### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

The births of 1,064 children, viz., 559 boys and 505 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of October. The number, although the highest recorded for the month since 1894, was still 50 below the average of the month during the last ten years, or 112 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in October numbered 540, viz., 288 of males and 252 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 524, or by 97 per cent., as against 63 per cent. in October, 1900, and 88 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 65 less than in October, 1900, and the lowest recorded for the month during any of the previous ten years, except 1892, 1894, 1896, and 1897; it was also 51 below the average of October during the last ten years, or 84 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25·35, and of deaths registered to 12·86 per annum; as compared with averages of the same month in 1900 of 24·37 and 14·91 respectively; and during the last ten years of 28·38 and 15·03 respectively; and averages for the whole year of 29·74 and 16·16.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 83·5° on the 19th, and the lowest was 37·2° on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (55·0°) was 1½° below the average, and only once in the last ten years was the record lower (viz., in October, 1899). The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (33·9°) took place on the 18th, and the least range (7°) on the 12th. The mean daily range was 17·2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30·336 inches on the 9th, and the lowest was 29·120 inches on the 27th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·879 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on twelve days, the amount being 4·31 inches, which was the highest recorded for the month during the last 22 years, and 2·65 inches above the average of the previous ten years.

The mean humidity of the month was 78·7.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 20 per cent. to that mortality, as against 24 per cent. in October, 1900, 19 per cent. in October, 1899, 30 per cent. in October, 1898; 19 per cent. in October, 1897; 21 per cent. in October, 1896; 21 per cent. in October, 1895; and 24 per cent. in October, 1894.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 80, as compared with 90 in October, 1900. The rate of infantile mortality was 75 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 91 in October, 1900; 89 in October, 1899; 133 in October, 1898; 64 in October, 1897; 68 in October, 1896; 79 in October, 1895; 64 in October, 1894; 72 in October, 1893; 77 in October, 1892; and 186 in October, 1891.

In striking contrast to the decline in the percentage of deaths of children under five years, the proportion of deaths of elderly persons—aged 75 and upwards—has shown a marked increase in the last ten years, proving infallibly that the percentage of elderly persons in the population has considerably increased, and has apparently not yet reached a maximum. This point is of considerable interest as bearing on the question of old-age pensions. The actual numbers of aged persons cannot be ascertained until the results of the recent census have been fully tabulated.

Nineteen of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 39 in October, 1900—were from external causes, of which 15 were set down to accident and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A coal miner, aged 26, died of fracture of spine, consequent on being crushed between trucks; a driver, aged 21, of injuries, the result of being crushed between a dray and a gate; a painter, aged 15, of injuries, caused by a fall through a skylight; a labourer, aged 34, and a gardener, aged 67, both of fracture of the skull, resulting from a fall; a wool-buyer, aged 26, of laceration of the brain; a female, aged 14, was drowned during a fit; five persons were "found drowned," viz.:—A horse trainer, aged 33, an accountant, aged 34, a fireman, aged 36, and a male of unknown occupation, aged 44, all found in the River Yarra; and a dairyman, aged 27, in Hobson's Bay; a male infant, aged 3 weeks, was overlain; a female, aged 69, was suffocated by food; and a male infant, aged 15 days, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The suicidal deaths were those of a photographer, aged 53, who poisoned himself with cyanide of potassium; and a hawker, aged 50, and two females, aged 17 and 34 respectively, who drowned themselves.

One hundred and sixty-five deaths, or 31 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—76 in the Melbourne, 14 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 5 in the Women's, 10 in the Children's, 6 in the Homoeopathic, and 11 in the Austin Hospitals; 5 in the Metropolitan and 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 5 in the Immigrants' Home; 15 in the Benevolent Asylum; 9 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; and 2 in Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 108, of which 57, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 51, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 80 were under one year of age, 12 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 432. Of these 231, or 53 per cent., were males, and 201, or 47 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 22 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 30 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 21 were between fifty-five and sixty, 35 were between sixty and sixty-five, 37 were between sixty-five and seventy, 56 were between seventy and seventy-five, 28 were between seventy-five and eighty, 26 were between eighty and eighty-five, 13 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 2 were between ninety and ninety-five.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was a decrease of 9 deaths under zymotic, 15 each under developmental and local diseases, 20 under the head of violence, and 7 under ill-defined causes. Under the zymotic class, there was a marked fall in the number of deaths from measles and diphtheria, viz., from 21 to 1, and from 12 to 3 respectively. The current epidemic of influenza is rapidly abating, for its mortality, after having suddenly risen from 7 in June to 43 deaths each in July and August, fell to 14 in September, and 10 in the month under notice; but whooping-cough still continues to cause a high total since the 1st January therefrom having been recorded in the month, as against 14 in September, 3 in August, 13 in July, whilst the cancer rose from 33 to 50. Under the constitutional class, deaths from phthisis fell from 77 to 62, but those from old age rose from 24 to 19. Under the developmental class, deaths from premature birth fell from 29 to 21, and those from old age urinary system by 4; whilst those from diseases of the circulatory system increased by 2, and those from diseases of the respiratory system by 5, those from diseases of the digestive system by 4, and those from diseases of the organs of generation by 2.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1900, and the first ten months of 1901, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was very low.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District, that is to say:—In regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes—

1. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling per annum the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1902, commencing on the 1st day of January and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1902, and shall be payable in equal moieties in advance on the 1st January and 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, sue for, and recover the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation No. 8 was made by the Commissioners of the said Donald Waterworks Trust this 7th day of November, 1901, and the seal of the Trust affixed in the presence of—

THE CHARLTON SHIRE COUNCIL AND THE  
ST. ARNAUD SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—

WHEREAS by the Water Acts it is enacted that any municipal council may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, from time to time apply any portion of its municipal fund towards the payment of interest on and the creation of a redemption fund for the liquidation of any moneys borrowed by any Waterworks Trust: And whereas the Municipal Council of the Shire of Charlton is desirous of applying from the municipal fund of the said shire a sum of One hundred and seventy-seven pounds four shillings sterling (£177 4s.) towards the payment of interest on moneys borrowed by the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust: The Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria has therefore, by an Order made on the 13th day of November, 1901, consented to the said sum of £177 4s. being applied by the municipal council of the said shire from the municipal fund thereof for the purpose aforesaid.

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATIONS FOR 1902.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1902.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1902 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.
2. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value and over, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling.
3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid.
4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.
5. The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.
6. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.
7. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.
8. For every water-trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made.
9. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.
10. For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings for each stall shall be made.
11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.
12. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied, so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1902, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulations were passed by the Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust this 12th September, 1901, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

THE HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGU-  
LATION No. 4.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Hamilton Waterworks Trust make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water from his premises, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty in accordance with the 36th section hereof.
2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
3. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall each have at the main a stop cock to which a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe must be attached, and another stop cock at the footpath, and where the supply is otherwise than by measure shall in no case, unless with the sanction of the Trust, exceed the following diameters:—

For domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, half-an-inch diameter.

For domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, three-quarters of an inch diameter.

For other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust may in case authorize in writing.

4. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

5. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by allowing the same to flow from a tap or otherwise, or who shall use water for purposes other than that for which he is supplied, or who shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any) or if none the owner, shall in every instance after notice given by an officer of the Trust in its behalf that such service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and shall be responsible for any loss of water, and also for any damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and shall, in the event of his failing to forthwith make such repairs, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds per day during which such occupier or owner shall fail to effect the repairs after the service of such notice. In the event of the necessary repairs not being effected forthwith in accordance with the aforesaid notice, the Trust may proceed to make the necessary repairs, and the expenses which may be incurred or paid by it in effecting such repairs shall be paid to it by the occupier or owner by whom such work ought to have been done, and the Trust may recover the same from such occupier or owner before two justices or in an action of debt in any court of competent jurisdiction.

6. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this provision shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

8. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved, by a duly authorized officer of the Trust, and unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons. A separate meter shall, in every case, be provided for each tenement when the supply is by measure.

9. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of any provision of this Regulation, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which, under the provisions of this Regulation ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

10. The water supplied within that portion of the Waterworks District of the Trust which has been proclaimed an Urban District shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with this Regulation, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid and placed under and in accordance with the said Regulation and not otherwise.

11. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.



12. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the Regulations of the Trust, and with the sections of the Water Act affecting his work. The Trust may, at any time, cancel such licence.

13. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust appointed for such purpose, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipe of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty in accordance with section 36 hereof, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty in accordance with such section for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

14. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.
- (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and be capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.
- (4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.
- (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles, for connecting the service-pipes and mains, to be high-pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbow bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

15. Any person other than a servant of the Trust in the execution of his duty, who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without having given to the Trust two days' notice, in writing, of his intention so to do, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, or who shall trespass on the Trust's work without leave, shall be liable, for each offence, to a penalty in accordance with the 36th section hereof.

