## FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

**W**HEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient; And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Tuesday, the 26th day of February, 1901, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday, the 26th day of February, 1901, until Tuesday, the 26th day of March, 1901.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.

PILOTS, exempt masters, and mariners generally are hereby informed that the usual method of observing and describing positions in connexion with casualties, groundings, or other occurrences, namely, by compass bearings to fixed objects, being unreliable and useless for accurately defining such positions, such method should only be used where circumstances do not permit of more accurate methods for defining such positions being employed; therefore it is requested by the Marine Board and the Ports and Harbors Department that whenever possible all-round horizontal angular measurements to prominent fixed objects be made from any such position, and that such angular measurements be given in reports of occurrences. Any complete set of all-round angular measurements taken as requested, their sum being 360°, would enable the position from which they were taken to be afterwards ascertained.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40—20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

10. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

11. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.
