PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions continued in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation appoint—

WEDNESDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF APRIL NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Shepparton, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Bridgewater, Inglewood, and Shepparton respectively.

SMALL-POX ON THE S.S. "INDIA."

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship *India* has arrived in Victorian waters, and had on board during the voyage a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the Colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williams-town, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and do further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters, shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer.

Articles for Equipment of 4th Contingent, for Defence Department.

The supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Controller of Naval and Military Stores, or any other officer whom he may appoint. An officer may also be appointed to inspect any article in process of manufacture at the factory of the contractor. Delivery to be made at the Ordnance Stores, Barracks, St. Kilda-road, within twenty-one days from the date of the acceptance of the tender, except where otherwise specified; but in the case of saddlery and saddlery appurtenances, one-third of the quantity tendered for must be delivered weekly during the period of the contract.

All articles must be strictly in accordance with samples at the Ordnance Stores.

As regards goods of Victorian manufacture, no subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture of Leather Work, Saddlery Stores, &c., tendered for in this schedule shall not exceed 48 per week, unless the amount annually paid for overtime is allowed by the contractor, and every such person shall be paid at the minimum wage usually paid to skilled workers in the trades to which the various articles respectively belong; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision will be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

OVERCOATS, WATERPROOF, FOR THE POLICE (OF VICTORIAN MANUFACTURE).

(To sample at Tender Board Office.)

The waterproof cloth and taping must be purchased from the Police Department at the prices laid down in the schedule herein, but all other material, including buttons, must be provided by the contractor at his own expense.

No cloth other than that purchased from the Police Department is to be used in the garments, and the contractor will not be allowed to use any material purchased from the department for any private work.

Should any emergency arise which would necessitate either coats or cloaks being required in less time than is provided for under the contract, the Government may obtain them elsewhere than from the contractor without in any way infringing this contract.

Delivery must be made at the Police Depot, St. Kilda-road, within two months from the date of the order, failing which a fine of One shilling (1s.) per garment per day may be enforced at the option of the Tender Board on report from the Chief Commissioner of Police, the amount to be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

The coats and cloaks must be cut and made in accordance with samples at the Tender Board Office, with buttons, canvas, and finishings as per sample—the canvas to run the entire length of facing of garments, to be not less than three (3) inches in width, and sewn to outer edge of garment. The best para rubber solution must be used in sticking down seams, &c. All coats and cloaks must be indelibly marked and numbered as required.

All garments shall be subject to the approval of the Chief Commissioner of Police or such other officer as may be authorized by him.

Any garment not fitting or bad in workmanship will be rejected, and the cost of the material that may be thereby rendered unserviceable for the purpose intended will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; in exceptional cases arrangements may be made for any member of the force to visit the premises of the contractor for the purpose of being measured.

No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor; and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture of the coats and cloaks tendered for in this schedule shall not exceed 48 per week, at a minimum wage for a man of £2 5s. and for a woman of £1 per week respectively; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory (and in each part of the factory where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under this contract. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.



SMALL-POX ON THE S.S. "INDIA."

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steam-ship or vessel *India* arrived in Victorian waters having had on board in the course of her voyage a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean or at the Outer Anchorage off Williams town, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and doth further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the Board of Public Health, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer.

WOOD'S POINT PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid to the secretary when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Orders for interments must be given to the secretary of the cemetery eight hours previous to the interment.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Seven p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten to Four in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the only hours will be from Two to Five.
6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying on payment of the charges set forth in the schedule marked A.
8. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission, and may prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of

any monument which may be preferred to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

12. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owners.

13. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the charge set forth in Schedule B.

14. It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault or tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence or shrubbery, tree or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Cemetery Act in that case made and provided.

15. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

16. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

17. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.

18. No grave to be of a less depth than 6 feet.

19. No burial shall be permitted to take place without a certificate from a registrar of deaths, coroner, or justice of the peace, and such certificate shall be delivered to the sexton before the funeral enters the cemetery.

The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these Regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF CLARENDON.

WE, James Cahir, Henry Bowers, Henry Heather, Kenneth McLennan, and William Austin the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Recreation purposes in the parish of Clarendon, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for sports.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, or roll or throw stones therein.
5. No person shall light any fire in the reserve, or erect any dwelling therein, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
6. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or set apart for plantations of trees or shrubs.
7. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
8. All goats, pigs, and poultry, and all dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, found trespassing on the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for sports, or be permitted to bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail, except on the day for which it is issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any buildings, erections, enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots in the reserve.
10. All persons paying for admission to the reserve, or bringing therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, and, if required, surrender to any gate-keeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand the production or surrender of tickets.
11. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall, together with any horses, carriages, or other vehicles in his possession and care, be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or be in possession of a ticket of admission.
 - (a) Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.
 - (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
 - (c) Trespassing upon any inclosures, plantations, cultivated plots, or any portion of the Reserve set apart for sports, or interfering with or interrupting any person engaged by the authority of the committee of management in carrying out any sports or amusements.
 - (d) Being found in any portion of the reserve or in any building, erection, or inclosure for the time being thereon, and not producing on demand or surrendering if required to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the place wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Committee of Management or any person deputed by it that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to him has been lost.
12. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the Reserve, and to any buildings, erections, or inclosures for the time being thereon, on any days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, shall be as follows :—
 - (a) For admission of every adult to the Reserve, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling.
 - (b) For admission of every person to any stand, building, erection, or inclosure, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.
 - (c) For admission to the Reserve of every saddle-horse, exclusive of rider, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling.
 - (d) For admission to the Reserve of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers) drawn by one horse or other animal, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding Two shillings.

- (e) For admission to the Reserve of every cart, carriage, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers) drawn by two or more horses or other animals, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding Three shillings.

13. No person shall be allowed to exercise or train horses in the Reserve except on payment of the fees specified hereunder :—

For a single trial of a horse, Two shillings and sixpence.

For exercising or training any horse for one year, Ten shillings.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or inclosure for the occasion of any sports may be required to deposit any sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, which the Committee of Management may determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or inclosure, and the Committee of Management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or inclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserve, or the buildings, erections, or inclosures for the time being thereon.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
