Sir,—With reference to Lord Knutsford's Circular Despatch, dated the 22nd April, 1890, forwarding an Order in Council giving effect to the Convention of 12th June, 1889, between this Country and the United States of America for the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony, a copy of an Order of His Majesty the King in Council, dated the 26th June, 1901, giving effect to a supplementary Convention between the United Kingdom and the United States of America for the same purpose, which was signed at Washington on the 13th December, 1900, and of which the ratifications were exchanged on the 22nd April, 1901.

It will be observed that by Article I. of the Convention certain crimes are added to the list of crimes in the first Article of the 1889 Convention, on account of which extradition may be granted.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

SAINT JAMES'S, 26TH JUNE, 1901.

EXTRADITION CONVENTION.—AMERICA.

At the Court at Saint James's, the 26th day of June, 1901.

PRESENT:

The King's Most Excellent Majesty.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895 it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient;

And whereas a Convention was concluded on the thirteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred, between Her

late Majesty Queen Victoria and the President of the United States of America, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Convention is in the terms following:—

“Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain and Ireland and the President of the United States of America, being desirous of enlarging the list of crimes on account of which extradition may be granted under the Convention concluded between Her Britannic Majesty and the United States on the twelfth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, with a view to the better administration of justice and the prevention of crime in their respective territories and jurisdictions, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention for this purpose, and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, to wit:

“Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, His Excellency the Right Honorable Lord Pauncefoot, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, and Her Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the United States; and

“The President of the United States, the Honorable John Hay, Secretary of State of the United States;

“Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, which were found to be in due and proper form, have agreed to and concluded the following Articles:—

“ARTICLE I.

“The following crimes are added to the list of crimes numbered one to ten in the first Article of the said Convention of July twelfth, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, on account of which extradition may be granted, that is to say:

- “11. Obtaining money, valuable securities, or other property by false pretences.
- “12. Wilful and unlawful destruction or obstruction of railroads which endangers human life.
- “13. Procuring abortion.

“ARTICLE II.

“The present Convention shall be considered as an integral part of the said Extradition Convention of July twelfth, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and the first Article of the last-mentioned Convention shall be read as if the list of crimes therein contained had originally comprised the additional crimes specified, and numbered eleven to thirteen in the first Article of the present Convention.

“The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged either at London or Washington as soon as possible.

“It shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the laws of the High Contracting Parties, and it shall continue and terminate in the same manner as the said Convention of July twelfth, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

“In testimony whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention in duplicate, and have thereunto affixed their seals.

“Done at Washington, this thirteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged at Washington on the twenty-second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and one:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the thirteenth day of July, one

thousand nine hundred and one, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the United States and of the said Convention with the President of the United States of America.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

FRIDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1901, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Sheep Hills and Warracknabeal;

TUESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF OCTOBER, 1901, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Numurkah, and the North Riding of the Shire of Borung; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Cobram and Beulah;

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF OCTOBER, 1901, as a Public Holiday throughout the United Shire of Beechworth, the Shires of Maldon and Yarrawonga, the North Riding of the Shire of Huntly, and the Western Riding of the Shire of Waranga;

THURSDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF OCTOBER, 1901, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Numurkah, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Nathalia.

DEFINITION OF THE MOUTHS OF THE BEMM, CANN, WINGAN, AND GENOA RIVERS. SPECIFYING LIMITS WITHIN WHICH NETS AND FIXED ENGINES ARE NOT TO BE USED.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to issue a proclamation defining the mouths of the Bemm, Cann, Wingan, and Genoa Rivers, to be a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such rivers enter the ocean or bay thereof, and prohibiting the use of nets and fixed engines within a radius of a quarter of a mile seaward from any portion or point of the line defining the mouth of any of the said rivers.

CHINA—TUNGHAI OR EASTERN SEA.—VERIFICATION AND POSITION OF SOCOTRA SHOAL.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 560 of 1900—Telegraphic information, dated 1st August, 1901, has been received from Lieutenant and Commander W. O. Lyne, H.M. surveying vessel *Waterwitch*, that he has searched for the shoal reported north-eastward of the Great Yangtse bank by the P. & O. Co.'s s.s. *Socotra* in 1900, and found a rock, with a depth of 18 feet over it, in lat. 32° 7' N., long. 125° 11' E., or about 5 miles south-eastward of the *Socotra's* position.

