PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897 (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, viz.:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of East Loddon;

FRIDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Creswick; Monday, the 18th day of February instant, as a Bank Holiday at Bacchus Marsh;

TUESDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Central and Southern Ridings of the Shire of Tungamah;

WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Oxley, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Kyabram;

THURSDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Sale;*

WEDNESDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Castlemaine and Chewton, and the United Shire of Mount Alexander;

Wednesday, the 27th day of February instant, and Wednesday, the 20th day of March next, as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Huntly;

THURSDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF FEBRUARY INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Flemington and Kensington and the Shire of Fern Tree Gully;

WEDNESDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at

WEDNESDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, as a Bank Hall-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, a Kerang;

Monday, the 18th day of March next, as a Public Holiday throughout the Town of Warrnambool;*

TUESDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Kilmore;

WEDNESDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the City of Bendigo and the Shire of Dundas.
