THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has appointed Mr. Henry Arthur Cooke, Mr. John C. Milligan, Mr. E. Seymour Bell, and Mr. E. H. Melville to be British Commercial Agents in Russia, Switzerland, the United States, and Central America respectively, for an experimental period of two years.

Mr. Cooke's address is—

Moscow.

The head-quarters of the other Commercial Agents have been fixed at Zurich, Chicago, and Guatemala.

The business of the Agents will consist in watching and reporting on the commerce, industries, and products of special districts, and in answering inquiries on commercial subjects.

Individual firms applying for information will have to pay the prescribed fees as hereafter stated.

Communications intended for the Commercial Agents may be addressed to Her Majesty's Ambassador at St. Petersburg or Washington, or Her Majesty's Minister at Berne or Guatemala, as the case may require, in order that the proper fee may be assessed and levied before the desired inquiry is proceeded with.

Simple inquiries can be addressed direct to the Commercial Agent, accompanied by the fee of 5s.

together with actual expenses of locomotion.

All fees above 5s. are to be prepaid.

The method employed for levying the fees will be as follows:—

In case of an inquiry addressed to the Agent which can be answered forthwith, and for which the lowest fee would be charged, he can reply at once requesting that the sum of 5s. may be sent to the Embassy or Legation. He will transmit to the Mission lists of inquiries so answered in order that the payments may be checked and demanded if not already made.

If the fee has been sent with the inquiry he will remit it to the Embassy or Mission.

In cases of inquiries for which fees of £1 Is. and upwards are to be charged, the Agent will forward the information to the Mission for transmission thence in exchange for the fees which may, according to circumstances, be required before the answer is given.

In cases requiring research or a journey the Agent will report to the Ambassador or Minister, who will decide whether an offer should be made to procure the information, and, if so, on what terms; or whether it should be stated that the information cannot be procured.

VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT DEBENTURES (64 VICT. No. 1659).

PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST PAYABLE IN MELBOURNE,
TRANSFERABLE ON DELIVERY.

TENDERS will be received at the Revenue and Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, until Noon of Tuesday, the 21st instant, for the whole or any part of the Victorian Government Debentures to be issued under the authority of the *Railway Loan Act 1900* for the sum of Five hundred thousand pounds secured upon the Consolidated Revenue of Victoria.

The Debentures will be repayable on 1st July, 1930 (but may be redeemed after 21 years upon twelve months' previous notice), and will carry interest from the 1st July, 1900.

The Debentures will, at the option of tenderer, be issued for amounts of Ten, Fifty, One hundred, Five hundred, or One thousand pounds.

The interest will be at the rate of 3 per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly, on the 1st January and 1st July in each year, the first half-year's interest being payable on the 1st January, 1901.

Each tender must specify the number of Debentures tendered for, the denomination thereof, the rate per £100, amount of tender, and the amount of Debentures tendered for, and must be accompanied by a deposit equal to Ten per cent. of the nominal amount of the Debentures tendered for in cash or bank draft, which will be refunded if tender is not accepted. Successful tenderers when paying the balance will be required to pay the interest accrued to date of payment.

The envelope containing the tender must be addressed to the Treasurer, Treasury, Melbourne, and inscribed "Tender for Government Debentures," and may be deposited in the Tender-box in the Revenue and Pay Office, at the Treasury, Melbourne. Tenders will be opened by the Treasurer in the presence of such of the tenderers as may desire to attend at the Board Room at the Public Offices, Treasury Gardens, at Noon on Tuesday the 21st instant, and the result will be announced forthwith.

The Government will not necessarily accept any tender.

Successful tenderers will be allowed to pay the balance, together with accrued interest, up till Noon of Wednesday, the 21st November, on which date the Debentures will be delivered to the successful tenderers. The deposit will be forfeited if the balance be not then paid.

The minimum price will be £96. Brokerage of 1/4 per cent. on face value will be allowed to members of recognised Stock Exchanges of Victoria.

Forms of tender may be obtained on application to the Under-Treasurer, Melbourne, or to the Secretary to the Tender Board, at the Treasury, Melbourne.

The decision of the Government will be made known on the day following that on which the tenders are opened.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Visà voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

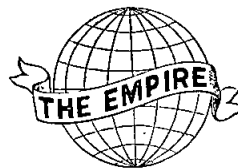

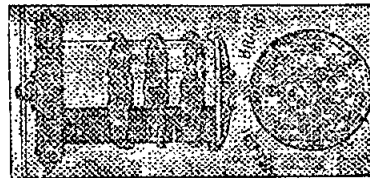

WHEREAS by Division I. of Part I. of the *Water Act 1900* the Governor in Council is empowered to make regulations for the election of Commissioners of Waterworks Trusts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid make the following regulations for the election of Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust.