The births of 1,151 children, viz., 566 of boys and 585 of girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of August. The number was, it will be observed, 147 more than in August, 1900, and was the highest recorded for the month since 1894; but it was 60 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 127 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in August numbered 668, viz., 401 of males and 267 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 483, or 72 per cent., as against 64 per cent. in August, 1900, and 96 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 54 more than in August, 1900, and the highest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, except 1891 (688) and 1893 (710); it was also 50 above the average of August during the previous ten years, or 16 above it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 27.43, and of deaths registered to 15.32 per annum; as compared with averages of the same month in 1900 of 24.74 and 15.13 respectively; and with averages for the month during the last ten years of 30.56 and 15.68 respectively; and averages for the whole year of 29.74 and 16.16.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 65.0° on the 15th, and the lowest was 33.9° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (49.4°) was 1.2° below the average, and was lower than in the corresponding month of any of the previous ten years except 1897 and 1900. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.4°) took place on the 3rd, and the least range (2.0°) on the 16th. The mean daily range was 12.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.476 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.418 inches on the 26th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.003 inches) was one twenty-seventh of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on nine days, the amount being 1.89 inches, which was lower than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years, except 1891, 1893, 1895, and 1898, and .06 of an inch below the average during that period.

The mean humidity of the month was .800.

Males contributed 60 per cent. and females 40 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed only 18 per cent. to that mortality—an exceptionally low proportion—as against 21 per cent. in 1900; 20 per cent. in August, 1899; 27 per cent. in August, 1898; 22 per cent. in August, 1897; 22 per cent. in August, 1896; 23 per cent. in August, 1895; and 30 per cent. in August, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 86, as compared with 82 in August, 1900. The rate of infantile mortality was 75 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 82 in August, 1900; 77 in August, 1899; 111 in August, 1898; 85 in August, 1897; 88 in August, 1896; 89 in August, 1895; 91 in August, 1894; 103 in August, 1893; 84 in August, 1892; and 121 in August, 1891.

In striking contrast to the decline in the percentage of deaths of children under five years, the proportion of deaths of elderly persons—aged 75 and upwards—has shown a marked increase in the last ten years, proving infallibly that the percentage of elderly persons in the population has considerably increased, and has apparently not yet reached a maximum. This point is of considerable interest as bearing on the question of old-age pensions. The actual numbers of aged persons cannot be ascertained until the results of the recent census have been fully tabulated.

Twenty-six of the deaths recorded during the month, as compared with 30 in August, 1900, were from external causes, of which 17 were set down to accident, and 9 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A labourer, aged 63, was passed over by a railway train; a labourer, aged 16, and a female, aged 47, died of injuries to the head, consequent on a fall from a horse in the former, and from a cart in the latter case; an engine-turner, aged 28, of injuries, the result of being caught in machinery; a boy, aged 14, of gunshot wounds; a male child, aged 2 months, and a carpenter, aged 74, of scalds; a fireman, aged 29, and a carpenter, aged 48, were drowned in the River Yarra; a cook, aged 28, in Hobson's Bay; a labourer, aged 65, in a bath; 4 persons were "found drowned," viz.:—Two males, of occupation unknown, aged 24 and 69 respectively, and an ex-bank manager, aged 52, in the River Yarra; and a seaman, aged 40, in Hobson's Bay; a stonebreaker, aged 55, was suffocated by smoke; and a male infant, aged 4 weeks, was overlain. The suicidal deaths were those of a labourer, aged 21, and a draper, aged 47, who shot themselves; a female, aged 37, who cut her throat; a female, aged 49, who poisoned herself by taking spirits of salts; a frenchpolisher, aged 36, and a female, aged 17, who drowned themselves; a driver, aged 16, and two females, aged 39 and 41 respectively, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and eighty-one deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—63 in the Melbourne, 16 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 7 in the Women's, 9 in the Children's, 15 in the Homœopathic, and 10 in the Austin Hospitals; 11 in the Metropolitan and 14 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 7 in the Immigrants' Home; 16 in the Benevolent Asylum; 4 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 2 in the Protestant Refuge; and 3 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 120, of which 78, or 65 per cent., were of males, and 42, or 35 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 86 were under one year of age, 18 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 548. Of these 323, or 59 per cent., were males, and 225, or 41 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 30 were between thirty and thirty-five, 39 were between thirty-five and forty, 35 were between forty and forty-five, 33 were between forty-five and fifty, 31 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 36 were between sixty and sixty-five, 66 were between sixty-five and seventy, 62 were between seventy and seventy-five, 47 were between seventy-five and eighty, 39 were between eighty and eighty-five, 14 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 3 were between ninety and ninety-five.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 31 deaths under zymotic, 2 under dietic, 3 under developmental, 23 under local diseases, and 5 under ill-defined causes; whilst there was a decrease of 9 under constitutional diseases, and 4 under the head of violence. Under the zymotic class, deaths from influenza rose from 2 to 43, and those from typhoid fever from nil to 4, whilst those from measles fell from 20 to 3. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer fell from 36 to 29. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the respiratory system increased by 12, those from diseases of the digestive system by 6, those from diseases of the urinary system by 4, those from diseases of parturition by 6, and those from diseases of the integumentary system by 2; whilst those from diseases of the organs of generation diminished by 5. The epidemic of influenza caused 86 deaths altogether in the last two months, as against only 7 in June last. The previous outbreak in the last quarter of 1899 caused 274 deaths.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1900, and the first eight months of 1901, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from diphtheria during the month was below the average.

