Of these 45 occurred in Ballarat East, 63 in Ballarat West, and 2 in Sebastopol; included were 10 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 112, viz., 55 of boys, and 57 of girls.

The deaths registered in July numbered 61, viz., 37 of males and 24 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 49. 

No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the first column of the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the Chinese Act 1890 aforesaid, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the fourth column of the said Schedule, that is to say:—
