PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. NOTE.—A census of the population was taken on the 31st March, 1901, which showed the actual population of the State on that date to have been 1,201,438, consisting of 604,205 males and 597,233 females. The result proved the soundness of the estimates made by this office from 1891 to 1900, on which basis the total estimated population brought on to the 31st March 1901, was found to be understated by only 9,868, or by little more than $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the actual population; the males by 7,340, or by $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.; and the females by 2,528, or by less than one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) per cent., as will be seen by the following figures:—

The estimated allowance made for unrecorded departures during the intercensal period was $\frac{8}{10}$ per cent. of the recorded departures by sea for both sexes, or 10 per cent. for males and 6 per cent. for females; whereas the true allowance, as disclosed by the census, should have been about $\frac{7}{10}$ per cent. for both sexes, or nearly $\frac{8}{10}$ per cent. for males and a little over 5 per cent. for females, as shown by the following statement:—

For the future, it is proposed to allow for unrecorded departures in the proportion of $8\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. for males and of 5 per cent. for females.

During the second quarter of 1901, the births numbered 7,821, or 93 less, and the deaths 3,845, or 452 more than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year (when the mortality was exceptionally low); whilst the natural increase of population (3,976) was 545 less than in the corresponding quarter of 1900, but exactly the same as that of 1899.

The recorded arrivals by sea during the quarter numbered 22,637, and the recorded departures by sea 22,266, resulting in a net recorded gain of 371; as against 18,101 arrivals and 19,199 departures, resulting in a net loss of 1,098, as recorded in the corresponding quarter of 1900. The necessary allowance for unrecorded emigration, however, converts the gain of 371 into a net loss of 1,239, viz., 931 of males and 308 of females. It should be mentioned that the migration movements during the quarter were increased by the influx of visitors who came to witness the celebrations held in Melbourne in connexion with the opening of the First Parliament of the Commonwealth, but who, for the most part, returned to their homes before the quarter closed.

The total recorded increase of population during the quarter was 4,347, which was 924 greater than in the corresponding quarter of 1900, and 735 greater than in that of 1899. But, allowing for unrecorded departures, the net increase becomes reduced to 2,737, made up of an increase of 925 for males, and 1,812 for females, as shown in the table.

The records of the immigration agent show a net gain during the quarter from other parts of the Commonwealth of 403—made up of a net gain of 1,241 from New South Wales, of 316 from South Australia, and of 1,375 from Tasmania, less a net loss of 407 to Queensland and of 2,123 to Western Australia; also of a net gain of 145 from New Zealand, 673 from South Africa, 246 from "Other British Dominions," and 116 from Foreign Ports, but a net loss of 1,188 to the United Kingdom, and of 26 to the South Seas.

NOTE.—During the third quarter of the current year the number of births was 8,108, or 389 more, and that of deaths 4,116, or 358 more than in the corresponding quarter of the preceding year. The natural increase was thus 3,992, or 31 more than in the third quarter of 1900, and 742 less than in that of 1899.

The recorded arrivals by sea during the quarter numbered 18,067, and the recorded departures 18,226; the former being 2,069, and the latter 2,811 more than in the previous corresponding quarter. The net recorded loss by emigration was thus 159, as against a recorded gain of 533 in the third quarter of 1900, and a recorded loss of 1,751 in that of 1899. The allowance for unrecorded departures, however, increases the total estimated loss during the quarter to 1,498, consisting of 543 males and 955 females, as shown in the table.

The total recorded increase of population was 3,833, as against 4,544 and 2,983 in the corresponding quarters of the two preceding years. After allowing for unrecorded departures, however, the net result for the quarter was only 2,494, consisting of 1,202 males and 1,292 females.

In regard to the apparent origin or destination of migrants, the records show a net loss of 2,603 to other parts of the Commonwealth, but a net gain of 2,444 from other countries. The former resulted from a net loss of 1,451 (thus more than counterbalancing the gain in the preceding quarter) to New South Wales, of 1,568 to Western Australia (as against 2,123 in the second quarter), less net gain of 19 from Queensland, of 177 from South Australia, and of 220 from Tasmania. The latter was made up of a gain of 132 from New Zealand and South Seas, of 934 (as against a loss of 1,188 in the second quarter) from the United Kingdom, of 835 from South Africa, of 420 from "Other British Dominions," and of 123 from Foreign Ports.

Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line, except on payment of 20s. first class and 15s. second class. In all cases the journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.