TOWN OF ESSENDON.

BY-LAW No. 25.

A By-law of the Town of Essendon, made under the provisions of section 253 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 25, for regulating the removal of night-soil and the description of pans for night-soil to be used in the said town.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said town make the following by-law:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the town of Essendon.
3. From and after this by-law coming into force every closet shall be forthwith furnished with a double-pan service, such pans to be constructed of such materials, size, and design as the said council may approve, and to have tight-fitting lids similarly approved, for use during the removal of the night-soil therein.

4. Occupiers of premises in the said town shall obtain and use such a number of pans and lids as aforesaid as may be necessary for use on their premises, and shall permit the officers of the council, and all workmen, servants, and contractors employed by it to have access to and upon their premises during the daytime for the purpose of performing the necessary service in connexion with the removal of night-soil therefrom.

5. At least once a week, or as much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the occupier shall permit the pan in use in each closet to be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed in the daytime, between such hours as the council may direct, in a suitable cart, and a pan cleansed and disinfected by efficient means approved of by the council to be left in its place.

6. No individual householder shall contract for the removal of night-soil from their respective premises in any other manner than is herein provided.

7. Every person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding

Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings for every breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW NO. 7.—AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Council of the Shire of Ballan, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ballan, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, doth make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the shire of Ballan.

4. *Registration of Cow-keepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of October, 1901, and on or before the first day of October in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows, and the number of such cows is—

- (1) Not more than 5, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.
- (2) More than 5, but not more than 10, a fee of Five shillings.
- (3) More than 10, but not more than 20, a fee of Seven shillings and sixpence.
- (4) More than 20, but not more than 30, a fee of Ten shillings.
- (5) More than 30, but not more than 40, a fee of Twelve shillings and sixpence.
- (6) More than 40, but not more than 50, a fee of Fifteen shillings.
- (7) Over 50 cows, a fee of Twenty shillings.

If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council, and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said

council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairymen, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect to cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairymen, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife, or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairymen, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or any of its provisions, shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW NO. 34.

Deposit of Night-soil.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 34, for regulating the deposit of night-soil and other offensive matter.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg hereby order as follows:—

1. That By-laws Nos. 14 and 15 shall be and the same are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and any legal proceeding pending at the time of this by-law coming into force.

2. This by-law shall apply and have operation within the Ridings of Fairfield, Ivanhoe, and Heidelberg, of the Shire of Heidelberg.

3. No person shall deposit, or suffer, or cause to be deposited, any night-soil or other offensive matter on any land in the aforesaid Ridings of the Shire of Heidelberg, within a distance of 15 chains from any road or highway.

4. No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the shire of Heidelberg shall cause or permit night-soil or other

offensive matter to be deposited on any land owned or occupied by such owner or occupier, without first having obtained a permit from the council of the said shire in the form of the Schedule following:—

The Council of the Shire of Heidelberg doth hereby grant to deposit of permission to on the land owned or occupied by him situate at for a period of one calendar month from the date hereof, the same being subject to By-law No. 34, and subject also to any other by-law in force within the said shire.

Dated at Heidelberg this day of 190 President. Shire Secretary.

5. Every person placing, depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread any liquid manure, of which night-soil, urine, or any similar offensive matter forms a part, night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered with a layer of earth not less than 6 inches in thickness, and shall keep and use the same in such a way only as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

6. The managers of any public or private hospital, used for the reception of sick or diseased persons, shall cause all night-soil, blood, offal, filth, or other refuse matter, before removal from such premises, to be thoroughly disinfected and deodorized so as to be rendered inoffensive and innocuous.

