CONVENTION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND GUATEMALA RELATIVE TO TRADE MARKS. THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Convention between the United Kingdom and Guatemala relative to Trade Marks, signed at Guatemala on the 20th of July, 1898, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Guatemala on the 28th July, 1899.

2. I have to call your attention to Article II. of the Convention, from which you will observe that, if it is desired that the stipulations of the Convention should be made applicable to the Colony under your Government, notice to that effect must be given to the Minister of Foreign Relations of the Republic of Guatemala within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications.

3. I have therefore to request that you will be good enough to acquaint me as soon as possible of the wishes of your Government in the matter.

CONVENTION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND GUATEMALA RELATIVE TO TRADE MARKS.

Signed at Guatemala, 20th July, 1898.

[Ratifications exchanged at Guatemala, 28th July, 1899.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., &c., and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Gnatemala, being desirous to conclude a Convention for the mutual protection of trade marks and designs, have for that purpose appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, namely:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., George Birt Jenner, Esquire, her Minister Resident in Central America;

And His Excellency the President of Guatemala, Doctor Francisco Anguiano, Secretary of State for the Department of the Interior and Justice, and in charge of that of Foreign Rela-

Who, after having mutually communicated their Full Powers, found in good and due form, have agreed to the following Articles:—

Article I.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall have, in the dominions and possessions of the other, the same rights as are now granted, or may hereafter be granted, to national subjects or citizens in all that relates to trade marks, industrial designs, and patterns.

In order that such rights may be obtained, the formalities required by the laws of the respective countries must be fulfilled.

Provided always that the stipulations of the present Convention shall be made applicable to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions, on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative to the Minister of Foreign Relations of the Republic of Guatemala within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of the present Convention.

Article III.

The present Convention shall be ratified as soon as possible, and shall remain in force for five years, which will commence to run one month after the exchange of ratifications, which shall take place in the city of Guatemala. Nevertheless, if one year before the expiration of that term neither of the two Contracting Parties shall have announced to the other, by means of an official declaration, the intention of putting an end to the present Convention, it shall continue binding until the lapse of a year after such declaration shall have been made.

In witness whereof the Undersigned Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention, and affixed thereto their seals.

INSTRUCTIONS TO SURVEYORS.

Carriage of Liquid Ammonia on Board Ship.

Carriage of Liquid Ammonia on Board Ship.

The Board of Trade are advised that ammoniacal gas compressed into liquid form should be classed with dangerous goods, not only on account of the danger of explosion involved when it is contained in vessels not sufficiently strong to withstand the pressure which may be produced by a rise in temperature, but also on account of the highly dangerous nature of the gas.

The following precautions should be adopted when this liquid is carriod as cargo on board ship:—It should only be packed in iron vessels which have been carefully tested up to a pressure of 675 lbs. per square inch, and should be stored in a part of the ship beyond the influence of any heat from boilers or furnaces, and remote from the living quarters.

The aqueous solution of ammonia of a specific gravity of '880 at 60° F. should be conveyed in drums of about 12 gallons capacity, with an empty space equal to 5°33 per cent. left in each drum. If for carriage on board ship, the drums should be capable of withstanding a pressure of 66 lbs. per square inch, and should be packed in cases with not more than four drums in a case, the interstices being filled with sawdust.

But for short voyages, such as to Ireland or the Continent, the drums need not be packed in cases.

At a temperature above 130° F, the expansion of liquid ammonia is rapid and a risk of explosion much increased. Care should therefore be taken not to expose drums containing this liquid to the rays of the sun or to the influence of heat from boilers.

It should be carried well away from the living quarters, as desce cargo only, and should not be covered with black tarpaulin.

Carriage of Bi-sulphide of Carbon on board ship, otherwise known as Carbon Bi-sulphuret, or Disulphide of Carbon, de.

THE Board of Trade are advised that bi-sulphide of carbon comes within the definition of "Dangerous Goods," and it should therefore be distinctly marked and otherwise dealt with as required by section 446 of the Merchant Shipping Act IS34.

It is a colourless, heavy, mobile, volatile liquid, which evaporates very quickly. It produces a pressure in any closed vessel containing it. It easily passes through the smallest opening, and it is very difficult to keep the drums tight in which it is stored.

and it is very difficult to keep the drums tight in which it is stored.

It is not liable to spontaneous combustion, but both the liquid and its vapour take fire at very low temperatures, the liquid at rather a lower temperature than the vapour. The vapour has a tendency to travel, and if it finds its way to any surface sufficiently warm to ignite it, the flame will flash back and ignite the liquid. This is known to have occurred when the liquid was at a distance of 20 feet from the warm surface. The mere striking together of two pieces of ion within the inflammable atmosphere may cause ignition.

It has a very powerful and penetrating odour, which in small quantities resembles that of foul vegetable matter.

Bi-sulphido of carbon should be carried in strongly made and perfectly tight drums of not more than 5 gallons capacity each. The drums should be satisfactorily tested by hydraulic pressure to at least 40 lbs. per square inch before being used, and a space of at least 10 per cent. should be left in each to allow for

expansion of the liquid. Drums of the kind employed by the Government of India for the shipment of ether are recommended

expansion of the liquid. Drums of the kind employed by the Government of India for the shipment of ether are recommended for this purpose.