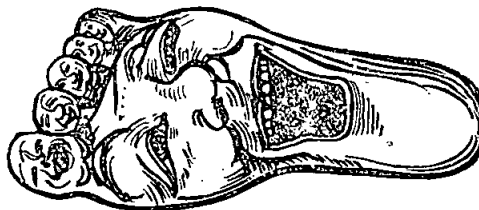

**BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1902.—No. 19.**

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following regulation, viz. :—

1. That the rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements liable to be rated within the waterworks district of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1902. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance, in four equal instalments, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in such year.
2. On every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual value of Twenty-five pounds or under a sum of Twenty-five shillings.
3. On every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, above the annual value of Twenty-five pounds a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property.
4. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile a sum of Three pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.
5. On every saw-mill, cordial, or aerated water factory, or other factory, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings, on every flour-mill a sum of Fifteen pounds, and on every livery-stable a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings.
6. On every steam-engine (not including any steam-engine in a factory or mill named in clause 5) a sum of Twenty shillings.
7. On every horse trough a sum of Ten shillings.
8. The area of land allowed for every house or tenement shall be one rood. Should any larger quantity of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Ten shillings for cultivated land and Three shillings for uncultivated land shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood.
9. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or if there be no contract, then upon the value of or amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust.

Cases where Water is not laid on.

10. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twelve shillings and sixpence.
11. On each rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any tenement a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Three shillings.
12. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service pipe with water by the Trust, who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided for in clause 10, must give notice, in writing, to the Trust Secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the quarterly period then current. No allowance will be made unless the water is turned off for a full three months, or in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service pipe.

Water Supplied by Measure.

13. The charge for water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold, shall be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which may either be provided and affixed by the consumer after being approved by the Trust, or the Trust may provide and affix same and charge a rental of One shilling and sixpence per quarter. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be Twenty thousand (20,000) gallons; a 1-inch service pipe may be allowed.
 14. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 13 shall apply.
 15. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under clauses 13 and 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.
 16. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's standpipes shall be Sixpence for each Two hundred gallons.
 17. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.
 18. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.
 19. In the construction of this regulation the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force in the Borough of Echuca on the 1st January, 1902, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust.
- The foregoing regulation was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust on the 28th day of October, 1901, and the seal of the said Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water District has, for the purposes of the said Acts, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following :—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1902 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say) :—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Eighteen pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Five shillings per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided. Payment in either case to be made in advance.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters, the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year, which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

Provided that the said rate shall not in any case be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

(2) For every unoccupied allotment or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings each be charged.

(3) For every occupied allotment, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings (6s.) each be charged.

(4) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the 31st day of December, 1902, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties, half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1902.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following regulation:—

**REGULATION FOR DETERMINING THE RATES AND CHARGES WHICH
SHALL BE MADE FOR WATER SUPPLIED WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES
OF THE YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.**

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-five pounds sterling and upwards (except in cases of special arrangements with the Trust), situate within the Waterworks District of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1902.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds sterling and not more than Twenty-four pounds sterling, a rate of One pound five shillings sterling per annum shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Twelve pounds sterling and under a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For any public water-trough supplied with water by the Trust the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure, provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special arrangement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata*, upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes.

11. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust used for the purposes of cooling houses the sum of Ten shillings per annum, in addition to the charges under any previous clauses of this Regulation, providing that such spray shall only be used between the hours of Nine o'clock a.m. and Nine o'clock p.m.

12. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1902, and are made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly, or as the Trust may direct.

13. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

WHEREAS by section 102 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time fix a sum which shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by any owner or occupier of property liable to be rated by any Waterworks Trust: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the now in part recited Act, doth order and direct that the sum of Twenty shillings (20s.) in regard to properties supplied with water, and Ten shillings (10s.) in regard to vacant or unoccupied allotments not so supplied, shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid for the year 1902 by every owner or occupier of such properties liable to be rated by the Benalla Waterworks Trust.

And the Honorable John Balfour Burton, His Majesty's Minister of Mines and Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

UNIFORMS.

1. The clauses in the Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 14th day of April, 1892, are hereby amended in the manner hereunder set out.

PEAK CAPS.

The concluding words of the clause, namely:—"the letters M.F.B. in front worked in silver lace" are struck out thereof, and the following words substituted therefor:—"A metal badge in front with an edging of silver lace."

HELMETS.

The first two clauses relating to helmets are rescinded as and from the 13th day of September, 1901, and the following clauses substituted therefor:—

"All ranks under District Superintendents shall wear helmets of black leather, brass, or other metal, with the letters M.F.B. on a plate in front in plain characters."

