BRITISH COMMERCIAL AGENTS IN RUSSIA, SWITZERLAND, THE UNITED STATES, AND CENTRAL AMERICA.

THE subjoined Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, which has been received by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, is published for general information.

Sin,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for general information, the accompanying copy of a Memorandum* from the Foreign Office respecting the appointment of British Commercial Agents in Russia, Switzerland, the United States, and Central America, for an experimental period of two years, and the fees to be charged by Her Majesty's Diplomatic Missions in consideration of services rendered by Commercial Agents in making inquiries for private firms.

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has appointed Mr. Henry Arthur Cooke, Mr. John C. Milligan, Mr. E. Seymour Bell, and Mr. E. H. Melville to be British Commercial Agents in Russia, Switzerland, the United States, and Central America respectively, for an experimental period of two years.

Mr. Cooke's address is—

Malo-Znamenski per House Mishin 2, Noscow.

The head-quarters of the other Commercial Agents have been fixed at Zurich, Chicago, and Guatemala.

The business of the Agents will consist in watching and reporting on the commerce, industries, and products of special districts, and in answering inquiries on commercial subjects.

Individual firms applying for information will have to pay the prescribed fees as hereafter stated.

Communications intended for the Commercial Agents may be addressed to Her Majesty's Minister at Berne or Guatemala, as the case may require, in order that the proper fee may be assessed and levied before the desired inquiry is proceeded with. Simple inquiries can be addressed direct to the Commercial Agent, accompanied by the fee of 5s.

The following is the scale of fees to be charged by Her Majesty's Diplomatic Missions in consideration of services rendered by Commercial Agent, accompanied to Missions in consideration of private firms:—

All fees above 5s. are to be prepaid.

The method employed for levying the fees will be as follows:-In case of an inquiry addressed to the Agent which can be answered forthwith, and for which the lowest fee would be charged, he can reply at once requesting that the sum of 5s. may be sent to the Embasy or Legation. He will transmit to the Mission lists of inquiries so answered in order that the payments may be checked and demanded if not already made.

If the fee has been sent with the inquiry he will remit it to the Embassy or Mission.

In cases of inquiries for which fees of £1 Is, and upwards are to be charged, the Agent will forward the information to the Mission for transmission thence in exchange for the fees which may, according to circumstance, be required before the answer is given.

In cases requiring research or a journey the Agent will report to the Ambassador or Minister, who will decide whether an offer should be made to procure the information, and, if so, on what terms; or whether it should be stated that the information can-



ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of August, 1900.

WHERAS by Division I. of Part I. of the Water Act 1900 the Governor in Council is empowered to make regulations for the election of Commissioners of Waterworks Trusts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutonant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the following regulations for the election of Commissioners of the Elmere Waterworks Trust.

- 1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Elmore Waterworks Trust. "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.
- 2. Period for which Commissioners shall hold office.—The period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.
- 3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, reisgnation, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulations within one mouth after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.
- 4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commissioners.—
 The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 17th day of October, 1900, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shall be held on the 17th day of October in each succeeding triennial year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon any day set apart as a public holiday such election shall be held upon the day next following.
- 5. Voters' List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 6 of the Water Act 1850 in so far as circumstances will admit, on or before the 7th day of September, 1900, by the Secretary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the said election of Commissioners, and shall remain in force and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a fresh voters' list being made out as hereinafter provided.
- 6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a voters' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 6 of the Water Act 1900 which shall, upon approval of the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust, be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing.

 7. Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of sormame, the christian name or names, sunrame, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Huntiy included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.
- In making out such list of voters if the property in respect of which any ratepayer is entitled to vote is only in part within the Waterworks district, then the number of votes of such ratepayer in respect of such property shall be reduced in the proportion which such part bears to the whole property of such retepayer rated in the municipal district.

 8. Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.— Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.— For the purpose of the first election lerein mentioned the Minister shall appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the Chairman of the Trust holding office as such on the day immediately preceding the date of election shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of Chairman of the Trust should become vacant the Commissioners of the Trust should become vacant the Commissioners of the Trust should become vacant the Commissioners of the Trust about the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

 9. Notice of Election.—Nomination of Caudidates—Second Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of Commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the Elmore township, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said township to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein, and any person desirous of becoming a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper, in the form to the Second Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein both his ch

- 10. Qualifications of Commissioners.—No person shall be eligible for election as a Commissioner unless he is liable to be rated under the Water Acts in respect of property within the district of the Trust.

Appeal to Minister from Determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.
- 28. Failure to Elect deemed to create Extraordinary Vacancies—If at any election of Commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the Commissioners eventually elected or appointed to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.
- 29. Expenses of Election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the Trust.
- 30. Penalty for Breach of Regulations.—Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before just ces of the peace.
- 31. Interpretation.—In these Regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

The births of 980 children, viz., 497 boys and 492 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July. The number was by far the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years; and was, moreover, 221 below the average of the month during that period, or 257 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in July numbered 336, viz., 275 of males and 261 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 453, or 55 per cent., as against 77 per cent. in July, 1899, and 95 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 59 smaller than in July, 1899, and was, with one exception, July, 1897, the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years; it was also 86 below the average of July during the last ten years, or 105 below it allowing for the increase of nonulation.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24:37, and of deaths registered to 13:21 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1899 of 26:41 and 14:91 respectively, and during the last ten years of 30:67 and 15:81 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31:27 and 16:80.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 64:8° on the 29th, and the lowest was 30:20° on the 3rd. The mean temperature of the month (47:39) was noarly a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27:05) took place on the 22nd, and the least range (5:5°) on the 3rd. The mean daily range was 13:0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30:462 inches on the 20th, and the lowest was 29:304 inches on the 24th. The mean atmospheric pressure recorded was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on ten days, the amount being 1:07 inches, which was nearly a quarter of an inch lower than in July, 1899, and 1:47 inches below the average of the previous ten years.