Penalties.

7. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Brighton, made under the Health Act 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890 and of every other power and authority enabling them in this behalf, the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Brighton, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Brighton, doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. Section 1, By-law No. 44, fixing cesspan fee of Twenty-one shillings per pan per annum, &c., made and passed by the Council of the Town of Brighton on the 6th April, 1891, shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. On and after 1st October, 1901, the ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be abolished, and from and after that date every closet (excepting where council has granted special permission to ratepayers under Regulation No. 2 to dispose of night-soil by some means other than council's system) shall be furnished with a double-pan service, to be provided by the council, under which, at least once a week, the pan in every closet shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed from the premises, and a clean pan shall be left in its place.

3. The council shall have power (in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil) to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for the pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Mansfield, made under Part 3 of the Health Act 1890 and under the Health Act 1900, and numbered 14, for providing for the registration of persons carrying on the trade of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk, and for inspection of dairies, and for fixing the fee to be paid for each such registration.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the Council of the Shire of Mansfield, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 14 of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. *Repeal of former by-laws.*—All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. *Date of coming into force.*—This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. *To have operation in whole of shire.*—This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Mansfield.

4. *Persons who shall register and fees for same.*—From and after coming into force of this by-law, every person carrying on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall within fifteen days from and after the first day of January in every year, and every person about to carry on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, previous to carrying on such trade or business, register himself with the said council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the council an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application, if he does not keep any cows, pay a fee of 5s.; but if he does keep any cows, then he shall with such application pay a fee according to the following scale, namely:—

5. *Registration and books.*—Upon receipt of every application for registration and fee, the shire secretary shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for the purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. *Inspection of water supply and paddocks—Prohibition of use of same—Inspection by veterinary surgeon.*—All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used by any person in his trade or business as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk as a grazing ground for dairy cattle, and all sources of water supply used in connexion therewith shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the president or secretary of the said council; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or sources of

water supply, or any of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order, in writing, signed by the shire secretary, and served personally, or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally, or left at his dwelling, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding or watering dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order; and any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made. All cattle and other animals used or kept by any person carrying on the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, may also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from the poverty or weakness of their bodily condition are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, and any other diseased animal, shall be forthwith removed from the premises of such cow-keeper, dairyman or purveyor of milk if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid.

7. *Alteration of premises.*—The council, on receiving a report from an inspector that the construction of any dairy, milking-place, cow-shed, milk-store, milk-shop, or other building in the occupation of any person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk is defective or faulty in regard to lighting, ventilation, drainage, or water supply, or in any other respect whatsoever, in such a way as to prejudicially affect the health of the cows or the wholesomeness of the milk or other dairy produce, may order such person to make alteration in any such buildings or structures and to remedy any such defects within a time to be specified in such order.

8. *Closet, night-soil, &c.*—Such closet accommodation shall be provided for the persons employed on the premises of any person, following the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and at such distance from the dairy, milking-place, milk-store, milk-shop, or source of water supply of such premises, and such methods shall be adopted for the disposal of the night-soil as may be directed by the council, and the closet-pans on such premises shall be disinfected daily to the entire satisfaction of the inspector or other officer as aforesaid.

9. *Horses, stabling, &c.*—Where horses are kept on the premises of any person following the trade or business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, such stable accommodation shall be provided, and at such a distance from the milking-place, or milk-store, or milk-shop, or source of water supply of such premises as the Council may direct.

10. *Cleanliness to be observed.*—All houses, dairies, milking-places, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper, or dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health by affecting the milk, or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings and milking-places shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and such means of access provided to the source or sources of water supply as may be directed by the council or duly authorized officer as aforesaid.

11. *Sweeping, Fumigating, &c.*—All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows, shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer, or inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, lime washed, or be otherwise dealt with, as may be in any such order so directed.

12. *Scalding and care of vessels.*—All vessels used for holding milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily, and no cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or person employed in the milking or dairy work, shall use in connexion with milking or for washing vessels used for holding milk or for any dairy work, water that is in any way infected or contaminated or contains matter injurious to health, and the health officer or inspector may, after inspection, prohibit by order served, as prescribed in clause 7 of this by-law, the use for dairy purposes of the water obtained from any well or tank or other source of water supply, and may require any tank to be cleaned and disinfected.