Every holder of a licence under section 65 of the *Land Act 1890* shall, if the land comprised in such licence be fenced wholly or in part, affix and keep affixed to the outside of four of the corner posts of the fence notices bearing thereon the following words, namely:—

"This land is auriferous, and subject to mining conditions."

Any neglect to comply with this regulation will render the licence liable to forfeiture.

Grazing Licences under Section 67, Land Act 1890.

Every holder of a licence under section 67 of the *Land Act 1890* shall, if the land comprised in such licence be fenced wholly or in part, affix and keep affixed to the outside of four of the corner posts of the fence notices bearing thereon the following words, namely:—

"This land is auriferous, and subject to mining conditions."

Any neglect to comply with this regulation will render the licensee liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

Section 89 of the Land Act 1898.

Every holder of a licence under section 42 or section 49 of the *Land Act 1890*, or section 59 of the *Land Act 1898*, subject to the special mining conditions set forth in section 89 of the *Land Act 1898* shall, if the land comprised in such licence be fenced wholly or in part, affix and keep affixed to the outside of four of the corner posts of the fence notices bearing thereon the following words, namely:—

"This land is auriferous, and subject to mining conditions."

Any neglect to comply with this regulation will render the licensee liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

Schedule 55 (Chap. IX., Part 2), Section 99.—Miscellaneous Licences.—Licences which confer the exclusive right to enter on Crown lands.

The fee for a licence under section 99 of the *Land Act 1890* for obtaining limestone and erecting lime kilns on allotments 2 and 3 in the township and parish of Waratah shall be Twelve pounds ten shillings (£12 10s.) per annum, payable quarterly in advance.—(Corr. 2630/91, Melb.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE PARISH OF LAURISTON, AT KYNETON, FOR RACING AND RECREATION PURPOSES, AND FOR DRILLING AND REVIEWING VOLUNTEERS.

WE, John Barry, Frederick Boyett, James Brady, John Francis Crewther, George Morrison Harper, John Kennedy, Hugh Rawson, George Owen Rigby, Martin Joseph Ryan, and William Jermyn Thirkettle, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve in the parish of Lauriston, at Kyneton, for Racing and Recreation purposes, and for Drilling and Reviewing Volunteers, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be parcelled out into the following divisions:—1st. The grand-stand, the saddling-paddock, and the paddock for carriages and horses, the weighing-yard, and the passage thereto, the stewards' stand and the judge's box (these being within the enclosure which is surrounded by a close fence), and any other stand that may be erected outside such enclosure by the Committee of Management. 2nd. All the residue of the reserve excepting such parts, if any, as may be hereafter fenced in and set apart for plantations or other purposes.

2. No person shall enter at any race or other meeting into either of the said divisions, nor bring any horses, carriages, or other vehicles into the first or second division, or train or exercise any horses therein, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management, duly authorizing him in that behalf, and then only in such part or parts of the said divisions as shall be indicated on the ticket, and only on the days for which the ticket is issued: but the ticket-holder shall not remain in the first or second division or any part thereof for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run, unless with the consent of the Committee of Management.

3. No person except the judge or any person he may call to his assistance shall enter the judge's box at the time the horses are prepared to start for or are running in any race.

4. No person shall enter the weighing-stand or the weighing-yard, or the approaches thereto, except the jockeys requiring to be weighed and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

5. The following persons shall not be admitted into the reserve during any race, race meeting, or agricultural show:—

(a) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to have been at any time guilty of malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connexion with racing or agricultural shows.

(b) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to be a defaulter.

6. Every person paying for admission to the first or second division or any part thereof shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, or if required surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand its production or surrender.

7. The Committee of Management shall be at liberty to rent or hire from time to time and upon such terms and conditions as they may think fit any stand or stands on the reserve, or the gates of admission thereto, or to any part thereof. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting or for any sports or recreation the grand-stand or any portion thereof, or any booth in the reserve; and persons allowed to train or exercise horses in the reserve shall abide by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the reserve and the buildings and other erections for the time being thereon.

8. No person shall bring any dog into the first or second division or into any building thereon.

9. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency, as regards dress, language, or conduct.

10. No person shall damage or in any way injure any trees, shrubs, or flowers at any time planted or growing in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

11. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats; or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

12. No person shall put into the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs (except at agricultural shows for the purpose of competing) without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

13. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

15. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall, together with any horses, carriages, or other vehicles in his possession or care, be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have

purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the first or second division or any part thereof:—

(a) Assaulting any other person.