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Elmore Waterworks Trust. "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply.

2. Period for which Commissioners shall hold office.—The period for which the Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years, and shall date on and from the date of election.

3. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—Should any vacancy in the office of Commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, the same shall be filled up by election under these regulations within one month after the vacancy has occurred, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of Commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the Commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

4. Date of first and subsequent Election of Commissioners.—The first election of Commissioners under these regulations shall be held on the 17th day of October, 1900, and the ordinary election of Commissioners shall be held on the 17th day of October in each succeeding triennial year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon any day set apart as a public holiday such election shall be held upon the day next following.

5. Voters' List to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of Commissioners a voters' list shall be prepared in like manner to that provided by section 6 of the *Water Act 1890* in so far as circumstances will admit, on or before the 7th day of September, 1900, by the Secretary to the Trust, certified by him as correct, and such list shall be the list of voters for the said election of Commissioners, and shall remain in force and shall be used at any subsequent election of Commissioners that may be held prior to a fresh voters' list being made out as hereinafter provided.

6. Voters' List to be prepared annually.—Before the last day of February in each year a voters' list shall be made out in the manner prescribed by section 6 of the *Water Act 1890* which shall, upon approval of the Commissioners under the common seal of the Trust, be the list of voters for the election of Commissioners for the twelve months next ensuing.

7. Form of Voters' List.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every ratepayer within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Huntly included within the district of the Waterworks Trust.

In making out such list of voters if the property in respect of which any ratepayer is entitled to vote is only in part within the Waterworks district, then the number of votes of such ratepayer in respect of such property shall be reduced in the proportion which such part bears to the whole property of such ratepayer rated in the municipal district.

8. Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purpose of the first election herein mentioned the Minister shall appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the Chairman of the Trust holding office as such on the day immediately preceding the date of election shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of Chairman of the Trust should become vacant the Commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

9. Notice of Election.—Nomination of Candidates—Second Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of Commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the Elmore township, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said township to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein, and any person desirous of becoming a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper, in the form of the Second Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein both his christian and surname, together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, as well as by the candidate. And no person who shall not

have been so nominated shall, within the provisions of these Regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of Commissioners.

10. Qualifications of Commissioners.—No person shall be eligible for election as a Commissioner unless he is liable to be rated under the Water Acts in respect of property within the district of the Trust.

11. Where Number of Candidates does not exceed Number of Commissioners to be elected.—If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of Commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

12. Where Number of Candidates exceeds the Number of Commissioners to be elected.—Third Schedule. Notice of Poll. Hours of Polling.—If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of Commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause the ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and shall also give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the Elmore township, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such Commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said township as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eight o'clock in the forenoon, and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

13. Retirement of Candidates before polling day.—If, at any election, after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid, any candidate for such election, and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid, are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the Elmore township a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall, on the day appointed for the election, declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and, if such papers are already printed, shall erase such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

14. Polling booth may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

15. Returning Officer to preside at Polling Booth.—The returning officer or his deputy shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.

16. Scrutineers may be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling booth, and the said returning officer or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.

17. Pencils to be provided.—The returning officer or his deputy shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

18. Mode of voting where Voter is illiterate.—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter, who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

19. Ballot-papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number, not opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

20. Informal Ballot-papers.—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of Commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

21. What Question may be asked.—At any election of Commissioners the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

“Are you the person whose name appears as (A. B.) in the roll now in force for this Trust, being enrolled therein in respect of property described to be situated in (here specify the street or other place described in the roll)?”

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

22. False Answer, Polling Twice, and Personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling booth after having received a ballot-paper, without having deposited the same in the ballot-box, as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

23. Result of Polling, how ascertained.—Immediately on the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll, publicly declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected Commissioners of the Trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall determine by lot the candidate to hold office.

24. Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall forthwith after the declaration of the poll indorse with a description of the contents thereof, and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust.

25. Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question, in writing, to the Minister, who shall decide the same; and such decision shall be final and binding.