13. *Cow-keeper to notify disease of stock.*—If at any time disease exists in or among the cows, cattle, or other stock of any cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

14. *Provision for pigs.*—No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

15. *Infected persons.*—No person who is suffering from any dangerous infectious or contagious disease, or who has been so situated by contact with any person or persons so suffering or otherwise so that he may have contracted or be in danger of contracting any dangerous infectious or contagious disease, shall milk cows or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business until authorized by the council, shire secretary, or health officer so to do.

16. *Epidemics.—Milk not to be used.*—If any person (whether an adult or a child) living on, or occupying, or staying on a visit at any premises used as a grazing ground or dairy, or for cow-sheds, or as a milk-shop or milk-store, be attacked by any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, the occupier of the house or premises in which such person is (or if he be the person attacked his wife or other person in charge) shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or health officer, or to the nearest member of the police force, and the council may, whether or not the person

so attacked has been removed from the premises by order served as aforesaid, prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk or the produce thereof from the premises until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and may order the destruction of the milk or any produce thereof on the premises.

17. *Report of Inspector.*—Every dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop, the premises of any person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall be inspected once in each half-year by the council's inspector, who shall furnish a report to the council on the following matters, that is to say:—Condition of paddocks, water supply, drains, sheds, and buildings, closet and stable accommodation, disposal of night-soil and manure, storage for milk, means of scalding and cleaning vessels, cleanliness of premises, compliance with regulations.

18. *Interpretation.*—In the interpretation of this by-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular number, and the word person shall include a corporation, and the word "cows" shall mean and include all cows in profit, all cows in calf, heifers, and cows, and dry cows to be subsequently used as milkers.

19. *Penalties.*—Any person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid, and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law, being By-law No. 14 of the Shire of Mansfield, was agreed to by the council of the said shire on the twenty-sixth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and one, and confirmed by the said council on the thirty-first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and one.

SHIRE OF BROADFORD.
BY-LAW No. 2.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Broadford, for the purposes of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, hereby make the following by-law, that is to say:—

Double-pan Service.

(1) Every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, and such pan shall be furnished with air-tight lids. The pans to be provided by householders; to be constructed of galvanized iron, and to be of a capacity not exceeding 2 cubic feet; and such pans shall be removed for cleansing at least once every week.

Removal of Night-soil.

(2) No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the said council, and any such pan or pans shall be removed and emptied alternately as the said council shall direct.

Use of Deodorant.

(3) Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficiently to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

(4) The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for the double-pan service herein provided, and for pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

(5) For the use of each pan supplied, and for the removal and disposal of its contents, each owner or occupier shall pay to the council half-yearly, and in advance, such sum as the council may from time to time fix.

Extent of Application of By-law.

(6) This By-law, No. 2, shall apply to and have operation in that portion of the shire of Broadford included within the boundaries described hereunder, that is to say: Commencing at

a point on the Sydney-road at the western angle of Crown allotment 65, parish of Broadford, county of Dalhousie; thence south-easterly by south-west boundary of Crown allotment 65 aforesaid to the Dry Creek; thence by the south-west and south-east boundaries of Crown allotment 64; thence by the north-west boundaries of Crown allotments 63n, 60, 59, 58b, and 58e; thence south-easterly by the boundary of Crown allotment 57 to a point due south of the south-west corner of Crown allotment 50; thence due north to the aforesaid south-west corner of Crown allotment 50; thence north and north-westerly by Crown allotment 50 to the Sydney-road; thence by a line bearing north 35° west to the Sunday Creek; thence south-westerly by the Sunday Creek to its junction with the Dry Creek; thence westerly and southerly by the Dry Creek to the northern corner of Crown allotment 65; thence south-westerly by Crown allotment 65 and the Sydney-road to the point of commencement.

Penalties.

(7) If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and a further penalty of not more than £5, or less than 5s., for every day such offence is continued after any conviction.

ALTERING BY-LAW No. 25.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. That clauses 13 and 21 of By-law No. 25 shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. That the words "and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances," in clause 16 of By-law No. 25, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

3. That the figures 12 shall be and the same are hereby substituted for the figures 10 in clause 17 of By-law No. 25, and the following words shall be and the same are hereby included in the said by-law:—"No privy or earth-closet abutting on to any street, lane, or right-of-way aforesaid shall be erected within a distance of 10 feet of the intersection of such street, lane, or right-of-way with any thoroughfare or main road."