The drums should be packed in strong wooden cases (which should be perforated), with not more than four drums in each case, each drum being in a separate compartment of the case.

It should be carried as deck cargo only, the utmost care being taken to protect it from the rays of the sun, or lights, or sparks; sail cloth (not black tarpaulin) is suggested as a covering. It should be stowed apart from all other goods, whether dangerous or not, and kept at a distance from all steam pipes, funnels, or other heated objects, and from all hatchways or other openings in the deck; also from all living quarters of the vessel, and smoking in its vicinity should be strictly prohibited.

The cases containing the drums should be examined at frequent intervals (at least twice in 24 hours), during daylight, to ascertain if there is any escape, and if any leakage is detected, even by the presence of the odour above described in the vicinity of the packages, they should be immediately thrown overboard, and it is important that the person making these examinations should know that leakages sufficiently large to be very dangerous may exist without its being possible to see anything in the nature of moisture on the outside of the drums to indicate their presence.



ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.-REGULATIONS.

LILE Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:— THE Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the

- 1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence. offence.
- 2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- No person, whether licensed as hereinafter mentioned or not, 3. No person, whether licensed as bereinafter mentioned or not, shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
- 4. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:-

 - For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, \$\frac{1}{2}\$ in. diameter;
 For the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, \$\frac{3}{2}\$ in. diameter;
 For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.
- and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

 5. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

 6. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any) and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which—after notice that service-pipe requires repairing—any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

 7. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully excellents.
- 7. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.
- 8. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve, for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affixing the dial of the meter.
- 9. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

 10. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes, or permits to be done, any thing in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do acything which, under any of these Regulations, ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not romedied.

 11. The water supplied in the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed under, and in accordance with the said Regulations and not otherwise.

 12. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes
- lations and not otherwise.

Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes, and to fix meters, or to relay or to refix the same must satisfy the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner, and shall pay a licence-fee of One pound per annum. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, or aqueduct, which by notice in the Government Gazette has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks or reservoir belonging to the Trust, or wash or throw or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, he shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Trust for domestic purpose ato any house or premises) for watering any garden or land, laying dust, or any other purpose whatever, nor shall any person be allowed to carry water from any tap or pipes as aforesaid in buckets or in any other vessels for the purpose of watering gardens, trees, shrubs, or any land, or any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water is supplied by measure, and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.
- 23. The Trust may enter into a Special Agreement with any person requiring water for any other purposes than domestic at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may condition.
- 24. The charge for water from stand-pipe shall be Sixpence for any quantity of water up to 200 gallons, over 200 and up to 400 gallons, One shilling.
- 25. The Trust reserves the right to sell water to any person for any purpose whatever other than domestic, and any person using water for other than domestic purposes without the written authority of the Trust will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds in each case.
- 26. In the construction of these Regulations the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or

company, whether aggregate or sole; the word officer shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word Trust shall be deemed to mean The Alexandra Waterworks Trust.

(g) Supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paul for at such rate the Trust will in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be paid at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

(a) In the case of any dispute as to any sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.

(i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(j) The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on the 1st January and 1st July.

(k) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

The valuation of lands and tenements for the purpose of water rates shall be the same as the valuation for such lands and tenements during the same or the previous year by the council of the municipal district in which such lands or tenements are situated, or (if there he no such valuation) the valuation of such lands or tenements by a police magistrate; and that no such rate shall exceed the amount of Ten pounds per centum on such valuation. Provided that the charge for the supply of water aforesaid shall not in any case be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum. shillings per annum.

3. The rate or charge for water sold by meter shall be Fourpence per 100 gallons.

4. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary. Such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering One million gallons. Except in case of special agreement with the Trust, or in cases not otherwise specially provided for, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be a quantity equal to that quantity which the amount of the assessed water rates of the lands or tenements so supplied would purchase at Fourpence per (100) hundred gallons, had such rate been levied.

5. If any meter shall cease to, or be reported by any officer of the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period the meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or they may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.

No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose. And any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

10. No person supulied with water by the Trust shall wilfully

No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or shall any person not supplied with water by measure at any time use water by hose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and also to have his supply of water cut off for a period not exceeding one month.

No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or effecting the dial of the meter under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

13. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or any fitting connected with the pipe of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any way interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforessid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

14. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have power of cancelling such licence at any time.

15. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe, or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of the Trust in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessiy break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

16. If any person shall neglect to keep in proper repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting of the service-pipe or otherwise out of rep

For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum raid for stone-work, brick-work, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in clase four (4) hereof.

Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, take or carry away, or wilfully permit to be taken or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public service, pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or wilfully permits to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to pay his or her rates when due, or fails to do anything which under this Regulation ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or mjury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust.

HE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Act 1850 (and whose Water district has, for the purposes of the said Act, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1900, in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Eighteen pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the amount value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.

(b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

(c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.

(c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.

(d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being domiciles nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.

(f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fitteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

(g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 1000 gallons; and ratepayers shall be Threepence per 1000 gallons; exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.

(k) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per entum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Ten shillings per contum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

(m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.

(n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
