PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHILEAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas it is expedient to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria": Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said Council and Assembly, called the Parliament of Victoria, until Tuesday, the 26th day of February, 1901.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one, and in the sixty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1901.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Trust district shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1901.

1. For every house or tenement of under Twenty-five pounds (£25) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound five shillings (£1 5s.) per annum.
2. For every house or tenement of Twenty-five pounds (£25) and under Thirty-five pounds (£35) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence (£1 12s. 6d.) per annum.
3. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds five shillings (£2 5s.) per annum.
4. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds ten shillings (£3 10s.) per annum.
5. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds (£4) per annum.
6. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per one thousand (1,000) gallons, or at a price as shall be specially agreed on.
7. For water supplied to Government departments, police station, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, shire hall, and similar properties, shall be charged Two pounds (£2) each per annum.
8. For every public water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.
9. All public water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow, such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.
10. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste-pipe from any private bath.
11. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.
12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who are in arrears with the payment of their water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes or by any other means that are available by or through which the water is supplied, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.
13. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence on that behalf to execute such works.
14. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust; and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.
15. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officer of the Trust, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
16. For any breach of any of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.
17. The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1901, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1901, and shall be payable in two instalments; the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1901, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1901.

Water Act 1890.—Part II.—Division 9.

THE BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations are made by the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, pursuant to the provisions of the above Act, and shall come into operation and shall take effect on the 1st January, 1901.

1. Water will, subject to the provisions of the Water Act 1890, Part II., be supplied within the district of the Trust for purposes other than domestic solely by measurement through a meter.

The charge for water so supplied shall, subject to clause 7 of these Regulations, be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon between the Trust and the person requesting the supply, provided that the minimum charge shall be as follows:—

- (a) For irrigation, Two shillings and sixpence per annum.
- (b) For carriers' and livery stables, Two shillings and sixpence per stall, or in open sheds Two shillings and sixpence per 5 feet of accommodation per annum.
- (c) For a trough in a paddock, Five shillings per annum.
- (d) For steam-engine, Ten shillings per inch cylinder diameter per annum.
- (e) For syphon, One pound sterling per annum.

The Trust year begins on the 1st day of January in each year, and all payments and charges on tenements having no water meter shall be payable half-yearly in advance; and where water meters are affixed, payment shall be made at the end of each quarter, namely, 31st of March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

2. (a) On and from the 2nd January, 1899, the supply of water to lands or tenements not having meters affixed to the service-pipes as hereinafter provided shall be for domestic purposes solely. And all persons who shall use water of the Trust so supplied for domestic purposes for purposes other than domestic solely shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and may be prosecuted according to law.

(b) All persons requiring water for other than domestic purposes solely on and after the 2nd January, 1899, shall deliver to the Trust Engineer personally a notice in the form in the Schedule hereto, and upon acceptance by the Secretary of such notice the person delivering the same shall be deemed to have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure.

(c) Every person having delivered such notice, if the same be accepted by the Secretary, shall be entitled forthwith to use water for the purposes in the said notice set forth, and the quantity of water used before a meter be affixed shall be ascertained by the average consumption during such number of days following the fixing of the meter as the Secretary may deem right.

(d) No meter or apparatus for measuring water shall be deemed to be a meter within the meaning of clause 1 of this Regulation unless the pattern or type be of a kind approved of by the Trust.

(e) All meters shall be affixed in such position as the Engineer or Secretary to the Trust may direct, and the keys shall be kept by such Engineer or Secretary.

(f) When a meter shall be out of repair, the water consumed during the period of disrepair shall be ascertained according to the consumption during such number of days following repair as the Secretary may think right.

(g) No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-engine without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

3. (a) Any person who shall waste or misuse, or allow to be wasted or misused, the water supplied to him by the Trust, shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(b) A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include watering horses in stables, or hosing down or washing horses or vehicles.