4. That the words "Provided that the contents of any cess-pool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom, except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., and," in clause 18 of By-law No. 25, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

5. That after the words "Pay a Fee," in clause 30 of By-law No. 25, the words "of Five shillings" shall be struck out, and the following substituted—"in accordance with the following scale:—

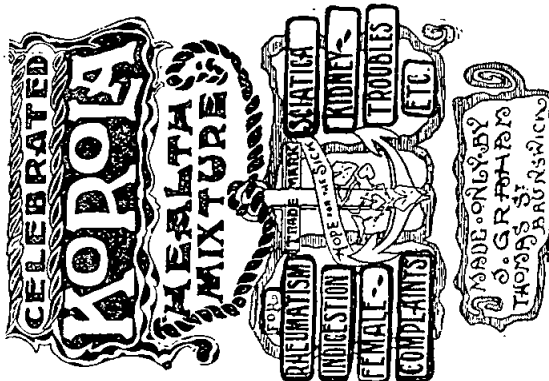

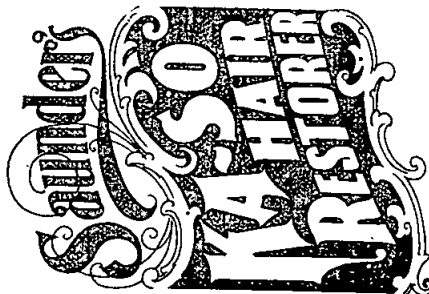

WHEREAS by the Income Tax Act 1895 (58 Vict. No. 1374), it is amongst other things enacted that if any act, matter, or thing prescribed by or under the said Act to be made or done at or within a fixed time cannot be or is not so made or done, the Governor in Council may by Order from time to time appoint a further or other time for making or doing the same, whether the time or any such further or other time within which the same ought to have been done has or has not elapsed or expired: And whereas the assessments of incomes for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1901, for the first, second, third, and fourth periods for which assessments were prescribed to be made or done, were not made or done on or before the 16th day of May, 1901, the 30th day of May, 1901, the 13th day of June, 1901, and the 12th day of September, 1901, as prescribed by the Regulations made pursuant to the said Act, and dated the 20th day of December, 1900, and by orders in Council, dated the 20th day of May, 1901, the 4th day of June, 1901, and the 17th day of June, 1901, respectively: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby appoint that all assessments of incomes for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1901, which were not made on or before the 12th day of September, 1901, shall be made on or before the 7th day of December, 1901, and that the tax payable on such assessments shall be paid on or before the 23rd day of December, 1901.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Treasurer for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NETTING AT PORTLAND PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Fisheries Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sections 37 and 38 of the said Act; and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be published in the Government Gazette, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation prohibit the use of trammels, trawls, and other nets or fixed engines at Portland within an area bounded by two imaginary lines extending as hereunder described from the shore seawards to their intersection and by the foreshore between such lines, one of such lines forming the northern boundary of such area extending seawards parallel with and 100 feet off the northern side of the new pier from a post on the shore, and the other line forming the eastern boundary of such area extending seaward from the junction of the eastern side of the breakwater with the shore through a point 100 feet to seaward of the outer extremity of the new pier.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE BALLAN RACECOURSE
AND RECREATION RESERVE IN THE PARISH OF
MOORABOOL WEST.

WE Dugald Macpherson, John Ord Inglis, Marcus Mason, Mogg, and Philip Cantwell, the surviving Trustees of the Ballan Racecourse and Recreation Reserve in the parish of Moorabool West, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the Land Act 1890.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees in the Reserve nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the written consent of Trustees.
4. No person shall stick bills or paint, write or cut names on the buildings, fences, or seats in the Reserve.
5. No person shall bring into the Reserve during any races or other public sports any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees.
6. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the written permission of the Trustees. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any articles, without the written consent of the Trustees first obtained.
8. No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal upon or over the running track in the Reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
10. The maximum scale of feet which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for races or sports shall be as follows:—

Provided always that the Trustees may wholly or partially exempt any member of a racing club from the payment of all or any such charges or fees; and that the money so received shall, after deducting necessary expenses, be applied towards the permanent improvement of the Reserve, or the erection and

maintenance or repair of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees or shrubs in the Reserve, and in prizes for any race or recreation, or in such manner in or upon the Reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purpose of rendering the same more convenient or useful for racing and recreation purposes.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