16. Any person appointed for that purpose by the Trust may, between the hours of Nine in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, apply to the owner or occupier of any house or premises supplied with water by the Trust for permission to enter the same, in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and if such person, at any such time, be refused admittance into any such dwelling house or premises for the purposes aforesaid, or be prevented from making such examination as aforesaid, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises.

17. No bath supplied with water by the Trust (except through a meter), and having a holding capacity of more than one hundred gallons shall be allowed, except with the special permission of the Trust. The inlet-pipe must be placed above the highest water level of the bath, and no overflow pipe will be allowed except when the bath is fitted with an approved waste preventer.

18. Except where water is supplied by measure, no person shall convey water supplied by the Trust through a hose for any purpose. Provided that (save where in the opinion of the Trust a meter shall be necessary) taps will be allowed to be fixed in gardens, and hoses allowed to be used therein on payment of a special rate (in addition to the assessment rate) of Five shillings per annum for each year or portion of a year, ending on the thirty-first day of December next then ensuing, for any garden not exceeding 250 square yards in area, with an additional Five shillings per annum for each 250 square yards or portion of 250 square yards in excess thereof up to 1,000 square yards in area. All gardens above 1,000 square yards in area will be supplied by meter only. Fractions of a year shall be paid and charged for as for a whole year. Each payment shall be made in advance, and before any permit or authority is issued. Any person offending against this section or clause, or any part thereof, shall be liable to a penalty in accordance with the 36th section hereof.

No person shall convey water supplied by the Trust through a hose for any purpose except when the water is supplied by measure or for garden purposes as hereinbefore mentioned. Any person offending against this section shall be liable to a penalty in accordance with the 36th section hereof.

19. The Trust may enter into a special agreement with any person requiring water for any other purposes than domestic, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

20. The charge for water supplied from any stand-pipe shall be Sixpence for any quantity up to 200 gallons, and Sixpence for each additional 200 gallons or portion of 200 gallons.

21. The Trust reserves the right to sell water to any person for any purpose whatever other than domestic. If any person (1) not having from the Trust a supply of water for other than domestic purposes, uses for other than domestic purposes any water supplied to him by the Trust, or (2) having from the Trust a supply of water for other than domestic purposes, uses for any purposes other than those for which he is entitled to use the same, such person shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings, without prejudice to the right of the Trust to recover from him the value of the water misused.

22. In the construction of this Regulation, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, "The Trust" shall mean "The Hamilton Waterworks Trust," and the words "The Act" shall mean the "Water Acts" and every amendment thereof. Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular, unless the contrary as to gender or number is expressly provided.

23. Every urinal shall be supplied only through a cistern or service-box, fitted with waste-preventing apparatus approved by the Trust. No service-pipe shall be suffered to communicate directly with any urinal.

24. If any meter in use cease registering or be reported by any officer of the Trust as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust may estimate, and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe, and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.

25. Excepting with the permission of the Trust, not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The Trust may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop cock on such sub-service, and any person offending against the provisions of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

26. Extensions of private services will not be allowed without the consent of the Trust, and every such extension shall be made under the superintendence and according to the directions of an officer appointed for that purpose by the Trust.

27. With each application for a new service there shall be deposited with the treasurer of the Trust a sum of One pound, and with each application for repairs to service-pipes from the mains to the building line, a like sum of One pound. Such moneys shall be repaid to the depositor on a certificate being produced from an officer of the Trust that the work in each case has been carried out to his satisfaction, otherwise such money shall be retained either wholly or in part by the Trust at its absolute discretion.

28. No service pipe will be allowed to communicate with any cistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of rain water, whether above or below the surface of the ground, except where water is supplied by measure.

29. No pipe or other apparatus shall be laid through any sewer, drain, ash pit, manure tank, or other place where, in the event of the pipe becoming unsound, the water conveyed through such pipe would be liable to be fouled or to escape without observation, unless such pipe or apparatus be laid through an exterior pipe or box of sufficient length and strength to afford due protection to the same and to bring any leakage or waste within easy detection. In all cases before being used the exterior pipe or box must be submitted to and approved by the officer of the Trust appointed for such purpose.

30. Subject to previous written consent of the Trust, private fire services will be allowed at expense of owner, but every such service must be sealed except in cases where the Trust's officer shall have certified in writing that sealing is unnecessary. For each such private fire service there shall be paid a sum of Ten shillings upon the fixing thereof, and a sum of Ten shillings per annum thereafter. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion of such service except for extinction of fire. Except in case of fire no person shall, without authority of the Trust, wilfully break the seal affixed to any private fire service, and in the event of any such seal having been broken accidentally or otherwise, the occupier of the tenement shall within twenty-four hours thereafter give notice, in writing, of the fact to the officer of the Trust, and failing to do so shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and to a continuing penalty of Ten shillings for every day during which he shall neglect to give such notice.

31. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper-bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement on pain of cancellation of the licence of the plumber who, by himself or his workmen, shall break these Regulations.

32. A high-pressure screw-down stop cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, shall be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the latter.

33. No person other than an employé of the Trust or a municipality or member of a fire brigade on duty shall, without the written permission of the Trust, be allowed to take water from the fire plugs for watering the streets or any other purpose (except in case of fire). Any person offending against this section shall be liable to a penalty in accordance with the 36th section hereof.

34. The water supply to all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the Trust, and any person not duly authorized who shall, except with the written permission of the Trust, turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply, shall be liable to a penalty in accordance with the 36th section hereof.

35. In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice, in writing, addressed to the secretary of the Trust, and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Acts or in any Regulation of the Trust, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the Trust's consent, in writing, and

then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified; such consent may be given by and under the hand of the Chairman of the Trust, the secretary, or the engineer, who severally shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto, and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the Trust for confirmation.

36. For every breach of or offence against any provision of this Regulation not herein expressly provided for the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in cases of continuing offence a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

#### EUROA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1902.

THE Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Rating Regulations:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, supplied otherwise than by meter, in all parts where the main pipes of the Trust have been extended (the minimum for each house or tenement supplied with water to be Thirty shillings), according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such property is situate, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1902, and ending on the 31st December, 1902. Such rate shall be payable in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1902, and the second instalment on the 1st day of July, 1902.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

#### THE ST. ARNAUD BOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST —RATING REGULATION FOR 1902.—REGULATION No. 3.

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1902 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust District (that is to say):—

1. The rates and charges specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes.

2. On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds, and not exceeding Twenty pounds, the sum of Twenty shillings.

4. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds, the sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of such valuation.

5. The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1902.

6. In the construction of this Regulation the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

#### YATCHAW IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1902.

REGULATION for the making of a rate, under the provisions of the Water Acts, on all rateable property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District.

1. #### LODDON UNITED WATER TRUST.—REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF WATER.

THE Commissioners of the Loddon United Water Trust, in pursuance of the powers of the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulation for the sale and distribution of water from the Catummal, Woolshed, and Bullock Creek channels and off-takes.

1. For the purpose of filling dams and tanks all water shall be paid for by measure as follows:—When the supply is obtained by gravitation, the rate or price to be charged shall be—during summer, from 1st December to 28th February, One pound (£1), and during winter, from 1st March to 30th November, Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per thousand cubic yards or fraction of one thousand cubic yards. When the supply is obtained by pumping by the Trust, the rate or price to be charged shall be Two pounds per thousand cubic yards or fraction of one thousand cubic yards.

2. No dam or tank shall be supplied by the water bailiff unless a proper drain shall have been made to convey the water.

3. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlet, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust, shall be guilty of a breach of this Regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

4. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or pollute the water therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works or any part thereof, or waste or pollute the water contained therein, and shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this Regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

5. In the event of the Trust being unable, through failure of the works or from any other cause, to deliver or supply water to persons who, through its water bailiff, it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust shall not be answerable for any damage that may have been sustained by any person by reason of such failure or non-delivery.

6. The water bailiff shall receive all applications for water, and shall enter same in an order-book supplied to him for that purpose, with the several particulars required therein, which shall be signed by the applicant, and all applicants for water may request and shall be entitled to the inspection of such order-book. Each applicant for water will be supplied in the order in which his application appears in the order-book, to the time at which such water is required (if available), but the Trust will not be responsible for the non-supply of water applied for under any circumstances.

7. The water bailiff may accept applications for the sale of any surplus water not required for stock and domestic purposes.

8. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for all land, including gardens, payment in all cases to be made in advance.

9. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through the respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence. And the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays, as well as on ordinary working days.

10. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence (excepting in the cases of gardens, applications for the supply of water for the irrigation of which may be dealt with by the Trust on their merits, and such agreement made from time to time as may be deemed expedient); and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays, as well as on ordinary working days.

