases.

At a temperature above 130° F. the expansion of liquid ammonia is rapid and a risk of explosion much increased. Care should therefore be taken not to expose drums containing this liquid to the rays of the sun or to the influence of heat from boilers.

It should be carried well away from the living quarters, as deck cargo only, and should not be covered with black tarpaulin.

Ammoniac solution of a specific gravity of .959 and upwards is exempted from the operation of the above Instructions.

Carriage of Bi-sulphide of Carbon on board ship, otherwise known as Carbon Bi-sulphuret, or Disulphide of Carbon, &c.

THE Board of Trade are advised that bi-sulphide of carbon comes within the definition of "Dangerous Goods," and it should therefore be distinctly marked and otherwise dealt with as required by section 446 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*.

It is a colourless, heavy, mobile, volatile liquid, which evaporates very quickly. It produces a pressure in any closed vessel containing it. It easily passes through the smallest opening, and it is very difficult to keep the drums tight in which it is stored.

It is not liable to spontaneous combustion, but both the liquid and its vapour take fire at very low temperatures, the liquid at rather a lower temperature than the vapour. The vapour has a tendency to travel, and if it finds its way to any surface sufficiently warm to ignite it, the flame will flash back and ignite the liquid. This is known to have occurred when the liquid was at a distance of 20 feet from the warm surface. The mere striking together of two pieces of iron within the inflammable atmosphere may cause ignition.

It has a very powerful and penetrating odour, which in small quantities resembles that of foul vegetable matter.

Bi-sulphide of carbon should be carried in strongly made and perfectly tight drums of not more than 5 gallons capacity each. The drums should be satisfactorily tested by hydraulic pressure to at least 40 lbs. per square inch before being used, and a space of at least 10 per cent. should be left in each to allow for

expansion of the liquid. Drums of the kind employed by the Government of India for the shipment of ether are recommended for this purpose.

The drums should be packed in strong wooden cases (which should be perforated), with not more than four drums in each case, each drum being in a separate compartment of the case.

It should be carried as deck cargo only, the utmost care being taken to protect it from the rays of the sun, or lights, or sparks; sail cloth (not black tarpaulin) is suggested as a covering. It should be stowed apart from all other goods, whether dangerous or not, and kept at a distance from all steam pipes, funnels, or other heated objects, and from all hatchways or other openings in the deck; also from all living quarters of the vessel, and smoking in its vicinity should be strictly prohibited.

The cases containing the drums should be examined at frequent intervals (at least twice in 24 hours), during daylight, to ascertain if there is any escape, and if any leakage is detected, even by the presence of the odour above described in the vicinity of the packages, they should be immediately thrown overboard, and it is important that the person making these examinations should know that leakages sufficiently large to be very dangerous may exist without its being possible to see anything in the nature of moisture on the outside of the drums to indicate their presence.

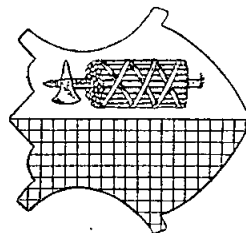

**ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATIONS.**

THE Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1899*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person, whether licensed as hereinafter mentioned or not, shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

4. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diameter;

For the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diameter;

For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

5. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

6. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any) and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which—after notice that service-pipe requires repairing—any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

7. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

8. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve, for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affixing the dial of the meter.

9. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

10. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes, or permits to be done, any thing in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which, under any of these Regulations, ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

11. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed under, and in accordance with the said Regulations and not otherwise.

12. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes, and to fix meters, or to relay or to refix the same must satisfy the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner, and shall pay a licence-fee of One pound per annum. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

No. 24.—MARCH 2, 1900.—2.

14. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.

(2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

(3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and being capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(4) The whole of pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship and of approved pattern to screw into elbow bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

15. If any person throw or convey or permit to be thrown or conveyed any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noxious things into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or any thing, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

16. If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, or aqueduct, which by notice in the *Government Gazette* has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks or reservoir belonging to the Trust, or wash or throw or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. Any person who, having been served with notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to provide such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice. A separate meter shall in every case be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.

18. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without having given to the Trust two days' notice in writing of his intention so to do, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's work without leave, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

19. The officers of the Trust shall have power, between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, to enter any house, building, or lands through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, pipes, instruments, and apparatus, for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land, for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

20. Any person appointed for that purpose by the Trust may, between the hours of Nine in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, enter any house or premises supplied with water by the Trust, in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and if such person at any such time be refused admittance into such dwelling house or premises for the purpose aforesaid, or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises.

21. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meter, shall not exceed 6ft. 3in. in length along the centreline by a mean width of 2 feet and a depth of 1ft. 9in., the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

22. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Trust for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden or land, laying dust, or any other purpose whatever, nor shall any person be allowed to carry water from any tap or pipes as aforesaid in buckets or in any other vessels for the purpose of watering gardens, trees, shrubs, or any land, or any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water is supplied by measure, and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

23. The Trust may enter into a Special Agreement with any person requiring water for any other purposes than domestic at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

24. The charge for water from stand-pipe shall be Sixpence for any quantity of water up to 200 gallons, over 200 and up to 400 gallons, One shilling.

25. The Trust reserves the right to sell water to any person for any purpose whatever other than domestic, and any person using water for other than domestic purposes without the written authority of the Trust will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds in each case.

26. In the construction of these Regulations the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or

company, whether aggregate or sole; the word officer shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word Trust shall be deemed to mean The Alexandra Waterworks Trust.

REGULATION No. 3.**

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1899* (and whose Waterworks District has for the purpose of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District), make the regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1900 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.

(b) Occupied and unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal annual valuation.

(c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this regulation, the rate shall be Fourpence for every 100 gallons.

(d) The rate to be charged non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Sixpence for every 100 gallons.

(e) For steam boilers the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(f) In buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement; wooden houses shall be charged half rate. Payments to be made before the supply is given.

(g) Supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate the Trust will in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be paid at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

(h) In the case of any dispute as to any sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.

(i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on the 1st January and 1st July.

(k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation No. 3 was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust, on the 23rd day of November, 1899, and the seal of the Trust was hereby affixed in our presence—

REGULATION No. 4.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1899* (and whose Waterworks District has for the purpose of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District), make the regulation following:—

1. Any person plying for hire with horse and dray shall be supplied with water by measure only, provided that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be in each case 6,000 gallons per year.

2. The valuation of lands and tenements for the purpose of water rates shall be the same as the valuation for such lands and tenements during the same or the previous year by the council of the municipal district in which such lands or tenements are situated, or (if there be no such valuation) the valuation of such lands or tenements by a police magistrate; and that no such rate shall exceed the amount of Ten pounds per centum on such valuation. Provided that the charge for the supply of water aforesaid shall not in any case be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

3. The rate or charge for water sold by meter shall be Fourpence per 100 gallons.

4. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary. Such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering One million gallons. Except in case of special agreement with the Trust, or in cases not otherwise specially provided for, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be a quantity equal to that quantity which the amount of the assessed water rates of the lands or tenements so supplied would purchase at Fourpence per (100) hundred gallons, had such rate been levied.

5. If any meter shall cease to, or be reported by any officer of the Trust as being out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period the meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or they may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.

6. Overflow pipes to any vessel will not be permitted.

7. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away from his premises such water, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away from any tap, trough, public or private service-pipe any water shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose. And any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

10. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or shall any person not supplied with water by measure at any time use water by hose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and also to have his supply of water cut off for a period not exceeding one month.

11. Water is supplied by the Trust for domestic purposes only, unless by measure.

12. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or effecting the dial of the meter under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

13. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or any fitting connected with the pipe of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any way interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

14. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have power of cancelling such licence at any time.

15. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe, or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

16. If any person shall neglect to keep in proper repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipe inside the building line of street being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier, if any, and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaking, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

17. In the construction of these by-laws the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust shall mean the Charlton Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing Regulation No. 4 was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Charlton Waterworks Trust on the 23rd day of November, 1899, and the Seal of the Trust was hereby affixed in our presence—

**NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1900.**

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1892*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of less than Eleven pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Eleven pounds or more than Eleven pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water, except by special agreement, a charge of Twenty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

5. For water supplied to syphon-pumps, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

6. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable institutions, and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.

8. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or at such prices as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre.