26. Questions arising upon subsequent election to be determined by Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the Commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no Commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a Commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the Commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

27. Appeal to Minister from Determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

28. Failure to Elect deemed to create Extraordinary Vacancies.—If at any election of Commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the Commissioners eventually elected or appointed to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

29. Expenses of Election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the Trust.

30. Penalty for Breach of Regulations.—Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

31. Interpretation.—In these Regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

WHEREAS by section 5 of the *Water Act 1900* it is enacted that where, under section 26 of the *Water Act 1890*, the councillors of any riding of any municipal district, together with any other person or persons, have been appointed by the Governor in Council to be the Commissioners of a Waterworks Trust for a Waterworks District, the Governor in Council, upon the petition of a majority of the ratepayers in so much of any municipal district or districts as is within the Waterworks District of such Trust, may, if he thinks fit, declare that the persons holding office as Commissioners of such Trust by virtue of their office as municipal councillors or by appointment by the Governor in Council shall, from a day to be named in such Order, cease to be Commissioners of such Waterworks Trust, and shall be succeeded by Commissioners elected for such Trust.

And it is further provided by the aforesaid section that the Governor in Council may, by the same or any subsequent Order, direct that any number of Commissioners stated in such Order shall, within a time specified in such Order, and from time to time, be elected in such manner as may be prescribed by regulations made by the Governor in Council.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 2nd March, 1891, a certain Waterworks Trust, known as the Elmore Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and the Councillors for the Northern Riding of the Shire of Huntly municipal district and three other persons were in and by such Order appointed to be the Commissioners of such Trust.

And whereas a petition has been signed by a majority of the ratepayers within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Huntly included within the Waterworks District of the said Trust, praying that the Councillors for the Northern Riding of the Shire of Huntly municipal district and the three other persons appointed Commissioners of the Trust shall cease to hold office, and that they be succeeded by Commissioners to be elected by ratepayers within the aforesaid portion of the said shire.

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the provisions of the said *Water Act 1900*, doth hereby declare that the persons holding office as Commissioners of the said Elmore Waterworks Trust by virtue of their office as municipal councillors, and the three other persons appointed Commissioners of such Trust, shall, after the 16th day of October, 1900, cease to hold office as such Commissioners accordingly, and shall after such day be succeeded by six Commissioners, to be elected for such Trust on the 17th day of October, 1900, in the manner prescribed by regulations made for that purpose, and also for the purpose of conducting subsequent elections.

And the Honorable Alfred Richard Outtrim, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines and Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 291 of the *Water Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may, for any of the purposes of the Board of Land and Works mentioned in the said Act and in favour of the Board, grant any rights or powers to or confer any estate or interest on the Board in the same manner as the Governor in Council may under any Division of Part III. of the said *Water Act 1890* do with regard to Trusts: And whereas by section 231 of the aforesaid Act it is provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time by any Order in Council order that all or any of the lakes, lagoons, swamps, marshes, rivers, creeks, and water-courses situated within the district of any Trust shall be under the exclusive or partial control and management of such Trust, and shall publish such Order in the *Government Gazette*; and upon such publication such Trust shall, notwithstanding anything contained in the *Local Government Act 1890*, from and after the date of its first meeting next after the date of the publication of such Order in Council, have the exclusive or partial control and management of all lakes, lagoons, swamps, marshes, rivers, creeks, and water-courses specified in such Order: And whereas it is deemed necessary that the exclusive control and management of that portion of the Broken River, and also those portions of the Broken Creek, Yabba Yabba Creek, Boosey Creek, and Nine-mile Creek, severally described hereunder, shall be under the exclusive control and management of the Board of Land and Works, viz.:-

Broken River.

From the National Works, known as Casey's Weir, above the effluence of Broken Creek to the National Works, known as Gowangardie Weir, and from thence to the junction of the Broken River and the Goulburn River.

Broken Creek.

From the point where the National Channel from Casey's Weir joins the said creek to the western boundary of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust District.

Yabba Yabba or Major Creek.

From its effluence from the Broken Creek at Hall's Weir to the south boundary of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust District, including the constructed channels connecting portions thereof.

Boosey or Back Creek.

And the constructed channels connecting or defining the same from the point of offtake on the Broken Creek at Bailey's Weir to the south boundary of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust District.

Nine-mile Creek.

From its effluence from the Broken Creek at Katandra Weir to the west boundary of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust District.

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the Broken River, Broken Creek, Yabba Yabba Creek, Boosey Creek, and Nine-mile Creek as herein described shall be under the exclusive control and management of the Board of Lands and Works.