11. All water supplied for the purpose of filling dams should be paid for in advance.

# CHURCH OF ENGLAND, SOUTH YARRA.—POWER TO DISPOSE OF SITE.

**A** STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England, in the diocese of Melbourne, in Victoria, under the provisions of the *Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, the same was allowed by him on the eighteenth day of November, 1901, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

*Description of Land.*—Two acres, county of Bourke, parish of South Melbourne, city of Melbourne, being allotment 5 of section 6A: Commencing at the intersection of the south side of Gardiner's Creek-road and the west side of Punt-road; bounded thence by the last-named road bearing south 5 chains; thence by a right-of-way bearing west 4 chains; thence by Fawknor Park bearing north 5 chains; and thence by Gardiner's Creek-road aforesaid bearing east 4 chains to the point of commencement.

*Names of Trustees.*—Edmond Gerald FitzGibbon, of South Yarra, Esquire, C.M.G.; The Right Reverend Field Flowers Goe, D.D., Bishop of Melbourne; Henry Edward Agincourt Hodges, Chancellor of the Diocese of Melbourne; William Edward Morris, Registrar of the Diocese of Melbourne; and Frederic Race Godfrey, of St. Kilda, Esquire.

*Power of Disposition.*—To permit and suffer so much of the land as shall not be disposed of under the powers hereinafter specified to be used for the purposes for which they were granted by the Crown. To permit and suffer at the request of the incumbent or officiating minister having for the time being the spiritual charge of the parish or district in the diocese in which the land shall be situate, and also by the present or future guardians or churchwardens for the time being of the church built upon the land, or hereafter to be built, if such request be concurred in by the bishop thereof, or by the administrator of the affairs thereof during the vacancy of the See, the erection of buildings on any portion of the said land. To lease or sell, at the like request, if concurred in as aforesaid, any portion of the said land, or any buildings or portion of any buildings thereon, on such terms and conditions as shall in such request be specified.

*Purposes to which proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.*—Moneys obtained from sales or leases to be paid to the bishop or administrator aforesaid to be dealt with for Church of England purposes, in accordance with an agreement previously come to between such bishop or administrator and the incumbent or officiating minister and the present or future guardians or churchwardens aforesaid; but to be subject nevertheless to the payment or deduction therefrom of all costs, charges, and expenses incurred by the trustees, or for which they shall be liable in respect of the trust estate.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE MOORABBIN BEACH PARK.

**W**HEREAS by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make, alter, or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the regulations made by the said Board on 22nd February, 1900, in respect of the Moorabbin Beach Park, and doth hereby make the following regulations in lieu thereof:—

### REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall place or erect or cause to be placed or erected in the Park any tent, marquee, stall, booth, boat-house, bathing-box, shed, or any building or structure whatsoever, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.

2. No person shall offer for sale in the park any article, goods, or commodity whatsoever without the consent of the committee of management.

3. If any person refuses or neglects within fourteen (14) days after receiving notice, in writing, from the committee of management to remove from the park any building, erection, or structure which may heretofore have been or shall hereafter be erected, either with or without the consent of the committee of management, such person shall commit an offence against these regulations.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF GARVOC.

**W**E, William Clancy, Thomas Eldridge, and William Blain, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the township of Garvoc, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.

### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise until sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

## REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AND FOR AFFORDING ACCESS TO WATER IN THE PARISH OF NEWHAM, KNOWN AS THE HANGING ROCK WATER AND RECREATION RESERVE.

**W**HEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Newham, in respect of the Reserve for Public Recreation and for affording access to water in the parish of Newham, known as the "Hanging Rock Water and Recreation Reserve," it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a place for recreation and amusement and for affording access to water, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime, under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Lands and Works and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire of Newham: And whereas by section 137 of the *Land Act 1890* it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees, or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council from time to time, to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the Shire of Newham do hereby make, in lieu of clause 1 of the regulations at present in force in respect of the said Reserve, the following regulation for the care, protection, and management thereof:—

### REGULATION.

The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on the first day of each year or any holiday substituted for such day on which a fee of Sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission to the Reserve of every person not under the age of eighteen (18) years.

Every person offending against this regulation shall, in accordance with section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant, or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Applications for the undermentioned allotments, accompanied by the registration fee of 5s., must be made on the usual form, addressed to the President of the Board of Land and Works, and lodged at any Crown Lands Office or Receipt and Pay Office in the State before Friday, the 20th day of December, 1901.

That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

That where improvements are authorized under section 116 of the Land Act 1890 the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

A tenderer not desiring to accept a contract for part of the requirements of any station should write against such station the words "all or none."

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, based on the estimated quarterly consumption of 8 centals of oats, 1 of bran, 12 of hay, and 3 of straw per horse, or thereabouts, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