(c) Unless a meter shall be affixed to the service-pipe no person shall have fitted to the pipes or apparatus through which he receives the water of the Trust any tap with a thread, union, or other attachment, for the purpose of attaching thereto hose, nor shall any stand-pipe be fitted to such pipes or apparatus in or near any garden, and available for the purposes of delivering water for irrigation.

(d) No person shall have fitted to any bath supplied by water from the Trust any over-flow pipe.

(e) The bore of any pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust otherwise than by measure shall not exceed one-half of an inch in diameter, except with the consent of the Trust.

4. Every person supplied with water by the Trust shall keep his pipes and other apparatus in repair; and if any pipes or apparatus become out of repair the Trust may, by notice, require the same to be placed in proper order.

5. Any person supplied with water by the Trust shall not allow any other person to use such water unless by special authority of the Trust; any person who shall use without such authority the water supplied to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

6. The Trust will, upon the application of an intending consumer, supply to him a meter at cost price for cash on delivery, or on time payment on the following terms:—Ten shillings cash deposit, and the balance bearing interest at 7 per cent. per annum, by annual payments of Five shillings, payable in advance.

7. Any person having agreed to be supplied with water by measure may take the water supplied for domestic purposes through the meter service on the following terms:—He shall be entitled to a supply per annum for domestic purposes at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, until at such rate the charge for the quantity consumed would equal the current water rate on the tenement; and thereafter all the water consumed shall be deemed to be taken for the purposes for which water is supplied to such consumers by measure.

8. In laying down future services, or in extending existing services, the intending consumer shall not be entitled to avail himself of the provisions of clause No. 7 without the consent of the Trust, to be refused or accorded at the discretion of the Trust, and on such terms as the Trust may decide.

9. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations, he shall, where not otherwise herein expressly provided or specially provided in the *Water Act 1890*, incur a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and if such breach shall continue after notice by the Trust he shall incur a further penalty not exceeding Three pounds for every day that such breach continues.

10. If any person acts in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay when due or on demand any rates or charges, the water may be cut off by stop-valve, or cutting through the service-pipe, or otherwise as the Trust may determine.

If acting under or giving effect to the foregoing Regulations, the Secretary, instructed by resolution of the Trust, may do, and in his name sign, for the Trust, all things and documents required to be done or executed by the Trust, and in construing the Regulations "The Trust" means the "Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust," the singular imports the plural, the masculine imports the feminine, and persons imports a corporation.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATIONS FOR THE YEAR 1901.

THE Chairman and the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act*, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, where such lands and tenements front streets wherein the pipes of the Trust have been laid, shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount equal to Seven and a half pounds per centum per annum, or One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling annual value, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1901, shall be as follows:—

For street water troughs, Twenty shillings per year. All water troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball-taps to prevent overflow.

For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.

For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—

1. If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons which would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
2. If for other than domestic purposes only 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government departments, police station, churches, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, bowling green, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1901.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes specified in the said Acts, and generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Acts: And whereas by the *Brunswick Lands Purchase Act 1900* (No. 1688) it is further enacted that with respect to allotments taken up on conditional purchase lease for workmen's homes under the said Act, the Governor in Council may, in the manner provided in the Land Acts aforesaid, make regulations with regard to certain matters set out in section 5 of the said *Brunswick Lands Purchase Act 1900*: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say) :—

The Land Acts.

LANDS ACQUIRED FOR PURPOSES OF CLOSER SETTLEMENT.

ALLOTMENTS FOR WORKMEN'S HOMES.