(b) Being drunk.

(c) Kidding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course or any part of it during a race meeting or agricultural show, or when horses are preparing to start for or are running in any race.

(d) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.

(e) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.

(f) Behaving improperly or riotously.

(g) Being found in any part of the first or second division and not producing upon demand, or not surrendering if required, to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand production or surrender of tickets, a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part of the first or second division where such person shall be so found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy such Committee of Management or the stewards deputed by them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by such person and that such person's ticket has been lost.

(h) Obtaining admission to any part of the first or second division when disqualified to such admission under these regulations.

16. The scale of charges or fees which may be levied and taken for admission to the first and second division and buildings thereon respectively shall be fixed from time to time by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed the following:—

For the admission of every person to the first division, a sum not exceeding ten shillings.

For the admission of every person to the second division, a sum not exceeding three shillings.

For the admission to the second division of every person with truck or barrow, cart, or other vehicle engaged in trade, a sum not exceeding twenty shillings.

For the admission to the second division of every horse, not being a horse entered for any race, a sum not exceeding one shilling.

For the admission to the second division of every vehicle drawn by one horse, a sum not exceeding two shillings and sixpence.

For the admission to the second division of every vehicle drawn by more than one horse, for each horse a sum not exceeding two shillings and sixpence.

For the admission of every horse to the training ground, for training or exercise, for every three months, a sum not exceeding fifty shillings.

Provided that the Committee of Management may exempt any member of a racing club or agricultural society, wholly or partially, from the payment of all or any such charges or fees; and that the money so received and all rents shall, after deducting necessary expenses, be applied towards the permanent improvement of the reserve, or the erection and maintenance or repair of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees or shrubs in the reserve, and in prizes for any race or agricultural show or recreation, or for the owner of any horse engaged in any race, or for any exhibitor at the show, or in such manner in or upon the reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purposes of rendering the same more convenient and useful for racing and recreation purposes.

17. No person shall injure, destroy, or damage any building, fence, or erection, or any other property, tree, shrub, or plant, erected, being, or growing on the reserve, or plough, barrow, remove, or otherwise damage any portion of the grass or the surface soil of the reserve.

18. No person shall, after the first day of January, 1902, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker upon any portion of the reserve unless and until he shall comply with the following conditions:—

(a) That he be registered annually, or for each or for any race meeting, as a bookmaker by the Committee of Management or the committee or stewards of the Kyneton District Racing Club, or by those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards.

(b) That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket or badge to be supplied by the Committee of Management, committee, or stewards aforesaid, or by those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, which ticket or badge shall be visible to the public and shall have his name legibly printed thereon.

19. The fee for registration of every such person as a bookmaker under the foregoing regulation shall be (a) if registered annually, the sum of £2, and (b) if registered for any single race meeting, the sum of £1 for each and every such race meeting.

20. The Committee of Management shall have power to lock all gates during wet weather, and from sunset to sunrise, to preclude the admission of any cattle, horse, or vehicle to the reserve.

21. Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, the second division shall be open and free to pedestrians at all times, except on such ten days in any one year as may be named from time to time by the Committee of Management and approved by the Minister of Lands, and on any other day or days that the Minister of Lands may specify.

22. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, any of the Military Forces of His Majesty's Government in Victoria shall be allowed to use the reserve for drilling and reviewing purposes at any time except on days specially set apart for racing or for agricultural shows.

23. Regulations Nos. 18 and 19 shall apply only to the days on which race meetings shall be held in the reserve by the Kyneton District Racing Club or under its auspices.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction

before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any stock without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve.
8. No person shall erect in the Reserve any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Acts provided: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 8, 9, 10, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael
and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112, section 388) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be
lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality,
by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road,
highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and
thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within
the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Councils of the Town of Essendon and the Shire of
Nunawading have requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said
Councils for the purpose of making streets within the said town and shire respectively, be so declared public highways: Now
therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do
by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within
the Town of Essendon and the Shire of Nunawading aforesaid respectively, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the
said Act, viz.:—

THE situation of the land is on the Murray River, about twenty-five (25) miles north-west from Swan Hill, in the parish of Piangil, and is known as the "Murray river frontage reservation."

The land may be reached either by coach or steamer from Swan Hill.

Alternative tenders are required for white and Algerian oats.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

A tenderer not desiring to accept a contract for part of the requirements of any station should write against such station the words "all or none."

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, based on the estimated quarterly consumption of 8 centals of oats, 1 of bran, 12 of hay, and 3 of straw per horse, or thereabouts, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
