ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to authorize the construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Newtown to Pitfield."

"An Act to sanction the acquisition by the State of certain land in the County of Borung known as the Walmer Estate."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

for a period of eight weeks from the 24th September, 1900, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twelve females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twelve females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

SHIRE OF TOWONG.

BY-LAW No. 7, UNDER THE *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Towong, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. Repeal of By-law No. 3.—By-law No. 3 of the Shire of Towong, made under the *Health Act 1890*, shall be and hereby is repealed.
2. Premises kept so as not to be a nuisance.—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.
3. The ordinary system of open pans for night-soil shall be abolished.
4. Double-pan service.—In lieu of such ordinary system of pans every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be fitted with air-tight lids, and the pans removed for cleansing at least once a week.
5. Construction of privies.—The owner or occupier of any building, which, by the provisions of the *Health Act* or any by-law made under it, should be provided with a privy, shall erect a substantial building suitable for the pan system herein adopted, the floor of which privy shall at no point be less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof. Every privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination of at least half-an-inch to the foot towards the door or other opening for removal of pan, and shall be provided with stops or bars, so that in placing the pan the centre of same may be readily adjusted under the centre of the opening of seat, and the space under the seat must not allow of a larger interval than one and a half inches between the pan and the seat. Every privy shall be provided with a suitable vessel to contain deodorizing material.
6. Use of deodorant.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every privy belonging thereto a supply of such disinfectants or deodorants as the council may from time to time direct, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such privy to be, immediately on the deposit

thereof, sprinkled with a quantity of such disinfectants or deodorants sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

7. Boxes for house refuse.—Every occupier of a house or premises shall collect all dust, mud, ashes, dead leaves, rubbish, filth, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on such premises, and for the temporary deposit of such refuse shall provide and keep on the premises one or more covered boxes, sufficient to contain the collections of one week. The dimensions of each box shall not exceed 3 cubic feet, and in weight, when filled, 112 lbs., so that the same may, with the contents thereof, be readily and conveniently movable by one man. Every occupier or person having control of premises shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as convenient in some such box or receptacle.

8. Removal of night-soil.—No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil or house refuse, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons, save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the council of the said shire, and the pans and boxes shall be removed and emptied as the council of the said shire shall direct.

9. Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall, once at least in every week, and more frequently if directed, remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon, and in case of default of such occupier the council may remove the same at the expense of such occupier or (where there is no occupier) of the owner of the premises.

10. Power to use refuse as manure.—Nothing contained in the foregoing sections 8 and 9 shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or any other refuse matter (excepting night-soil), produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, provided that the same be not so removed or used as to contravene any by-law of the council, or as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

11. Disposal of refuse matter.—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, dead leaves, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, soil, night-soil, urine, or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health; and no person shall place or deposit any such filth or rubbish in any public drain or in any position from which it may be carried to the drains by a flow of water or other liquid.

12. Removal of offal.—Every occupier of any premises on which there may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within 24 hours.

13. Power of council to make a charge.—The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, house refuse, and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such service, and for pans, boxes, or other receptacles supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

14. Extent of application of by-law.—This By-law, No. 7, shall apply to and have operation within an area the boundaries of which are described as follow:—Commencing in the parish of Bulloah, at the junction of Tallangatta Creek with the Mitta Mitta River; thence up the Tallangatta Creek to the intersection of the northern boundary of allotment 70, section A; thence by that boundary to the south-west corner of allotment 70a, section A; thence by the western boundary of allotment 70a to the north-west corner of that allotment and the one-chain road; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the road and a continuation of the bearing of same to the western boundary of allotment 72b, section A; thence by that boundary to the Tallangatta Creek; thence by the creek north-easterly to a point north of the north-east corner of allotment 1b, section 2, parish of Wagra; thence south to the north-east corner of allotment 1b, and following the eastern boundary of the same allotment and a continuation of the bearing of such boundary to a point east of the north-east corner of allotment 2, section 4; thence to that corner and by the bearing of the northern boundary of allotment 2 to the Mitta Mitta River; thence by the river to the point of commencement.

15. Penalties.—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than Five shillings for every day such offence is continued after any conviction.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF WANNON.

By-Law No. 9.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers for the Shire of Wannon, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, do hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

1. Interpretation of terms in the construction and for the purpose of this by-law.—The following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging houses, or other building or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any lane, road, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. Removal of refuse from houses.—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in the case of default of such occupier the council may remove the same.

4. Receptacles for house refuse.—Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box, or some other covered receptacle, for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited, as soon as conveniently may be, in some such box or receptacle.

5. Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to 2 cubic yards, or, at least, once in every week, and in the case of default of such occupier, the council may remove the same.

