PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare, that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act for the prohibition of the exportation of Arms Ammunition and certain other Articles to China.”

PORT CURTIS.—EXHIBITION LIGHTS, SOUTH CHANNEL, AND CHANGED POSITION, GATCOMBE HEAD LIGHTHOUSE.

REFERRING to Notice No. 11, issued from this office on the 6th July last, notice is hereby given that on and after the 8th August, the South Channel into Port Curtis will be lighted for navigation by night, and the light from Gatcombe Head will be exhibited from the new tower erected 450 feet N. by E. from the old structure.

A description of the new lights has already been given in Notice No. 11, and the directions for their use are as follow:—

SOUTH CHANNEL.

By Day.—Vessels bound into the Port of Gladstone, and using the South Channel by day, will bring the leading light beacons, near the Boyne River, in line S. 75° W. before the Jenny Lind Bank buoy is reached; continue with them in line until South Trees Point comes in line with Scrubby Mountain N.W. by W. ½ W., then haul up for these marks, keeping them in line, and passing two red buoys on the starboard hand, until abreast of the floating lightboat (at the main entrance of the North Channel), then steer N. 55° W. until abreast of the Black Beacon (marking the limit of the shoal water E.S.E. from South Trees Point), then change course to N. 79° W., passing South Trees Point at a distance of about three cables, and two red buoys on the starboard hand; after the second red buoy is passed (marking the Rich Rock) haul down for the jetty.

By Night.—Vessels entering the South Channel at night will get on the line of leading lights near the Boyne River before Bustard Head Light bears E.S.E. With the leading lights in line bearing S. 75° W. stand in until the leading lights on

Gatcombe Head come into line bearing N. 55° W., when follow these leads until East Point Light is obscured, or until the main light on Gatcombe Head opens out. Then steer N. 69° W. to pass about two cables to the westward of the lightboat marking the inner entrance of North Channel; after passing the lightboat proceed as in directions given for North Channel at night.

NORTH CHANNEL.

By Day.—Same as at present.

By Night.—Bring Gatcombe Head Light to bear S.W. by W. ½ W., and steer in on this course until East Point Light opens out, then haul down S. by W. until Oyster Rock Light comes in sight, then steer to pass about 1¼ cables from it, taking care to avoid the shoal bank lying off the land between Settlement Point and Gatcombe Head. After passing the Oyster Rock Light, bring it and Gatcombe Head Light slightly open to the westward and steer to pass the floating white light close on the starboard hand.

A vessel when passing the floating white light will be in the main channel, and a N.W. by W. ¼ W. course should be steered up the harbor until the small light at the pilot's cottage at Gatcombe Head opens out on an E. by S. ¼ S. bearing, when a vessel may be kept away, being clear of the elbow of the bank and of South Trees Point while the light is in sight.

Before rounding South Trees Point the light at the foot of Auckland Point will be seen. Keep the light open and steer to pass it at a cable's length, and after it changes to red continue until the two red beacon lights are in line, when haul up to enter the creek.

Since the tides run with a velocity of from 1¼ to 2½ knots an hour, due caution will have to be observed and a proper allowance made for tidal influence when navigating this channel.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificates of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

I, A. B., a registered land surveyor of the colony of _____ hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ and that he is fully competent to conduct surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

9. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.**Mathematics.**

Trigonometry plane and spherical, geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurements of heights, surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

Levelling, &c.

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.

Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:—

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JULY, 1900.

THE births of 75 boys and 58 girls, or in all of 133 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of July. Of these 56 occurred in Ballarat East, 60 in Ballarat West, 14 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 9 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 105, viz., 58 of boys and 47 of girls.

