PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

P R O C L A M A T I O N

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

THURSDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF AUGUST NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Sale;

WEDNESDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF AUGUST NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the West and South Ridings of the Shire of Huntly;\*

THURSDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF AUGUST NEXT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Sale;

WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF AUGUST NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Rutherglen, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Apsley;

THURSDAY, THE 22ND, AND WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAYS OF AUGUST NEXT, as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Wannon;

THURSDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Hamilton, and throughout the Shires of Oxley and Wannon;

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT, as a Bank Holiday at Dunolly.
