VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JULY, 1901.

THE births of 63 boys and 48 girls, or in all of 110 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of July. Of these 45 occurred in Ballarat East, 63 in Ballarat West, and 2 in Sebastopol; included were 10 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 112, viz., 55 of boys, and 57 of girls.

The deaths registered in July numbered 61, viz., 37 of males and 24 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 49. In June the recorded deaths numbered 74; in July, 1900, they numbered 54; in July, 1899, they numbered 68; in July, 1898, they numbered 73; in July, 1897, they numbered 55; in July, 1896, they numbered 70; in July, 1895, they numbered 73; in July, 1894, they numbered 67; in July, 1893, they numbered 67; in July, 1892, they numbered 72; and in July, 1891, they numbered 57.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Eighteen deaths, or 30 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in Public Institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 10; Benevolent Asylum, 5; Lunatic Asylum, 3.

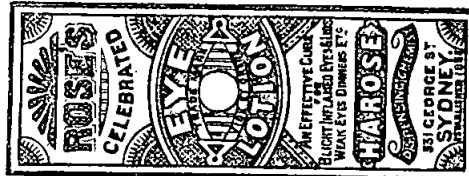

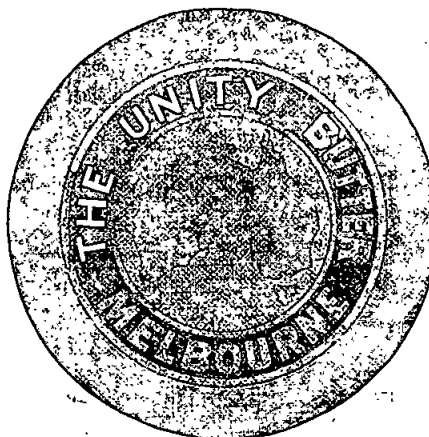

WHEREAS by section 25 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* (No. 1238) it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations for the purposes in the said section specified: And whereas by the *Acts Interpretation Act 1890* (No. 1058) it is among other things provided that where an Act passed after the commencement of the said *Acts Interpretation Act 1890* confers a power to make rules, regulations, or by-laws, the power shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be construed as including a power to rescind, revoke, amend, or vary the rules, regulations, or by-laws: And whereas by Order in Council made the 2nd October, 1893, certain Regulations were made in connexion with the Heidelberg and Eltham Railway Construction Trust for convening meetings of the Trust, and generally for regulating the conduct of the business of the said Trust: And whereas it is advisable to amend certain of the said Regulations so made, and to revoke others, and substitute therefor a new Regulation in place of the Regulation so revoked: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Acts hereinbefore referred to, doth make the Regulation following (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, limiting the hours during which shops mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* within such district may be kept open, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of the class to be affected thereby within such district: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that a regulation be made limiting, in the municipal district of the City of Hawthorn, the hours during which all chemists' shops (such shops being shops included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* afore-said) may be kept open by directing that they shall be closed on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from the hour of Nine o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from the hour of Ten o'clock: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said City as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of the class to be affected thereby: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

All chemists' shops within the municipal district of the City of Hawthorn shall be closed on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from the hour of Nine o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from the hour of Ten o'clock.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

EXEMPTIONS OF CHINESE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the first column of the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the fourth column of the said Schedule, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring

the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.

3. The orders for wood will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor for wood will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

TENDERS, indorsed "Tender for wattle bark, lot ——" and addressed to the Secretary for Lands, will be received at the Department of Lands and Survey, Melbourne, up to Twelve noon on Monday, 9th September, 1901, for the right to strip and remove wattle bark on and from the following areas. The general conditions hereunder will apply in every case where not expressly stated to the contrary, and special conditions will also apply where provided. General Conditions.

1. No tender will necessarily be accepted.

7. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other—in his opinion—valid reason.
8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.
9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.
10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.

Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, immediately dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking or ordinary cooking operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.
12. No live tree, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

The violation of any of the above conditions, or of any special condition, will render the licence null and void, and the Honorable the Minister shall have power to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance. 3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

That where improvements are authorized under section 116 of the *Land Act 1890* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

7. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of £1.

8. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

9. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

10. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

11. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.