The deaths registered in July numbered 54, viz., 37 of males and 17 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 79. In June the recorded deaths numbered 75; in July, 1899, they numbered 68; in July, 1898, they numbered 73; in July, 1897, they numbered 55; in July, 1896, they numbered 70; in July, 1895, they numbered 73; in July, 1894, they numbered 67; in July, 1893, they numbered 67; in July, 1892, they numbered 72; in July, 1891, they numbered 37; and in July, 1890, they numbered 65.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

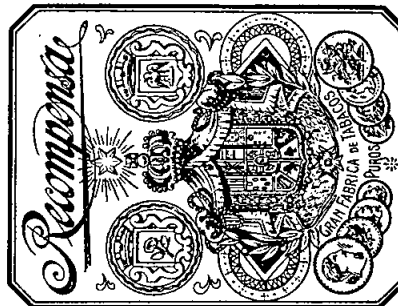

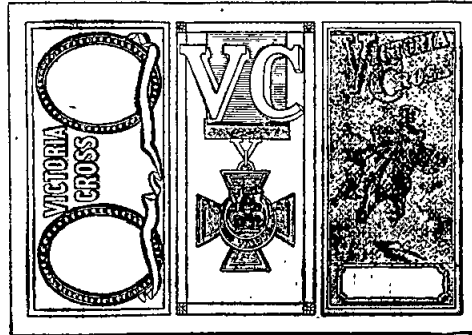

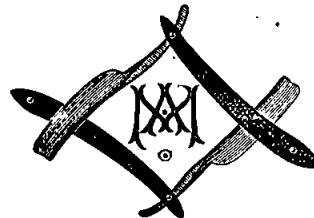

HALF-HOLIDAY REGULATION IN PARTS OF THE SHIRE OF BALLAN.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of August, 1900.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, dated the 2nd day of July, 1900, the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts* which relate to shops were extended to the whole of the shops in the Townships of Blackwood and Red Hill and the Village of Bayup (Barry's Reef), in the Shire of Ballan, and within that part of the said shire contained within the following boundaries, namely:—Commencing at the junction of the Whipstick Creek with the Lerderberg River; thence westerly by the said river to a point due north of the south-west angle of allotment 49, at Simmons' Reef; thence south by a line to the Back Creek; and thence easterly by that creek and northerly by the Whipstick Creek to the commencing point: And whereas by the said *Factories and Shops Acts* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, closing all shops other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, or all shops of any particular class within such district on one specified day in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council, and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers other than those mentioned in the said Fourth Schedule, or of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected, as the case may be: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded

praying that in the said parts of the said Shire of Ballan all shops, other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* aforesaid, shall be closed on Thursday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers, other than those mentioned in the said Fourth Schedule, within the said parts of the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Acts* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, requiring all shops other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* to close before the hours mentioned in the said *Factories and Shops Acts*, and for fixing the hours for the closing of such shops at the hours specified in section 46 of the said *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, where by any by-law shops of any particular class have been permitted to keep open after the hours specified in the said section 46, provided that in either case a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as being signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers keeping shops other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule aforesaid: And whereas by a by-law published in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th March, 1893, certain classes of shops not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* aforesaid, in the Borough of Inglewood, are permitted to keep open after the hours specified in section 46 of the said Act: And whereas a petition has been addressed to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, praying that in the Municipal District of the Borough of Inglewood all shops (other than Fourth Schedule shops) shall be required to be closed for the evening on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from the hour of Six o'clock, and on Saturday from the hour of Ten o'clock in each and every week: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers keeping shops (other than Fourth Schedule shops) in the said district: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

All shops in the municipal district of the Borough of Inglewood (other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*) shall be closed for the evening on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from the hour of Six o'clock, and on Saturday from the hour of Ten o'clock in each and every week.

REGULATION.—STAMPING OF FURNITURE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of August, 1900.

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Acts* it is amongst other things enacted that all furniture manufactured or prepared either wholly or partly in Victoria shall, before being sent out of or removed from the building, premises, or place in which it is so manufactured or prepared, be stamped with a stamp of an indelible permanent ink, or stain, or impression, and that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the

Government Gazette, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for prescribing where the stamp shall be placed on any class or kind of furniture: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

STAMPING OF FURNITURE.

On the classes or kinds of furniture mentioned in the Schedule hereunder the Stamp which by the Factories and Shops Acts is directed to be stamped on furniture shall be placed where specified opposite the name of each such class or kind of furniture respectively in such Schedule.
