By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

In Pursuance of the provisions continued in Part VI. of the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. ### SMALL POX ON THE S.S. "INDIA."

WHEREAS by the Health Act 1890 it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship India has arrived in Victorian waters, and had on board during the voyage a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and anthorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exerciseable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the Colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepsan, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmath-head; and do further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other other in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters, shall leave the said steam-ship, oxcept only that her mails, cargo, and passengers luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and many after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his supervision; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggago, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her v



relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying on payment of the charges set forth in the schedule marked A.

8. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or

iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission, and may prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of

any monument which may be preferred to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

12. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the

owners.

13. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the charge set forth in Schedule B.

14. It is notified that any person wantenly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damege to any monument, vault or tembstone, building, erection, railing, fence or shrubbery, tree or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Cemetery Act in that case made and provided.

15. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

16. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

16. The cemetery will be open to the patient state sunset.

17. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.

18. No grave to be of a less depth than 6 feet.

19. No burial shall be permitted to take place without a certificate from a registrar of deaths, coroner, or justice of the peace, and such certificate shall be delivered to the sexton before the funeral enters the cemetery.

The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these Regulations.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick hills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, or roll or throw stones therein.

leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, or roll or throw stones therein.

5. No person shall light any fire in the reserve, or erect any dwelling therein, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

6. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any blots therein which may be enclosed or set apart for plantations of trees or shrubs.

7. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

8. All goats, pigs, and pountry, and all dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, found trespassing on the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for sports, or be permitted to bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail, except on the day for which it is issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any buildings, erections, enclovures, plantations, or cultivated plots in the reserve.

10. All persons paying for admission to the reserve, or bringing

buildings, erections, enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots in the reserve.

10. All persons paying for admission to the reserve, or bringing therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, and, if required, surrender to any gate-keeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand the production or surrender of tickets.

11. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall, together with any horses, carriages, or other vehicles in his possession and care, be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or be in possession of a ticket of admission.

(a) Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or obscene

- (a) Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or obsecue language.

  (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

  (c) Trespassing upon any inclosures, plantations, cultivated plots, or any portion of the Reserve set apart for sports, or interfering with or interrupting any person engaged by the authority of the committee of management in carrying out any sports or amusements.

  (d) Being found in any portion of the reserve or in any building, erection, or inclosure for the time being thereon, and not producing on demand or surrendering if required to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender a ticket duly authorized to demand production or surrender a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the place wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Committee of Management or any person deputed by it that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to him has been lost.

  12. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the Reserve, and to any buildings, erections, or inclosures for the time being thereon, on any days (not exceeding twelve in any one vear) as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, shall be as follows:—

  (a) For admission of every adult to the Reserve, such a sum

ows:

(a) For admission of every adult to the Reserve, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling.

(b) For admission of every person to any stand, building, erection, or inclosure, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

(c) For admission to the Reserve of every saddle-horse, exclusive of rider, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling.

(d) For admission to the Reserve of every carriage, cart, or of Admission to the lessers of every carriage, early of other vehicle (exclusive of passengers) drawn by one horse or other animal, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding Two (c) For admission to the Reserve of every cart, carriage, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers) drawn by two or more horses or other animals, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding Three shillings.

13. No person shall be allowed to exercise or train horses in the Reserve except on payment of the fees specified herender.

13. No person shall be allowed to exercise or train horses in the Reserve except on payment of the fees specified here-under:

For a single trial of a horse, Two shillings and sixpence. For exercising or training any horse for one year, Ten shillings.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or inclosure for the occasion of any sports may be required to deposit any sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, which the Committee of Management may determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or inclosure, and the Committee of Management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or inclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserve, or the buildings, erections, or inclosures for the time being thereon.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1800, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fivo pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