6. Power to use refuse as manure.—Nothing hereinbefore contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed or to be used as manure on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used to contravene any by-law of the council, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. Removal of refuse from places where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever, shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matter, and all waste products of such manufactory from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every 48 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom. And if any such occupier or other such person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid the same may be removed by the council.

8. Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.—Every occupier, licensee, or other person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith with commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in the proportion of 1 lb. to the gallon, or some other sufficient deodorizer sufficiently effectual to deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within 48 hours after such blood is shed.

9. Removal of offal.—Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within 24 hours.

10. Construction of privies.—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof do not exceed 5 cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

11. Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal,

lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil to be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficiently and thoroughly and effectually to deodorize the contents of such pan or receptacle for night-soil.

12. Emptying receptacles for night-soil.—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises, once at least in every week, shall empty or cleanse or cause to be emptied or cleansed every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

13. Removal of night-soil to be by properly constructed conveyances.—No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of a conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

14. Hours within which night-soil may be removed.—No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Ten and Twelve o'clock at night, and not until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

15. Construction of cesspools.—Every cesspool shall be furnished with a water-tight cover or roof, and every cesspool which shall be formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be constructed with water-tight walls or sides which project on all sides at least 6 inches above the surface of the ground.

16. Emptying of cesspools.—Every occupier of premises, and every person having the management or control of premises on which there shall be any cesspool, shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

17. Times within which cesspools may be emptied.—No person shall empty, or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except between the hours of Ten and Twelve o'clock at night, nor until such contents have been properly deodorized, and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any cesspool shall remove or cause to be removed the contents thereof as soon as the same is emptied.

18. Conveyances by which cesspools may be emptied.—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse or offensive matter, except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

19. Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, offal, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place, so as to be a nuisance to any person, or injurious to health.

20. Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere, to be covered with earth.—Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall, immediately on deposit thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, with a layer of earth not less than 6 inches in thickness.

21. Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.—No person shall empty, or cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, so that the contents thereof may find their way into any drain or sewer.

22. Prevention of pollution of water.—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in, or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any person using such water, or drink, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

23. Cesspools not to be emptied into water used for drinking or domestic purposes.—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used, or likely to be used for any dairy, or so that the contents, or any portion of the contents thereof, may find its way into any such water.

24. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or likely to find its way, into any water used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized, and removed by the owner within one week of notice given by the council, or by one of its officers.

25. Keeping of animals.—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

26. Animals not to be so kept as to pollute water.—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used, or likely to be used, in any dairy so as to endanger the health of any person using such water, or drink, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

27. Supply of water to slaughter-houses.—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

28. Drainage of new buildings.—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundation thereof and the ground over which such building is to be placed to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soaks or damp shall lodge there.

29. Drainage of existing buildings.—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building, and every tenant of a building under lease of which fourteen years or upwards are unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

30. Registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the 1st day of March in every year, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Wannon Shire Council an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

31. Upon receipt of every such application the secretary for the Wannon Shire Council shall indorse the same, with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and shall file the same, and enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for such purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

32. Milk shops and stores to be kept clean.—Every person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairymen shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation or under his management or control, and every vessel used by him for containing milk for sale to be kept thoroughly clean.

33. Dairymen, &c., to report disease to the Health Officer.—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the Health Officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

34. By-laws numbered 2 and 3, as made by the Wannon Shire Council, are hereby repealed.

35. Extent of application of by-law.—This By-law, number 9, and numbered by sections 1 to 36, shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Wannon Shire Council.

36. Penalties.—If any person commit a breach of any of the foregoing sections of this by-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only, not being less than Five shillings, of such penalty to be paid, and every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by these by-laws or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF WANNON.

BY-LAW No. 10.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers for the Shire of Wannon, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, do hereby make the by-law following, that is to say:—

1. Interpretation of terms.—In the construction and for the purpose of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises.

2. This By-law, number 10, shall apply to and have operation in the part or in the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Wannon Shire Council as follows, that is to say:—All that area comprised within the limits of the surveyed boundaries of the township of Coleraine.

3. This by-law shall come into operation from and after the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

4. This council's By-laws, numbers 5 and 6, are hereby repealed.

5. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is abolished.

6. Instead thereof every closet shall be forthwith furnished with a double-pan service.

7. The pans for such service shall be supplied by the council, and every occupier shall permit such pans to be placed in every such closet, where directed by the Inspector of Nuisances for the Coleraine Riding, Shire of Wannon.

8. Every occupier must have a closet constructed, with a door or opening sufficiently large to admit of the removal of pan or pans, and shall be available for access for such removal when required.

9. No person shall be allowed to remove any night-soil unless duly authorized by this council.

10. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, between the hours of Sunrise and Sunset, allow each pan to be removed for cleansing purposes.

11. This council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such double-pan service, as specified in this by-law, and for pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

12. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.