For every additional acre and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1900, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1900, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1900, and the 1st day of July, 1900.

Where water meters are affixed, payments shall be made on the end of each quarter in each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

**SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1900.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of One shilling and twopence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Seventeen pounds two shillings and sixpence (£17 2s. 6d.) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1900.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Seventeen pounds two shillings and sixpence (£17 2s. 6d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings, as provided by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings (2s.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises,

shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the charge will be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof.

10. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

11. No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty of One pound.

12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use the same in earthen or other drains or pipes for irrigation purposes, (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

13. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, take or carry away, or wilfully permit to be taken or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

14. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or wilfully permits to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to pay his or her rates when due, or fails to do anything which under this Regulation ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust.

15. The officer or officers of the Trust appointed for that purpose may at all reasonable times between the hours specified in sections 451 and 471 of the *Water Act 1890*, enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders or prevents any such officer from entering or making such inspection or examination, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

16. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the said year 1900. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

18. The word "person" in these Regulations shall include corporation.

The foregoing Regulations were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the evening of the 1st of December, 1899.

3. For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending 31st December, 1900, and shall be paid quarterly, in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January, 1st day of April, 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October, 1900.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose Water district has, for the purposes of the said Act, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1900, in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Eighteen pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.

(b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

(c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.

(d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.

(f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

(g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.

(h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings or Five shillings per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided. Payment in either case to be made in advance.

(k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters, the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

(l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

(m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.

(n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(c) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the Chinese Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the Chinese Act 1890 aforesaid, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the said Schedule, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106, Part I., section 73) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim as a street or road or as a township any portion or portions of Crown lands, and that the lands in such township or within any city, town, or borough proclaimed before the passing of the *Land Act 1884* shall be sold by auction in the manner provided in the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and that the lands upon which such street or road have been proclaimed shall be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this notice proclaim as townships the portions of Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish

THE BEECHWORTH AND WOORAGEE UNITED COMMON by deducting therefrom the portion of land hereinafter described, viz.:

One hundred and twenty acres, more or less, parish of Beechworth; Commencing at the north-west angle of H. Dowling's selection; bounded thence south and east by that selection and a line; thence south by M. E. Price's and J. H. MIDDLE VERMIN DISTRICT.—ANNUAL RATE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any vermin district shall, within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount the rate to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or

cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committee duly appointed for the Middle Vermin District has recommended a rate of Five shillings per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vermin District: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of Five shillings per square mile to be the rate payable by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Middle Vermin District aforesaid for the current year.

PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1163) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; but that no rules or regulations made as aforesaid respecting any public wharf shall have any force or validity to repeal or affect any by-law passed by the corporation of the city of Melbourne or of the town of Geelong or by the council of any borough, district, or shire for preventing obstruction and encumbrances in and upon any wharf within the limits of such city, town, borough, district, or shire; and that any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby make the following Additional Regulation for Ports in Victoria, which shall come into force on and after the 1st day of March, 1900, that is to say:—

REGULATION.

93a. The Port Officer, Pier Master, or Wharf Manager may exclude any person or persons from any wharf for such time and under such conditions as he may think fit, whenever it shall appear to him to be expedient to do so for the purpose of facilitating the embarkation or disembarkation of passengers on or from any vessel, or for the good government and management of such wharf.

CHURCH OF ENGLAND, MURCHISON.—POWER TO DISPOSE OF SITE.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England, under the provisions of the Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion, for allowance by the Lieutenant-Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty seventh day of February, 1900, and the following is the form in which such Statement of Trusts has been allowed:—

Description of Land.—Two acres, county of Rodney, town of Murchison: Commencing at the intersection of the south-east side of Robinson-street and the south-west side of Station-street; bounded thence by the latter street bearing S. 62° 31' E. four chains; thence by lines bearing respectively S. 27° 41' W. five chains, and N. 62° 31' W. four chains; and thence by Robinson-street aforesaid bearing N. 27° 41' E. five chains to the point of commencement.

Name of Trustee.—The Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne.

Power of Disposition.—To sell to the Commissioner of Railways for the colony of Victoria for the sum of Fifty pounds.

Purposes to which proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.—To be used for repairs and improvements of the Church of England at Murchison, and not in liquidation of existing liabilities.