The Regulations under which the lands referred to in the *Brunswick Lands Purchase Act 1900* shall be available for application shall be as follow :—

- (1) The land shall be divided into allotments not exceeding in value £100, and no lease shall comprise more than 3 acres.
- (2) A substantial dwelling house to the value of at least £50 must be erected within one year from the date of his lease, and substantial improvements to the value of a further £25 before the end of the second year, and at least quarter of the area must be fenced off, and be under proper cultivation as a garden or orchard before the end of the sixth year.
- (3) Every application shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule 136 hereto.
- (4) The applicant shall, before lodging his application, pay to the nearest Receiver of Revenue the sum of 5s. for a Certificate of Registration for each allotment applied for, which must accompany the application, and such amount shall not be refunded unless specially authorized in exceptional cases.
- (5) All applications shall be publicly investigated by the Minister, or by persons appointed by the Minister to hear the same, and report to him in writing, and at least ten days' notice of the date and place of the sitting of such Board shall be given in the *Government Gazette*.
- (6) Any male or female person 21 years of age, who is engaged in any form of manual, clerical, or other work for hire or reward, and is not possessed of real or personal property to a value exceeding £250, shall be deemed to be a workman.
- (7) No workman shall be eligible as an applicant if at the time of his application he is directly or indirectly the owner, tenant, or occupier of any other land in the state, which if town or suburban land, exceeds in area $\frac{1}{2}$ of an acre, or if rural land exceeds 50 acres.
- (8) No workman shall be eligible as an applicant unless he has the means to erect a suitable house on the land for himself and his family, and unless there is reasonable probability that he will be able to fence and cultivate the land.
- (9) The fee for the preparation of a conditional purchase lease shall be £1.
- (10) Upon payment of the valuation (if any) and of the fee for lease, there shall be issued to the approved applicant a permit to occupy the land to be indicated therein.
- (11) Every lessee of a Workman's Home Allotment shall, on the expiration of one year and again on the expiration of the 2nd and 6th years from the date of his lease, forward to the Secretary for Lands a statement in the form prescribed in Schedule 137 hereto as to the performance of the conditions of his lease.

PART I. OF THE POLICE OFFENCES ACT 1890 EXTENDED TO THE SHIRE OF CRESWICK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Police Offences Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1126) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Act to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and that upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation extend the provisions of Part I. of the *Police Offences Act 1890* aforesaid to the whole of the Shire of Creswick.

BY-LAWS OF THE WYCHEPROOF HOSPITAL ADOPTED AT A MEETING OF SUBSCRIBERS HELD IN MECHANICS' INSTITUTE, WYCHEPROOF, 3RD DECEMBER, 1900.

HOSPITAL SEAL.

THE seal of the corporation shall only be affixed to any document by direction of the board of management, and shall be attested by the signatures of the president and secretary, or two members of the board and the secretary.

OBJECT.

2. The institution is for the purpose of affording surgical and medical aid to destitute persons in cases of accident or disease, or in such circumstances as the board may determine.

MANAGEMENT.

3. The board of management shall have power to frame regulations for the conduct of its meetings and rules for the internal management of the hospital, the same not being repugnant to the general by-laws.

4. The affairs of the institute shall be directed by a board of management consisting of eighteen (18) subscribers, and the said board shall elect at their first meeting after the annual meeting in each year their president, vice-president, and treasurer.

5. The annual general meeting shall be held on the last Thursday in July in each year, and shall elect two auditors, not members of the board, to examine the accounts; but in case either of such auditors neglect or refuse to perform his duty, the board is empowered to temporarily appoint another auditor or auditors.

6. Should vacancies occur in any of the offices under the fourth rule, the board shall supply such vacancies, according to the provisions of Act 1099.

RETIREMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

7. On the last Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election; or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

VACANCIES: HOW FILLED.

8. If any member of committee shall die or resign by letter under his hand, and addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted for any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent without the permission of the committee for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of this Act, are required to go out of office.

9. The board of management shall include all the officers named in the fourth rule. It shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, present a report to the annual general meeting (which report shall be presented at a special meeting of committee for revision and approval at least one week before the annual meeting), and manage the affairs of the hospital generally; and may from among themselves from time to time appoint house and other committees, give the same power to perform such duties as may not be contrary to Act of Incorporation, and may also from time to time alter or discontinue such committees.

MEETINGS AND QUORUM.