BY-LAW No. 11, UNDER THE *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Mansfield, in name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. All closets shall be furnished with two night pans, of pattern and quality to be approved of by the Council of the Shire

of Mansfield, or such officer as they may appoint, and the cost of same must be defrayed by each householder or occupier.

2. No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person or persons in that behalf appointed from time to time by the said council; and such pan or pans shall be removed and emptied as the council may direct, and the contents deposited in such manner and place as authorized by such council.

3. Every householder shall use and cause to be placed for use in and in connexion with every closet a suitable and effectual disinfectant or deodorant.

4. For the removal of night-soil every householder or occupier shall pay to the said council for the removal of same such sum per annum per pan as shall be from time to time fixed by the said council, and such sum shall be paid annually in advance to such person or persons as the said council shall authorize to receive the same.

5. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in that part of the shire within the following boundaries:—Commencing at a point being the intersection of the east side of Rowe-street with the northern bank of Ford's Creek; thence southerly by the east boundary of Rowe-street to its intersection with the south side of Malcolm-street; thence westerly along the south boundary of Malcolm-street to the north-east corner of allotment 70, parish of Mansfield; thence northerly along eastern boundaries (across main road) of allotments 67 and 59, parish of Mansfield; thence easterly along northern boundaries of allotments 58 and 36, parish of Mansfield, to their intersection with the north bank of Ford's Creek; thence north by the bank of Ford's Creek to the point of commencement.

6. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than Five shillings for each day such offence is continued after any conviction.

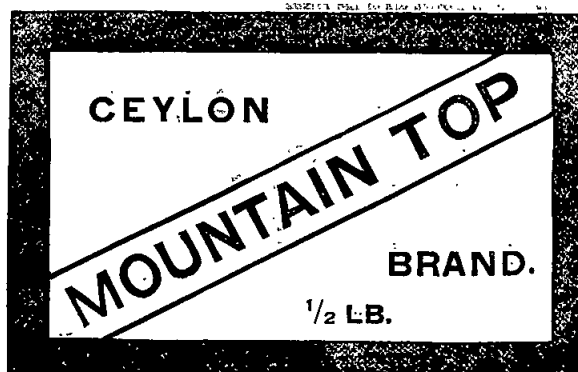

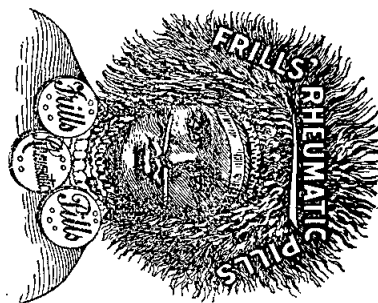

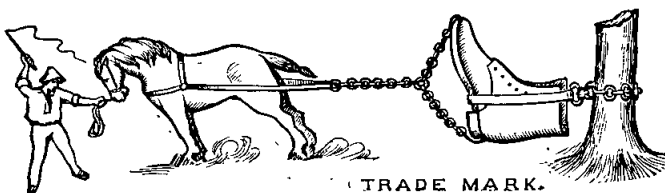

(Crown Lands other than Mallee Lands).

CHAPTER IV.—GRAZING AREAS.

PAYMENT OF ARREARS OF RENT BY HALF-YEARLY INSTALMENTS.

In every case where, pursuant to section 28 of the *Land Act 1898*, arrears of rent are to be payable by instalments, the following additional condition shall be included in the conditions of the lease to be issued under section 29 of the *Land Act 1898*:—

That he or they will pay by half-yearly instalments of each the further sum of being the amount due to Her Majesty for arrears of rent in respect of a previous demise of the land the subject of these presents. The first of such instalments to be paid on the day of now next and a further instalment on each of the days hereinbefore appointed for the payment of the rent reserved until the whole sum be paid. Provided always that any default in the payment of any instalment shall have the like consequence as a default in the payment of rent and may be levied or recovered by or under the authority of the Board in like manner as rent is leviable or recoverable by law and that in case the same be levied by distress an order under the seal of the Board shall be a sufficient warrant and authority to distrain.

PAYMENT BY HALF-YEARLY INSTALMENTS FOR IMPROVEMENTS OF A PERMANENT CHARACTER.

In every case where, pursuant to section 71 of the *Land Act 1898*, payment for improvements of a permanent character is to be made by half-yearly instalments, the following additional condition shall be included in the conditions of the Grazing Area Lease to be issued under section 29 of the *Land Act 1898*:—

1. That he or they will pay the instalments payable hereunder at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions.

2. That he or they will during the continuance of this demise pay all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time being payable either by landlord or tenant in respect of the said premises.