And the Honorable Alfred Richard Outtrim, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines and Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Renalla has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Taminick in the said shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):-

No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Colac has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a road in the parishes of Barwongmoong and Moomowroong in the said shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the roads defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):-

The births of 989 children, viz., 497 boys and 492 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July. The number was by far the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years; and was, moreover, 221 below the average of the month during that period, or 237 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in July numbered 536, viz., 275 of males and 261 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 453, or 85 per cent., as against 77 per cent. in July, 1899, and 95 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 59 smaller than in July, 1899, and was, with one exception, July, 1897, the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years; it was also 86 below the average of July during the last ten years, or 105 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24.37, and of deaths registered to 13.21 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1899 of 26.41 and 14.91 respectively, and during the last ten years of 30.67 and 15.81 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31.27 and 16.30.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 64.8° on the 29th, and the lowest was 30.2° on the 3rd. The mean temperature of the month (47.3°) was nearly a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (22.6°) took place on the 22nd, and the least range (5.5°) on the 31st. The mean daily range was 13.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.462 inches on the 20th, and the lowest was 29.304 inches on the 24th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.907 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on ten days, the amount being 1.07 inches, which was nearly a quarter of an inch lower than in July, 1899, and 1.47 inches below the average of the previous ten years.

Fog occurred on four days during the month.

The mean humidity of the month was .806.

Males contributed 51 per cent. and females 49 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 20 per cent. to that mortality, as against 25 per cent. in July, 1899; 25 per cent. in July, 1898; 20 per cent. in July, 1897; 20 per cent. in July, 1896; 27 per cent. in July, 1895; and 27 per cent. in July, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 72, as compared with 119 in July, 1899. The rate of infantile mortality was exceedingly low, being only 73 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 113 in July, 1899; 100 in July, 1898; 70 in July, 1897; 82 in July, 1896; 117 in July, 1895; 100 in July, 1894; 131 in July, 1893; 88 in July, 1892; 96 in July, 1891; and 118 in July, 1890.

Eighty-five persons—as against 70 in July, 1899—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, an accountant, aged 75, died of hemiplegia; a gardener and three females, each aged 75, of heart disease;

a gardener, aged 75, of bronchitis; a contractor, aged 75, of fracture of the leg, the result of a fall; a groom, aged 76, of epilepsy; a gentleman, aged 76, of dilatation of the heart; a gardener, aged 76, of aneurism; a labourer, aged 76, of asthma; a commission agent, aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of Bright's disease; a gentleman and a clerk, each aged 76, of cystitis; a male, of no occupation, aged 76, of disease of the kidneys; two females, each aged 77, of cancer; a shipwright, aged 77, of asthma; a labourer, aged 77, of pneumonia; a plasterer, aged 77, of cystitis; a female, aged 77, of cellulitis; another, aged 78, of influenza; a farmer, aged 78, of hepatic cirrhosis; a hawk, aged 78, of nephritis; a greengrocer, aged 79, of cerebral hemorrhage; an Imperial army pensioner, aged 79, of hemiplegia; a pensioner, aged 79, of epilepsy; a female, aged 79, of nephritis; a contractor, aged 79, of cystitis; a gentleman, aged 80, of paralysis; a female, aged 80, of mitral disease; a farmer, aged 80, of bronchitis; a gentleman and a female, each aged 80, of bronchitis; two labourers, each aged 80, of pneumonia and cystitis respectively; a male, of no occupation, aged 81, of cancer; a carpenter and a nurse, each aged 81, of endocarditis; two females, each aged 81, of heart disease; an engineer, aged 81, of cirrhosis of the kidneys; an accountant, aged 81, of carbuncle; a butcher and a female, each aged 82, of bronchitis; a female, aged 83, of softening of the brain; a gentleman, aged 83, and a female, aged 84, of pericarditis; a cabinetmaker, aged 84, of syncope; a female, aged 85, of embolism; a gentleman, aged 85, of bronchitis; a miner, aged 85, of pneumonia; a male, of no occupation, aged 86, of insanity; a female, aged 86, of oedema of lungs; two females, each aged 87, of heart disease and bronchitis respectively; a coach-builder, aged 87, of cystitis; a female, aged 88, of valvular disease of the heart; two females, each aged 89, of embolism and bronchitis respectively; a sculptor, aged 90, of pneumonia; a female, aged 92, of erysipelas; another, aged 94, of heart disease; three females, aged 75, 77, and 77 respectively, two males, of no occupation, aged 78 and 79 respectively, four females, aged 79, 80, 80, and 82 respectively, a labourer, aged 83, another and two females, each aged 84, a labourer, aged 87, a gamekeeper, aged 88, a tailor, aged 89, and a female, aged 99, of old age.

