RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1901.

THE number of births registered during the month of October in all the Bendigo Districts was 107; of these 60 were of males and 47 of females; included were 4 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the registered births numbered 127, viz.—60 of males and 67 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 52, viz.—34 of males and 18 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 55. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 49; in the month of October, 1900, they numbered 66; in the month of October, 1899, they numbered 105; in the month of October, 1898, they numbered 72; in the month of October, 1897, they numbered 66; in the month of October, 1896, they numbered 57; in the month of October, 1895, they numbered 73; in the month of October, 1894, they numbered 59; in the month of October, 1893, they numbered 63; in the month of October, 1892, they numbered 53; and in the month of October, 1891, they numbered 104.

Of the registered births 75 occurred within the city of Bendigo, and 32 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 37 took place within and 15 without the city.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1901.

THE births of 47 boys and 59 girls, or in all of 106 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of October. Of these, 49 occurred in Ballarat East, 48 in Ballarat West, 8 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 7 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 111, viz., 59 of boys and 52 of girls.

The deaths registered in October numbered 52, viz., 28 of males and 24 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 54. 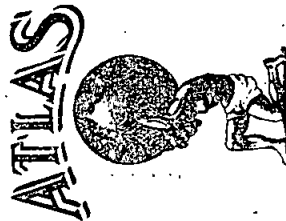

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1896*, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution the Council of the Shire of Orboast, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire of Orboast, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law numbered ten (10) and the resolutions of the Council of the 11th day of July, 1900, and the 8th day of August, 1900, are hereby revoked.

1. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall on or before the fourth day of June, 1901, and in and for subsequent years on or before the 1st day of January, register himself by signing and forwarding to the shire secretary an application in the form next hereinafter set out, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings.

2. Every person, who, after the fourth day of June next is, or shall become a cow-keeper or purveyor of milk, shall register himself forthwith in the manner provided in the next preceding section.

3. Upon receipt of every application for registration and fee, the secretary shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

4. All paddocks, grounds, lands, houses, yards, premises, and enclosures used as a grazing ground for dairy cattle, shall whenever necessary, be inspected by any person authorized, in writing, by the president or secretary of the said council; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, houses, yards, premises, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or the person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally, or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or left in the case of an unregistered person, served personally, or left at his dwelling, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle or other animals in dairies may also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, and any other diseased animal, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

5. The council, on receiving a report from an inspector that the construction of any dairy, milking-place, cow-shed, milk-store, milk-shop, or other building in the occupation of any person following the trade of dairyman, cow-keeper, or purveyor of milk is defective or faulty in regard to lighting, ventilation, drainage, or water supply, in such a way as to prejudicially affect the health of the cows or the wholesomeness of the milk or other dairy produce, may order the dairyman, cow-keeper, or purveyor of milk to make alterations in any such buildings or structures and to remedy any such defects within a time specified in such order.

6. Such closet accommodation shall be provided for the persons employed on the premises of any dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop, and at such distances from the milking-place, milk-store or milk-shop as may be directed by the council, and the closet-pans on such premises shall be disinfected daily.

7. Where horses are kept on the premises of any dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop, such stable accommodation shall be provided, and at such distances from the milking-place, or milk-store, or milk-shop as the council may direct.

8. All houses, dairies, milking-places, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health by affecting the milk, or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings or milking-places shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman.

9. All yards or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and shall be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer, or inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

10. All vessels used for holding milk shall be thoroughly scoured and scalded daily, and no cow-keeper, dairyman, or person employed in milking or dairy work, shall use in connexion with milking, or for washing vessels used for holding milk or for any dairy work, water that is in any way infected or contaminated or contains matter injurious to health, and the health officer or inspector may, after inspection, prohibit by order served, as prescribed in clause 4 of this by-law, the use for dairy purposes of the water obtained from any well or tank or other source of water supply, and may require any tank to be cleaned and disinfected.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No dairyman, purveyor of milk, or cow-keeper, shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. No person suffering from any dangerous infectious or contagious disease, or dangerous infectious disease, or who has been recently in contact with any person so suffering, shall milk cows or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business until authorized by the council, municipal clerk or health officer so to do.

14. If any person (whether an adult or a child) living on or occupying, or staying on a visit at any premises used as a grazing ground or dairy, or for cow-sheds, or as a milk-shop or milk-store, be attacked by any epidemic or contagious disease, the occupier of the house or premises in which such person is (or if he be the person attacked his wife or other person in charge) shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or health officer, or to the nearest member of the police force, and the council may, whether or not the person so attacked has been removed from the premises by order served as aforesaid, prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk or the produce thereof from the premises until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and may order the destruction of the milk or any produce thereof on the premises.

15. Every dairy, milk-store, or milk-shop shall be inspected once in each quarter of the year by the council's inspector, who shall furnish a report to the council on the following matters, that is to say:—Condition of paddocks, water supply, drains, sheds, and buildings, disposal of manure, closet and stable accommodation, storage for milk, means of scalding or cleaning vessels, cleanliness of premises, compliance with this by-law.

Penalties.

If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided that the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings (5s.) of such penalty to be paid.

BY-LAW No. 18.—AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, the Council of the Shire of Rodney, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire of Rodney, do hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Rodney.

4. From and after coming into force of this by-law every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the Shire of Rodney shall within fifteen days from and after the first day of December in every year, and every person about to carry on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall previous to carrying on such trade within the said shire, register himself with the said shire council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the secretary of the said shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every cow-keeper or dairyman shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Sixpence for every cow kept, the minimum charge to be Two shillings and sixpence and the maximum charge to be Two pounds. And when so registering shall verify the particulars contained in the application for registration hereunder written as to the number of cows kept by a statutory declaration, and every purveyor of milk shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings.

All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, who shall be known as the Dairy Inspector, and as hereinafter designated the "Inspector," or by any person authorized, in writing, by the secretary of the said council, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any of them are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or in case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid, and any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and

the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any manner whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business, nor if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, or officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law, words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

And any such order as aforesaid the Council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, or purveyor of milk, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectually lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such cowkeeper or dairyman.

If any person or member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of any house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the Council or Officer of Health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Council or the Officer of Health by order, served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale of and forwarding

of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Council or Officer of Health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering to milk cows, or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

10. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Council, Officer of Health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

11. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

12. In the interpretation of this By-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word person shall include a corporation.

13. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS, EITHER UNDER LICENCE OR PERPETUAL LEASE.

THE situation of the land is, on the Murray river about twenty-five (25) miles north-west from Swan Hill, in the parish of Piangil, and is known as the "Murray river frontage reservation."
