### KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

## TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGISTRATION OF DOGS IN THE GILBERT AND ELLICE ISLANDS PROTECTORATE.

(L.S.) W. L. ALLARDYCE.

1. Every person owning a dog or dogs within the limits of the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate shall register such dog or dogs in accordance with the Schedule hereto at the office of a Native Magistrate or of such other person as may be appointed for the purpose by the Resident Commissioner, and any person in whose custody, charge, or possession or in whose house or premises any dog or dogs shall be found or seen shall, unless the contrary be proved, be deemed to be the owner of such dog or dogs for the purposes of this Regulation.

2. Registration under this Regulation shall be effected and renewed in the month of January in each year. Provided that the first registration of any dog or dogs imported into any of the islands of the Gilbert and Ellice Protectorate between the months of February and November in any year after this Regulation shall have come into force shall be effected within one month of the date of such importation.

3. For and in respect of every registration effected under this Regulation, a fee of Four shillings shall be paid at the time of registration by the person making such registration.

4. Any person owning a dog or dogs who shall on the first day of February of any year have failed to register such dog or dogs or to pay the fee under this Regulation, and any person importing any dog or dogs into the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate who shall fail to register such dog or dogs and to pay the fee on such registration as provided in sections two and three hereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten shillings or in default

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of payment to imprisonment not exceeding seven days, but such penalty or such imprisonment shall not act as a discharge of the obligation to register and pay the fee therefor in accordance with the provisions of sections one, two, and three hereof.

5. Any island official or constable may take possession of any dog that he has reason to suppose to be not under the control of any person, and may detain such dog until the owner has claimed the same and paid all the expenses incurred by reason of such detention, and when any dog taken in pursuance of this Regulation has been detained for seven clear days and during such period shall not have been claimed, the Magistrate of the island or district within which such dog was found may cause such dog to be destroyed.

6. This Regulation, which shall not apply to dogs under six months old, may be cited as *The Gilbert and Ellice (Dogs) Regulation, 1901*, and shall come into force on the 1st day of January, One thousand nine hundred and two.

### CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION No. 6.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Waterworks District has for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890* been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1902, in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- On every house or tenement whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- Occupied and unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of municipal annual valuation.
- For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement by the Trust or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fourpence for every 100 gallons.

- For steam-boilers the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- In buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement; wooden houses shall be charged half-rate, payment to be made before supply is given.
- For supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate the Trust will in each case determine, and the preliminary payment must be paid at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- In the case of any dispute as to any sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.
- The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or lands so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- The rate hereby made shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January and 1st July.
- Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust there shall be paid the sum of Five pounds sterling.
6. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
7. Water supplied to the Government Departments, religious denominations, and persons outside the Trust District shall be by measurement or special agreement.
8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1902. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.
9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

  5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.
  6. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.
  7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure (and except in cases where the Trust has made special agreements).
  8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.
  9. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1902.
  10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

5. Such owners or occupiers of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons.

For all tenements and allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise in the said district, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements and allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements and allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, and over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

5. For every steam-boiler supplied with water except by special agreement, a charge of Twenty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

6. For water supplied to syphon-pumps, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

7. In all cases of water supply the Trust reserves the right of putting on a meter at the consumer's expense, and supplying water by measure.

8. Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable and other public institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure, or by special agreement.

9. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners and occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands, where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum 40,000 gallons per acre.

For every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1902, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1902, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1902, and the 1st day of July, 1902.

Where water meters are affixed payment shall be made at the end of each quarter in each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

**THE LOWAN SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.  
RATING REGULATIONS.**

THE Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following regulation:—

Regulation for the making of a rate for the year 1902 on all rateable property within the Trust district.

Whereas His Excellency the Governor in Council has by an order made the 21st day of December, 1897, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in such divisions, viz.:—

The Shire of Lowan Division.

The Shire of Dimboola Division.

And has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such several divisions.

And whereas by a further Order in Council made under the provisions of the said section of the said *Water Act 1890*, and bearing the date of the 12th day of January, 1900, it was directed that the respective rating in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said divisions shall be—

The Shire of Lowan Division, Sixpence.

The Shire of Dimboola Division, Fourpence.

The following rate is therefore made on the annual valuation of all rateable property in the said several divisions of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust District according to the valuation on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of Lowan and Dimboola respectively, that is to say:—

On the rateable property within the Shire of Lowan Division a rate of 6d. (sixpence) in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dimboola Division a rate of 4d. (fourpence) in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1902, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1902, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1902, and shall be payable on the 1st day of March, 1902.

Such person, or persons, as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was made on the 30th day of August, 1901, by the Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and in pursuance of the direction contained in the said recited Order in Council of the 12th day January, 1900.

Clause 5. That the source from which the said Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is to obtain a supply of water shall be the River Murray *via* the Kow Swamp National Works. The quantities of water that the said Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be entitled to take from the River Murray *via* Kow Swamp National Works shall be one thousand four hundred and ninety-eight (1,498) cubic feet per minute in the winter season, and nine hundred and nine (909) cubic feet per minute in the summer season.

WHEREAS it is among other things provided by section 118 of the *Stamps Act 1890*, that the Governor in Council may from time to time made Regulations for carrying out all or any of the provisions of the *Stamps Acts*, and among other things all such Regulations as the Governor in Council may deem expedient for the better securing the revenue of the Crown as it may be affected by the *Stamps Acts*: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council of the same doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

## REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations shall come into force on and after the publication of the *Government Gazette*.

2. All officers and persons in the public service of the State of Victoria whose duty is to cancel by metal hand stamps or rubber hand stamps any adhesive fee or duty stamps, or to impress receipts on any instruments by metal hand stamps or rubber stamps, shall use for such purposes the special obliterating inks, black or fluid, manufactured for such purpose, and no other ink or inks.

3. It shall be the duty of all such officers and persons to make themselves acquainted with these Regulations and to act in accordance therewith.

## BONUSES FOR EXPORT OF GREEN FRUIT.

In clauses 1, 2, and 3 of the aforesaid Regulations of 6th November, 1896, the sum of £3,500 shall read £5,500.

## GENERAL VEGETABLE PRODUCTS, £10,000.

In clause 1 of the aforesaid Regulations of 6th November, 1896, the sum of £10,000 shall read £6,000.

of the said State, do hereby proclaim that portion of the Water-  
works District of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust,  
included within the following boundaries to be an "Urban  
District" for the purposes and within the meaning of the said  
Act:—

Commencing at a point two thousand three hundred and eighty  
link and a half west from the south-east corner of allotment  
No. 20; thence south across three-chain road into allotment No.  
23 to a point twelve chains and a half south of northern boundary  
of said allotment; thence east twenty-two chains; thence south  
eleven chains and a half; thence east one hundred and sixty-

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight  
Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael  
and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of  
Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of  
Australia.

**WHEREAS** by the *Fisheries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1093) it  
is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in  
Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall  
have force and effect only in any waters or places specified  
therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sections 37  
and 38 of the said Act; and that every Proclamation under the  
said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and may  
be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any  
other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the  
Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Common-  
wealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council  
of the said State, do by this Proclamation prohibit the use of  
trammels, trawls, and other nets or fixed engines at Portland  
within an area bounded by two imaginary lines extending as  
hereunder described from the shore seawards to their intersec-  
tion and by the foreshore between such lines, one of such lines  
forming the northern boundary of such area extending seawards  
parallel with and 100 feet off the northern side of the new pier  
from a post on the shore; and the other line forming the eastern  
boundary of such area extending seaward from the junction of  
the eastern side of the breakwater with the shore through a  
point 100 feet to seaward of the outer extremity of the new  
pier.