Seventeen of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 23 in July, 1899—were from external causes, of which 15 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A canvasser, aged 55, was passed over by a tram-car; a labourer, aged 25, by a dray; a carpenter, aged 40, died of injuries, the result of a fall from a window; a coppersmith, aged 50, of hemorrhage and rupture of the brain, caused by a fall from a house; a female child, aged 2, of fracture of the skull; a female, aged 29, of laceration of the brain, and a contractor, aged 75, of fracture of the leg, the result in each case of a fall; a boy, aged 4, and a clerk, aged 39, of burns; a boilermaker, aged 55, was drowned by falling into the River Yarra; a gardener, aged 56, a male, of no occupation, aged 60, and a dealer, aged 65, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a plasterer, aged 38, was suffocated by vomited matter getting into air passages; and a new born male infant died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a new born male infant, who was found dead, the cause being ascertained to be suffocation (probably murder). The suicidal death was that of a baker, aged 22, who shot himself.

One hundred and forty-eight deaths, or 28 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—60 in the Melbourne, 12 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 9 in the Women's, 9 in the Children's, 6 in the Homœopathic, and 9 in the Austin Hospitals; 7 in the Metropolitan and 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 12 in the Immigrants' Home; 7 in the Benevolent Asylum; 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 1 in the Protestant Refuge; 3 in the Melbourns Gaol; and 1 in Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 107, of which 56, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 51, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 72 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five. A falling off of 34 in the case of male infants, but of only 10 in the case of female children occurred, as compared with the corresponding month of 1899.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 429. Of these 219, or 51 per cent., were males, and 210, or 49 per cent., were females; 13 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 21 were between twenty and twenty-five, 25 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 30 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 18 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 37 were between sixty and sixty-five, 42 were between sixty-five and seventy, 33 were between seventy and seventy-five, 40 were between seventy-five and eighty, 27 were between eighty and eighty-five, 14 were between eighty-five and ninety, 3 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of 99.

N.B.—The figures in parentheses represent the numbers in the corresponding month of the preceding year.

As compared with the corresponding month of the previous year, there was a falling off in the mortality from local diseases by 34, from developmental diseases by 24, from zymotic diseases by 10, and from violence by 6. Deaths from parasitic, dietetic, and constitutional diseases as a whole showed but little variation; whilst the only increase which occurred was one of 13 under ill-defined causes. The decrease of 34 under local diseases resulted from decreases of 40, 12, and 8 respectively in the deaths from diseases of the nervous, the respiratory, and the urinary systems, counterbalanced by an increase of 20 under diseases of the circulatory system. The principal reductions under the head of developmental diseases consisted of 9 under old age, and 8 under premature birth. Under zymotic diseases, deaths from whooping-cough fell from 13 to 1.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1899 and the first seven months of 1900, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality during the month from typhoid was below, but that from diphtheria above, the average.

NUMURKAH PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them by Act of Parliament, the Trustees of the Numurkah Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the secretary, and, if approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A hereto.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval.
4. That any order for interment shall be given at the office of the secretary for the trustees eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made if required. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule C hereto shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the trustees, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
7. That no coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contain the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around the uppermost coffin previously buried in the grave.
8. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
9. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
10. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the said cemetery without a certificate from a Deputy Registrar of Deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the secretary before the funeral enters the cemetery.
11. That the hours fixed for burials shall be from Ten a.m. to Five p.m. on each day throughout the year, and no burial shall be allowed to take place at any other time except by special permission, in writing, of the trustees.
12. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
13. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

14. That any person desiring to place any inscription of epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

15. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

16. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No bath, caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone work.

17. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance.

18. That all erections in the cemetery must be made within the exact space allotted for the grave, in connexion with which the erections may be required, and such space shall be regulated or calculated by the plan or survey of the cemetery made on behalf of the trustees, and which may be seen at the office of the secretary during business hours.

19. That a metal tablet shall be placed on each coffin, having thereon a number corresponding to the certificate register number.

20. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment either in said or any other cemetery.

21. That before any such exceptional case shall be dealt with by the trustees, a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and, in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Act 1890*, or any amendment thereof, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and airtight coffin prior to removal.

22. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the secretary, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

23. That no children, except those in charge of parents or responsible guardians, will be permitted to enter the cemetery at any time.

24. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

25. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery nor any fireworks discharged therein.

26. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

27. That a book for recording complaints and suggestions from the public is kept by the secretary at his office.

28. That the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

29. That a plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial, shall be kept at the office of the secretary.

30. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the
Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the
area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 3, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the
area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted
that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so
situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of
Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot
legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may

increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