10. The board shall meet for general business once in each month, the date of such meeting to be fixed by the board, and adjourn such or any meeting as may be deemed expedient. Special meetings of the board shall be called by the president or secretary, or upon the requisition of any three members of the said board to the president or vice-president, such requisition to state the object of such meeting, and no other business but that stated shall be entertained. At any meeting five (5) members to form a quorum, the president or vice-president to be chairman, and in their absence the meeting shall elect a chairman. The chairman to have, in addition to his own vote as a member of the board, a second or casting vote.

11. No proposition to enact or amend a by-law, or frame or vary any rule, shall be entertained unless one month's previous notice has been given of such, and no motion to rescind a resolution shall be submitted within three months after such resolution has been passed, unless one month's notice of same has been given, and such motion be passed by an absolute majority of the whole general committee.

CONTRIBUTORS.

12. Benefactors of Thirty pounds or contributors of Twenty-five pounds in any one year, shall be entitled to be made life governors. Benefactors or contributors of Fifteen pounds in any one year shall be entitled to be made annual governors. The word "benefaction" shall mean a sum of money raised from the public by church or other collections, by fêtes and entertainments, or contributed by mining or other companies, societies, or associations, and the bodies under the Local Government Act. The nomination of benefactors as life or annual governors to be made by the minister or governing body of churches, the collector or collectors, the committee of the said fêtes or entertainments, or the giver or givers thereof, the directors of mining or other companies, societies, or associations, and the councils of the local governing bodies respectively. The word "contribution" shall mean a personal gift. Life and annual governors shall have the privilege of voting at all meetings of subscribers and of nominating five patients in each year. Other contributors shall be entitled to nominate one patient for every pound of their contribution, provided that the funds and accommodation of the hospital will permit of the reception and treatment of such patients. Members of the board are not to be limited to the

number of patients they may recommend. Any person subscribing Ten shillings shall have the privilege of recommending one out-patient, but shall not be entitled to vote. All subscribers and benefactors who have, prior to the gazetted of these rules, been elected to the title of life or annual governors shall henceforth be placed on the list of life or annual governors respectively, and shall be entitled to the privileges they have hitherto enjoyed.

EMPLOYERS OF LABOUR.

13. Where employers of labour pay Sixpence per week to the hospital funds for each man employed, they shall have the privilege of nominating one patient for each pound received for the year of such subscription.

VOTER'S QUALIFICATION.

14. No person shall hereafter be qualified to vote at any meeting of subscribers to this hospital unless he shall have been a subscriber of at least One pound sterling to the hospital within a period of twelve months previous to the time of such meeting being held, nor unless the said subscription, being the first, has been paid at least fourteen days before the meeting at which such subscriber wishes to vote, and all subscribers who shall allow more than a year to elapse since the payment of their last subscription, for the purpose of this clause their next subscription shall be considered as a first subscription.

15. Each contributor of One pound, having fulfilled the above conditions will be entitled to one vote, of Five pounds to two votes, and of Ten pounds and upwards to three votes. Life and annual governors to have two votes in addition to any they may possess as subscribers, provided that no person shall exercise more than three votes.

ACCOUNTS.

16. All accounts for payment shall be presented by the finance committee (after having been initiated by at least one of their number) passed by the board and duly initiated by the chairman then present. And the said finance committee shall at each monthly meeting of the board present a report of the financial position of the hospital.

CONTRACTORS.

17. No person under contract to the hospital shall be eligible to sit on the committee during the consideration of his tender or the period of his contract.

HONORARY TREASURER.

18. He shall receive all money on behalf of the hospital and deposit same in such bank or banks as the board of management shall direct to the credit of the hospital. He shall pay all accounts after the same have been signed by the chairman of the meeting and the secretary as having been approved by the board, by draft on the bank or banks, which shall be countersigned by the president or vice-president and by the secretary. He shall also keep an account of all moneys received and paid by him and report the same at least once a month to a meeting of the board.

SECRETARY.

19. The secretary shall keep the minutes, accounts, and records of the hospital, compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before the same, carry out the resolutions, and perform all clerical and other duties that may be ordered by the board.

20. He shall convene the annual general meeting of each year as directed by the Act of Incorporation.