3. That these presents are upon this condition that the lessee will personally reside on the land demised eight months during each year of the first six years after the granting of this lease. Provided that for the purposes of this condition personal residence by the wife or any child not less than eighteen years of age of the lessee shall be accepted as personal residence by the lessee.

4. That these presents are upon this further condition that neither he nor they will transfer assign mortgage sublet or part with the possession of the whole or any part of the land hereby demised within the first six years of this lease. Provided that in the case at any time of the insolvency or death of the lessee it shall be lawful for the assignee or trustee in insolvency or for the executors or administrators of the lessee at any time within twelve months from the date of such insolvency or death to assign these presents to any person who is qualified for becoming a lessee under Division 4 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1893* and such person shall be with respect to this lease in the same position as though he had been the original lessee.

1. That he or they will pay the instalments payable hereunder at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions.

2. That he or they will during the continuance of this demise pay all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time being payable either by landlord or tenant in respect of the said premises.

3. That these presents are upon this condition that the lessee will personally reside on the land demised eight months during each year of the first six years after the granting of this lease. ELMORE CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1850*, the Trustees of the Elmore Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefore, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be:—On Wednesdays (September to April inclusive), Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the Trustees; but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interments permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

LIABILITY TO QUARANTINE OF VESSELS FROM GLASGOW IN SCOTLAND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels whatever arriving from or having touched at any such place and all vessels and boats receiving any person or thing whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at any such infected place as aforesaid (whether such person or thing shall have come or been brought in such vessel or such person shall have gone or have been put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessel at any place in Victoria and whether such vessel was or was not bound to any place in Victoria), and all persons and things whatsoever on board of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid or on board of any such receiving vessels or boats as aforesaid shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act and of any Order made by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of departure of such vessels from such infected place as aforesaid or from the time such persons or things shall have been received on board respectively: And whereas it is enacted that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid and all persons (as well pilots as others), and all things whether coming or brought in such vessels or boats from such infected place as aforesaid or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats in any place in Victoria, and all persons and things as aforesaid on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid shall upon their arrival at any place in Victoria be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be from time to time directed by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas it is further enacted that until such vessels and boats persons and things as aforesaid shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from quarantine no such persons or things shall either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria come or be brought on shore or go or be put on board any other vessel or boat in order to come or be brought on shore in any such place (unless in such manner and in such cases and by such licence as shall be directed or permitted by any such Order as aforesaid): Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation notify that

GLASGOW IN SCOTLAND

is infected with Oriental Plague, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may

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increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF ELSTERNWICK PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Brighton and their successors, in respect of the Elsternwick Public Park and Recreation Reserve, in the Borough of Brighton (now called the Town of Brighton), it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a Park and Recreation Ground, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and, in the meantime, under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Brighton: And whereas by section 137 of the *Land Act 1890* it is provided that, where any such land has been vested in trustees, or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in Clause 1 of the said section: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the Town of Brighton do hereby make the Regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect of the said Elsternwick Public Park and Recreation Reserve:—

REGULATION.

The undermentioned gentlemen shall constitute a Committee of Management to exercise control over the said Public Park and Recreation Reserve:—

Alfred Robert Stone,
George Samuel Ferrin,
Joseph Martin Reed, and
James Thomas.

Provided nevertheless that the said Thomas Bent, John Ferrier Hamilton, and Alfred Robert Stone shall hold office as members of the Committee of Management of the said Public Park and Recreation Reserve for so long only as they shall respectively continue Councillors of the said Town of Brighton.

UNDER CONDITIONAL PURCHASE LEASE OR
PERPETUAL LEASE.

MOE SWAMP.

THE allotments mentioned in the schedule hereunder will be available for application on or before Saturday, 23rd September, 1900.

Applications, accompanied by the registration fee of 5s., must be made on usual form, and lodged at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

All applications so lodged on or before the above-mentioned date will be deemed to have been simultaneously made.

The applications received will be dealt with by a Special Local Land Board, the place and date of sitting of which will be hereafter notified.

Not more than one allotment may be included in any application.

Conditional Purchase Lease.

Every conditional purchase lease will be dated the 1st day of January, 1901, and may be for such a term of years, not exceeding 31½, as may be agreed upon between the lessee and the Board.

The purchase money, with interest at 4½ per cent., must be paid by 63 or a lesser number of half-yearly instalments (including deposit), calculated according to any of the tables under Division 3 of Part I. of the *Savings Banks Act 1890 Amendment Act 1896*. Each instalment will include interest upon the balance of the purchase money remaining unpaid.

On a conditional purchase lease application a deposit equal to the two (2) first instalments of purchase money, together with fees (including survey charge) must be paid within fourteen days after an allotment has been recommended.

Perpetual Lease.

On a perpetual lease application the first rent and fees (including survey charge) must be paid within fourteen days after an allotment has been recommended.

Rent.