Fog occurred on four days during the month.

The mean humidity of the month was '306.

Males contributed 51 per cent. and females 49 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 20 per cent. in July, 1895; 27 per cent. in July, 1897; 22 per cent. in July, 1898; 20 per cent. in July, 1897; 22 per cent. in July, 1898; 70 per cent. in July, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 72, as compared with 113 in July, 1893; 80 in July, 1895; 70 in July, 1897; 82 in July, 1896; 17 in July, 1895; 10 in July, 1893; 88 in July, 1892; 96 in July, 1891; and 118 in July, 1890.

As compared with the corresponding month of the previous year, there was a falling off in the mortality from local diseases by 34, from developmental diseases by 24, from zymotic diseases by 10, and from violence by 6. Deaths from parasitic, dietic, and constitutional diseases as a whole showed but little variation; whilst the only increase which occurred was one of 13 under ill-defined causes. The decrease of 34 under local diseases resulted from decreases of 40, 12, and 8 respectively in the deaths from diseases of the nervous, the respiratory, and the uninary systems counterbalanced by an increase of 20 under diseases of the circulatory system. The principal reductions under the head of developmental diseases consisted of 9 under old age, and 8 under premature birth. Under zymotic diseases, deaths from whooping-cough fell from 13 to 1.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899 and the first seven months of 1900, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality during the month from typhoid was below, but that from diphtheria above,

NUMURKAH PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

N pursuance of the powers vested in them by Act of Parliament, the Trustees of the Nunnrkah Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the secretary, and, if approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A hereto.

3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval.

4. That any order for interment shall be given at the office of the secretary for the trustees eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made if required. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.

5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule C hereto shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dur.

order.

6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the trustees, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone,

slate, or iron.
7. That no coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary 7. That no coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contain the body of a child under twelle years of age, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around the uppermost coffin previously buried in the grave.

8. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the

next rule.

9. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in

with the order.

10. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the said

10. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the said cemetery without a certificate from a Deputy Registrar of Deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the secretary before the funeral enters the cemetery.

11. That the hours fixed for burials shall be from Ten a.m. to Five p.m. on each day throughout the year, and no burial shall be allowed to take place at any other time except by special permission, in writing, of the trustees.

12. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

13. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, centaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner. expense of the owner.

14. That any person desiring to place any inscription of epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy

15. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as

a trespasser.

16. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No bath, caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exceeds them work.

exposed stone work.

17. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal

entrance.

18. That all erections in the cemetery must be made within the exact space allotted for the grave, in connexion with which the erections may be required, and such space shall be regulated or calculated by the plan or survey of the cemetery made on behalf of the trustees, and which may be seen at the office of the secretary during business hours.

19 That a metal tablet shall be placed on each coffin, having thereon a number corresponding to the certificate register number. entrance

20 That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional

number.

20. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment either in said or any other cemetery.

21. That before any such exceptional case shall be dealt with by the trustees, a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and, in the ovent of such application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the Coroners Act 1890, or any amendment thereof, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and airtight coffin prior to removal.

22. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the secretary, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

23. That no children, except those in charge of parents or responsible guardians, will be permitted to enter the cemetery at any time.

responsible guardians, will be permitted to enter the cemetery at any time.

24. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

25. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery nor any fireworks discharged therein.

26. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

27. That a book for recording complaints and suggestions from the public is kept by the secretary at his office.

28. That the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

29. That a plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial, shall be kept at the office of the secretary.

30. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any crection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the Settlement on Lands Act 1893 (57 Vict. No. 1311) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, from time to time set apart and appropriate for the purposes of "village community allotments" any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the Land Act 1830, and may at any time revoke any such Proclamation: And whereas by certain Proclamations as hereunder set forth, made in pursuance of the provisions of the said Part of the said Settlement on Lands Act 1893, certain lands respectively described in such Proclamations were set apart and appropriated for the purposes of village community allotments under the said Part of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke

in part each of such Proclamations; Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby order as follows, viz.:—
ROSEDALE.—The Proclamation bearing date the 23rd October, 1893, by which certain lands situate in the parish of Rosedale, and comprising an area of one thousand two hundred acres, more or less, were, amongst others, set apart and appropriated for the nurposes of village community allotments, is hereby revoked so far only as it relates to the portion of the said lands hereinafter described, viz.:—Five acres two roads, county of Buln Buln, parish of Rosedale, being allotment 14 of section 4.— (1900.V.18865.) (1900. V.18665.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the Land Act 1898, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 9, of the said Land Act 1898, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased. And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may

increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the Land Act 1838 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the first column of the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the Chinese Act 1890 aforesaid, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the fourth column of the said Schedule, that is to say:—
